EL PROBLEMA

Se está tomando grave el problema de la habitación en esta ciudad. Prácticamente lo que comprende el Plano Oficial de Limón es tá todo construido. Apenas quedan pnos pocos lotes en donde pueda levantarse una casa. Lo demás está lleno.

La población total de esta ciudad -aunque no lo crea la Oficina de Estadística pasa de catorce mil personas. Este dato pudimos controlarlo al levantar los censos para el racionamiento del azúcar. El centro de la ciudad está abarrotado de gentes al extremo de que hay manzanas -la 42 por ejemplo- en que viven más de cuatrocientas cincuenta personas. Allí naturalmente los problemas de higiene se agravan en perjuicio de toda la ciudad.

No hay en este momento una sola casa desocupada ni para habitación ni para comercio, incluyendo los barrios de Ceneguita, Roosevelt y Santa Rosa. Posiblemente en el fondo de algún patio pueda encontrarse un cuarto que en cualquiera otra parte habría destruido por ruinoso. Muchísimas personas que trabajan en esta ciudad hace más de un año, no han encontrado casa para trasladar sus familias ni es probable que en mucho tiempo las encuentren.

Es necesario tomar medidas inmediatas. La situación angustiosa que ahora se presenta no puede prolongarse indefinidamente. Es imperativo extender la población hacia el Barrio Roosevelt, Ceneguita, únicos lugares que tienen calles más o menos transitables.

No solamente para la higiene de la ciudad sino también para el propio interés del Municipio se hace necesario tomar una determinación inmediata. La falta absoluta de locales de comercio impide abrir nuevos negocios que traerían competencia de precios en beneficio de la población, y que pagarían patentes en beneficio de las arcas municipales.

De los dineros que nos traería el empréstito alguna parte podría destinarse a urbanizar nuevos barrios. Así facilitaríamos el ensanche de la población aliviando la gravísima crisis de alojamientos que ahora atravesamos. En este momento en que la Caja del Seguro Social está iniciando la construcción de casas baratas, es el momento oportuno de estudiar las posibilidades de ensanche dando facilidades a la iniciativa privada y al capital.

THE LITTLE NIBELUNG

Anton A. Museret stopped grow- ing when he was 4 feet 10 in- ches tall. Thereafter this Dutch Nibelung developed into a crafty and power-hungry a little man as the dwarfs in the German le- gend who stole the Rhine gold. His one professional success as an engineer was the construction of the Amsterdam-Rhine Canal. His outstanding prewar escapade was marrying at 28, after divorc- ing his first wife, the wealthy 46 year old aunt who had put him through college. In 1931, he found- ed the Dutch National Socialist

party. Museret built up a sabotage net- work in preparation for the Ger- man invasion of the Netherlands. The Nazis named him Dutch Fihler in 1942. For four years he led a campaign of opposition and terror against his fellow countrymen. Last week, in a courtroom that was once the ballroom of Princess Juliana's palace in The Hague, he made the usual quishing plea: All he had done was for his country's sentence Anton Museret to death for high treason.

ZOMBIE IN THE DOCK

Prince Batoula or Prince of Zombies, as the 6-foot Negro called himself, cut a broad swath through Paris before the war. He overtook as a feldt at the 1937 International Exposition, and spent tozily in the smarter night clubs. Rumor later identified him as the fiancee of a wealthy white Amer- ican, as a big operator in Congo railroads, and as a leader in relief work for Senegalese pris- oners. Only one thing was cer- ain: During the occupation, the Prince opened a German propaga- nda shop in the Grand Hotel, renamed himself Alioune Mamarou Kane, and took the title of Grand Barabout. This, he explai- ned, meant he was Black King or Pope of the Moslems.

Last week, the Barabout occu- pied the prisoner's dock in the Paris Court of Justice. He wore a gray coat over a beige trench- coat, a rust-colored suit, a white sweater, and an orange head- bandana he felt his rank entit- led him to retain in court. Forty witnesses, mostly exorable Negroes, testified in unison on his behalf. The judge and prosecu- tor, roared indiscriminately at the prisoner and witnesses. The Barabout babbled, lighted and sobbed, made incoherent re- ferences to Congo railroads, tried to explain how he came to speak French with a Britanny accent, denounced the Minister of Colon- ials, and quoted André Gide. It

was as cacophonous as a Harlem jam session. When the judge roared, "Who did you get your money?" the defendant replied tolerantly: "In the same way as the Pope-I had many faithful followers." Senegalese witnesses declared that he was not a Prince, not a Marabout, not even a Moslem but a Catho- lic. But out of the confusion, one charge stuck. The Marabout had worked for the Germans. He had organized a service to help Senegalese prisoners and had sold provisions thus obtained in the

## WHY BRITAIN MUST EXPORT

Slumps in Britain have often started with slumps in its export trade. A decline in the foreign demand for Lancashire cotton goods, or for coal from South Wales, or for steel from the Midlands, led to a fall in activity and employment in the cotton, coal or steel industry, and thence to a fall in income and employment everywhere else. For as Lancashire cotton operatives, or South Wales miners, or Birmingham steel forgers lost their jobs and had less to spend, local retailers, publicans, builders, transport workers earned less and in turn spent less.

So the vicious spiral of deflation spread from the export industries to the home industries and from one region to another. The effects were particularly serious as so much of Britain's economic activity has always centred on exports: more, in fact, than is the case in any other major country of the world.

Here, then, is a source of instability which it is not in the power of any Government to control directly. Every Government can directly influence the level of domestic demand; but none can control the foreign demand for its country's goods and

There is no doubt that Britain's standard of living could never have risen to the extent it has if Britain had not fostered a large export trade. Nor is there any doubt that the same holds good for the future. It is true that a larger proportion of our foodstuffs can be efficiently grown at home than had been thought possible before the war. It is also true that the war time development of substitute products may allow us in future to go without some of the raw materials which we used to import before the war.

On the other hand, the loss of much of our overseas assets means that we shall have to export more in order to obtain the means of payment for any given volume of imports. Moreover, as against any cuts in our imports due to expanded home production and raw materials, we have to set the fact that MORE foodstuffs and raw materials will be wanted to nourish our full employment economy. For high level of employment calls for a high level of imports. When the wheels of industry turn at full speed large quantities of raw materials are used up. And when everybody has a job, incomes are high and people want to consume more foodstuffs. We should therefore budget for a level of imports at least as high as it was before the war, and seeing that we shall no longer pay for any substantial

# BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

## BRITAIN'S FARM ARMY

It is the United Nations' victory over their enemies in the Second World War that will be made of Britain's ill-out effort to increase food production. At a time when submarines were on the rampage and shipping was a vital matter, British farmers accomplished a miracle. In 1939, the agriculture was Britain's richest industry, the United Kingdom raised only 33 per cent of the food it consumed that year the cultivated area, including crop land and grazing areas, was about 32 million acres which tillage 13 million acres were sowing. In 1944 the land in crops was early 18 million acres. At the beginning of the

war the Minister of Agriculture was empowered to set up a single - two County War Agricultural Executive Committees which had compulsory powers in determining the use of land. Priority was given to the production of milk, wheat, oats, potatoes and sugar beets. By 1944, in spite of vexing shortages of manpower, fertilizers and machinery, Britain was raising 70 per cent of its food.

Britain's record for wartime food production was an outstanding achievement and plans for the future include keeping most of the 18 million acres in production. — The war taught the lesson that food is as essential as any other item in maintaining national strength.

## THE WAY TO THE STARS

Reviewed by Squadron Leader William Simpson of Britain's Royal Air Force

"The Way To The Stars" one of Britain's best war films was made in the modern studios of the Two Cities Company at Denham, near London. The title was inspired by the motto of Britain's Royal Air Force PER ARDUA AD ASTRA. The story was written by Terence Rattigan, a playwright, who had already won a reputation for reproducing faithfully the emotional background of the young British airman with whom he served as a Flight Lieutenant. It was produced by Anatole de Gruenwald and directed by Anthony Asquith.

The film opens with the camera moving slowly about the unit and deserted buildings of an airfield, one of many hundreds that transformed Britain in a gigantic stepped career. As the camera stopped here and there to accentuate little clues to the past — such as an American pin up girl alongside a British dart board chalked on the wall of the deserted crew room —

it was clear that only recently the sheep had started to crop the grass between the run ways.

## BATTLE OF BRITAIN

Suddenly, in a flash back, the airfield springs to life. The Battle of Britain is on. Squadrons of Blenheim bombers take off and land all day long. Their duty is to destroy the landing barges assembled in the Harbours, and creeks of France and the Low Countries ready to carry the German invasion armies across to Britain. Elsewhere, Hurricanes and Spitfires are knocking the Luftwaffe out of the skies, to crash on southern England. In the English Channel the atmosphere is unreal. The countryside continues quietly with its work. Only the airman who are in the thick of battle can fully appreciate how critical is the situation.

Peter (John Mills) a young British pilot officer straight from training, arrives in the middle of an air raid. He needs his commanding officer (Michael Redgrave) who has brought his newly wed wife into the winter wedding dress.

The story unfolds, sometimes with flying as the background and for emotion, but mostly in and around the "Red Lion" inn near the airfield. For it is there that "Miss Todd" (Glossina John), who married the flight commander, divides her life between her husband, her son, and management of the inn.

## FOR A RATIONAL WORLD

There have been mistakes, and egregious ones, on both sides of the overprotracted Anglo - American financial negotiations. But the result as it is now finally laid before Congress, Parliament and the two peoples, represents a real effort at enlightened statesmanship. These agreed proposals aim at three objectives, each of them vital to both nations. They are, first, to roll up and write off the whole lendlease and reciprocal-aid structure, cleanly, fairly and promptly, and thus to avoid a repetition of the disastrous war-debt wrangles of twenty years ago, in which all participants were the losers in the long run; second, to afford Great Britain, on a fair but businesslike basis, the financial assistance she immediately requires if she is to restore her economy as a healthy pillar of international trade; third, to secure in return the assurance that this assistance will really be used by the British in such a way as to promote the re-establishment of a rational and reasonably free world economy.

The lend - lease settlement refers to the past and may be considered separately. Payment for goods received after V-J Day, for installations now turned over and other claims, the British owe a debt of \$650,000,000. All the rest is wiped off the slate; it was put to the use for which this country furnished it, which was to secure

re victory over the common enemy and thereby the safety of the United States, and the debt, if there was one, has been paid in British blood. It is as much to our own as to the British interest thus to remove it once and for all from the books.

The loan and trade provisions refer to the future, and may again stand on their own merits. The United States opens a credit of \$3,750,000,000, to be repaid over fifty years with an interest rate which works out over the full period to about 1.63 per cent. This is rather less than the rate at which our government can now borrow, which is an "escape clause" permits the total waiver of interest in the British balance of payments is found to be insufficient to sustain the charge. The difference in interest rate of waiving all interest repaid what the United States is actually putting into the agreement. What it gets in return is the British undertaking to do all that can be done to adjust other British financial obligations and to accept policies that will "promote the development of multilateral trade and facilitate its early resumption on a non-discriminatory basis"; not to have ourselves and Britain and, as far as possible through the world economy.

We are, in other words, offering to make a not very onerous investment, first, in British economic recovery, but more particularly in the restoration of a more or less free world market, relieved of the exchange controls, trade barriers, governmental monopolies and discriminations, totalitarian regimentations which otherwise threaten to overwhelm us all. How well this gallant enterprise may ultimately turn out no one can say. There is, at first glance, a very theoretical note about our "proposals for expansion of world trade and expan-

ment" which the British agree to take over and support. The cankers in world trade are formidable and virulent. But at least with this agreement we will turn what would otherwise be simply another grave focus of infection into a focus of health and sanity which, also, may grow and spread.

The attempt would be made in our own case. But it is in vain as also operated since Great Britain, its great power with its own fortunes are more closely linked, and we wish with us the response for the future of democracy on this earth.

## HERBERT MORRISON TO VISIT CANADA

The British Embassy in Washington has announced that Herbert Morrison, Lord, resident of the Council in the British Cabinet, will arrive in Canada on January 3 for a visit of one week and will then go on to the United States, reaching Washington on January 12. Political quarters in London interpreted the visit to Canada as an early effort by the Labour government to establish closer contact with the Dominion. The visit is not connected in any way with the Anglo American loan negotiations, will involve energy discussions or other any other aspect of high British Empire or American policy; these matters indicated.

Mr. Morrison will visit Ottawa, Montreal and Toronto. He has been in Canada only once before, when he

crossed the frontier for a short time during a tour of the United States. According to present arrangements he will not address the Canadian Parliament, but will speak to various clubs and organizations and will meet ministers of the Canadian government.
