## The Russians Have Retaken Czernowitz.

Rumours are current that they have also occupied Sadogora and Marshala.

ROME, December 2nd 1915.

The "Corriere di Italia" reports from Bucharest that the Russians have retaken Czernowitz. It is also reported that they have occupied Sadogora and Marshala, although this report has not yet been officially confirmed.

## King George Pays a Visit to Queen Alexandra.

Three Cambridge students awarded the Victoria Cross and numerous others awarded medals for distinguished conduct.

LONDON, 1st. — The Post reports from Athens that one of the Gounaris newspapers "Neon Asty", publishes a statement from diplomatic sources, stating that the Austro-Germans are preparing to warn Greece that should she yield to the Entente's demands and should the Allies make out of Salonika their base of operations the Austro-Germans will pay no heed to Greek territorial rights. The Standard reports from Athens, that the Serbians who have taken refuge in Albania, are estimated to number 250 thousand between civilians and combatants. It is reported that the Serbian armies still hold all their mountain batteries and some of their field guns. A large number of Serbian lads, between the ages of 15 and 17, have joined the army where they will be trained and instructed to replace casualties in the ranks. The Daily Mail reports from Bucharest that the Bulgarian

authorities at Rustchek are making preparations for the arrival of 50 thousands Austro-German troops to prevent the large number of desertions and in order that when the Russians arrive to the outskirts of Rustchek this place will already be occupied by the Austrians. Tennant, upon answering a question asked in the House of Commons, stated that approximately 33 thousands British prisoners were in Germany. McKenna, in answering another question in the House of Commons said that Ernest Casel, who upon several occasions had been charged with being of German origin, subscribed five million dollars to the Anglo-French loan. Reuter's New Agency reports that Baron Cederstron declares that the manufacture of German aeroplanes is undergoing a great evolution by changing the models to a much lighter type, capable of carrying heavy loads

including guns, wireless plants, oil pumps and arsenal apparatus. He describes one of these machines while making a flight, by saying that it is a giant armoured biplane, three times as large as any of the common type and powerful in its speed, stability, armour, heavy artillery and numerous crew it carries. The King, for the first time since his accident, left the Palace to call on his mother, Queen Alexandra, to congratulate her on the occasion of her birthday. The last list published by the University of Cambridge of its students who are fighting at the front makes this number 11 thousand of which 416 have been killed in battle, 900 have been wounded and 123 have been made prisoners. Three have been awarded the Victoria Cross while others have been awarded medals for their distinguished conduct.

## GERMANY CLAIMS NO SUBMARINES HAVE BEEN "FISHED".

Kaiser congratulates German Premier on his birthday and praises his capabilities

BERLIN 1st. — (By way Sayville). The Overseas Agency considers absurd fiction, the recently published reports that three submarines had been caught in nets opposite the Horney Islands and that their crews had been captured.

The Kaiser sent the Chancellor the following message: "I sincerely congratulate you my dear Bethmann, on the day of your birthday which regretfully you are forced to celebrate for the second time in the midst of this great war. At such grave moments as the present you have been the faithful and true column of my Empire. Our triumphs, which are envied by our enemies, deserve my most sincere congratulations. I trust that Providence will bestow upon us greater successes, for the benefit of the Empire and the glory of your family. These are the sincere wishes of your grateful Emperor."

## German Railroads and Telegraphs in Russia

IT IS BELIEVED THE GERMANS INTEND TO MAKE RIGA AND DVINSK A BASE FOR THEIR CONTEMPLATED ADVANCE ON PETROGRAD.

PARIS, 1st. — Correspondence has been received from Petrograd describing the German railroad and telegraph systems connecting General von Hindenburg's forces on the fronts of Riga and Dvinsk. The same correspondence adds that this wonderful organization has been carried to the front and among them huge pieces of steel which have been handled like toys, and set up immediately. A railroad net extends along the whole front. They have also built three trunk lines from Eastern Prussia as far as Riga and Dvinsk which are constantly kept in public service as well as interurban electric roads which have been built from town to town. The same efficiency is noticed in the telegraph service. The conclusion drawn from all these improvements, which the Germans have made in this section, is that they intend to make out of Riga and Dvinsk the base of operations for the contemplated advance on Petrograd.

## The German Claim

Several Successes TWO ALLIES AEROPLANES SHOT DOWN AND THEIR OCCUPANTS MADE PRISONERS.

BERLIN, 1st. — An official report reads as follows: "In the La Basse, our troops have carried out extensive mine operations which caused considerable damage on the British positions. A British and a French aeroplane were shot down and their occupants were made prisoners. In the eastern theatre there is night to report.

In the Balkans several successful engagements took place. The men composing the enemy's rear-guard have been made prisoners. The Bulgarians captured fifteen thousand Serbians, many guns and a large amount of war material."

## Leading German

Newspaper in favor of Peace Discussions. THE "VORWAERTS" CLAIMS THAT THE GOVERNMENT FOR ITS OWN BENEFIT OUGHT TO ABSTAIN FROM INTERFERING IN THE DEBATES.

COPENHAGUEN, 1st.—The last editions of the "Vorwaerts" which arrived here, published new articles demanding and urging that the Reichstag be allowed to discuss conditions of peace. It further adds that this is the only place at which the people can be kept posted and that for its own benefit, the Government ought to abstain from interfering in the debates.

INVESTIGATION TO BE MADE. AMBASSADOR PAGE INSTRUCTED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION ON THE SEIZURE OF TWO AMERICAN STEAMERS BY BRITISH PRIZE COURT.

WASHINGTON, 1st. — Secretary Lansing has instructed Ambassador Page to investigate if two of the steamers of the American-Transatlantic Co., which were seized while flying the American flag, will be requisitioned by the Prize Court and that in such case the Embassy must protest.

## Another British Steamer Sunk.

CAPTAIN AND TWENTY-FIVE OF THE CREW ARE SAVED WHILE FIVE ARE STILL MISSING.

LONDON, 1st.—The steamer Kingsway was sunk. Its captain and 25 of the crew have landed. Five men are missing.

## Strained Relations Between Britain and Argentine.

Seizure by Great Britain of the Argentine steamer "President Mitre" brings about serious complications

BUENOS AYRES, 1st. — An editorial published in "La Prensa" sternly condemns the seizure of the steamer "President Mitre." This note says: "The blockade on the river Plate is effective as if such were a zone of war. It is more than a peaceful blockade as has been imposed on Greece to exert moral pressure. Great Britain ought to respect our sovereignty with all its tributes and results or bring about a rupture of diplomatic relations which would have irreparable consequences on British capital invested in our country." It further adds that Great Britain has no interest in provoking Argentine much more so at present when she is incapable and will be for many years to come, to send over a thousand ships with a million men to put a stop to local commerce which is carried on with half a dozen vessels, or to interrupt tra-

de with the United States which also would give rise to complications with the Washington Government." The same note urges the Government to notify Great Britain that the river Plate flows as far as capes Saint Mary and San Antonio and that therefore no British ships can be allowed to remain there. Other newspapers decidedly urge the Government to adopt a vigorous attitude. Deputy Ceballos, a member of the Court of Peace at the Hague, introduced a Bill asking for an interpellation in reference to the seizure of the "President Mitre" and inviting Minister Murature to appear on Monday next before the Chamber to explain the policy which the Government intends to adopt. The Bill was unanimously passed.

## VIOLENT CANNONADE ALONG THE FRESE VALLEY SECTOR.

At the Dardanelles extraordinary mine operations were conducted by both sides on the 27th and 28th.

PARIS, 1st. — An official report says the following: "Nothing worth mentioning happened last night, outside of violent cannonading kept up by our artillery along the Frese valley sector, on the river Somme. This cannonading was followed by the explosion of a German mine which caused no damage.

In the district of Artois yesterday, one of our aeroplanes attacked two German machines behind the German lines. One of them was forced to descend and the other one was put to flight and pursued as far as Toul.

Calm has prevailed on the Serbian front with the exception of mild artillery duels which have taken place at different points. The extreme cold hampers operations.

At the Dardanelles the 27th and 28th were marked by extraordinary mine operations which were conducted by both belligerents. The explosion of a mine by the French demolished a Turkish observation post and the soldiers of one of our galleries, having opened their way to one of the Turkish retreats, charged against them while the sappers with hand grenades forced the Turks to retire.

## THE SURRENDER OF MONASTIR.

The city will not be occupied by the Bulgarian army until the Germans arrive.

LONDON, 1st. — Reports from Athens state that Monastir was evacuated and that the Bulgarians will delay their entry into the city until the Germans arrive. This fact strengthens the rumors that the Germans had forbidden the Bulgarians to seize the place in their absence.

The Daily Telegraph upon giving details of the surrender, states that Monastir was abandoned Monday. On Sunday the commander notified the Greek Consul of his intention to evacuate the place in order to avoid unnecessary slaughter. Following this notification a committee was appointed, formed by the Greek and Roumanian Consuls and most prominent priests who went to the Bulgarian General Headquarters to negotiate the surrender. The Serbian commander left on the last train for Florida and the British Consul on a motor car which carried the archives. Railroad communication between Monastir and Florida has been interrupted ever since.

## Divisions in the German Reichstag.

ONE GROUP BELIEVES THAT TERMS OF PEACE OUGHT TO BE ANNOUNCED WHILE ANOTHER BELIEVES THAT THIS WOULD BE BAD POLICY.

BERLIN, 1st. — Ackerman, through the United Press, says the following: "A rupture of the socialists in the Reichstag is a threatening menace. Enthusiastic conferences have been held. In the course of the next few weeks of recess, the socialist leaders hope to unite the contending factions, although they recognize that this will be a most difficult task. One group insists that the Government ought to make a statement of the terms of peace which Germany would be willing to accept, while the other group believes that this would be a confession of weakness.

There is also divergency of opinion as to the rules of food distribution which the Government has instituted. One party is satisfied but the other one claims that such measures are unsuccessful.

PARIS, 1st. — A Montenegrin official statement says the following: "On the 29th of November we attacked and defeated the Austrians in the Focha region. The enemy made a disorderly retreat. The situation along the other fronts remains unchanged.

BERLIN, 1st. — (By way of Sayville). The Overseas Agency reports that the heavy losses suffered by the Italian troops in the Isonzo valley have induced them not to take Gorizia. In spite of the great sacrifices already made, the general opinion is that the battle has not reached its climax. All positions are strongly defended.

Notwithstanding the fact many of the Austro-Hungarian positions are nearly demolished every night, the damage is rapidly repaired in the course of the day while infantry engagements are taking place.
