Será a fines de mes o en los primeros días de mayo siguiente, que la Compañía Inglesa asumirá la administración del ferrocarril, que por varios años ha tenido arrendado a la United Fruit Co. Para dirigir la empresa y tratar de darle una nueva orientación de servicio público, vendrá al país un experto en esa clase de organizaciones, procedente de Londres.

Con motivo de saberse que está para realizarse el traspaso definitivo, en éste puerto corren muchos rumores: que se sustituirá el personal; que se reducirán sueldos; que todo el personal está en interinidad, mientras se hace la nueva organización etc. Claro, todo eso, unido a la mala situación económica que vive la provincia, cada día peor, estimula una crisis de nervios muy fuerte.

Para tranquilidad pública y perfectamente informados en fuentes directas podemos adelantar la siguiente información, sobre el particular:

1.—Que efectivamente a fin de mes o primeros días del siguiente se hará el traspaso de la empresa ferrocarrilera a la Compañía Inglesa, que se pro-

Resumiendo, que el traspaso no causará trastornos económicos, ni perjudicará ningún interés particular, sino que más bien podrá redundar en beneficios para el país, al orientar bajo normas de trabajo y de rendimiento, esa empresa ferrocarrilera.

Se ha anunciado que los hacendados de la provincia de Limón pedirán la desvalorización de sus propiedades en vista de que se han depreciado notablemente a consecuencia de la depresión económica que afronta actualmente toda esa provincia Atlántica, ya que la industria bananera se terminó y los precios para el cacao son bastante malos.

En relación con lo anterior, se nos informó hoy que la Tributación Directa no puede proceder a verificar la desvalorización general de la provincia, por

cuanto no toda se ha depreciado de manera uniforme. Hay casos en que unas propiedades se han depreciado; pero hay otros en que, por diferentes circunstancias que no es del asunto analizar, la propiedad ha logrado mantener su valor.

En este caso, lo único que procedería es la revaluación de cada hacienda por separado, de modo que su valor actual pueda constatarse ampliamente y ser consignado así en los registros de la Tributación Directa para los efectos del cobro del impuesto territorial.

EL USO DE CUPONES DENUNCIA CONTRA EN GUAPILES

Una ley de la República prohíbe el uso de cupones o boletos para pagar a los trabajadores, quienes deben cambiar esas órdenes de pago por mercaderías. Es una forma de hacer un doble negocio. La venta de mercaderías a precios altos, obligada en esa forma, permite reducir el costo de producción. La víctima es el trabajador. Esto está bien comprobado. Por eso se dictó la ley que prohíbe ese negocio.

Ahora se informa que en Guapiles está establecido ese sistema de pago. La queja llegó a la secretaría de gobernación, quien la trasladó a la oficina del trabajo, encargada de esas cuestiones.

Se realiza la investigación del caso para constatar si la ley, a fin de sancionarlo.

TURQUIA SE VERA ENVUELTA EN LA GUERRA

ESTAMBUL, 4 UP.—En las esferas turcas bien informadas se reiteró hoy que es "casi seguro" que Turquía se vería envuelta en la guerra si Alemania ataca a Yugoslavia y advirtieron que está próxima una acción militar. Se descuenta que en tal caso también Bulgaria se vería arrastrada a la guerra. De la determinación de Turquía de hacer frente a cualquier eventualidad, pese a su reconocido deseo de paz, es signo elocuente la convocatoria de las clases de 1910-11 publicada en los diarios de esta mañana.

EN AGUAS DEL PLATA

La ampulosidad, el desbordamiento de las dimensiones, juega siempre un papel muy importante en la realización práctica de los problemas del Estado totalitario. No se comprende una concepción totalitaria, del orden que sea, si no se la enuncia con una amplitud y con un luao de atributos y de efectos calculados para llamar la atención, desmesurados. Cuando el Estado totalitario se asoma al exterior, especialmente, este aspecto de la propaganda adquiere proporciones monumentales y, para ser justos y equívocos al juzgar, debemos hacer la observación de que la imaginación desbordada de los italianos, que en un tiempo se encauzó con éxito universal hacia la realización de la obra de arte, encuentra en la tarea de acometer la conquista integral del neutral simpatizante, campo más apropiado que la

parquedad fría y poco jugosa que caracteriza a los alemanes.

En la mente teutona la idea de magnitud se expresa forzando todo lo posible el número. Un acto público al que acuden el Fuehrer o los primates del partido nazi, se concentran en un espacio de dimensiones apropiadas, cantidades inmensas de automatas y un número imponente de gallardetes y banderolas. Después del acto lo que importa para los efectos de la propaganda no es lo que haya dicho en sí Hitler o alguno de sus segundos, por muy incongruente o agresivo que parezca, sino la manifestación multitudinaria que, a través de la película que recorre los cinematógrafos del mundo, ofrecerá a los ojos del espectador una verdadera marea humana agitando los brazos a compás en el momento teatralmente pre-

parado por el maestro de ceremonias.

Los italianos no desdennan este aspecto de la propaganda para difundir la doctrina fascista y también sus concentraciones de camisas negras en Roma, en Milán o en Nápoles hay que contarlas por centenas de millares; pero donde su genio se manifiesta con un mayor grado de utenticidad es en otros aspectos, menos llamativos exteriormente, aunque no por ello menos demostrativos de la ampulosidad y del fanfarronismo que los caracteriza.

Una fuente informativa argentina, del propio corazón de Buenos Aires, trasmite una noticia que prueba hasta el punto que la propaganda nazi-fascista se desmorona en cuanto la realidad se impone por sí misma y cierra el paso a la osadía y al descaro.

za rodeando las muestras manes e italianos que residen en los países neutrales de América del Sur.

Las oficinas de navegación de las grandes compañías que realizan el tráfico de pasajeros desde Europa con los puertos de la América Latina continúan actuando exteriormente en la misma forma que antes del comienzo de la guerra; pero "de puertas adentro" el asunto cambia sustancialmente de aspecto. En Buenos Aires la oficina de la línea italiana paga puntualmente todos los meses el local que ocupa, aunque no presta servicio en ella más que un solo empleado cuya misión actual consiste en renovar periódicamente los bastidores ilustrativos colocados en el escaparate donde se anuncia el boletín de noticias de guerra, con los "éxitos extraordinarios" de las naves y de las tropas del Duce.

Los alemanes parece ser que se han decidido a reducir el personal de estas oficinas hasta un mínimo, y la prueba más patente de la ociosidad a que están condenados se deduce del hecho de que los alardes de propaganda fotográfica y de otra que anteriormente cubrían la superficie de las vidrieras han perdido el pasado esplendor y hoy no se ven ellas más que polvo y tristes medio ajadas que fueron de actualidad al comienzo de la conflagración.

En cambio las grandes compañías navieras británicas, "Royal Mail", "Blue Star", "Houlder Brothers" y "Chadwick Weir", y otras, con cantidad considerable, mantienen todo el personal como en circunstancias normales. Continúa en ellas la vida activa como en los mejores tiempos. Los escapafuertes renuevan con frecuencia su aspecto. Los empleados se mantienen activos en sus puestos. El público entra y sale para informarse de lo que le interesa o se estaciona desde el exterior delante de las vidrieras atraído por el espíritu de vitalidad que vibra en las manifestaciones que se ofrecen a su contemplación. En cambio pasa por delante de las oficinas germanas o italianas sin paramientos y sin detenerse, al solutamente desinteresado de lo que allí pueda haber.

Y en las aguas del Plata ya mucho tiempo que se mojan las quillas de los barcos alemanes o italianos aunque los navíos británicos frecuentan el puerto de Buenos Aires cuantas veces entra en sus propósitos el hacer. El pabellón italiano y la svástica están borrados definitivamente en la sinfonía y colores del bosque de mástiles enhiestos de un día fiesta en los muelles bonaerenses. La Escuela de Varones

La vieja Escuela de Varones, modernizada totalmente y con un nuevo y magnífico pabellón adicional, fué bautizada en días pasados con el nombre del General don Tomás Guardia. Muy patriótica y edificante nos parece la medida. La memoria ilustre del ex-presidente Guardia está por encima de toda discusión. ITALY LOSES MORE TERRITORY

Consequent on the fall of Eritrea the Italians were forced to vacate the important port of Massawa and thus place the British in control of the entire territory of Eritrea with the capturing of a considerable number of additional prisoners and much war material.

Conditions in Ethiopia are reported nearing a climax. Some 300,000 or more British troops, operating jointly with the Ethiopian warriors under the personal command of the Regus and aided by a strong aerial force, are pursuing a successful offensive from many points with Addis Ababa as the final objective and which it is rumored the Fascists may shortly abandon in view of their inability to withstand an assault.

German and Italian forces have initiated a new offensive in Libya and important fighting has been reported. The port of Benghazi with about 170

miles of coastal territory has been evacuated by the British on account it is believed of the troops in occupation being greatly reduced by the assistance sent to Greece. Operating from Tripoli with an army estimated at about 20,000 men, the Nazis are supposed to be endeavouring to check British offensive operations in that sector of the North African war front.

The situation in the Balkans, though regarded as exceedingly critical, has not yet experienced any outstanding changes. The threats of an offensive against Greece and the invasion of Yugoslavia still exist but the opinion has been expressed that Herr Hitler's plans have been affected so materially by Yugoslavia's determined position to his demands that he cannot yet decide his future activities, particularly in view of the uncertainty which sur-

WIRELESS NEWS

WASHINGTON. — President Roosevelt has requested Senate to ratify the Pact concluded on the 1st. instant with Mexico to organize a defensive co-operation by both countries and to also guarantee the mutual use of territorial waters, airports and bases.

BUDAPEST. — Two trains loaded with wheat were detained and confiscated by the Yugoslavian authorities while on their way to Italy from Rumania.

THE MIGHTY BRIDGE OF PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT

President's Roosevelt's outstanding speech delivered on the 15th. ultimo has been warmly welcomed by the entire press of Great Britain. The following are some of the comments.

The "Daily Telegraph" — When the history of this war is written, it will adjudge that the most important event from the downfall of France to this critical moment, was the great speech delivered by President Roosevelt on the 15th. March. The President stated that America will assure the survival of the vital "bridge" across the ocean. This is plain speaking, and the world knows that the will and the power to fulfil every word are ample and must assure victory and freedom, be the conflict long or short.

The "London Times" — President Roosevelt has blown into thin air any doubts that many have existed in any part of the world of what the passage of the "Lend Lease Bill" means in this great struggle. The Americans have recognized the dan-

ger which confronts them and have gone into action as a united nation. The speech, which was more than a speech and rather a political event of the first order, was broadcast in fourteen languages, including those of all the countries now occupied and enslaved by Germany.

The Daily Telegraph's Washington Correspondent cabled this comment — President Roosevelt's speech tore the last shreds of neutrality from the foreign policy of the United States. It was learned that under the new programme to be financed by Congress, the number of aeroplanes under contract for delivery to the U. S. Army and Navy as well as to Britain may be doubled approximately. The number ordered, at the present time, amounts to 40,000, but the plans call for the delivery of 75,000 machines by the middle of 1943, and of these 45,000 are to go to Great Britain.

BEAR ONE ANOTHER'S BURDEN

This is a great thought, and when one is urged to bring it particularly to the attention of those who claim it as their fraternal motto, but are, apparently drifting far from it in practice, much more food for consideration is added thereto.

There is an urgent need, at this time, for a greater amount of co-operation among the members of our general public, but more so among those affiliated with the several fraternal and other like organizations. Existing economic conditions have completely changed our financial aspects. None can guarantee the receipt of fixed incomes with which to liquidate accruing liabilities. Many of the members of the different organizations find it exceedingly difficult to meet the prescribed assessments, contributions and other fees, though none are, we

believe, so indigent as to be unable to contribute at least a monthly sum of twenty-five cents for the up-keep of his own liability and to assist others while the storm of depression lasts.

If certain intelligent systematized of methods were placed in operation, such as a chain of entertainments, each group would, we have no doubt, add an appreciable amount, periodically, to their treasury. If each of the estimated seven hundred and fifty members of the thirty odd Units now functioning here donated his twenty five cents as suggested, a tidy sum would be regularly secured without the slightest difficulty or inconvenience being experienced, while affording much benefit to all concerned. The idea is worth trying out.

THE CONSCRIPTING OF BRITISH WOMEN

We note with much interest the report that British women, married or single, between the ages of twenty and twenty-one, are being conscripted for work in the war industries of the United Kingdom. Hundreds of these weaker vessels of our great human family have met untimely deaths as the result of enemy bombings over England, and the present call for their employment in the works connected with the conduct of the war will assuredly further endanger their lives thereby jeopardizing the Empire's future manhood.

In view of the known loyalty and patriotism of Britishers

the world over, we think the Minister of Labour would experience no difficulty in an appeal to the men of the British West Indies for volunteer service in place of the nerve-wrecked and badly scared women. Even in this and other Latin American countries we feel sure there are thousands who yearn to do their bit for their King and Flag, and with the mighty bridge which President Roosevelt's personal efforts have materially aided in erecting across the ocean, there should hardly be any serious experiences encountered in placing the men on the soil of Old England.

MORE OF OUR WORKMEN LEAVE FOR THE CANAL ZONE

Accommodation was secured on the S. S. "Cottica", which sailed from this port on the 29th. ultimo, for a further batch of men contracted for work with the Panama Canal Authorities.

While much enthusiasm was being evinced in connection with the departure of the men and great satisfaction experienced by reason of the good reports received from the Canal Zone, it was rather surprising to hear of the return of two of the youngmen who had gone over with the previous group. According to their own story, there was seemingly no justifiable reason for their hasty retreat; it was plainly a misunderstanding of what was embodied in the term "labourer".

We have been authentically informed that Jamaica is receiving a wonderful financial support from her sons now at work on the Canal project under contracts similar to those con-

cluded with our men. It is stated that during the first three months, when only seven hundred Jamaicans were employed, their cash remittances totalled 7,000 pounds sterling, and that since the number has reached more than two thousand the remittances have developed to such an extent that it became necessary for the government to increase their staff at the Post Office in the city of Kingston to cope with the volume of Money Orders being received.

As cash remittances will also be arriving here in a short while, and having regard to the delays which usually occur in having the Money Orders exchanged for cash on account of the originals having to be sent direct to the Central Office in San Jose, we wish to suggest that the Director General of our Postal Department conclude, if possible, such arrangements as will permit our people receiving payment at the branch of

NEW YORK. — German and Italian diplomats, consuls and other agents have received instructions from their respective governments to prepare to leave the country on a moment's notice. Several have also been instructed to destroy all documents which might be prejudicial if discovered. They were also requested to liquidate their funds.

NEW YORK. — Passengers arriving from Italy declare that Marshall Badoglio had organized a revolutionary movement against Mussolini in the month of January, and on its failing the Marshall took refuge in the Quirinal under the protection of King Victor Emanuel while others complicated in the attempt were sent to the front lines of the war.

LA PAZ. — Deputy Humberto Duchon has requested Congress to initiate criminal proceedings against the representatives of the Standard Oil Company on the charge of Treason for having aided Paraguay during the "Chaco" war.

NEW YORK. — War material to the value of \$ 31,415,000 were exported to Great Britain and her associate Powers during the month of February last. During the same period, shipments to China totalled \$ 6,310,000; to the Dutch East Indies \$ 7,565,000 and to Greece \$ 200,000.

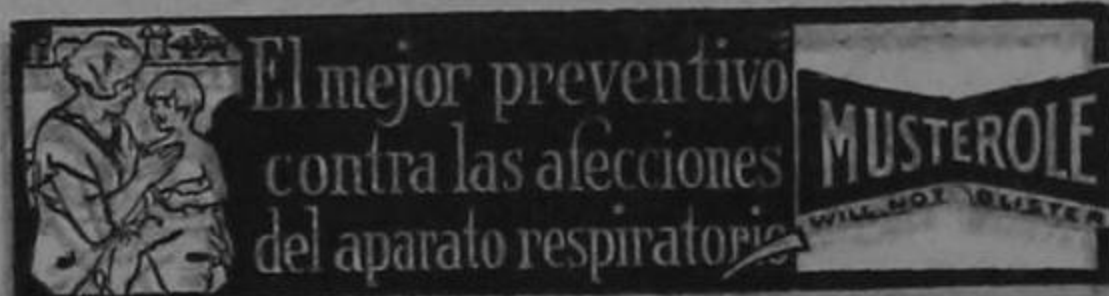

FARM TENANTS ENCOUNTER UNSATISFACTORY TREATMENT

The tenants on the Rio Blanco division of the Alvarado's property known as "Castro" are experiencing a situation unparalleled in their long period of tenancies.

The good old Doctor gave the se lands to the settlers to cultivate Bananas, and contracted with them at twenty cents per count bunch as payment for the use of the lands. They were also advised to plant Cacao which he agreed to buy from them.

After the death of the doctor, his widow assumed the Management and fixed two colones per hectarea per month as the rate for the Cacao and twenty-five cents per count bunch as that for the Bananas.

Though this was rather exorbitant and kept the farmers in a state of continued indebtedness, they were never unduly pressed by the Management. As time went by different gentlemen undertook the management, and though the majority of the tenants made great sacrifices to meet their obligations these efforts were abandoned as unprofitable. Latterly the Police Agent of Liverpool visited San José and returned as owner of the property with plenipotentiary powers. He immediately threatened to embargo all tenants who did not pay their rents promptly each month, even though their farms were not producing anything other than "leaves" for which there is no market.

During the administration of Mrs. Castro, the writer, a tenant for many years, paid as much as six colones per month for rent after the rate of fif-

teen cents (gold) per count bunch. On the failure of the bananas I was left with a few hectares of Cacao; my health then got impaired and as rents were mounting I arranged to sell one of two plots on the instalment plan. I received 150 colones as a first payment and paid C 50.00 to the Manager for rent — this was in September 1940. Since then the man who purchased the plot from me paid something more on the account, but had to eventually give up the place on account of the conduct of the present management. I left the other plot with a neighbour on the half-share basis-my portion to be utilized in paying the rent until the account was cleared. I have however, received the report that Chung Rivera, the Police Agent, has dispossessed the man taken possession, and is reaping the crop.

He is said to have stated that the farm owed rent and as soon as this was cleared, he would hand it back.

I have been residing in this country for more than thirty years and know that her laws are as just and righteous as may be expected of any democratic government. It would therefore, I think, be well if a little more attention were directed to the conduct of some of our local Police Agents who taking refuge behind their governmental authority, endeavour to trample on the rights of law abiding people. It is a terrible hardship for one to live his life cutting down tremendous forests establishing productive farms, even though small, and then to be driven off without the slightest recompense.

From "El Diario de Costa Rica" we glean the information that the government is to be asked to grant subsidies to private colleges and schools.

The Inspector of these institutions, don Carlos Mora Barrantes, is stated to have furnished the Minister of Education with a list of all of them special mention being made of the numerical order of the schools in this Province.

The newspaper article to which we refer also stated that the Commercial School of this city has opened a free preparatory course in the Spanish method of teaching, to which our teachers of colour are invited. We do not think this praiseworthy offer is known general-

The Inspector also suggested that the Minister arrange for government control of the schools by means of special delegates.

SAVAGE BULL ATTACKS CITIZEN

A very grave incident occurred in this city on Saturday afternoon, a week ago.

While walking south of the Playground on her way home from shopping, the attention of Miss Matilde Cameron, a citizen of colour, was incited by shouts of "Look Out". The frightened young woman immediately attempted to run to her residence which was near, but was attacked and thrown to the ground by a savage bull which also gored her several times all over her body.

We understand the animal had just been released from a railway car and was being taken by a lonely man to the slaughter house. On seeing the

woman he rushed at her pulling and the effect that this bull was unable to restrain him until he managed to wrap the end of the rope around a nearby water pipe, thereby saving the unfortunate pedestrian from being killed. Miss Cameron is yet in a very precarious condition. It is not an unusual thing to see unroped cattle being driven along this section of the city, and the fact that his bull was roped raises the presumption that its ferocity was known. The matter is receiving, we understand, the attention of the judicial authorities. We hope Miss Cameron will shortly recover from her injuries.

PANAMA'S COMMERCE TO BE NATIONALIZED

According to press reports the Chinese merchants in Panama are up against the efforts of the Republic's legislators to weed them out of business.

A law is reported under consideration to nationalize all commercial activities throughout the country. Only three or four of the one hundred and forty-one saloons in Panama are now operated by Chinese.

These orientals have also been replaced by natives in the city market. A movement is said to be on foot to incorporate a firm to buy out the stores and saloons conducted in Colon by Chinese for more than three decades.

Panama apparently aims at closing out all alien commercial interests.

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United States Assist Nicaragua's Defence Programme

A large shipment of ammunition is reported to have reached Nicaragua from the United States of America in the interest of the Republic's defence programme. As a precautionary measure against sabotage, all key positions throughout the
