Sir:

In your issue of Saturday, 21st. June you made a false statement re. ice in connection with the business of which I am Manager here. Enclosed please find letter from many prominent persons, desproving this. Please let me know of one instance *on any day* in the hours of dispatch when any one has been told at the factory that we were out of ice. When there was interruption on the railroad some time ago and we did not know when trains would pass through, we refused for part of a day to give ice to resellers, fearing that they might abuse the public by raising the price, so we kept what we had, to retail to the public that they might not be imposed upon, and to control the price and keep it at its usual retail rate; even though the train had not been able to come through for two days, we could have given the public ice. Please come to the right place before publishing statements, calculated to damage this enterprise and mislead the public.

Earthquake

International Polo

EDITORIAL

OUR DEMORALIZATION

By the San José papers we find that there has been a Bill introduced by the Fernández party to amend the Liquor law in so far as the opening of Liquor establishments are concerned on Holidays and Sundays. We will say nothing against the opening on Holidays, but to imagine that a body of gentlemen claiming to be the leaders of the people legally, educationally and morally would attempt to amend a law so as permit the opening of Liquor establishments on Sundays and particularly at midday just while Divine Service is being held is beyond the conception of any sane man.

In all countries that claim any semblance toward civilization everything is done to respect and dignify the Sabbath day, hence by this act on the part of the law makers of Costa Rica, we seem to be going backward rather than forward as far as civilization is concerned.

Going ahead as we are in every thing that tends towards the onward march in the progress of Civilization, enlightenment and prosperity, if the other candidates for election were to use this move against the party advocating such demoralization among the sons of the country, we feel sure it must operate seriously against them because if there is anything that tends to the elevation of the rising generation it is the moral effects that may be imbedded on their minds and character by the Christianizing influence thrown in

their lives by the Church, and surely by opening Rum shops and saloons on Sundays until 12 o'clock cannot tend to anything elevating.

We hope this hint will be taken in time so as to avoid the bringing into law an action that must prove disastrous not alone to the fathers and mothers of our homes but to the children who must naturally grow up to lose the honour and respect for the day as well as to imbibe the uses and influences of these spirituous liquors the degrading results of which we see around as every day.

While on this subject of our demoralization we would like to bring forcibly to the minds of our Police officers the need of a stricter surveillance with regard to the increasing frequency in the use of filthy and degrading language particularly in English along the streets. The Police seem to take no notice of it even in their own language, and as for English it is getting barbarous, we would therefore beg our Commandant who is always ready to do everything that will help towards the uplifting of our people, to engage a few English speaking Policemen to assist in putting down this hideous misdemeanour, it is getting a menace to our ladies and children and while it is not allowed in any other country, even Colon that used to be so bad, we do not hear any more of this language along the Streets why should we tolerate it on the Streets of Port Limon.

A RATE WAR ON SHIPPING

There is the possibility of a split among the leaders of the shipping combines in Jamaica. From what can be gleaned the United Fruit Coy. is about separating herself from the former understanding by which the rates of freight carried by the steamers trading to the Island were controlled by these Companies.

This will naturally leave her free to place her own rates on such freight received, which may soon bring about a cut in prices to see who can command the greater amount of business, which cannot but be beneficial to the Merchants importing as well as to the consumer.

The Merchants have for a long time been trying to devise some means to induce the owners to reduce the high cost of freight at present prevailing but instead of a reduction, every effort has been met with a rise. Now if this move comes about, it will be a great Salvation to the Country, we thought there was something significant in the visit to Limon a week ago of the freight and passenger Agents of that Coy.

The sentence on Jack Johnson has been postponed indefinitely in consequence of the absence from Chicago of the Assistant Attorney General of the United States, Mr. Harry A. Parkin.

Jack has been found guilty on seven counts, on either of which there is a penalty of 5 years imprisonment with \$10,000 fine.

Simpson introducing a Bill before the Legislature to amend the "Shop assistants Law" which would certainly affect the recreation of the labouring classes Mr. Simpson has always championed the cause of these people and its strange now that he has changed to suit the merchants, we are pleased however that the governor has turned down the attempt.

THE WOMEN GAINING

The State of Illinois has granted the franchise to women on Municipal makers by a vote of 83 to 58, needless to say the rejoicing created among the fairer sex by the passing of this bill. The Parliament of Norway has unanimously passed a Bill enfranchising all women.

THE JAMAICA CHOIR

By the Gleaner we find that the Lord Mayor of Liverpool has made all arrangement for the Jamaica Choir to be present at the unveiling of the Statue of Sir Alfred Jones on July 5th, and to sing before the King and Queen on July 11th.

Several other performances have been arranged for. The members who will take part are Mrs. McDermot-Tavare, Miss Blackburn, Miss Welsh, Miss Gordon and Messrs. Packed Ramsay and Drysdale with Mr. Ellis Jackson the Director unfortunately Mr. Jackson could not get a passage on any of the boats leaving Jamaica last week as every passage was already booked it is feared therefore that they will be late for the ceremony and as Sir Alfred Jones did so much to bring that troupe into notoriety it would indeed be a great pity should Mr. Jackson and his Singers be absent.

The S. S. "Imperator" the biggest ship afloat, arrived safely in New York, from her maiden trip, during which she maintained a speed of 22 knots per hour, she is so high that a portion of the Roofing of the Pier had to be taken down to admit her alongside.

Bubonic Plague has broken out in Jacmel Haiti several cases are reported at that place, a strict quarantine movement has therefore been instituted by the Jamaica authorities against that Port.

The Jamaica Railway authorities are pushing ahead with the Construction of the No. 3 Pier, this is to be a mighty structure of double decks. The United Fruit Coy. are watching narrowly the progress of the work as they are anxious to make a profitable lease with the government. There is another Company willing to enter into a lease for the Pier, but it depends on the one giving better facilities. The U. F. Coy. is said to have bought extensive holdings in the extreme West End with the idea of building a Pier there, but the fact of the improbability of getting a connection with the Jamaica Government Railway lines has delayed any move in that direction, and creates the necessity of leasing the new Pier from the government.

Craganour the winner of the Derby, who however lost the race in consequence of unfair riding by the Jockey was sold to the Argentine government for 150,000 dollars, being \$50,000 less than the price paid for White Knight.

Montegonians are much elated over the activity of the U. F. Coy. in and around that town. Engineers are hard at work surveying the roadway for connecting the two immense new plantations of that Coy. Mocho and garland with Catadupa Station on these estates there have recently been planted more than 2,000 acres of bananas and still planting so as to be able to ship within 15 or 18 months hence between fifty to sixty thousand stems the Railway connections will cost about £25,000 with this amt of ruit to handle it is now expected that the Coy. mut also build a Pier, which will give employment to hundreds of labourers.

The Coy. also does a very extensive lumber business in that town having by far the largest lumber shed in the Island. Mr. Charles Ward Barrister at law, son of our Hon. Custos and great benefactor of the city and Parish of Kingston arrived in Kingston last week, and will take up practise in the legal profession in his native land. His future is already laid.

The Gatun Locks are declared completed, water has been turned on by way of trial and given great satisfaction. Col. Goethals has reported that the waters of the Atlantic can be turned on at any time now, and that by the 1st. Jany. 1915 anything that floats can pass through the great ditch.

The Culebra cut is however causing him great anxiety as the Engineers have not yet designed a plan to stop this continual sliding. The recent slides in the Cucaracha cut exceed all the excavations that have been made there for the past month.

Queen Victoria of Spain gave birth to another son on Friday last.

The arrival of the S. S. "Lusitania" in New York harbour with guns aboard, according to recent orders from the Admiralty caused consternation in New York from the fact that its about a century now that merchant ships have not arrived there under guns.

The Masonic Lodge was illuminated and a banquet was given in honour; we had hoped to have seen a great mustering of the Knights of St. John.

A cricket match was played on the Plaza football on Tuesday last between Mr. Harts team and a team from the Pier captained by Mr. A. Stewart. The Dock team won easily. It will be repeated on Tuesday next.

DANCE IN SCHOOLROOM

The St. Marks schoolroom seem to have dropped a few points, in the estimation of Cruch folks, by the actions of the Rector, who let out the schoolroom to the organist for the purpose of having a dance in it.
