## The Big Stick. Echoes of The Union

From "La Informacion" we see that the newspaper "Cuba" of Havana, published a very sensational article against Mr. Beaupré, the American Minister to Cuba and the Secretary of the Legation, Mr. Gibson.

The article says that many notes that have been presented to the Cuban Government by Mr. Beaupré, purporting to be from the American Government putting forward certain propositions and protesting to others, but which were got up by Mr. Beaupré himself with a view of its carrying greater weight. Moreover the article goes on, Mr. Beaupré has considerably augmented his personal deposits in two Banks in Havana besides sending away large sums of monies to his own country, which have accrued from certain abominable actions, in which it is supposed that Secretary Gibson was his accomplice.

Consequently Mr. Beaupré has made representations to his government, which has in turn denuded from the Cuban Government the punishment of the Editors and Proprietors of the paper.

The note to the Cuban Government says that if the Cuban Laws are insufficient to assure the protection of foreign diplomats; the United States will insist that quick means be found to protect them.

## Curanderos.

A Limon correspondent of one of the San Jose papers has been very hard on the "Curanderos" along the lines of the Atlantic Coast; but he does not designate whom he intends to include in the list of his curanderos. Surely he does not mean the Druggists along the lines, who hold Licenses to dispense drugs, and give relief to sufferers where a doctor is not to hand and in this respect the government is quite correct, because it costs hundreds of dollars to bring a doctor along the line to attend to those who suffer, and some times when they get to Limon, sometimes a doctor cannot be got handy; with Dr. Stegga' in San Jose Dr. Velasquez at the Hospital, Dr. Vasquez visiting a ship, Dr. Badilla busy, where is the poor patient, hence the Druggists along the lines are indispensable, and to prove to that correspondent that their services are appreciated, we find the medical faculty, calling upon the authorities to prevent the sale of patent medicines by persons who are not licensed to sell them.

Today we find Chemmen and other liquor establishments selling medicines for which the drug stores have to pay a license.

We hope however according to the latest resolution of the Medical faculty, to see a stop put to this so that our Drug Stores will sell medicines of any kind.

This is to notify all financial members of the Defunct Artisans and Labourers Union:

Be it known that it was decided by the Civil Judge of Limon on the 9th day of December 1912 that the Society of Artisans and Labourers, was, and is the Artisans and Labourers Union of Costa Rica, and that the amount of 2,000 colones that was deposited in the Commercial Bank of Costa Rica, be liquidated.

The decision of the courts is to be duly published for three months in succession, the first publication having appeared in the Gazette of the 6th of January 1913.

At a recent meeting held before the Court on Wednesday February 26th 1913, for the appointment of a Liquidator, Don Ricardo Mora Fernandez, The Municipal Treasurer, was unanimously appointed to fill the position.

Further notification is hereby given that members who were not more than three months in arrears, when the Society became defunct in December 1912, to submit firstly their cards to the Secretary to be recognized, and endorsed with a private mark before approaching the Liquidator. No Card is considered valid or worthy of payment without this mark and signature of the Secretary, as the result of the raid that was made on the goods and chattles of the Society by members at the Limon crossing on March 7th 1911, when volumes of cards were seized and taken away.

Further notification is hereby given to the Public. Whoever having any claims against the Society, to furnish the Secretary a copy as well as the Liquidator, as it is only such claims that can be specified by him or the Legal Representative Mr. J. E. Davis, that will be sanctioned and endorsed.

Further notification is hereby given to the individuals who seized the goods and chattles of the Society at the Limon Crossing on March 7th 1911 which are as follows:—One Desk valued at \$60, 8 Chairs at \$4 each, 7 Benches at \$4 each, 1 Type-writer at \$100, 1 Sign Board \$2, 1 Ice Cream Bucket \$20, one small Desk \$4, 3 Flags at \$1 each, one Charity Box \$150, 1 Feather Duster \$1.50, 1 Inkstand \$1.50, 1 File of Letters, 1 Box Pen Nibs \$1.50, 3 New Receipt Books 75 cents each, 1 Letter Receiver with important Letters, 1 Official Diary, Cash Book of Commissary, Stock Book of Commissary, two Electric Bulbs and Globes, 2 Black-board, \$2 each, 1 Book of Funeral Taxation, 100 New Cards, 200 enrolled Cards, etc. etc.

All claims, cards and indebtedness must be tendered in to the Secretary and Liquidator not later than April 7th 1913 after which date all claims ceases, and action will be taken to bring in that which is indebted to the Society.

## Merchant closed Affairs of the Union.

The firm of Desporte & Coy. has been thrown into liquidation at the request of Mr Joe Desporte himself.

His assets and liabilities have been handed in by him to his creditors, the majority of whom appointed Mr. Chas. Broedy, receiver, pending the approval of the Manager of the Commercial Bank, who is the largest creditor with 896 colones for acceptances for goods received from Europe.

The balance of creditors are comparatively speaking, poor men, who have either loaned him cash or given security for amounts of moneys.

Mr. Mallick, one of the creditors refused to enter into liquidation on the ground that his credit had a fraudulent appearance, inasmuch as Mr Desporte only applied for that credit a week previous, when he must fall well have known the straightened condition of his business. He therefore embargoed on the premises for his amount of 54 colones.

## Railway Robbery.

The unfortunate man William Uriah Mullings, who was condemned with regard to the robbery of Railroad material an account of which Walker and several others had to quit the country by night, was sent to San Lucas on Thursday last having got a sentence of 2 year 3 months, 19 days and 16 hours after being in jail for about a year and a half.

It is understood that the Coy. is to press the matter of the Bonds for those that have gone away.

## To Members of the Defunct Union

Notice is hereby given by Don Ricardo Mora F. Official Liquidator, to all Agents, Representatives and Claimants of the defunct Labourers and Artisans Union of Limon, that there will be a meeting on Saturday the 8th inst. at 7 p. m. at his office, at which they are asked to be present to discuss the matters of the payments of the bills being presented, the classification of cards, financial or otherwise, the balance in the hands of Mr. Davis of the 3000 colones for which the Commissary was sold and other matters.

This is the last meeting at which any opinion can be expressed.

## Candy Banana Co.

The "Noticiero" speaks of the first meeting of the Candy Banana Society to be held on 3rd March, among the Share holders of the Coy. On the list we see the most influential men of the country—from the President down.

The objects of this Society is for preserving the banana and it seem to be a powerful organization.

It however, has nothing to do with the Banana Fig Factory of Limon, which is progressing rapidly and which Mr. Jim Gore the Manager, hopes to start operations in about two weeks. We therefore will have two factories for preserving bananas.

There seem to be a peculiar phase of the Union affairs there are wranglings among the members. It appears that the chief bone of contention among them is the 3000 colones which were handed to Mr. Charles Bryant as Secretary who said he in turn handed same to Mr. Davis the Treasurer, but it is asserted now that this amount has been paid out by them and among themselves, for services and salaries, as Secretary and Treasurer for two years past whereas the members distinctly resolved since March 1917 to abolish the office and stow away the furniture in a room to be rented from Mr. Davis.

Mr. Bryant now says that this amount is exhausted between himself and Davis for salaries because he was appointed by the courts as Secretary.

Now this seem foolish because the Courts cannot appoint anyone as the officer of a society without the members consent.

Mr. Davis was appointed on the 13th November as Legal Representative by the members to attend to any call of the Courts, which must be paid for by valuation of the Liquidator but no one appointed Mr. Bryant to do any business for the Union. Why should he be posing now for a job as Secty. to supervise the cards and accounts? Why not hand in the books to the Liquidator, who will find out by the books what cards are registered in in books from what are not and if any information is needed, why not get such from the Representative appointed? why pay two men.

There is no necessity for taking these cards to the Secretary because the Union had no laws registered, therefore there is no consideration as to who is financial or who is not, for all the members became non-financial, (the Secretary included) in consequence of the rascality of the officers, due to which the Union was closed down, how now can he talk of financial cards, and what right has Mr. Bryant got to supercede the duties of the Liquidator.

Mr. Bryant claims that the lawyer Mr. Mora put him in office, hence he must claim from Mr. Mora his dues for assisting to clear the entanglement. Of course if he has rendered services under Mr. Mora's orders, by all means Mr Mora will say what he thinks just to be paid to him, but we do not believe that Mr. Mora would think it just to pay him 24 months salary at 90 colones meantime he has not been employed on an average 3 days monthly.

However, Don Ricardo, the Liquidator has called a meeting on Saturday night next, to discuss these points.

Is it possible that in the centre of the town, such a breach of the City Regulations can be tolerated in so glaring a manner without using every effort to bring the guilty party to justice? Did the Police allow anyone to leave the premises without searching them, and if the search was fruitless why not hold the party in charge of the Club responsible for the occurrence for he must know from whence the shot came this is what would have occurred had it been the establishment of a poor man. It is a great outrage on the community and an insult to the authorities.

We feel sure if such a misdemeanor had occurred among the poorer class of people that they would have been chased to earth and the law would have had its full course.

We hope therefore our energetic Commandants along with the Agent of Police will do everything to satisfy the public who are watching the proceedings and not allow a few men to ridicule the community in this way.

## Missfortune well Earned.

There was a wreck down Bananita on Saturday evening when Mr. Crowley refused to take home the men on the work train, who work on the construction there.

The Engineer had orders to back in on the siding drop off the car laden with men who were trying to get home to their families at the week end and run past at such a rate that the men could not get on. This was done and in running out the rails which were not laid to withstand that speed spread out and the engine turned heel up in the ditch, surely some one ought to be punished for this.

Mr. Chittenden blames us when men do not go to Bananita, but if the officials are so spiteful to the labourers how do they expect men to be willing to go there and spend Sunday when there are no camps and they are not permitted to come on the work train.

## Smaritan's scandal

On Saturday night the Lodge at the corner of 5th Avenue and 7th Street, was the scene of the greatest scandal possible. A man named Pusy, as Secretary, got drunk and behaved himself most indecently, and at the end carried off what liquors were provided for the refreshments after an initiation at the St. Stephens Lodge.

Other members also came out on the street and used the most filthy language much to the annoyance of the residents around.

There was an awful melee some hunting down Pusy for the banquet whilst others abused each other on the street in front of the Lodge.

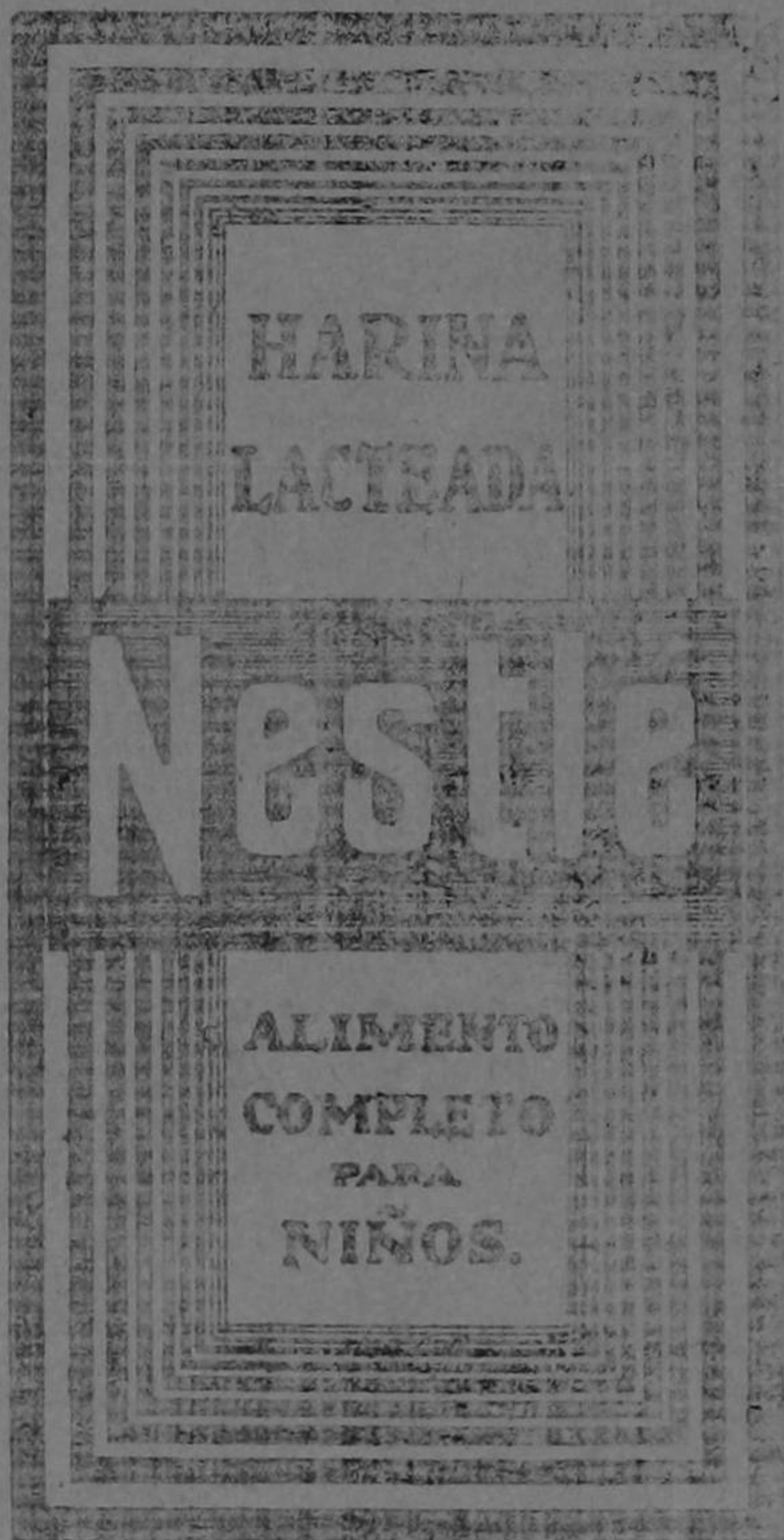

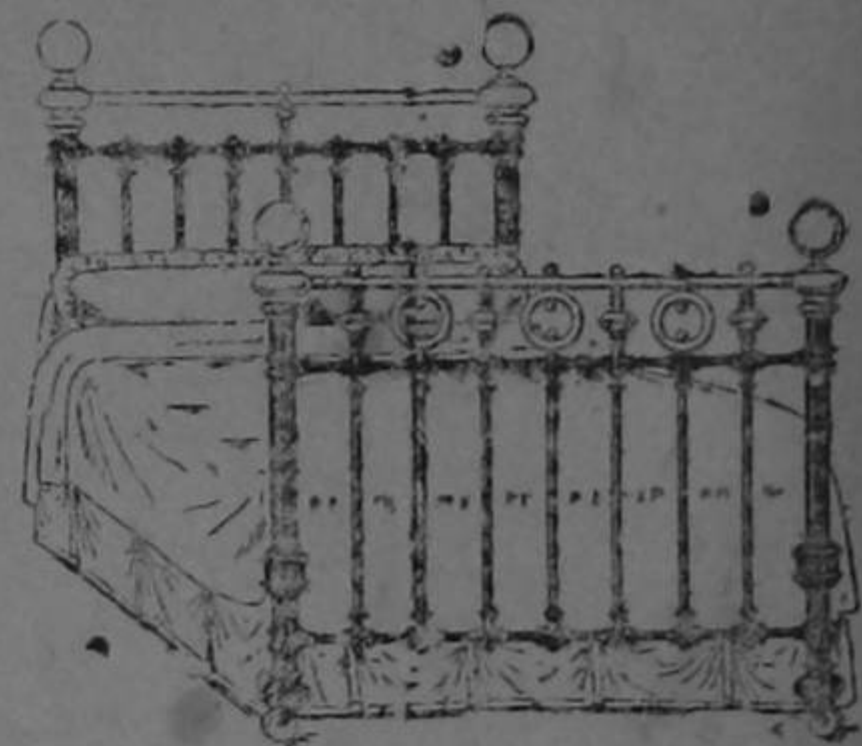
