Big Banana Suit.

Philadelphia, Feb. 19.—Upon agreement of counsel in the case of Bluefields Steamship Coy. against the United Fruit Coy., the trial of the suit was postponed this morning until the January, 1914 term of the United States District Court.

Australian Fleet.

London, Feb. 22.—The Commonwealth Government of Australia, which has been working in entire agreement with the British Admiralty in the selection of an Admiral for the Australian fleet, has accepted the Admiralty's nominee. The rear-Admiral nominated is said to be one of the most promising British Officers.

Naval Power.

New York, Feb. 24.—A London cable says: "Naval developments of a remarkable nature are taking place under a cloak of great secrecy. In the course of the next twelve months," says the "Daily Express," "some astonishing details will become known regarding changes in warship types, but none will be more noteworthy than the development of the submarine. An entirely new type of under water craft of considerable offensive power and capable of crossing the Atlantic at a high rate of speed, is being built for the British Navy. These crafts will carry guns, but in addition they will be able to fire eight torpedoes. In the meantime there are plans before the Admiralty for a flotilla of above water craft of a speed of forty knots and carrying several heavy quick-firing guns specially mounted for use against aircraft."

New Machine Gun

London Feb. 11.—Announcement was made in the house of Commons this afternoon that the British Government has purchased the invention and rights of a new machine gun of terrible death dealing capacity. The new guns will be issued to the army at once.

Condemned To Death

San Salvador, Feb. 16.—Three of the assassins arrested as the slayers of Dr. Manuel L. Amador, the late President, were shot at eight o'clock this morning, having been condemned at a brief court martial yesterday. They were Virgilio Mulatillo, Fabian Graciano and Fermín Perez. Two other men, Prudencio Alfaro and José María Melgar, were condemned to death also.

Cables.

Berlin.—On the 7th inst., the Prussian loan of \$187,000,000 will be issued.

Rome.—The government will ask for a credit of two millions and a quarter dollars to construct air ships.

London.—Sir William White the famous naval constructor died almost suddenly.

London.—Turkey has placed in the hands of the Powers her desire to make peace.

Washington.—All arrangements with Colombia were closed, because she rejected the American propositions of a ten million indemnity.

Havana.—Ex-President Madero's father and his Uncle Ernesto, declare that the American Ambassador was in a great measure responsible for the assassination of Madero.

London.—In Peking and Tokio reigns great anxiety for the military activity of Russia in Mongolia.

Dr. Calvin Smith, once physician to the late Queen Victoria, died. Rey Bajet, is also dead.

Washington.—Taft held his last Cabinet meeting. He will return the law relative to the construction of warships to the Cámara.

Wilson will oppose any distinction as to the use of the Canal in favour of the coastwise law of the U. S. Government.

Panama.—Messrs. Kouke and Faulkner of the lands Commission were presented to President Porras by the American Minister Dodge and afterwards to the Minister of Foreign Affairs Mr. Lefevre, and other prominent Panamenians. The President's Office in the National Palace was put at their disposal for their conferences.

Castro Free.

New York, Feb. 17.—Cipriano Castro, ex-president of Venezuela, was today granted unrestricted freedom in the United States by a ruling of federal court.

Judge Ward, in a decision handed down today, overruled the decision of Secretary of Commerce and Labor Nagel, which precluded Castro from entering the United States. This decision sustained the writ of habeas corpus granted to Castro recently under which he obtained the full privileges allowed to every foreigner visitor.

Warship Yards.

Montreal, Feb. 12. The Montreal "Star" understands that the representatives of prominent British ship building firms who are now here are making arrangements in anticipation of a permanent Canadian naval policy involving the establishment of yards for the building of warships in Canada. It is believed to be unlikely that Premier Borden will make an appeal to the country for the initiation of a permanent policy until everything is in readiness to put it into immediate effect.

Panama, Feb. 25.—The treasure hunting party led by Miss Genevive Davis, an English woman, which has been searching in Cocos Island for some hidden valuables for some months, arrived here on Sunday on board the steamship Melmore with a store of experience, but without any treasure. The party left Plymouth, England, in September last for Cocos Island, which lies about 500 miles South-west of Panama in the Pacific Ocean, with the object of recovering jewels and treasure valued at \$100,000,000.

Pres. Wilson's Reception.

By cables of the 3rd, we find that 600 students from the University of Princetown assisted as a Guard of Honour to President Wilson, they paid a special train, 1000 other students were at the station along with the populace, and gave him a grand send off. Mr. Wilson was very much impressed.

He was met in Washington by an unprecedented crowd, there were over half a million "wood men" who gave a review and parade. Next day there were expected special trains from all parts.

From latest advices, the following form his cabinet, Minister of State, Bryan, Minister of the Treasury, Meadaw; Minister of War, Grant; of Marine Daniels of North Carolina, Attorney General, Reynolds of Tennessee; Postmaster General Barnecon of Texas; Minister of Agriculture, Waters of Kansas; of Commerce Redfield; of Public works, Wilson of Pennsylvania; Minister of State for Home Affairs, Lane of California.

To claim Fortune.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 13.—Lieutenant Charles Raymond Slingsby, retired, of England and his wife are coming to San Francisco to wage a legal fight to prove the legitimacy of their baby son, heir to the \$1,000,000 Slingsby estate in England. Word to this effect was received today by District Attorney Fickert in a cablegram from Lieutenant Slingsby in England.

The cablegram reads as follows: "We are detained here settling the estate of my father. We will leave in March for San Francisco and will take all necessary steps to protect our son and his name."

DISCONTENT IN BANANITO.

On hearing so much discontent on Saturday night last due to the apparent intentional wreck of the work train, a representative of this journal was sent to Bananito to see what was going on in that vicinity where hundreds of men are engaged in daily toil.

Hundreds of complaints were thrown in on account of Saturday's misfortune, but the people who seem to suffer most and naturally have most to complain about, are the farmers, they assert that Mr. Crowley will not allow them to travel by the work train on Saturdays to Limon and return on Monday mornings to Bananito, even though the train comes in and out at those times without any extra expense to the Company, and particularly as they assert that they are the principal factors that bring a Railroad in the Bananito Division. They complain, and with apparent very good reasons, that meanwhile there are no proper camping accommodations in the forest of Bananito, but rather ranche which for the most part are open all around and not constructed with any attempt of considerations of sanitary ideas, it is unfair to expect them to work there all the week and see the chances of coming into Limon on Saturday evening to see their families and return on Monday morning and not be permitted to do so; whereas the means of transportation practically belong to the same Company. They are annoyed that the Mandadors and Time-keepers are provided with palaces beautifully done and wired in from the lower step to the verandahs upstairs with wire meshing looking like a huge cage made to secure or entrap wild animals, meanwhile the labourers who do the actual work to secure the jobs of these, are left in hovels with swamps and mud holes all around them, at the mercy not only of mosquitoes (because they may be immune) but of wild beasts, and on Saturday not afforded the means of getting a change away from all the malarial traps.

We feel that Mr. Veitch and Mr. Chittenden should intervene and see that Mr. Crowley permits these men to travel in and out on the Coy's. business for in the first instance they know that the more recreation and change of residences that their men can get, the better will their men keep health, in the second place, the greater pleasure will their men have in performing their duties, thus creating a mutually good understanding between employer and employee; but the trouble is that the cure lies in the hands of the labourers themselves. Why not make proper representation to the gentlemen above referred to, in an intelligent and decisive manner, and we are sure they would protect their labourers against the insults of the Railway Officials. Knowing them both as we do, we are certain they would help them in seeing them brought home and taken out, sufficient the Company loses nothing by the deal.

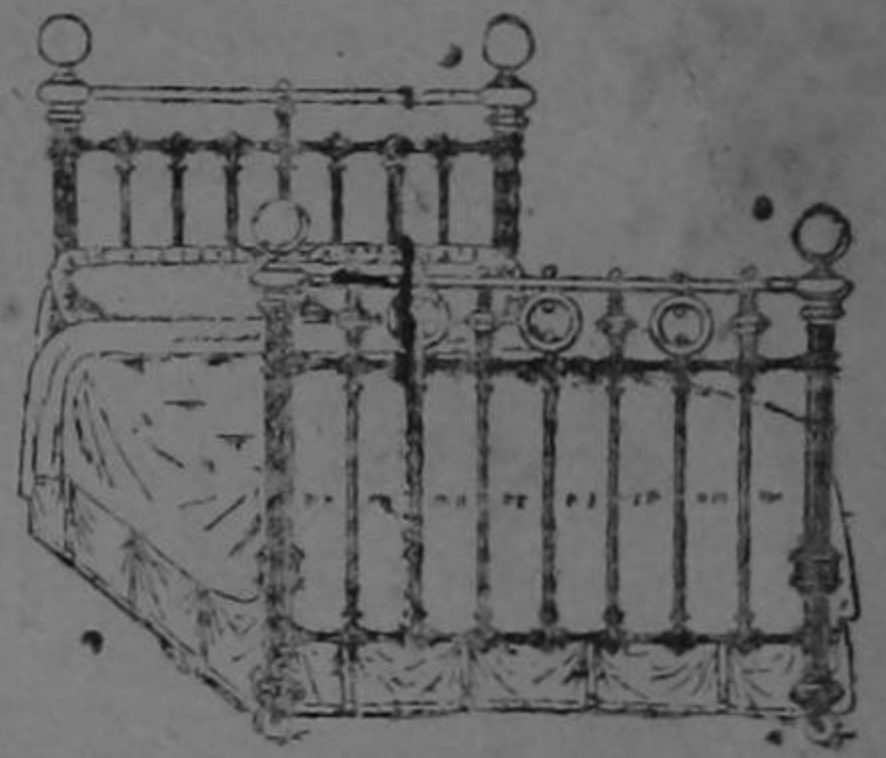
