## PRIMER AÑO DE LEGISLACION SOCIAL EN COSTA RICA

Del Boletín de la Unión Panamericana correspondiente al mes de Abril último, tomamos los siguientes sobre la legislación social de Costa Rica, durante su primer año, que no han sido publicados en el país y que vale la pena conocerlos:

El 15 de Setiembre de 1944 se cumplió el primer año de vigencia en Costa Rica de la Legislación Social de Trabajo. La labor de la Secretaría de Trabajo y Previsión Social en este campo ha sido eficazísimo, habiendo logrado en el corto tiempo de existencia de esta Ley formular 5,500 contratos escritos de trabajo, ins-

cribir 220 sindicatos, 8 cooperativas y 2 federaciones, realizar 25,000 consultas verbales y escritas, rendir 4,200 informes sobre reclamos de trabajo, conciliar 3,746 asuntos y pasar a conocimiento de los Tribunales de Trabajo otros 454, hacer 3,500 prevenciones sobre medidas de seguridad y condiciones de trabajo, preparar 84 expedientes de suspensión de contratos, de trabajo, aprobar 80 reglamentos interiores, y conceder indemnizaciones a trabajadores por concepto de pre-avisos, nulidad de contrato, horas extraordinarias, etc., por valor de 100,000 colones.

NOTAS EDITORIALES

EL PROBLEMA DE LA HABITACION

Con mayor intensidad que en el resto del país se presenta en esta ciudad el problema del alojamiento. Aquí donde son muy pocas las casas de habitación que pueden llevar, es nombre, es tan importante como en San José o en Cartago la construcción de casas, no solamente para obreros, sino también para burgueses.

En Limón la escasez de casas de habitación es un mal viejo, pero viejo y todo es necesario combatirlo. La mayoría de los edificios que se construyeron en las épocas de bonanza, fueron casas de vecindad, divididos en pequeños apartamentos, sin ninguna comodidad. Se hicieron para alojar en ellas gentes de vida inestable, turistas del trabajo, que llegaban a esta ciudad por pocos meses y se iban a otras partes a continuar su lucha por la vida. Esas casas de entonces quedaron como reliquias, sin haber sufrido otras reparaciones que el cambio de algunas maderas carcomidas y la sustitución de unas planchas de zinc. Lo que se ha construido después, con raras excepciones, se ha construido por el mismo modelo que seguramente por ser más económico, deja mejores utilidades a sus dueños.

Pero malas o buenas, actualmente no hay casas suficientes para alojar la población que vive de una manera estable. Esta escasez, obliga a las familias a meterse donde primero puedan, hacinados en cuartos anti-higiénicos y usando los servicios sanitarios en comunidad peligrosa.

La propagación de enfermedades específicas que tanto alarmó en días pasados a los funcionarios de la Liga Anti-venérea, es precisamente la comunidad de excusados y baños a donde acuden no solamente los vecinos de patio sino también los transeúntes sin distinción de clases.

Aquí nadie construye como no sean locales de negocio y día a día se va agravando la situación de falta de viviendas. Ahora que el Diputado por la Provincia de Limón, Lic. Don Francisco Fonseca Chamier, está elaborando en compañía de otros diputados el proyecto de ley llamado de construcción de casas, podemos tener la esperanza de que se incluya la ciudad de Limón y se equipare a las otras ciudades del país. No importa el nombre con que se bautice la Ley, Junta Habitación, Cooperativa de Familia, etc., importa que se lleve a cabo un programa de construcciones, lo mismo en Limón que en Puntarenas o Cartago. Sería lamentable que ocurriera lo mismo que con el impuesto deportivo o el hospital antituberculoso.

La presencia del Licenciado Fonseca en la Comisión de Previsión Social del Congreso es la única esperanza que tenemos. El licenciado Fonseca Chamier tiene cariño por Limón y estamos seguros de que hará todo lo posible en beneficio de esta ciudad y sus graves problemas.

#### GOBIERNO MILITAR LITOMIO EN AUSTRIA

ROMA, 24 UP.—El comité general anunció hoy que el mariscal de campo Sir Harold Alexander cesa definitivamente de ser el aliado en la zona del Mediterráneo ha establecido un gobierno militar para controlar el territorio austriaco ocupado recientemente por las tropas del octavo ejército británico. En dos proclamas dirigidas al pueblo austriaco,

Alexander dijo que el control militar era necesario hasta que se pudiese establecer una comisión aliada en el país. El mariscal indicó que Austria había hecho la guerra como una parte integral de Alemania contra las naciones unidas. # Britain's Coalitions Government Falls

Churchill resigns his important positions of Prime Minister, First Lord of the Treasury and Minister of Defence, but will on request of British Monarch, form a new Cabinet

On Wednesday last, the Rt. Hon. Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill resigned his outstandingly important position of Britain's Prime Minister. He personally delivered the resignation to His Majesty King George VI at Buckingham Palace. It was accepted. The resignation also affects Mr. Churchill's other positions of First Lord of the Treasury, and Minister of Defence. Mr. Churchill's decision to demit office was taken, we are assured, as the result of the Labour Party refusing to continue to participate in the Coalition Government

until the close of the war in the Far Eastern area. Among those of the Party who occupy high Cabinet positions, are Clement Richard Attlee, as the Vice Premier; Herbert Morrison, as Minister of the Interior, and Ernest Bevin, as Minister of Labour. Immediately after accepting the Premier's resignation, His Majesty the King is stated to have requested Mr. Churchill to undertake the work of organizing a new Government. This he has agreed to do. The dissolution of Parliament has been fixed by Ro-

yal Proclamation for the fifteenth day of June, and will be followed by the general elections on the fifth of July. As Mr. Churchill will, in the meantime, be carrying on the duties of the Premiership, neither the British Empire nor the United Nations will be deprived of the invaluable services of the one who has played so important a part in all the activities which have been the means of overcoming the determined efforts of Hitler and his adherents to destroy our civilization and enslave humanity.

Francisco Fonseca Chamier, Lic. Daniel Zeledon, and Messrs. Hernan Salas and Joaquin Hernandez of the Municipal Council.

The representation was effected on Friday the 18th. instant, and we are told don Teodoro re-iterated his willingness to do everything he possibly can for our city and people.

The existing unsatisfactory service can only be remedied, we understand, by the acquisition of two new diesel motors, and as the cash needed for their purchase in the United States of America is available, His Excellency's help is urgently desired in order to expedite delivery. Our delegation was assured immediate action. In view of this promise, we look forward, with much interest, to a marked improvement in our city's water supply system at no distant date.

## ADMIRAL DOENITZ AND HIS COLLABORATORS ARRESTED AS WAR CRIMINALS

It has been officially released that Admiral Doenitz, who succeeded Adolf Hitler as Führer, has been arrested by the Allied authorities along with all the members of his government and the High German Command. They are being held as prisoners of war and will be expelled

and proceeded against as war criminals. The number under arrest is given as three hundred officers and an unknown quantity of troops. Marshals Hermann Goering and Von Rundstedt have been removed to England.

## 4,500 TONS OF INCENDIARY BOMBS FALL ON TOKYO

In keeping with their announced determination to dispose of the remaining member of the Axis Combe as quickly as possible, the Allied High Command effected the most devastating assault against Tokyo during the earlier hours of wednesday last.

The announcement states that more than 550 super-forts discharged not less than 4,500 tons of incendiary bombs during a period of one hundred and five minutes on the city, particularly in the important industrial area of Shingawa.

It has been released that the United States of America and Great Britain intend to use the German naval units, now in their possession, in their offensive against the Japanese. Meantime, General Mac

Arthur continues his successful operations in the Philippines and other areas. Manila, the capital of the agricultural province of Bukidnon, in the central part of the Island of Mindanao, was occupied by North American troops last Sunday. On the Island of Luzon, the enemy is being forced to the interior regions though they still maintain their organization intact, it is said.

The Australian troops are reported to have seized Cape Moen, the last stronghold of the Japanese in the region of Weval on the Island of New Guinea. Advices coming from Chung king indicate that the Japanese are preparing to abandon south and southeast China and to establish themselves strongly in Korea and Manchuria.

# BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

## THE "V-3" BOMBS

In his speech on Sunday (May 13th) Prime Minister Churchill referred to the final horrors which the Germans had planned to inflict upon the British people. "It was only... when all the preparations being made on the coast of France and Holland could be examined in detail... that we knew how grave had been the peril, not only from rockets and flying bombs but from multiple long-range artillery which was being prepared against London. Only just in time did the Allied armies blast the viper in his nest. Otherwise the autumn of 1944, to say nothing of 1945, might well have seen London as shattered as Berlin".

A launching site of Germany's third secret weapon at Mimoyecques, near Calais, was visited by the press, but momentous events in quick succession seem to have crowded out the story.

The V-3 site was designed to fire a continuous stream of rocket shells on to London. The instruments were to be fifty smoothbore gun barrels, each 400 feet long sunk 350 feet into the chalk hills at an angle of about 55 degrees.

The placements for the barrels had been arranged in two batteries of 25 each, both trained on London 95 miles away. If they had ever been completed they probably would have rained rocket shells on London at the rate of ten per minute.

Although no ammunition was found, it is estimated that the shells would have weighed 120 pounds with a forty pound explosive war head—Apparently they would have been carried to the guns on the standard-gauge railway which had been built up to the site and into the chalk hill through a tunnel 700 yards long.

The tunnel is solid concrete to 30 feet high and 25 feet across and has an unloading platform inside the hill. Running off from the platform are chambers and galleries. Small tunnel's run, at a lower level. The whole installation is protected by concrete 18 feet thick covering several acres. If the work had been completed, they would probably have been invulnerable to any bomb yet introduced.

## BATTLE OF THE ELEPHANTS

A hotly-contested battle for elephantine prizes has been going on for these years in Burma. Elephants are generally worth their weight in gold as workers, and the Burma variety are worth twice that in warfare; for they can do the work of a bulldozer and are much simpler to look after.

The Japanese captured most of the trained elephants, with their mahouts, when they invaded Burma, and the British only managed to smuggle out fifty during their retreat. As their recovery was vital, a unit of British Forestry officers was formed to recapture them; commanded by Elephant Bill—Colonel James H. Williams who has worked with Burmese elephants for 25 years, they operate far ahead of the front lines and have for three years been fighting to win back the elephants to the Fourteenth Army.

The Japanese made good use of their elephant booty working them in the comparative safety of the jungle, far from their much-bombarded road, rail and river supply routes. Then, when they invaded Manipur, they used elephants to haul supplies across the Chinwin to their forward troops. During the British counter-offensive more than fifty of the beasts were killed by R. A. F. bombers.

With the failure of the Japanese attack came the disintegration of their elephant force. The Burmese ma-

Scientists of Imperial Chemical Industries Limited of Great Britain have discovered the perfect insecticide—cheap to produce, simple to apply, and non-injurious to human and animal life, but deadly to insects. It is known as gammexane, or "666", and is said to be five times as powerful as DDT.

In 1934 I. C. I. began its search for an insecticide which would be free from the disadvantages of existing types. Arsenical poison, for example, can be dangerous if sprayed on fruit or vegetables, while pyrethrum and derris are expensive to produce, and the supplies are limited. United Kingdom chemists prepared and investigated a thousand chemicals. Early in 1942 they found their objective—a benzene product with the formula of C<sub>6</sub>H<sub>6</sub>CL<sub>6</sub>—"666" for short. The active agent in this compound is gammexane, which is present to the extent of ten to twelve percent.

Extensive tests have shown that gammexane has a deadly effect on a wide range of insect pests, including weevils, mosquitos, sheep ticks, ants, beetles, house flies and fruit-tree pests. It has established itself in North Africa as a possibly effective material with which to exterminate locusts.

## HAND FOR THE DISABLED

A new mechanical hand designed by an English engineer was recently demonstrated by an ex-sergeant major who lost an arm in Italy. Before an audience of leading surgeons and technical advisers to the United Kingdom Government he made skilful use of metal saws, screwdrivers and file; he did satisfactory welding, hammered nails in pin-point position, and planed wood. The hand works on a simple "plug in socket" principle, and can be mass produced. One machine alone can turn out a thousand daily. Not only does it enable its wearer to use standard tools in stead of the special appliances needed hitherto. He can also change his tools as quickly as a fit man. Mr. Harlow, assistant manager at the Government Training Centre at Leeds is the inventor of the device. He wants no financial recognition, and has handed over all rights to the Ministry of Labour.

## WE SHALL NOT FORGET

The Allies' triumph over the tremendous German military machine has brought joy to every freedom-loving heart. It has brought relief as well, for it has meant the end of concentration camps, the most notorious and evil of Nazi institutions.

For ten years and more the civilised world has
