WIRELESS NEWS

PARIS — In order the pre- vent the French continuing their aid to British parachu- tists who descend in France, the German authorities, in occupation, have dictated dra- stic measures, including the death penalty, against those who do so. Rewards have also been offered those who re- port landings, and the where- abouts of the parachutists.

LONDON — Cardinal Hin- sley, Archbishop of West- minster, has declared that the Nazis have assassinated 700,000 Jews in Poland since the termination of the fight- ing in that country.

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, — Admiral Jesse Oldendorf arrived here on the 8th in- stant to assume command of the naval base at Chaguara- mas. This indicates an intensi- fication of anti-submarine activities in the Caribbean.

BERLIN — The Gestapo have placed a fine of one million Belgian Francs a- gainst the city of Brussels be- cause of the dynamiting of a part of the German military quarters located there.

ROME — Guerilla warriors of the Balkan regions have penetrated Italian territory as far as Trieste, where they effected encounters with military troops and police.

BERNE — All the hospi- tals in Norway are filled with the thousands of wound- ed Germans brought from Ru- ssia. A large number of school buildings have also had to be conditioned as hos- pitals. The need of medicine and instruments is causing much difficulties.

ON THE SEVERAL BATTLE FRONTS

The Allied forces are reported to be pursuing their intensive counter of- fensive against the enemy troops commanded by Gen- eral Rommel who has been forced to retire the main body of his men and material over an apprecia- ble area while the R. A. F. are vigorously attacking their positions and commu- nicating systems.

Fighting of a most fu- rious and bloody nature is

said to be in progress in the valley of the Don where the Nazis are making a supreme effort to break through the Soviet defence lines for an advance east- ward.

The important German naval base at Wilhelmsh- aven was the object of a vio- lent raid by units of the RAF last Wednesday night 4,000 pounds of bombs were discharged causing ex- tensive destruction.

SORROW FOR THOSE WHO HAVE DIED

With his tyrannic hands and death dealing darts, a ruthless adversary has, within our very port, caused the loss of many lives and the destruction of valu- able property. The locali- ty where occurred the tra- gedy of the ill-fated "San Pablo", on the night of Thursday the 2nd. of the current month, will stand as a perpetual "Sprig of Cas- sia" to the memory of those who were so cruelly deprived of their earthly existen- ce.

The sorrow for the dead was evidenced throughout our city. Brave men and women rushed to the scene and offered to assist in the grim task of rescuing the remains of the victims. For- cogent reasons their serv- ices could not be utilized. At a later hour our gallant men of the volunteer Fire Brigade secured the neces- sary permission — and how they worked until their la- bours brought forth the mangled body of Antonio Mora, whose identification is said to have been ef- fected by means of the indel- ible imprint of his name on one of his arms. This con-

cluded the first day's ef- forts when the survivors of the other missing workers turned with aching hearts from the dismal precincts of the watery graves.

The work of rescue was resumed the following morn- ing — two more bodies floated — one was identi- fied as Clifford Powell, who le the other bore traces as that of Edwin Diamond. The appearance of pieces of hu- man flesh followed. Anot- her day's work was termi- nated. On Sunday, the re- mains of Thomas Evans floated.

day. Their efforts produced the body of Ernest Sinclair. On Tuesday, that of Miguel Mendez and on Wednesday that of Carlos Pearson were discovered.

Up to the time this is being written a total of seven bodies have been taken out.

The names of the dead are given as — David Banton, Gerald Brown, Alfred Colville, Leslie Clarke, Edwin Diamond, Thomas Evans, Augustus Holness, Albert Hay, Egbert Henry, Percival Heslop, Samuel Jones, Edwin Lewis, William Lapsley, Stanford Morris, Antonio Mora, Miguel Menendez, Alfonso Notice, Carlos Pearson, Clifford Powell, Jacob Robinson, Felix Sebe, Ernest Sinclair and Gonzalo Quesada. One member of the ship's crew was also killed.

The affliction brought about by the infamous act of a cruel enemy has thrown a dark cloud over the entire country and will long be remembered. The sadness spreads thicker, however, in the souls of those who have been deprived of their loved ones. May they gain some consolation from the thought that they will meet their lost ones in the Great Unknown. And may the souls of the departed ones find rest eternal.

We have since had the information, while at our Printers in San Jose, that two more bodies have been recovered from the bodegas of the San Pablo — one was identified as that of Felix Sebe, but the other was so decomposed as to be unrecognizable. These additional recoveries have increased the total to nine.

Unfortunately, as is generally the case when such manifestations take place, a large number of the more aggressively inclined, attacked the commercial and other business houses of a number of Germans, Italians and the Spaniards associated with the "Falangista" Movement, located in San Jose and Cartago. Such improper activities, of course, called for the active participation of the police authorities and many offending parties have been detained, while the matter receives the attention of the corresponding Courts of Justice.

**MEXICO STRIKES HER
FIRST WAR BLOW**

The Mexican Military High Command have announced the striking of the Republic's first blow against the Axis Powers, in her capacity as one of the Allied Nations.

Units of the Republic's air fleet is said to have detected a German submarine about three miles off the coast and that shortly after it had been attacked by bombing planes, a large quantity of oil appeared on the surface of the sea. This gave rise to the belief that the underwater craft had been fatally damaged.
