NOTAS EDITORIALES

600 MIL COLONES BIEN GASTADOS

Desde el martes 26 de Abril fué publicada en los diarios de San José la primera lista oficial de precios, por la Junta de Defensa Económica. Se indica en la publicación que es obligatorio a los comerciantes fijar en sus establecimientos la citada lista, y se les advierte que los inspectores vigilarán que esta disposición se cumpla.

Seguramente en los otros lugares de la república se acatará la ley, o los inspectores harán q' ella se cumpla. Aquí hasta el momento de escribir estas líneas, ningún comerciante, que nosotros sepamos, ha pegado en su tienda la lista de precios, y ningún inspector, si es que hay alguno, ha intervenido para hacer cumplir lo dispuesto por la Junta de Defensa. El arroz se sigue vendiendo a ₡ 0.65 la libra, los frijoles a ₡ 0.75 y los demás artículos que enumera el boletín de precios se venden públicamente a un precio superior al fijado.

Nosotros sabíamos de antemano que no se iba a regular los precios con una simple repetición de las disposiciones y procedimientos de la Junta anterior. Pensamos que el señor Zuñiga Montúfar iniciaría una total reorganización, no sólo de las dependencias a su cargo, sino de los sistemas que fracasaron en la lucha contra la especulación.

Bien gastados estarían los seiscientos mil colones que costará al país la organización de la Junta si esos diques evitaran el alza escandalosa de los precios y la especulación de los mismos.

Para toda la provincia de Limón se han designado tres inspectores, que como no vengán investidos de un don de ubicuidad, y estén al mismo tiempo en todas partes, no podrán evitar la continua especulación que se está haciendo desde Puerto Viejo hasta Guápiles. Esperar a q' el público colabore con las autoridades denunciando los fraudes, es como esperar la visita del Mesías.

Si la Junta designara en cada lugar un establecimiento serio para la venta de esos artículos a los precios fijados, y lo surtiera con que nunca falten, los precios se regularizarían automáticamente y la vigilancia sería mucho más eficiente. Cuando el público sepa que en cada lugar hay un establecimiento en que se vende azúcar de primera a cuarenta céntimos la libra, y el arroz a cincuenta y cinco, acudirá a comprarlos a esos sitios, obligando al resto del comercio a ajustarse a la ley. Los castigos, las denuncias y la vigilancia más o menos efectiva no han dado hasta la fecha ningún resultado práctico. Cuando el señor Zuñiga Montúfar, que tiene sobrada capacidad para el cargo que ejerce, logre por ese o por otro sistema la efectiva fijación de los precios, estarán muy bien gastados los seiscientos mil colones que cuesta el organismo que dirige.

Labores Municipales

Sesión quinta ordinaria de la municipalidad de Limón, iniciada a las diecinueve horas del diez de abril de mil novecientos cuarenta y cuatro con asistencia de los señores Echeverría, quien presidió, Hernández, Heilbron, Picado y Esquivel. Estuvieron presentes los jefes de dependencias municipales señores Alvarado, Arrázola, Barrantes, Casco, Mora Aguilar, Mora Morúa, Marín, Montero, Vindas y Zeledón.

Artículo I: Acta: Se leyó aprobó y firmó acta de la sesión anterior.

Artículo II: Conocido nuevamente el informe presentado por el señor apoderado en relación con el reclamo presentado por el señor Eduardo Benedit, cobrando su trabajo como administrador de la finca Barnmouth, se acordó: por unanimidad y definitivamente, pagarle, de acuerdo con una de las soluciones propuestas por el señor apoderado, la suma de cuatrocientos cuarenta y dos colones, setenta céntimos.

Artículo III: Notas del señor Gobernador: a) Conocido telegrama que trasciende suscrito por el señor Secretario de Gobernación en el que a instancias del Consejo Nacional de Educación Física comunica que, de acuerdo con la ley que creó dicho consejo, todas las plazas públicas que existen en el país están bajo el control directo y exclusivo del citado organismo y para poder hacer uso de ellas ya sea para festejos cívicos o populares o para espectáculos o diversiones de cualquier índole, es necesario obtener el permiso del Consejo, la Corporación por unanimidad

acordó manifestar lo siguiente: a) Que no está dispuesta a dejar bajo el control del referido consejo las plazas de su propiedad, las que tiene debidamente inscritas a su nombre en el Registro Público, ya que no ha sido expropiada ni menos se le ha pagado la indemnización correspondiente, conforme lo establece el artículo 29 de la Constitución Política. b) Que el control de esas propiedades municipales es uno de los atributos que le corresponden como propietaria de ellas y que ha venido ejerciendo desde que pasaron a su poder. c) Que es la Municipalidad la que las cuida y mantiene en condiciones de servicio con sus propios fondos y que por muchas gestiones que se han hecho en reiteradas ocasiones no ha sido posible siquiera que el producto del Timbre Deportivo que se cobra en el Cantón, sea invertido en su mejoramiento. d) Que como está se gura de que al pasar esas plazas al referido Consejo quedarían en completo abandono y como su deseo es ayudar con los medios a su alcance a los deportistas del Cantón, seguirá manteniéndolas en condiciones de que puedan ser utilizadas para esos eventos y mejorándolas hasta donde le sea posible.

b) En nota N° 473 el señor Gobernador comunica que los concesionarios del Balneario Municipal le han solicitado la ayuda de la Corporación para conseguir liberación de derechos de aduana a fin de importar sesenta galones de pintura que utilizarán en la reparación del referido Balneario. Se acordó comisionar al señor Gobernador para que solicite a

la Secretaría de Hacienda y Comercio la exoneración de derechos de aduana para los concesionarios del Balneario Municipal puedan importar los sesenta galones de pintura que necesitan para reparar dicho edificio.

ACUERDO DEFINITIVO.

d) En la misma nota citada informa que de acuerdo con la licitación pública, da en La Voz Atlántica para preparar la zanja de Estrada, sólo recibió propuesta del señor Eustace Black, la que acompaña original. Se acordó comisionar al señor Gobernador para que con estudio de las finanzas municipales avise a la Corporación a qué partida puede cargarse ese gasto y si cuenta con los fondos necesarios.

d) Informada la Corporación de que algunos de los deudores morosos no han pagado, por unanimidad y definitivamente se acordó: que el señor Contador haga las certificaciones necesarias para que el señor Apoderado proceda inmediatamente al embargo y remate de las propiedades que adeudan por impuestos y servicios según la última lista de inmoros enviada por el señor Contador al señor apoderado.

e) Se acordó archivar nota del señor Gobernador trascribiendo telegrama del señor Secretario de Salubridad comunicando que puso en conocimiento del Director del Servicio Interamericano de Salud Pública la nota enviada el 28 de febrero último.

Artículo IV: Notas de jefes de dependencias: a) Se acordó archivar informe mensual del administrador

del matadero.

Artículo V: Notas de particulares: a) El secretario del Comité Pro Construcción Hospital Nacional para Tuberculosos, comunica que una comisión se presentará para gestionar el aporte de la corporación; además pide que haga un movimiento entre los empleados con el mismo objeto. Se acordó que la municipalidad ve con simpatía el movimiento, mas carece de dinero para contribuir, pero que recomendará a sus empleados hacer lo.

b) Los administradores del Balneario Municipal informan que de acuerdo con los compromisos por ellos contratados han iniciado las reparaciones proyectadas. Que como saben del empeño de la Municipalidad en conservar el edificio de ese centro, informan del mal estado del piso del salón de baile, que está hundido en varias partes y algunas de las tablas quebradas, lo que constituye un peligro para el público asistente. Discutido el asunto, se acordó definitivamente: sustituir el piso de madera del salón de baile del Balneario Municipal por un piso de mosaico que es más económico y estable y comisionar al señor Gobernador para que publique en "LA TRIBUNA", "Diario de Costa Rica" y "Voz Atlántica", una licitación para ejecutar ese trabajo, comunicando a la Corporación las propuestas que reciba.

c) En memorial suscrito por los integrantes de la célula Federico Engels del Partido Vanguardia Popular, así como de otros interesados, se solicita a la Corporación el arreglo de la acera que circunda la plaza del Estado. Se acordó: contestar a los solicitantes que está pendiente de conocimiento por parte de la Secretaría de Gobernación un acuerdo tomado en esta misma sesión, con respecto a comunicación de ese funcionario en el sentido de que las plazas de deportes están bajo el control del Consejo Nacional de Educación Física y que, de pasar esas plazas a propiedad del mencionado organismo, a él corresponderá la reparación de las aceras.

d) Miguel A. Salazar Bermúdez renuncia el arrendamiento de un lote municipal en "el fondo" así como también de una paja de agua

que pidió y no ha usado pues desistió de construir en ese lugar. Se acordó: aceptar las renunciaciones y que el señor Gobernador tome nota de lo relativo al contrato de arrendamiento y el señor Contador en relación con la paja de agua.

UNCONDITIONAL SURRENDER OF GERMANS ON ALL FRONTS

The unconditional surrender of the Nazi fighting forces in Italy and Austria has been officially declared. The surrender was effected by about midday last Wednesday afternoon, according to the following:

Under the command of Colonel Heinrich von Vietinghoff and General Karl Wolff. The document of capitulation was executed by the two Nazi officers in the Royal Palace of

Castella, as also by Lieutenant General W. D. Mogen, who represented General Alexander.

The surrender is the definitive conclusion of the troops and fighting their losing cause in Berlin is expected at any moment. The announcement may probably be made before this impression of our Weekly gets into circulation, as it is known the Soviet forces are attacking the last of the Nazi defences in the doomed city.

The death of Hitler has again been announced. He is said to have died while taking part in the fight in the Reich Chancellery. Admiral Karl Doenitz, Commander in Chief of the German Navy, is said to have been named his successor by Hitler, shortly before his death. The new Fuehrer is not in favour with the people of Germany, it is stated.

The announcement has also been released that the Allied Nations do not intend to pay any attention to the reported death of Hitler until they are presented with his dead body.

A number of prominent Nazis are also reported dead or taken prisoners. Germany's Minister of Propaganda, Goebbels is said to have died some few days ago. Marshal von Rüdiger, who had been relieved by Hitler, of his position as Commander in Chief of the armies on the Western front, has been captured at a place 34 kilometers south of Munich. Hans Mackensen, the German Ambassador to Italy has also been made prisoner.

Since writing the above, we have received the advice of the unconditional surrender of the Nazi forces, in Berlin, which effects, it is stated, about 60,000 men and officials. Germany's organized resistencia is now regarded as at an end.

Pierre Laval, the noted French Premier, landed in Barcelona last Wednesday, along with other French and German refugees. They were arrested by Franco and placed at the disposal of the Allies.

We bid him a hearty welcome and wish him a very pleasant stay in Costa Rica. He has promised to spend some time in this city before returning to his responsible duties at Bluefields.

BENITO MUSSOLINI PAYS THE PENALTY

Had they been collected, money and many a gallon would have been filled with the tears shed by fathers, mothers, sons, daughters, husbands, wives, lovers and others, as a consequence of the heinous crimes cruel atrocities and wanton destructions Benito Mussolini inflicted on the innocent peoples of the ancient Empire of Abyssinia, then on those of Albania and Greece, and even on his own fellow nationals, in his rabid desire for self and empire aggrandisement.

For a period of more than two decades Mussolini dominated, as Dictator, the affairs of Italy, and falling beneath the spell of the Nazi Adolf Hitler, joined him in his fight for world domination and flag salvement of humanity. His beloved Italy was the first to suffer defeat at the hands of the combined fighting forces of the Democratic Powers. He then sought refuge in Germany, but realizing that a similar fate was in store for the Berlin Dictator, he fled thence and established himself in one of his remote haunts in his homeland. There, we are told, he, his concubines and a number of his partners in crime, were located and seized by a body of anti-fascist warriors who submitted them all to what has been termed a summary trial, when they were condemned to pay the

May the seed grow and produce an abundance of rich fruit.

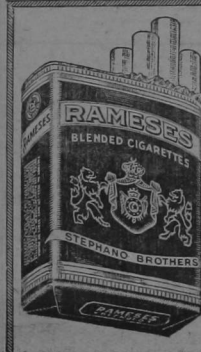

A NEWLY INVENTED COMPAS

A Braille compas, simple in design and construction, but declared an invaluable aid to the blind, has been invented by a display artist named Reginald Beauchamp.

The inventor is said to have developed the instrument for the rehabilitation of the Philadelphia Naval Hospital U. S. A. It includes a ball made of plastic wood, containing two balanced magnets, separated by a small aluminum disc. On the outside of the ball is a plain dress snap, used as a pointer. The ball is suspended by a nylon cord and revolves freely.

When it stops the pointer always faces north. The person holding the compas can determine which direction is north by closing his hand and touching the point.

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

PORCUPINE WORSE ENEMY THE JAP

British Commandos of the 25th Indian Division have had some grim moments fighting the Japanese in Arakan, but they have had a laugh from Burma's animal life.

The first "Jungle Book" episode happened during an enemy counter-attack the first night the Commandos held Hill 170. Lance-Sgt. John Salter, of Stroud Gate, South Harrow, Middlesex, hearing a scuffling and grunting in the bushes, prepared to fire on a Japanese. Suddenly a giant porcupine with foot-long quills jumped into his foxhole. Salter made repeated efforts to dust the creature and was rewarded with several nasty wounds on his hands and arms from the needle-sharp quills. The porcupine made such a noise when disturbed that the NCO decided to leave it alone rather than reveal his position to enemy. He spent an unhappy night in the open with bullets whistling past while the porcupine slept in the foxhole.

A few nights later, Sgt. Major Joseph Radman, of House Lane, Artesey, Bedfordshire, a peace-time wood machinist, led a nine-hour patrol which involved a swim across a 100-yard wide channel in the pitch darkness. As they were about to plunge in they were warned by a returning Indian patrol that the channel was alive with crocodiles. A bunch of very unhappy Commandos splashed across that river. Safely over, they obtained the information they wanted. One fear lurked in the minds of these men who have never feared a Japanese — the crocodiles on the return swim. They returned without incident, but all agreed it was the worst patrol they had ever been on.

The same Commandos have a front line mascot — "Jacko", a monkey veteran not three Arakan landings. "Jacko" has plunged ashore on the shoulders of his owner, Pte. Thomas Hall, who lives at Conker Avenue, Cwmbran, Monmouthshire, at Akyab, Myebon, and Kanngaw, and knows well the sound of enemy fire. When our own artillery opens up "Jacko" doesn't twitch an ear, but at the whistle of a Japanese shell he's in a slit trench a split-second ahead of the Commandos.

"Jacko" does countless tricks and will fetch a packet of cigarettes or a box of matches at an order from his owner. He loves cigarettes to chew and enjoys tight-rope walking on the Signals' phone.

SUPER-MEN FROM AFRICA

"The same job as is being done over in the recaptured ports of Western Europe" — that is the aim of the East African Port Artisan Works Company now training under a British Marines Major.

Their story began in Ceylon, when the Major noticed the extremely good job a group of East African Pioneers was doing in reservoir-construction and long-distance pipe-laying. He was so impressed that he went back to the Pioneers' homelands in East Africa to find more of these super-men.

It was not long before 60 adroitly trained Africans, clad in white, to date diving suits, were practising walking in the waters of a big Nairobi swimming bath.

Within two months, they had started real sea-diving off the Kenya coast. By the end of their training they will be able to do anything under water from the erection of steel scaffolding to the laying of concrete foundations.

The seadivers, with comrades now training to operate anything from an electric crane to a ramp landing craft, will soon be following up the Allied advances in the Far East.

FACTS FROM HOME FRONT

Tanks, guns, boats, and armour plates were among the 10,000 "out-of-gauge" loads carried in the London Midland and Scottish Railway during 1944. For such consignments the path of the train has to be plotted to avoid trains on adjacent lines, and an inspector has to examine the load every 25 miles.

Over two million of the all-day tickets costing one shilling have been now supplied by London Transport to H. M. and Allied Forces. These tickets were first introduced in November, 1940, for the use on the Board's system by Services' personnel on leave in London. They are issued mainly for mService Clubs and at certain London Transport stations in the Central London area.

In past weeks have been the mangrove swamps, muddy channels, and paddies of the Mye-bon, Kanngaw area, where some of the most beautiful multi-coloured tropical birds in the world abound. At night jacks' unearthly cries make the detection of approaching Japanese more difficult.

NEARING THE CLIMAX

Over a considerable area of the world the Christian year closes, responds roughly with that of the seasons. Advent, the time before Christmas, recalls a period of darkness, of preparation, of waiting.

Now, the long days of Lent are over. Easter has come and gone and we are in the time before Whitsun. We celebrate the triumph of Light over Darkness. Nature, in turn, performs her annual ritual, and bursts into blossom.

Maybe, this season of happy augury, with its hope of coming fulfilment, will lend its spirit to the progress of the war. Abroad, our army are reaping their reward, and the years of endeavour nearing their climax.

GPO IS NATION'S BIGGEST SHOP

A postmaster General once remarked that the Post Office was the barometer of business. To-day we are still involved in the grimy business of it all — that is, winning the war. What does the "glass" say?

During the financial year ending March, 1944, the total transactions of the Post Office reached the record sum of £ 2,427,763,000. The Post Office, then, more than maintains its title of "Britain's Biggest Business".

The handling of the mail is, of course, the largest part of this business. Postal items dealt with numbered over 6,500,000,000 of which 23,000,000 were parcels. Some 270 tons of stamps had to be printed to meet this demand.

New Strain On Staff

Registered letter and parcels mail a new record of 130,000,000. This last record placed a severe strain not only on the staff but also on the available special accommodation which the conduct of the service requires. Curiously, some people seem to think that registration expedites delivery. A little thought would show that this can never be the case. No one should register unless the contents of the packet are valuable.

Postal Orders do not decline in popularity. The massive sales of "sixpences" for football pools has been reduced, but in spite of that some two million of them are still ordered every year. Money orders were sold last year. Money orders were sold to total nearly 24,000,000.

A system comprising 12,000 miles of underground wires and 1,770,000 miles of overhead wires would seem capable of bearing any strain. It is not, however, and the Post Office has had to add — and still adds — the public to telephone and telegraph lines.

Huge Sum Reached

"We are now engaged in trying to create from the rather chaotic educational institutions of this country a system flexible and varied, which will be worthy of a nation that has saved civilisation, a system which will be the expression of that freedom and democracy for which we have fought" — Mr. Attlee.

"The United States now exerts a vast influence in the cause of peace throughout all the world. It will continue to exert that influence only if it is willing to continue to share in the responsibility for keeping the peace. It would be our own tragic loss were we to shrink that responsibility" — President Roosevelt.

"Public authorities are going to have to deal with an entirely different world than existed in 1929 in the domestic care of our hospitals. There will be a shortage for years to come. I want to see the old staid method, the old charwoman idea abolished" — Mr. Bevin.

£ 1,450,000,000 believed to be the largest balance held by a foreign bank. At the outbreak of the war there were just over 1,000 depositors with £300,000,000 to their credit. There are now over 18,750,000 depositors. These Savings Bank figures have a counterpart of the vast sums handled by the Post Office in connection with Savings Certificates.

THE FUTURE OF LONDON CHURCHES

An interim report of the Bishop of London's Commission on the City Churches recommends that all those not destroyed beyond hope of restoration shall be preserved. Other proposals made in the report are for amalgamation of some parishes, the erection of three institutes for social works on the sites of the destroyed churches, and the putting of titles in the City on a uniform and equitable footing. The report is published by the Press and Publications Board of the Church Assembly. It goes on to say, "No Wren church, not already destroyed nor damaged beyond the possibility of satisfactory restoration, should be removed except in a case of most urgent necessity". The report recommends that the number of churches was in excess of the parochial needs of the city, and that the social work undertaken among its daytime population was handicapped by the absence of parish halls. It, therefore, proposes that there be three institutes built "comprising principal halls, with suites of rooms equipped for recreation and refreshment, bodily and spiritual, and so situated as to be readily accessible to youthful workers from all parts of the city".

THE LAND WE LOVE

It has taken a war to bring home to many of us the beauty of Britain. In the days of peace we took it all for granted. Some tore through the countryside in car or coach looking not to right nor left. Others walked "to get an appetite", not to see the unrivalled glories of their native land.

The war has changed all that. Men and women serving overseas remember their homeland in terms of green fields, trim cottages, stately trees, the little cottage where tea was served in a flower lit garden.

Nor are the thoughts of those who are left at home so different. In a life made rigorous by stress of war, our minds have turned instinctively towards those simple things we tended to ignore. The falling leaves, the bird song, the ripple of the river, the moon on water.

War has helped us to find something we can with advantage always retain.
