Fate of Capt. Scott Railway And his Party

Oamaru, N. Z., Feb. 10.— Captain Robert Scott and his party were overwhelmed by a blizzard on their return journey from the South Pole. The entire party perished. They reached the South Pole on the 18th of January 1912.

The news of the appalling disaster which befell Captain Scott and his companions was brought to this port by a signalled message from the "Terra Nova," the vessel which had carried the explorer and his expedition to the Antarctic, and which late last year went once again to the south to bring him and his companions back.

The total number of deaths involved in the calamity is not exactly known, but it is believed that 66 scientists and sailors lost their lives.

The date of Captain Scott's attainment of the South Pole, January 18th, 1912, shows that he reached the goal of his expedition almost exactly one month after Captain Roald Amundsen had been there. No details had come to hand this morning as to how the records of Captain Scott were found, but that he reached the Pole on the date mentioned, was known.

Opium Trade.

The authorities at Canton (says the "Gleaner") are seizing Chinese owned raw opium in transit, and are also enforcing the penal laws against possessors of the drug and dealers. The decision of the Indian Government to suspend auction sales of certified opium has not relieved the situation.

A message from Changsha says that the Tutu (Governor) ordered a woman who persisted in smoking opium to be shot. The execution took place recently in the presence of large crowds.

Improvements.

As one passes along the lines there is one thing that you must admire—the efforts being made by Mr. Mullins, to put his track in first class order. From La Junta to Herediana the old ties have been replaced and the roadbed beautifully ballasted. From Herediana to Parismina, new ties have been put in and the old small rail-changed, but not until you reach Parismina before you find the same ballasting being done, between there and Guacimo. Formerly had a train jumped the track in that Division and lives lost, the Manager ought certainly to have been arrested and held responsible for gross negligence for the manner in which that road was kept; but today one cannot but feel proud to see the efforts is making to have that line quite as secure as the Limon—San Jose route.

There is only one place that apparently his eyes have not caught, or rather those of his Roadmaster, and that is the Middle Bridge at Guacimo; the ties on that Bridge are so bad that they cannot bear the weight of pedestrians passing over, and we would not be surprised to hear at any time that some of those ties break through with persons walking over them. Of course we know that there is a project on foot for changing those bridges but which have been held in abeyance in consequence of the recent changes of the river, but considering that these bridges are the only means people have of getting to and from the Commissary as well as to their work; it might be well if the Roadmaster could recommend that these bridges be fixed, as they are very dangerous alike to foot and wheeled traffic.

Device to capsize Air Craft.

Paris, Feb. 4.—An apparatus has been devised which, if all that is claimed for it is substantiated, may have an important bearing on the aeroplane as an engine of war.

General Hirschauer, of the flying corps, has received a communication from the inventor of the apparatus, Dr. Cousin, a scientist, who has recently been experimenting on this device with Jules Vendrines the aviator. He informs General Hirschauer that the apparatus which is small and simple and can be carried in a soldier's knapsack, by provoking disturbances of the air will cause any type of aeroplane to capsize, even if it has ascended to a height of more than nine thousand feet.

Re Proclamation

Mr. Editor:—In view of the Proclamation that has been published by you as purporting to be from the Jamaica District of the Order of Good Samaritans, permit me space in your valuable Journal to state that as we look upon the good management of the Lodges as a means of educating our people to a better standard of Unity, I deplore the stand taken by Brs. Edwards and Walcott of the Jamaica District No. 20. The fact is that as Samaritans we have sworn Loyalty to the Executive of the order, and I as a member of one of the Lodges belonging to the Jamaica District No. 20, am simply shocked to hear the decision of the Order in the West, defying in open revolt the mandates of the Executive to which they have sworn Loyalty and have been teaching same to us the Juniors up to now. Is this the spirit of Christian meekness, gentleness, kindness and charity, which the order teaches? Let me ask the officers of No. 20, and the members in Central America who consent to revolt and separate from the Order what name will they assume when they start up their new workings, for surely they cannot be Samaritans. Where are they going to obtain new Dispensations and work for its evident that the order must recall their goods and chattels if they recede, they cannot honestly keep what belongs to some one else, and surely Good Samaritans do not retain and impart what is not legitimately theirs.

I for one will not sanction to any revolt, and I hope that the well governed, right thinking members of the Lodges will not accede to any illadvised actions of the Rulers, for Supremacy is only a fad to suit the whims and fancies of the men high up in power, at the expense of us lower down in the walks of life. Whether Jamaica or Central American District is my head, I am resolved to stand by my Obligation as a Samaritan and not to be carried away to suit the honours of a certain few, whom I am convinced cannot succeed.

Good Times

Happily for not only the poor labourers, but the merchants as well we learn that the Parismina Banana Coy. has resolved to plant 1000 hectares of bananas more, in the extensive plantations they are making in that locality.

The Railroad has also made arrangements to put in a spur from Parismina, going down through the farms of the above company and it is thought that this spur will connect with the Rio Peje Branch thus completing the belt from Parismina to Cairo. There is also to be a line running through Monte Verde towards the sea.

The U. F. Coy. will also put in 300 hectares of immune bananas at Guacimo, and in all the other farms they are cultivating the native bananas which are diseased by the Australians which are said to be immune from the disease.

This is a bit of good news for all concerned, for in consequence of the laying off labourers on all the farms for

Cricket.

An interesting game of cricket was played on the Sports Club ground on Sunday between the Mandadors and Timekeepers of the Banana River Division, and those of the Zent Division. This is the second game of the kind, the first try was in Zent, when the Banana River team won, this time the Zent team won by six wickets, the rubber now will test the teams.

We are glad to see the many old game taken up by these gentlemen, as it will naturally give an impetus to sport which as a healthy exercise is so very essential to us.

We hope the U. F. Coy. Mandadors will soon tackle the Lindo Mandadors, such would indeed be interesting as Lindo's men are pretty strong.

Misappropriation

In consequence of an article in this Journal some time ago, relative to the mismanagement of the Matina Board of Education, we observe that there is a suit in progress by the Junta de Educacion of Limon against Mr. Salgado of Matina for misappropriation of funds, in his capacity as Treasurer of that Branch; but Mr. Salgado proves that whatever moneys were paid out by him, were done so by duly authorized orders, signed by the then President of the Board. The case will soon be decided.

A resident of Limon stabbed In Jamaica.

It is learnt that Mr. Ramsay, one of the checkers of the U. F. Cox, who recently left here for Jamaica on a vacation, was stabbed by some person who left here recently after him, under peculiarities. Rumour has it that the perpetrator of the deed was sentenced to prison, but we cannot verify the statements, nor how the matter came about.

Promotion Merited.

We hasten to congratulate Mr. Percy Heron on his promotion as Overseer on Monte Verde Farm. He has been for some time working as Foreman on this farm. Mr. Stable was sent there as Overseer, and still Mr. Heron continued being virtually Overseer, but only getting the merits of Foreman. Mr. French Mullen has however seen the sterling qualities of the man and as soon as Mr. Stable left Mr. Heron has been put in charge.

We have known Mr. Heron for a number of years, holding responsible positions in the Isle of Springs and from our knowledge of him we know that he is not the man likely to allow the confidence of his employers to improve the size of his head.

The want of work commerce has been reduced to a state of dullness never before seen, but with the revival of work, people will be better able to pay their bills and a little life will be thrown in trade.

Church Notes.

His Lordship Bishop Farrar has been very busy during the past week in his ministerial functions. He performed the rites of Confirmation on Sunday, a week ago immediately on his arrival, at Estrada, on Thursday he did the same at Rio Hondo and on Sunday night last, he preached to an immense congregation at St. Mark's Church and laid hands on 31 candidates for confirmation being 12 male and 18 female candidate. He left by special coach for La Junta Germania, and Africa yesterday morning where he will perform similar rites, before going to San Jose.

It is seldom that such an audience has been seen in St. Mark's Church as that on Sunday night and the ceremony was indeed an impressive one, but unfortunately some of the people at the lower end of the church forgot that they were not at the Bull ring, but in the House of God, started jumping on the seats as soon as the first pair of candidates were presented which greatly marred the solemnity to those who had the misfortune of being placed in their companionship.

The Railway Coy. has done everything to accommodate the Bishop, they have placed a special Car at his disposal while he administers to the spiritual needs of the people here. This has always been one of the leading features of the Company. Ever since they started inducing labourers to emigrate to their different fields of labour, no one can condemn them for neglecting the spiritual needs of the people; probably one of the great reasons of her grand success.

C. Beckles, Pastor's Warden; Fred. Smith, Peoples Warden; H. Beckles, Sect., S. A. Binns, G. E. Robertson, R. Lester Hatton, Jno. Mitchell, Frank Francis, R. Sealy, C. Harold Smith, W. Watson, and Mr. Bryan, Verger.

Let us hope that this committee will see that the Church is at least coiled and made to appear fit for the worship of God, whereas at present the Rector's residence is more fit for him than the house of God is for His worship.

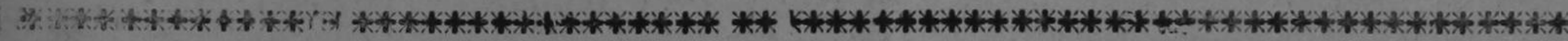

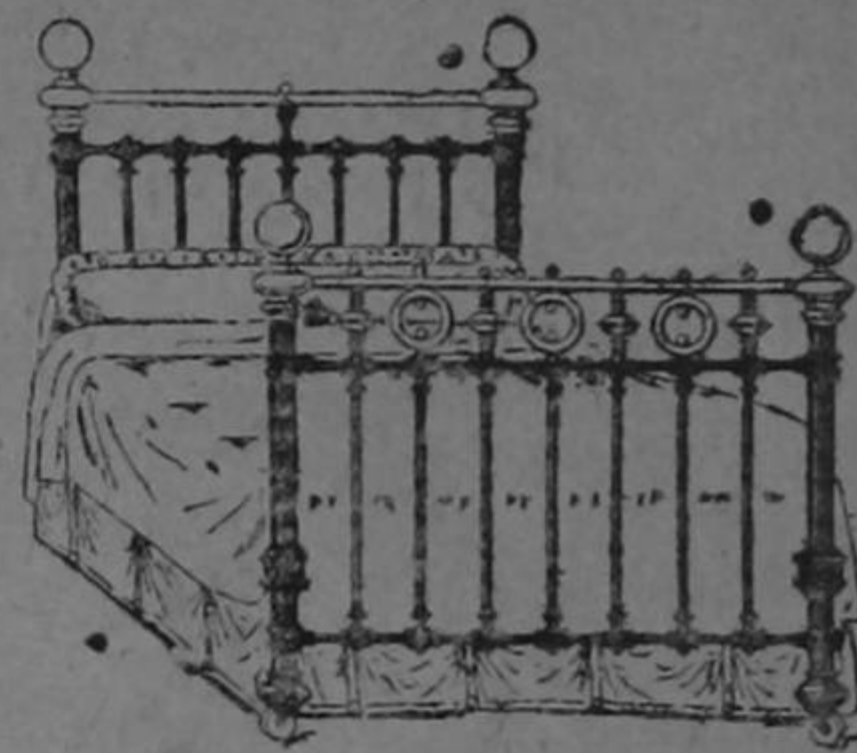
