COSTA RICA SE BENEFICIA CON LA MEDIDA ADOPTADA POR LOS ESTADOS UNIDOS DE AUMENTAR LAS IMPORTACIONES DE CAFE Y BANANOS

Las exportaciones e importaciones americanas se mantienen a un alto nivel, habiendo mejorado en más de 86 millones de dólares

La Secretaría de Comercio norteamericana ha reportado esta excelente situación del intercambio en América

Los Estados Unidos continúan importando café, azúcar, bananos, cacao y otros productos latinoamericanos en grande escala, según un report: «La Secretaría de Comercio, que infiere que en el primer trimestre de este año dichas importaciones ascendieron a 1,051 millones de dólares, en comparación con 967 millones en el mismo período del año anterior. La Secretaría atribuye este aumento a mejoras en los servicios de comunicaciones marítimas y a la creciente demanda del mercado norteamericano. El aumento en las importaciones de café, bananos, azúcar, etc., llama la atención de los

círculos comerciales hacia la posibilidad de un incremento todavía mayor en los años siguientes a la guerra, a medida que mejoren las comunicaciones marítimas.

DESINTERESADA Y AMPLIA COOPERACION OFRECE LA UNITED AL GOBIERNO PARA ABARATAR EL COSTO DE LAS SUBSISTENCIAS

En estos días recibió el señor Presidente de la República la visita de personeros de la United Fruit Company quienes, según los informes que se nos han suministrado, le ofrecieron la cooperación más amplia y desinteresada de parte de dicha empresa, en toda actividad del gobierno encaminada a abaratar el costo de los artículos de primera necesidad.

Como se está trabajando en el sentido de facilitar la salida de productos del cantón de El General por el puerto de La Uvita, en el Pacífico,

esta oferta de la United Fruit, muy oportunamente y servirá para que se haga una buena labor en ese sentido.

La misma compañía ha facilitado 600 frías a sus trabajadores para que cultiven maíz, arroz y frijoles con lo cual ha cooperado a la solución del problema de la carestía de alimentos.

EDITORIAL

DOS OBRAS MUNICIPALES

En la sesión municipal del martes último se leyó una comunicación de la Secretaría de Hacienda que incluye copia de la licitación publicada para la compra de la maquinaria que se ha de usar en el servicio de la cañería de Limón.

Resultó tarde la licitación citada. Ya la Corporación Municipal había hecho el pedido correspondiente a una respetable casa de los Estados Unidos y había gestionado con el señor Presidente y con la Legación Americana para conseguir la prioridad en el envío de las maquinarias para el servicio del agua.

La situación desastrosa de las bombas de la cañería no admita demoras ni tramitaciones más o menos largas. Era necesario conjurar, de inmediato el peligro de suspender el servicio de agua indefinidamente y la Corporación tuvo necesidad de tomar dinero del empréstito destinado a la construcción del matadero, para evitar los gravísimos peligros de la falta absoluta de agua.

La Municipalidad de Limón no está en condiciones económicas para hacer esas dos obras, por más urgentes que ellas sean y por buena voluntad que tenga en el saneamiento de la población. Tanto como a Limón, le interesa al resto del país la salubridad de sus puertos Mien tras el servicio de agua se encuentre en las condiciones actuales y el matadero permanezca como está, existe un inmediato peligro de que se propague una peste con desastrosas consecuencias para todo el país. Precisamente porque se consideraron estos peligros en toda la extensión que ellos tienen, fué por lo que la Municipalidad se resolvió a contratar un empréstito de ciento cincuenta mil colones e invertirlo en trabajos de saneamiento y no de ornato. Desgraciadamente cuando este empréstito se contrató, no se había agravado hasta el actual estado el desastre de nuestra cañería. Se pensaba electrificar el sistema de bombeo cuando la Compañía Eléctrica instalara la nueva unidad que tenía en proyecto. Pero el estado desastroso de las bombas no dió tiempo para esperar esa instalación y hubo necesidad de sacrificarse el matadero para salvar la población de la carencia de agua.

Nosotros estamos seguros que la Secretaría de Hacienda al hacer la licitación, estaba anuente a pagar el valor de la planta licitada. Siendo ello así, es de toda justicia que se reembolse al Municipio el dinero que gastó en pedir esas bombas, para ajustar la suma que requiere la construcción del matadero.

LAS ACTIVIDADES POLITICAS DE LIMON SON CASI NULAS

No obstante que en todas las ciudades del interior se ha comenzado la actividad política, no obstante la súplica que hizo a los partidos, el señor Presidente de la República, en esta ciudad las actividades de los partidos son casi nulas. Las gentes parece que piensan más en divertirse y en solucionar sus problemas económicos, que son bastante serios, en vez de dedicarse como en el resto del país a la política.

Efectivamente en esta ciudad se piensa en otras cosas. Se dice en los corrillos que hasta principios de setiembre no se comentará ninguna actividad y que se espera la aprobación por parte del Congreso de la nueva ley electoral que adjudica a la provincia de Limón un diputado más.

Hasta entonces parece que todos los partidos han acordado una espera en beneficio de la provincia que bastante necesita tranquilidad completa para resolver todos los problemas que tiene pendientes.

ALLIED AERO-NAVAL ATTACKS IN 21 DAYS COST JAPAN, 1,500 SHIPS AND 1,300 PLANES

The authorities of Japan having rejected the ultimatum submitted by Great Britain, North America and China, which accorded them the opportunity of terminating the war, the Allied naval and aerial forces initiated on Monday last what is regarded as an unprecedented and final attack.

The Third North American Pacific Fleet, reinforced by several of Britain's most powerful units, launched a ten-day campaign of fire over the installations at Hamamatsu, 216 kilometers south of Tokyo, while 1,500 planes, and superfortresses attacked Tokyo and

a number of other cities of strategic importance.

By his communique, dated the 2nd, Admiral Nimitz reported that a force of 800 superfortresses had established a new record with their attacks on the cities of Mito, Hachioji, Nagaoka y Toyama, as well as centers of war industry on the Island of Honshu and petroleum installations, at Kawasaki near Tokyo, when they

discharged 6,000 tons of incendiary bombs and high explosives with devastating results.

As the result of the devastating attacks launched against them during twenty-one successive days, the Japanese are reported to have lost 1,546 ships and 1,300 planes. Admiral Halsey's Fleet has also destroyed what was

THE "BIG THREE" CONCLUDE CONFERENCE AT POTSDAM

It has been Officially released that the historic Conference between President

Truman, Marshal Stalin and Premier Attlee came to a close half an hour before midnight on Wednesday, last.

The results obtained have not been made public up to this time of writing, but it is stated that full and complete accords have been reached on the vital problems of the Middle East, the reconstruction of Europe and the war in the Far East. In so far as the Japanese campaign is concerned, it is generally thought that nothing will be released regarding the decisions of Russia until some time later on.

EX-PREMIER CHURCHILL DECLINES OFFER OF KNIGHTHOOD

A London advice states that at the time Mr. Winston Churchill presented his resignation to King George VI at Buckingham Palace, His Majesty took the opportunity of offering to bestow on him the high honour of a Knight of the Order of the Garter in recognition of his outstanding services during the

course of the war. The ex-Premier, however, begged that he be permitted to decline the offer in view of the existing circumstances.

It is the belief that the motive behind the refusal, is Mr. Churchill's determination to continue in the political field as the head of the Opposition.

AMENDMENT NEEDED TO EXISTING RAIL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

In more than one way, the new railway timetable between the cities of Limon and San Jose, as far as the passenger trains are concerned, has earned much favourable comments; but, on the other hand, there are undeniable facts in proof that the inhabitants of certain districts along the route known as "Swamp Mouth" and as far as Matina, on the main line, are faced with great setbacks in their movements by rail.

From Mojin Junction, if need be that any of those residents are to effect a trip to San Jose by the regular passenger train, it will require an early rising with its added punishment of three or four more hours at the first passenger train stop at Batajan, since there is no means other than the Limon-Manila passenger and freight combination, which leaves the railway station in this city at five o'clock in the morning.

The greatly embarrassing condition is in the case of serious illness of any dweller from Matina to this point. To come by the regular Zent line local or the "little local", via Swamp Mouth, the sick cannot reach this city till long after the closing hour of the Medical and Sanitary Department of the Government, as well as the time-closing of our doctors, in private practice.

Then the present practice of throwing off newspapers, radiograms, letters, telegrams, etc. as we learn, at the non-stop localities, will, we doubt not, entail much disappointments. We believe, that in the interest of suffering humanity, a two-way omnibus service could be established between this city as far as Matina, along the passenger route, and with adequate arrangements to carry correspondence, as well as the milk from Saborio. Whatever drop from the head would surely fall on the shoulder. We appeal for a charitable consideration in the premises.

IMPROVEMENT PROJECT FURTHER DISCUSSED IN NATIONAL CONGRESS

We are in receipt of the information that favourable approval has been granted by the National Congress in conjunction with the improvement projects, which had been presented previously before the Constitutional Congress by our very widely esteemed Congressman Attorney Francisco Fonseca Coarier and don Carlos L. Falla, the Deputy for Puntarenas, a project of Law to impose a tax of 10 per cent on each kilo of merchandise that is imported into the Republic with a view of securing the required ten million colones to be dedicated to the urgent needs of Limón, Puntarenas and Guacacaste.

It has been reported that after some modification to the original text, the Congress has decreed, fundamentally and authorized the Central Municipalities of the Provinces of Limón, Puntarenas and

Guacacaste to have the project carried out by contract, in addition to the work of the National Road Committee.

The work in our province will include the construction of a highway between Estrella and Talamanca; the linking up of roads, the most important cultural

projects and the betterment of the city's water supply.

The classification of big merchandise and other projects implemented, as we gather, will be assigned to the office of the Economic Defence Committee with regard to such goods which might be exempted from the new tax

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

BRITAIN AGAINST JAPAN

At a moment in the war against Japan when the approach, though not the form, of a tremendous climax is seen, a brief view of British effort and achievement so far in that field may be useful.

The British Pacific Fleet has for months now been actively operating against the Japanese at Sakahino, Truk and Formosa. Now they have joined with Admiral Halsey's Third Fleet in striking against the Japanese mainland. Forming part of the vast air sea attack their plans dealt smashing blows at Japanese air fields and launchings joined in the bombardment of the Tokyo area.

The Royal Navy has been building up the fleet continuously since their first strike in March against Sakahino, in support of the American landings on Okinawa. Admiral Nimitz himself thanked the officers and men of the British Pacific Fleet for their valuable service in the Okinawa campaign, at the same time blasting those idle gossipers who seek to drive a wedge between the United Nations in saying the British Fleet in the Pacific is small, slow and inadequate.

The ships of the Royal Navy identified in the Pacific Fleet include over 35,000 tons of battleships, the King George V, another and the Duke of York. This only leaves one battleship of this most modern class, the Arizona, not yet mentioned in this theatre.

One of the six large fast new aircraft carriers (including light fleet carriers and baby flat top) in the Royal Navy, five have been announced as serving with the British Pacific Fleet; they are the Formidable, Illustrious, Indefatigable, Indomitable and Victorious. Cruisers are the Blücher, Prince, Swiftsure, Gambia, (R. N. Z. N.) Newfoundland and Uganda (R. C. N.) Destroyers Graspelle, Undine, Bardet, Trenton, Tencinas, and Termagant, also the Australian destroyers Naagar, Nabal, Nizam, Norman, Quibron and Quickmatch.

Referring to the above ships, the statement by a British Naval Spokesman on July 20 th at Washington that every major unit in the British Pacific Fleet has been constructed since the war started in 1939, and that no large modern units of the British Fleet remain in British ports, other than those being refitted or repaired, dispels any idea that Britain has purely a token naval force in the Pacific.

The worst defeat inflicted on the Japanese Army on the Continent of Asia in this, or any war, has been in Britain. Out of a total force of over 200,000 in 1944, less than 50,000 are left; and of these, all have not yet made good their escape into Siam. The Allied combat forces engaged in the campaign were 85 per cent British, 13% Chinese, 2% American, and the main operations were and still are under British direction.

JAPANESE COUNTER DISBANDING ATTACKS IN BURMA THE LUFTWAFFE

The Japanese have been counter attacking in strength in the bend of the Sittoung river, north-east, forcing their isolated parties at Pegu. Recently they came in from the east bank of the Sittoung river, reinforcing their isolated parties already in the area, and established themselves astride the Pegu-Sittoung canal and the Pegu-Moulmein railway.

The enemy's object is to relieve Pegu. Recently they came in from the pressure on his forces in the line has been in lowering ground, in the waist-deep mud of the rice fields and in shoulder-high elephant grass.

The Japanese made their crossings of the Sittoung river inrafts in parties up to 500 strong. Many of these were sunk by tank, artillery and mortar fire. Shortly after the crossing were made the Japanese lost heavily at the hands of British and Indian infantry. Though the Japanese are stricken with malaria, there is no sign of a break in their morale. They are still ready to come in with bomb and bayonet and in their recent attacks, made with heavy artillery and mortar covering fire, they advanced shouting in Urdu to the Indian soldiers.

Their recent fighting in Burma is an example of the enemy's determination to continue resistance on the fringes of his defensive position in South East Asia, even though communications with Japan are virtually cut. It is unlikely that the Japanese soldier has any idea what the real situation is, even his commanders are probably under the impression that the Japanese fleet is still capable of coming out and clearing the sea communications to South East Asia.

There is no sign of any large scale Japanese withdrawal either in lower Burma, Malaya, Siam, Indo-China, or the Dutch East Indies. In this respect the Japanese in South East Asia are acting in much the same way as they have done in Malaisia.

As regards future operations, the action of the large task force of the East Fleet, which has been clearing mines off Nicobar, is significant. Nicobar is on the direct sailing route between Madras and Penang, the most important port in northern Malaya.

THE END OF THE ROAD TO BERLIN

The supervision of 80,000 troops of the German air force, still quartered on their own aerodromes under their own officers and NCOs, is one of the responsibilities of the Air Disarmament Staff of the R. A. F. Second Tactical Air Force. All of them are documented, and those with suitable qualifications will be detailed to assist Air Disarmament in the task of ensuring that the Luftwaffe does not rise from the ashes of its own destruction.

The nucleus of Air Disarmament was formed more than a year ago, expansion began last autumn and the last weeks of war units followed close on the heels of the British Second Army. After the capitulation they were even shed the army, for one officer penetrating into Schleswig to take over the Luftwaffe organization, found himself the only Allied authority in the area and was forced to assume the role of Military Governor for nearly a week.

Thirteen Disarmament Wings now in operation in Germany, Belgium, Denmark, Holland and Norway, their 'targets' being all German airfields and all factories producing equipment for the Luftwaffe.

In addition to the disbandment of the Luftwaffe personnel their task is threefold: first, to identify new inventions and novel items of equipment so that they may be dispatched to research experts in Britain; second, to segregate any material (such as transport aircraft which can be useful to our forces, third, to destroy or immobilize any material immediately dangerous. All combat aircraft of the Luftwaffe are immobilized, for example, and all bomb and ammunition dumps are dealt with by bomb disposal squads.

An important but little-known unit of the Royal Navy's "back-room boys" (which nevertheless functions on the front line) is the Hydrographic Survey, on duty with the East Indies Fleet.

On the formation of the South East Asia Command it was realized that Britain's task here would call for much navigation in coastal waters that were either completely uncharted or had not been charted for many years. A sea-going survey unit

THE END OF THE ROAD TO BERLIN

In 1942 it must have seemed a long way to Berlin for the Desert Rats of the Eighth Army, even though they were racing after Germany at top speed across the Desert. And so it was a long way, not only in mileage (El Alamein to Berlin: 2,000 miles) but also in the length and arduousness of the struggle. But now they are there.

The Eighth Army's breakthrough at El Alamein on November 1, 1942, and the Desert Rats' great tank battle at El Agadira the next day, were actually the first steps on the road to Berlin. During the months immediately before the first 'Monty' barrage began at El Alamein the war against Germany had been one of hiding not of advance, and before that it had been one of fighting retreat. The Eighth Army and the Desert Rats may claim not only to have started off to period of advance but ledge up to successful surrender, but also to have brought an end to this period of retreat. For when the Eighth took its stand between the Qattara Depression and El Alamein, German advances came to a full stop. German success had reached its high water mark. On no front did the German army ever again win anything but a local victory.
