SESENTA MIL COLONES APROXIMADAMENTE COSTARA EL NUEVO EDIFICIO PARA EL MATADERO MUNICIPAL

En la sesión del martes Municipal el proyecto para tomo aprobó la Corporación la construcción del nuevo ma-

tadero municipal que presen- to a la consideración de los señores municipales el ingeniero don Rogelio Pardo.

Los planos en detalle so- rán elevados a la Secretaría de Salubridad Pública para su definitiva aprobación y el costo de la obra alcanzará aproximadamente a 60 mil colones.

Era necesario este paso de progreso deseado desde hace tanto tiempo por la ciudad. El actual galcón en que se sacrifican los animales de desface no reúne ninguna condición de higiene o comodidad. Entendemos también que el sacrificio de las reses se hará por un sistema más moderno para evitar el espectáculo desagradable que ahora se presencia. A propósito de esto nos parece oportuno sugerir al señor Administrador del Matadero que no permita la presencia de extraños durante las horas en que se matan a los animales especialmente a los niños. El espectáculo que es bien triste no es apropiado para chiquillos.

La construcción del nuevo edificio comenzará inmediatamente después que sea aprobado por la Secretaría de Salubridad el plano respectivo.

El Departamento de Agricultura de los Estados Unidos tiene en Turrialba 12.000 arbolitos de hule en jertados, más de los que se necesitan para las 40 hectáreas de plantaciones experimentales que se están haciendo en Los Diamantes este año. Estos se ofrecen vender

a los pequeños finqueros de la región de Turrialba, Limón y Guápiles en las siguientes condiciones:

1. Recomendamos la plantación de no menos de 225 arbolitos a cada finquero, en fincas para un acre de terreno con un espacio de 3 x 6 metros.

2. Un precio de 10 centimos será cobrado por los primeros 450 arboles. Los arboles comprados sobre esa cantidad costarán 25 céntimos cada uno.

3. Los finqueros pagarán el flete de Turrialba a la estación más cercana de su finca y devolverán las cajas vacías.

4. Los precios arriba mencionados incluirán:

- a) El beneficio de la vizi lante en el momento de hacerse la siembra;
- b) Vigilancia periódica durante el primer año de crecimiento;
- c) El préstamo de una bodega de fumar, suministrándose gratuitamente el fungicida necesario para proteger los arbolitos en aquellas

Un Recuerdo y Una Oración

Son inútiles las facetas de la propaganda con que Franco ha querido convencer a los habitantes de América Latina. Soeces mentiras salen diariamente durante nuestra guerra de los laboratorios de Falange para ser sembrados como demoníaco germen en genios cerebros. Los republicanos solos en Europa contra el fascismo, hartos reñían que hacer con defender cada palmo de terreno suyo de alemanes e italianos sin poder preocuparse del exterior.

Pero una de las facetas más odiosas de esa propaganda, es el vilipendio sistemático a la mujer republicana. No les bastaba insultar a unos hombres que habían nacido en el mismo suelo, se habían criado bajo idéntico cielo y tenían la misma sangre de gloriosos antepasados, que bien pudiera ser yaciesen enterrados juntos en tierras de Flandes, Africa y América. No. Era preciso difamar lo más sagrado entre la sociedad humana, lo que el chacal respeta, el león defiende, la voraz ave de rapiña acaricia; lo que hasta entonces había sido "tabú" en toda guerra por muy cruel que fuera; ante lo que el fiero guerrero se indignaba respetuoso: la hembra, la mujer.

En su propaganda nuestras mujeres son sanguinarias criaturas de melena sobre el rostro; pantalones sujetos con ancho cinturón portador de pistola al costado, listas a arrojarse sobre la indefensa víctima. ¡Pobres! ¡Pobres! ¡Pobres! calumnias engendradas por pobres odios!

La verdad es que la República fue la única capaz de sacudir el letargo en que yacía desde siglos atrás el sexo femenino en España.

Y así también a los primeros disparos del 18 de julio de 1936 se presentaron a cientos, a miles, mujeres dispuestas a aportar su ayuda a la lucha; intelectuales, obreras y todas las de la clase media consciente.

Dónde estaría entonces Hemineyawi escribiendo sus oprobiosos tipos españoles de su famosa obra? Cuando tan bellos personajes y tanta fuente de inspiración había para escribir una bella epopeya heroica.

Ante la lectura de tanta falsedad de una y otra clase surge en mí el recuerdo de una damita heroína de Madrid, no obrera sino de familia distinguida, caracterizada por la más exquisita espiritualidad. No había recibido de la vida más que halagos pero cuando se vio envuelta en la ola de bravura del Madrid heroico que se defendía con fiereza de la traición, llena de admiración y orgullo por sus compatriotas decidió como tantas españolas ayudarnos como fuese más útil. Y así por su voluntad trabajó agotadoramente en oficinas de organización de retaguardia, entre ellas una Brigada en formación. Un día se enteró que la Brigada marchaba al frente y contagiada del valor que la rodeaba marchó a los sitios de mayor peligro pensando que con su labor dejaba unos brazos de hombre disponibles para empuñar el fusil. Allí lo mismo atendía su oficina, como ayudaba a curar a un herido si era preciso, o consolaba una pena con su bondad dulce y su alegría ingenua.

Cayó, como los buenos, en un terrible bombardeo, valiente y serena hasta el final y seguramente feliz de morir por tan bello ideal como tantos héroes españoles. Yo la conocí y en ella sí ve un símbolo de la mujer republicana española. Ella es representante de toda una estirpe de mujeres ilustres que dieron su vida en aras de la libertad de su patria.

Desde los hospitales de sangre en las primeras líneas de fuego hasta los Estados Mayores de la retaguardia, pasando por todas las actividades que requerían su empleo, allí se encontraron estas mujeres, cumpliendo silenciosamente su deber y sosteniendo gallardamente el ideal de la lucha con la abnegación de que sólo una mujer es capaz.

Yo me arrodillo ante el venerado recuerdo de todos nuestros héroes y elevo esta oración.

Contamos con algunos jugadores de gran valor que lo único que les ha faltado para darse a conocer en el mundo de los bates, es participar como lo han hecho otros países, en competencias internacionales. Tenemos dos lanzadores de magnífica calidad, uno de ellos, Piquín Masís se enfrentó con Terry Cornell, jugador de fama internacional, y lo derrotó en doce innings. También están los tres hermanos Palomo, Orlando Jiménez, Orlando Sandoval, Manuel Zamora, Cob, Heyling, Timothy Mena, Maytland y algunos otros de grandes condiciones y de grandes perspectivas para el futuro.

Ya que la participación de nuestro país es casi segura a estas competencias, sólo resta esperar que las autoridades deportivas agoten todos los recursos y eliminen todos los tropiezos que puedan presentarse y hagan una realidad lo que en el Congreso recién realizado, prometieron.

El auge que el Baseball ha tomado en Costa Rica: en

Este gesto del Sr. Maynard se tomó en un principio como un acto puramente comercial por ser el gerente de la casa productora del refresco en mención; pero el tiempo se encargó de demostrar a los que tal cosa pensaban lo contrario pues posteriormente se tropezó con la dificultad de que no había un sitio adecuado donde poder jugar y de que la enorme masa de público que gusta de este espectáculo, pudiera presenciar cómodamente los partidos, pues el Estadio que el Gobierno anterior comenzó y dejó sin terminar por causas que no son del caso comentar, era un lugar que presentaba no sólo grandes dificultades para jugar sino que también era un gran peligro para el público asistente. Ante este dilema surgió la gran figura de Mr. Maynard quien de su propio bolsillo dio la suma necesaria

para la terminación de la obra, comprometiéndose la Federación de Baseball a cancelar dicho desembolso, abonando un porcentaje del producto de las entradas de dichos partidos, y aunque lo construido no reúne las condiciones necesarias para considerarse un estadio, sí resolvió en un principio lo que la afición beisbolística del país anhelaba, tener un sitio donde poder presenciar los partidos que se realizan y saber que el Baseball tiene lo necesario para su desarrollo y perfeccionamiento. EDITORIAL

EL RACIONAMIENTO DEL AZÚCAR

La Junta de Racionamiento del azúcar, recientemente nombrada por la Municipalidad de Limón, ha fijado la cuota de azúcar en media libra por persona a la semana. Dicen ellos que el cupo correspondiente al Cantón Central de Limón, es apenas de cien quintales por semana y que es posible que una vez levantados los censos correspondientes no alcance siquiera a la media libra que han fijado provisionalmente.

Nos parece que la cuota es muy baja. En San José se fijó una libra alegando que la escasez de dulce en la capital así lo exigía y que en los pueblos vecinos, donde había dulce la cuota sería de media libra. En la provincia de Limón no hay dulce, correspondiente al Cantón Central. Aquí no llega este artículo sino en muy raras ocasiones y a precios prohibitivos. No puede entonces fijarse para estos lugares una cuota de media libra que es absolutamente insuficiente para las necesidades más urgentes de la población.

Es necesario que la Junta Distribuidora haga las gestiones necesarias para que se aumente la cuota mientras en el interior se mantenga la proporción de una libra para los lugares que no producen dulce. Aquí estamos en ese caso. Tenemos seguridad que una gestión de esta clase ante el señor Monteleagre, presidente de la Junta de la Caña nos hará justicia, mientras sea posible. No hay razón ninguna para que se hagan diferencias entre lugares que están en igualdad de condiciones.

THE DAY OF THE RACES

No doubt, the vicissitudes of life might have clogged the memory of many persons in conjunction with the great anniversary that was with us yesterday, October the 12th—a date that is widely comprehended as the "Day of the Races".

We take a retrospective thought that from the earlier stages of human creatures there is always demonstrated a Supreme Influence over the life of some individual; a Power that directs and guides the chosen one even from the cradle days until the time is ripe to undertake the special task.

At the birth of Christopher Columbus in Genoa in the year 1451, we do not believe there were any visible signs that had tend to rise any significant thought with his parents Domingo Colen and Susan Fontanorrosa, but as the boy had grown in grace and strength of character and not without wisdom his special characteristics were accordingly inevitably loomed up. By degrees Christopher entered into the secret of navigation which was later aided by practical experience.

When we give deserving consideration to the undeveloped stage of the science of navigation and other useful knowledge in those long passed days and to know that Christopher had on the canvas of his mind the marvellous idea of circum navigation of the world; we cling firmly to the belief that there was an Infinite Teacher preparing the young mariner for the work to which he would be called in the future.

No doubt after the Admiral's dream had become a realization the King of Portugal who was then Don Juan the second must have been a very disappointed monarch when he recalls the unfolding of Columbus's plan which he had rejected principally on the grounds of its magnitudes, but the ambitious and determined aspirant to his great honours was not dismayed; he returned to Genoa, tried to convince the Government but visioning the fruitless effort he pinned his hope on Spain; set sail, landed at Port Potos in 1485. There was his place and time; Success attended his proposals, with illustrious goodness of womanhood to the front with Queen Isabela of Castile convincing King Ferdinand of Aragon and the royal court that there was virtue in Christopher's project and more than that she stripped her self of her precious jewels in order to finance the Expedition and adventure that has given us this Continent which we so dearly love.

UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE TO BE HELD AT QUEBEC, CANADA

It has been proposed to hold the International Congress among the United Nations on October the 16th at Quebec, Canada. Approximately forty nations are to be represented.
The problems of subsistence and world wide agricultural organization will be the most important items on the agenda. In general the Conference is slated to study the best ways and means for the betterment of the conditions of the economic life of the nation.

"The sufferings of the workers in Nigeria in war time is becoming grave" says the manifesto issued by the African Civil Servants Technical Workers Union. "Before the war, workers lived in families of three or four with children in rooms some of which measured ten feet by ten feet as a result of poor wages. Today, the situation is much more aggravated by abnormal rise in rentals. Price of food stuffs and imported goods have

soared very high, and there is obvious scarcity of stock — a situation occasioned by the war. But the Government does nothing to relieve the situation... The health of the community is getting impaired. Victims from day to day are increasing from day to day. Have we fought this war in order to be exterminated by starvation? We appeal to British sense of justice for timely redress," declares the workers' manifesto. But the Governor, Sir Arthur Richards, former pro consul of Jamaica, ignored the workers, who in desperation decided to take direct action.

RUBBER PLANTS FOR SMALL FARMS

The United States Department of Agriculture at Turrialba has 12,000 ludded Rubber stumps (plants) more than are needed for the 40 hectares of experimental plantings being put in at Los Diamantes this year. These are offered for sale to small farmers in the Turrialba, Limon, Guapiles, regions on the following conditions:

1.—We recommend the planting of not less than 225 trees by each farmer, enough for 1 Acre of land at a spacing of 3 meters per 6 meters.

2.—A charge of 10 centimos per plant will be made for the first 450 trees. All trees purchased above this number will cost 25 centimos per tree.

3.—The farmer will pay railroad freight, from Turrialba to station nearest his farm, of the shipment of trees he purchases, and will return the empty boxes.

4.—The above prices will include:

- a) —the benefit of supervision at planting time;
- b) —periodic supervision during the first year of growth;
- c) —instruction in spraying and a free supply of the necessary fungicide to protect the plant in those areas where South American leaf blight causes damage;
- d) —instruction in spraying the first time;
- e) —Advice on top-budding the trees when they reach the paper size.
- f) —The United States Department of Agriculture Ru-

ber Station reserves the right to select only those applicants for trees whose land is suitable, well prepared, and easily accessible to the supervisors.

This project of the supervision of planting rubber trees on small farms is being conducted in cooperation with the Costa Rican Department of Agriculture.

These rubber trees belong to an entirely different plant family from the common Hule silvestre of the forest.

They represent the very best selections of Hevea brasiliensis, the tree used for all successful plantation and small farm plantings in the Orient, in Mexico, Brazil, and other countries. With proper care a full stand of these trees will yield, at maturity, between 1000 and 2000 lbs. of dry rubber per acre per year. 1000 lbs. per acre is equivalent to 127 lbs. or 2470 kilos per manzana, or 1000 lbs. or 1000 kilos per hectare.

Rubber trees planted in suitable soil make an ideal crop

for small farms. They are easy to grow and, after coming into bearing, should provide an additional income for many years. We advise a family—unit size planting—not more than 5 acres (about 3 manzanas). One acre (a little more than half a manzana) may be planted the first year, and additional plantings made each following year until the total size reaches the farmers needs. Other cash and subsistence crops should also be grown on the farm. These may be planted between rows of rubber trees for the first three or four year as well as in other places on the farm.

When a man fails in his effort to help others he makes way for another; follow the examples of the Great Generals of the Military world, if they fail to stop the rush of the enemy, they give way to better brain to tackle the ordeal.

Think what a Great Body of Negroes could do—one for all and all for one. Costarrican Negro man! and Costa Rican Negro Woman!

The Association for the advancement of coloured costarricans speaks to you. Come let us act together! Let our government be proud of us as citizens. Help others to live. Begin yourself to live above poverty. Begin now to provide for your later days if God permits your life, and remember that your children depend on you as well as your old lady and your old man may have to call on you when they are not able to carry along for themselves any longer.

FROM ZENT

The district of Zent was celebrated on the night of Monday the first of the month in connection with the presentation of a spirit (ed) rally in the Chapel under auspices of the Methodists of Zent. The rally was headed on some of the Queens of Great Britain and other monarchal countries.

This main feature was precluded with many interesting reciting and singing items.

The runner up for honours were the Misses Ethel F6rbes clipped first position in the representation of Mary Queen of Scots. Melba Hamilton came next in speaking for Queen Victoria, the Good and H. Coilelle took third honours in her efforts in behalf of Queen Elizabeth. All had a very enjoyable evening. Reverend J. P. Holmes, the Minister of the Circuit presided.

LARGE-SCALE PROGRAMME

Large-scale programmes for the social, educational and economic development of the new nation should be financed, Mr. Cyrus suggested by a joint British-American fund of about 240 000 000 dollars, some of which may be repaid without interest and the balance made up as outright grant.

"It is provided, however," he said, "that not less than one-half of the annual expenditure from said fund shall be spent in Guiana," it being the belief that the future of the new nation lies primarily in the speedy development of the resources of Guiana."

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

LITTLE NAVIES

Although the part which the British Colonial Empire has played in world warfare is less spectacular than, let us say the famous fighting divisions of East and West Africa, the contribution to the waging of total warfare at sea has been by no means insignificant. Naval units are maintained in ten Dependencies, Nigeria, Gold Coast, Sierra Leone, Gambia, Kenya, Tanganyika, Zanzibar, Ceylon, Fiji and Trinidad. Units also existed in the Straits Settlements and Hong Kong until the capture of these Colonies by the Japanese. Also, a naval unit was established in Mauritius in 1941 but disbanded in 1943.

Most of these Forces existed prior to the war to provide part-time naval training and undertake logistical A. F. however, were set up in 1941 after the outbreak of hostilities. Under the stimulus of war, extended their activities, and increased the number of their personnel and vessel. In Ceylon and Trinidad the local naval units have manned escort vessels, but the main duties of the colonial units have been minesweeping and anti-aircrafting, harbour and coastguard duties (including anti-aircraft control), naval control and examination services and sentry duties at other establishments.

Although established by local legislation, these forces normally come under the operational direction of the appropriate R. N. authorities, and in a number of cases (viz. Kenya, Fiji, Trinidad and Ceylon) have passed under closer Admiralty control.

Existence of these forces has relieved the Royal Navy of a number of duties which would seriously have depleted personnel required for service elsewhere. The British Colonial Governments finance these units, except that during the war, the British Government has assumed responsibility for expenditures in excess of agreed amounts.

Whereas few of the units have been in action against the common enemy, the Ceylon Force provides one of the exceptions. This Force took active part in the Japanese raids on Colombo and Trincomalee in April 1942. At Trincomalee the ORPAT was on patrol outside the harbour and was attacked and machine gunned, and the OYBRIDGE, WYKE and SAMPHUR returned to the force of several divisions. At Trincomalee, bombs fell near the SAMPHUR and ratings suffered various injuries. It has been reported that during the raid the conduct of all concerned was excellent.

In the West Indies, the Trinidad and Tobago R. N. added to the unglamorous but useful task of guarding

Canadian dead of the second great war will be buried on or near the battlefields where they fell.

This policy, as announced by the War Graves Commission is the same as that for 1914-1918. The Commission says the same decision has been taken by Britain and other members of the British Empire.

The War Graves Commission, which is the accredited agent of all British Commonwealth Governments, issued its statement in answer to requests from relatives wishing to bring their sons or brothers or fathers back to Canadian soil.

The statement explained that the graves were widely scattered and shipping facilities almost non-existent. Therefore it would be difficult to transport the bodies back to Canada. On the other hand it would not be fair for a few individuals who could afford to do so to transport their dead back to Canada.

harbours the more dangerous escorting of vessels when U boats were busy in the Caribbean. In the four West African Forces, Egyptian and African worked side by side and a great ESPRIT DE CORPS has grown up in each of these little navies. Minesweeping had its dangers and when West Africa became an important supply centre for food and essential raw materials, the defence of vital harbour, fell in some measure to these "little navies".

With the entry of Italy into the war, East Africa became an important battle front. As the danger increased, so the Kenya Navy grew, and volunteers from inland tribes showed great promise right from the start as seamen and signalmen alongside the more experienced sailors and Coxswains. Three vessels of the Kenya R. N. V. R. manned entirely by the "locals" played a part during the retaking of Somaliland. The Forces of Uganda and Tanganyika were equally active in the defence of the East African coast line.

In Pacific waters, the Fiji R. N. V. R. have carried out patrol and guard duties against the threat of Japanese invasion.

In short, wherever the amateur sailors, white, brown and black who rushed to take part in the Empire's struggle have won few decorations and to their lasting disappointment had few opportunities for gaining in earnest they would gladly give their lives in admirably with the total naval strategy of the Allies.

BRITISH INVENTIONS FOR EUROPE

Among the engineering triumphs that materially assisted the United Nation to win the war in Europe, as well as in the conflict in the Far East, are some that can be commercialized.

BAILEY BRIDGE

The Bailey enabled our and invading armies to replace destroyed bridges at a rapid rate. It is made of wood parts that can easily be assembled and has special claims for consideration where rivers and gullies of medium or short width require to be spanned, or even for replacing portions of bomb or flood damaged bridges of greater width.

For more permanent bridges, of steel — possibly, flame ray, of plastics for special climates — the same ideas may be embodied.

MULBERRY DOCK

The Mulberry artificial dock enabled the allied armies to land in Normandy at a point they selected while Hitler's armies were concentrating on defending the natural ports. With its heavy concrete caissons to act as breakwaters, its floating piers for loading and unloading, the Mulberry dock can be adapted to the requirements of many coasts in different parts of the world according to needs. The piers alone can be made serviceable where tides are not too strong. PLUTO (Pipe line under the sea)

Piers of this description with or without breakwaters, could be usefully employed for loading mining and forest products to the nearest point on the coast, where at present many miles may have to be traversed to reach a natural loading port.

The oil pipe line that supplied a million gallons a day from the West Coast ports of England, where it was unloaded from tankers, across the English Channel to the Rhineland. It is a conduit, made on the principle of a hollow telegraph cable.

This can be adapted to many uses. Already there has been a report of an inquiry for its possible use in Switzerland, and inquiries from other countries are being received.

FIDO (Explosive disposal of)

The device that produced the walls of flame to dispel fog from the airfields in Britain and the Continent to enable our bombers to land in safety. It provided the necessary heat over airfields from a contiguous line of burners installed parallel to, and some distance from, the main runway.

BRITISH RADIO PLAN NAUTICALLY NAUGHTY

Britain's radio industry has planned a new system of wavelength allocations to bring all round listening for every country in Europe. It is designed to kill interference as far as possible and give free and more selective listening for all. The plan is put forward in the report of the Technical Committee of the British Radio Equipment Manufacturers' Association. Experts from five of Britain's biggest radio firms worked for nearly eight months on the scheme, which is to be sent to all interested governments. The plan aimed at clear "local" services, by replacing the present longwave band of 2,000 to 1,000 metres by one 2,000 to 250 metres as the medium or regional wave band. Places on the long wave band would be given to stations which have the largest areas to cover.

RADAR

Developments in radiolocation enabled our night fighting planes to make contact with enemy air raiders and to break their power.

British radiolocation inventions have been many during the war and applied to various purposes. In peacetime we might find some of the inventions used for guiding our ships into port during fog. The possibility of using radiolocation with the "Fido" equipment for this purpose should not be overlooked, nor should attractions of both as potential exports be disregarded. Both types may also be found useful in commercial night flying.

NEW AIRCRAFT

Four new types of aircraft faster than any warplanes yet produced are being made in Britain. Three of these are fighters and one a bomber. The jet propelled Vampire with a speed of more than 500 m.p.h. in level flight. The twin engine fighter, the Hornet, which is the fastest propelled war plane in the world with a top speed of more than 470 m.p.h. The mighty new four engine bomber, the Lincoln, which is bigger than its predecessor the Lancaster, can carry a heavier bombardment, including the latest 14,000 lb. bombs, and has in addition, greater speed and range.

Some of the heavy type of bombers have already been converted for commercial use and such as the more luxurious aircraft can

NEW BRITISH SPEED CAR

Lieutenant Robert Morgan, a British Fleet Air Arm Officer, has after six years of research work completed the plans for a new type of car designed to raise the present world speed record of 300 miles to 520 miles per hour. The invention represents a revolution in novelty in design and construction of cars. The car consists of a gigantic wheel approximately 11 feet in diameter, which contains the driver's seat and has a year-shaped body which is largely made out of special glass and light metal. The car, which the inventor has called the "Bomb", is jet propelled. It uses liquid gas as fuel, and works almost on the same principle as the German V2 rocket. According to the inventor, the "Bomb" will only be used after measurement and testing of fuels, anti-rank and combustibles and after the reaction of the human body has been ascertained and to the "Hull" ride in his opinion the construction of the new car will probably be in the practical possibility of a journey in a hour. The "Bomb" weighs about a ton and will cost £3,000.

be produced. Britain is prepared to supply useful machines for commercial transport. If the time comes when the jet propelled machines can be sold to foreign countries in need of these fast types, another export commodity will be available.

BRIDGE LAYING TANKS

Mobile tank bridges enable the heaviest tanks to cross ditches or craters up to thirty feet wide. In the assault on Normandy these bridges successfully surmounted sea front walls, streams, flooded ditches under fire, and various anti-tank obstacles built by the Germans. A "classroom" type folding bridge erected first of top of a Valentine Tank is laid by being automatically unfolded inside the tank and then lowered across the gap. A Churchill bridge lay consists of a thirty foot span, steel trackway mounted on top of a Churchill hull.

Tank bridges of all these kinds have been used with great success in north west Europe, Italy and Burma.
