MUY ADELANTADOS SE ENCUENTRAN LOS TRABAJOS DE HIGIENIZACION DE JAMAICA TOWN

LA OBRA QUE SE ESTA REALIZANDO ES DE UNA ENORME IMPORTANCIA HIGIENICA PARA LA CIUDAD DE LIMON. — EL INGENIERO SR. SALAZAR ESTA REALIZANDO UN MAGNIFICO TRABAJO

Hemos tenido oportunidad de visitar las obras de saneamiento que se están realizando en Jamaica Town y hemos podido darnos cuenta del enorme trabajo realizado por el ingeniero señor Salazar a cuyo cargo se encuentran estas obras. La primitiva idea de la Secretaría de Salubridad Pública no era otra que invertir una suma de cincuenta o sesenta mil colones en pequeños trabajos de higienización que era todo lo que podía hacerse con una suma tan pequeña. Pero la visita que hizo a esos trabajos el doctor Phinisse hizo que el presupuesto se extendiera hasta una suma de cien mil colones para dejar algo verdaderamente eficiente. Después, a gestiones del señor Gobernador de la Provincia esa suma fue ampliada a diez mil dólares mas, lo que permite extender los trabajos hasta una casi completa higienización de ese barrio.

Tenemos que agradecer al doctor Phinisse el empeño que ha puesto en todos estos trabajos y las continuas visitas que hace a los mismos en el deseo de que

resulte todo lo beneficiosa que sea posible para la higiene general de la ciudad. El ingeniero señor Salazar a cuyo cargo está todo este importante trabajo, ha realizado una labor admirable, utilizando todos los medios posibles para una obra de esta importancia.

Era nuestra intención publicar algunas fotografías de las obras que se han ejecutado, pero desgraciadamente la premura del tiempo no permitió hacer los grabados correspondientes y no será si hasta dentro de una semana que podamos hacerlo. Para entonces tendremos un completo detalle no solo de lo que se ha realizado hasta el momento, sino del plan general de la obra que abarca muchos aspectos sanitarios, como instalación de cañería, cloacas, desagües, alcantarillas y cordones de aceras. Mientras tanto felicitamos tanto al señor Salazar por el interés que ha puesto en estos trabajos y al doctor Phinisse por la ayuda que el Departamento de Salubridad Americana ha prestado a sus gestiones en favor de la ciudad.

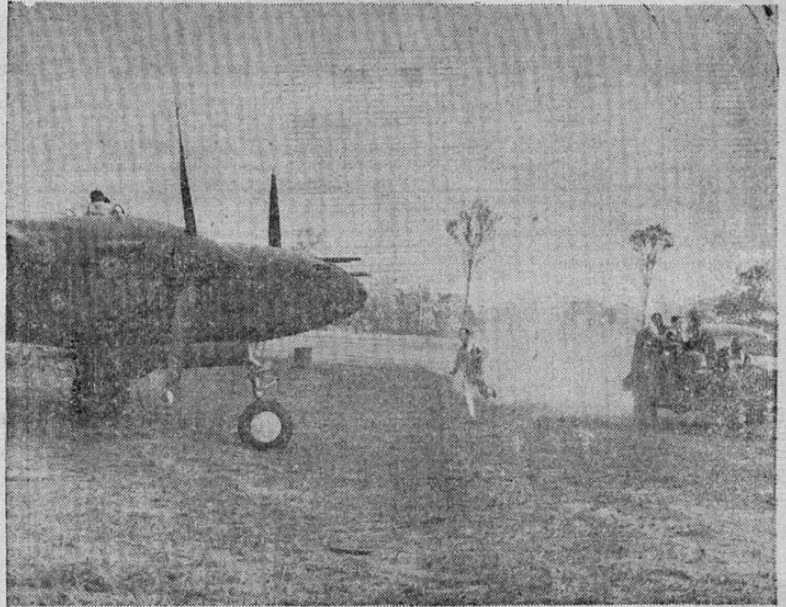
A C 575.686.00 ALCANZARON LOS INGRESOS DE LA Cía. BANANERA EN LIMON DURANTE EL AÑO 1942

año. El descenso de las ventas ha sido constante y considerable, pero sin embargo la patente de la citada compañía debe quedar igual por cuanto sus ventas superan en C 75.686.00 el límite de la clasificación inmediata anterior que la empresa pretende.

UNA NUEVA INDUSTRIA DE BANANO SE ESTABLECERA EN EL PAIS BAJO LA PROTECCION DEL GOBIERNO DE LOS ESTADOS UNIDOS

La Comisión Costarricense de Fomento Interamericano, comprará todo el banano que produce la Zona Atlántica

El señor Secretario de Gobernación se ha dirigido por telégrafo al señor Gobernador de Limón a fin de que averigüe la cantidad aproximada de banano que produce en estos momentos la zona Atlántica, y el precio a que podría pagarse puesto en las plataformas de la línea. No importa ni el grado de la fruta ni la cantidad de manos del racimo. El propósito es comprar toda la cantidad que sea posible para emplearla en una nueva industria que deberá establecerse en el país bajo la protección del Gobierno de los Estados Unidos. El Lic. don Manuel Francisco Jiménez Presidente de la Comisión Costarricense de Fomento Interamericano, es quien está encargado de las gestiones y estudios necesarios para la implantación de la nueva industria.

El señor Gobernador de la Provincia, después de conversar con personas entendidas en los asuntos bananeros informó inmediatamente al Lic. Jiménez Ortiz indicando los precios a que podría obtenerse la fruta sin pérdidas para los finqueros y que al mismo tiempo permita el desarrollo de la industria que se quiere establecer. Ese precio natu-

ralmente no podría ser el mismo que pagaba la compañía Bananera, pero si permitirá el cuidado de la finca y hasta las nuevas siembras de banano. Para los productores de banano las condiciones de venta de la fruta son bastante halagadoras ya

que no habrá rechazos ni límite de grado y se recibirá toda la cantidad que las fincas produzcan. Estas condiciones bajarán en una gran proporción el costo de corta y acarreo. Hasta el momento los cálculos que se han hecho sobre la producción actual de la provincia, sin contar la Barra del Colorado, son de cincuenta mil racimos por semana, pero una vez establecida la industria (Pasa a la Pág. estiman muy justo que se les reconozca tales pérdidas.

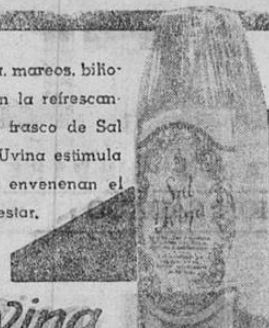

NOTAS EDITORIALES

LA EXPLOTACION NO ES SOLAMENTE A LOS AMERICANOS

En LA TRIBUNA del miércoles pasado el caballero don Mariano Guardia, Secretario de la Junta de Control de las Exportaciones, llama la atención sobre las proporciones alarmantes que ha adquirido en el país la explotación contra los ciudadanos norteamericanos. Cita el caso de habersele cobrado a un grupo de visitantes, ocho colones por un servicio de automóvil que según las tarifas apenas vale dos. El hecho es repugnante no por la ciudadanía de la víctima, sino por el abuso a extranjeros que nos visitan, cualquiera que sea su nacionalidad.

Desgraciadamente no es solo en San José, sino en todo el país donde esa explotación se ha convertido en comercio corriente y no solamente se ejerce contra el turismo que nos visita, sino contra los propios costarricenses en todos los aspectos de la vida económica. En el automóvil, en el cabaret, en la pulpería, en el almacén, en el mercado, en todas partes a donde hay que pagar, la explotación aparece mas o menos disfrazada.

Pretende el señor Guardia que sea el propio comercio el que reaccione en beneficio de los ciudadanos de la nación que está salvaguardando la integridad del continente. Y nosotros pensamos que peca de iluso el señor Guardia si piensa que ha de lograrse una reacción favorable. Mientras el Gobierno no proceda en una forma drástica contra esta clase de explotadores, nada se logrará en concreto. La creación de una Junta de Control de Precios se hace absolutamente indispensable, no solamente para el hecho que apunta el señor Guardia, sino también para el control de los artículos de primera necesidad en donde es necesario defender al público. Mientras la Junta o cualquier otra entidad, debidamente apoyada por las autoridades, no limite a ejemplo de otros países, la utilidad del productor, del vendedor y del agente, nada se gana con las lamentaciones.

La suspensión de garantías individuales decretada por el Congreso no ha sido necesario usarla sino en muy contadas ocasiones. El país ha seguido su misma eterna ruta de libertad completa para todos los ciudadanos. El Gobierno del Doctor Calderón Guardia puede vanagloriarse legítimamente de haber tenido en sus manos una arma tan poderosa, sin haber tenido que usarla en menoscabo de la ciudadanía y de la democracia. Pero este caso de la expeculación desenfrenada, es el más indicado para usarla, a riesgo de que se cometa una que otra injusticia. La situación que estamos atravesando es excepcionalmente grave. Nada ganaremos con buscar remedios mas o menos relativos. El aumento general de sueldos, que se trata de poner en práctica, no hará otra cosa que ensanchar las posibilidades de un alza desmedida en todos los artículos, formando un caos económico de proporciones insospechables.

El cobro indebido de dos o tres colones por un servicio de automóvil que tanto repugna al señor Guardia, no es mas que un granito de arena en la vasta especulación que se ejerce en todos los comercios.

Piensa el señor Guardia que no es mas repugnante que se cobren cuatro colones setenta y cinco céntimos por una libra de manteca, seis colones por una gallina y veinticinco céntimos por un huevo? Se han duplicado acaso los jornales de los vaqueros de las fincas lejanas, o se han sindicalizado las gallinas? Cree el señor Guardia que hay justificación para que se cobre una libra y cinco colones por un par de medias de seda, o los colones cincuenta por un paquete de cigarrillos extranjeros?

Si el señor Guardia una visita a los mercados de San José, Cartago o cualquier otro lugar y entérese de los precios que rigen. Verá entonces como los precios que se cobraron indebidamente a unos caballeros norteamericanos, se van esfumando entre las cosas de las señas de esta voragine nacional.

Varios factores influyeron en la caída del México, pero sobresalieron la superioridad, muy notoria del equipo contrincante y el pésimo arbitraje que realizaron ambos árbitros. Hubo malas jugadas cometidas en ambas ár-

reas del penal que no fueron sancionadas y que produjeron tantos que esas mismas faltas anulaban. Nos abstenemos de puntuali-

zar el arbitraje ya que preferimos no enfrascarnos en este asunto que debido a la falta de árbitros en Limón, puede perjudicar al deporte. Solamente nos resta felicitar muy sinceramente a la Gimnástica y muy especialmente al México que demostró todo lo que es capaz de hacer, en el juego del domingo.

cajo y banano que por falta de caminos están próximos a quedar en la completa ruina. Cahuita, Puerto Viejo y Manzanillo, producen cacao, bananos, hule, maderas de toda clase, granos y frutas de toda clase que les es imposible hacerlas llegar a Limón por falta de caminos, porque si bien es cierto que hay un servicio de cabotaje entre esos lugares y Limón, también es verdad que las lanchas en la mayoría de las veces, no llegan a cada puerto a recoger los productos que cada finquero tiene listos y entonces estos se pierden. De ahí, pues que al finquero no le quedan ganas de trabajar y sembrar. Hace falta pues, caminos, caminos y mas caminos.

Hay una ley general de caminos para toda la república, pero esta ley sólo se ha venido aplicando para el interior de la república y a esta zona se le ha dejado sin ellos como sino fuera parte integrante del territorio nacional. Esto es injusto. ¿Cuánto hace que Limón, se queja de esta falta de otros gobiernos? Ya es tiempo que debía haber un camino de Limón a Cahuita y de Estrella a Talamanca? Nada se ha hecho porque todo son promesas que no se cumplen. Falta mucho que hacer en esta zona por parte del Supremo Gobierno con la ayuda de los habitantes y agricultores, sin esto estaremos siempre en angustias.

La agricultura y el comercio son la base de la riqueza de las naciones pero si no hay protección para estos, ¿cómo puede prospere-

rar la Nación? Ahora bien: para mal de males y matar de una vez a los finqueros y agricultores de la zona de Cahuita, etc. etc., el tranvía que unía a Penshursts con dicha región y que llegaba hasta Hone Creek, ha sido vendido a la United Fruit Company con el fin de pasarlo a Monteverde y es natural como el Puente de hierro que cruza el río para unir a Penshursts con la región de Cahuita es parte de ese tranvía, este también será quitado de donde está, y entonces quedaremos aislados unos con otros y la ruina será mas efectiva. THE ANCESTRAL HOME OF DR. CALDERON GUARDIA

Having regard to His Excellency Dr. Calderon Guardia's recent visit to our neighbouring Republic of Panama, the following, culled from a newspaper published in that country will, we have no doubt, be read with more than passing interest.

PENONOME, capital of the province Coclé, is not a large town as towns go, but it has been the birthplace of a number of Panama's leading citizens, prominent both in public and private life. There is something about the place which seemingly puts zip in those born there under favourable stars at all, perhaps it is because of the soft breezes which blow nearly the year around; perhaps it is because of influences exerted by the surroundings, such, for instance, as one of the Republic's prettiest rivers—the lovely Zarati. Perhaps it is not due to any of these attractions, but rather to innate character handed down through generations since the conquest.

However all this may be, it is most interesting to learn that the grandfather of the President of the Republic of Costa Rica, Dr. Rafael Ángel Calderon Guardia, first saw the light of day in the little city on the Azrafi.

According to the findings of Dr. Hector Conte Bernudez, well-known attorney and local historian and a member of one of Penonome's prominent families, don Victor de la Guardia y Ayala, President Calderon Guardia's grand father, was born in the Coclé capital in the year 1808. In bringing the matter to attention, Dr. Conte provided a copy of the ancestor's baptismal certificate along with some verses written by don Victor de la Guardia y Ayala and published in Panama in the middle of the last century.

The revelation that Costa Rica's President has Panamanian blood in his veins cannot but serve to make the close ties already existing between Panama and her sister Republic all the stronger.

JAPS EVACUATE GUADALCANAL

Owing to the result of the recent naval actions in the area of the Salomon Islands, the Japanese forces, having been drawn from Guadalcanal, the strategic position which they vainly endeavoured to recapture from the North Americans. Their efforts, in this respect, are said to have cost them the lives of 75,000 of their man-power, and the loss of 150 ships and 1,000 airplanes.

The American forces are now in full control of the Island and are strengthening their positions to meet whatever other move the Japs may make.

According to official advices the Japanese left between four and five thousand dead bodies on Guadalcanal.

The enemy forces in New Guinea have been decisively routed it is reported by the North American and Australian troops.

Plans for a general offensive against Japan are supposed to be the principal result of the recently concluded conference between representatives of the Allied Nations held in the East.

But in the face of existing conditions the solicitation was no exaggeration. In this respect we would impress on those immediately concerned that honest, faithful services cannot be obtained from a dissatisfied body of workers.

We are all experiencing the ill effects of the World War, but our labouring people, whose only means of keeping themselves and their families alive is their weekly earnings, do so to a far greater extent. If the earnings of these men cannot meet their very moderate demands, they and theirs must "go under", a contingency which would seriously affect the interests of every employer.

It is sincerely hoped there is yet the possibility of the Matter being adjusted in a manner as will leave all concerned fully satisfied.

HITLER'S GREATEST DEFEAT NEAR AT HAND

Unable to further oppose the Soviet offensive in the Kherkov area which is being attacked from three distinct directions, the Nazis are reported to be evacuating the important city, carrying away all the material possible under violent gun fire from the Russians.

In the Rostov sector the Russians have cut the railway line which could have been used by the retreating Germans, they have also blocked their retirement by way of the Don. The Russians are also making successful progress in their offensive

movement in La Doga. Military circles think there is the possibility of Hitler abandoning Estonia and a part of Latvia.

According to the information released by the United States War Information Department one million and a half of men have just completed their training in Russia and are ready to go to the aid of the forces on the various fighting fronts.

The casualties suffered by the Germans in Kursk are stated to have been exceptionally great.

BY AUTOMOBILE FROM ALASKA TO PANAMA

WASHINGTON. — Advices received recently from El Salvador mention the construction of a bridge over the river Goascoran, at a point where the Inter-American highway which leads from Honduras joins the section from El Salvador. This indicates that within the next few months it will be possible to journey by automobile from Alaska to Panama.

It is further stated that the Administration of public road ways of the United States are co-operating with the Central American Republics for the purpose of hastening the construction of the section between Guatemala and El Salvador.

The one leaving San Jose every Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, for this end will do so at 9.45 a. m. instead of 9.30. These trains are to arrive in San Jose at 1.30 p. m. (15.57), and in this end at 3.40 p. m. (15.40).

ON THE AFRICAN BATTLE FRONT

General Harold Alexander, Commander of the British forces in the Near East, has announced that Egypt and Tripolitania have been completely cleared of enemy troops. The eighth British army, commanded by General Montgomery, now in Tunisia, is rapidly closing up with the remaining force of General Rommel whose only chance of offering opposition will it is said, be in the Gabes region. The Allied Command are, however, said to be concentrating their forces

of troops, tanks and air units for a final offensive against Tunis.

North American air units recently attacked an German air base near the holy city of Kairouan, in the interior of Tunisia, off the port of Sousse. British planes also attacked the southern front.

Unconfirmed reports declare that North American forces have initiated activities against the Rommel army in the Ben

NEWS AND VIEWS

It sounds somewhat ludicrous, yet it is not uncommon to find a home without a dictionary. Its importance in daily life is undisputed; without this treasure of words, modern literature could not be fully appreciated. I always think of the dictionary as a garden of words. You step into a garden—a garden of flowers, in search of your favorite rose; but down the row you see a score or more of other varieties, gracefully displaying their beauty and splendor beneath the gleaming sun. There is the wiff of delectable perfume, and you stand aghast to contemplate the beauty of nature.

Look up a word in a dictionary—any word, and while doing so you glance up and down the page before you. You will soon be looking at dozens of useful words, a knowledge of which would greatly enrich your vocabulary.

There are more than 680,000 words in the dictionary, but luckily, none of us will ever use more than a few thousands of them. Shakespeare, who used more words than any other writer, employed but 16,000; and Milton, who came next, used but 8,000; the ordinary working vocabulary is hardly over 5,000. Unfortunately, this list contains hundreds of troublesome words, which only the dictionary can explain. Additional words appear in every new edition of the dictionary.

Be many become obsolete. For instance, the term "fifth column" practically replaces the word "traitor"—so much used nowadays. General Francisco Franco is credited to have first used the term. During the Spanish civil war he is said to have declared that with our armoured columns by

his side, and a fifth column inside Madrid, he would take the city.

Many of us never go beyond our dictionary to trace the origin or birth of words. See how interesting it is: Many use the word DISASTER without ever thinking of its overtones.—the story tells it, Aster is from a creek word meaning Star. "Dis" is a prefix having a negative meaning—contrary to or against. Hence a disaster is something contrary to the Star—contrary to your Star. The word reminds us that at one time people thought their destinies were governed by the stars. None us believe the flight of a bird can tell us our fortunes; but the Romans did and so gave us the word "auspicious", which comes from "avis"—a bird, and "spicere", to look. Our word "lunatic" is from the latin word "luna", a moon—it was believed that if you stared at the moon too long or let it shine on you when asleep you would be moonstruck. "Vulgar" another word frequently used, is from the latin word "vulgus" which means the multitude, the common people. "Silvage" is from the latin word "silva" via the French, meaning the woods—a savage was merely someone who lived in the woods.

I recently read the story of an English schoolmaster who is convinced that Marshal Semyon Timoshenko, famous Russian general, is the son of Charles Jenkins, a Welsh technician who went to Russia and married a Russian girl. Timoshenko (Timothy Jenkins) is their eldest son. Our words "Capital" and "cattle" come from the same latin word. Hence Capitalism is just an "ism" concerned with cows, sheep, and not as some believe, with bulls and bears.

GOVT. INTERVENES IN PENSHURST TRAMLINE MATTER

With feelings of the highest appreciation, we mention the receipt of the information of the Government's intervention in the matter of the lifting of the tram line which connects the one-time great banana producing farm of Penschurt with the Hone Creek and other regions. The step is said to have been initiated by the Minister of Agriculture in response to representations from this end. It has been

further mentioned that the Secretary of State has taken up the matter with the parties principally concerned for the purpose of avoiding the lifting of the lines which, if allowed, will, we are assured, mean the isolating of a large number of the people who inhabit those regions and seriously interfere with their agricultural activities and our economic interests.

OUR CONTINENTAL DEFENCES

A large number of new batteries, airplane detectors, and auxiliary aerodromes are reported to be fully established in our neighbouring Republic of Panama, by virtue of the arrangements concluded with the United States of America. The new installations were commenced last May. Their principal objective is the defence of the vital zones of the Panama Canal. These defensive projects are supported by moveable land forces and an arch of aerial and coastal defences, maintained by the Republics of the Caribbean.

The coasts of Panama, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Cuba, Haiti, the Dominican Republic and the British Colonies toward the Caribbean Sea, are the regions most strongly defended in the Americas. Constant vigilance is

maintained against attacks by air, land or sea as also against sabotage. To strengthen the lines of communication with the Panama Canal, the thousand kilometre highway, to link the meridional frontier of Mexico, is said to be under rapid construction. This highway will connect with the Mexican railroad and facilitate land transportation between the United States and the Canal Zone. The Canal's aerial equipment, with its squadrons of potent bombing and fighting planes, patrol constantly over the air bases established in the forest. Some of these "human birds" scout over this country at frequent intervals. Other powerful installations along the coast-lines serve to strengthen the aviation and infantry garrisons of our Continental Defence.

PACIFIC LABOUR DISCONTENT STILL UNDER DISCUSSION

Growing out of the recent disturbance among the workers of the Pacific Banana Zone, we understand that several further conferences have been held between representatives of the Government and the Management of the Banana Company, with the view of permanent-

ly solving the entire question. The High Executive is also reported as giving the most careful consideration to the ways and means as will provide the workers in those regions with a more satisfactory standard of living.

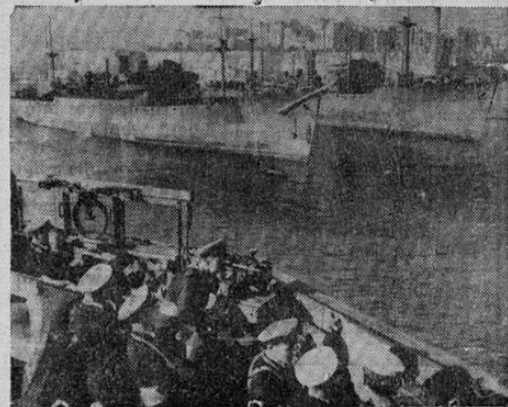

A VALUABLE PLANT DISCOVERY

The Island of Jamaica is the recipient of a great plant discovery. It is reported that after much scientific study, Mr. J. B. Sutherland, the Island's Agricultural Instructor, has produced an "Immune" Banana Plant. Its value as a product and an article of export, has been established, we are told.

The Island's governing authorities have, we gather, accepted the plant and directed that it supersede the other which is so much affected by the Panama and Sigatoka diseases. A grant of five hundred pounds sterling has been extended Mr. Sutherland by the government, in addition to a salary of £ 900.

It may be recalled that some time ago Mr. Sutherland accompanied Mr. Thielwell, the present Secretary of the Jamaica Agricultural Society, on a visit to this country.

The discovery will undoubtedly be a great boon to Jamaica and its agricultural interests. It is understood that the immune plant is not to be sent out the Island.

With his sickle in hand, Death is ever grasping for the beautiful, the lovely, the rich or the poor, and while he effects his rounds, no one can say who will be his next victim. We should, for this "if no other reason,

The sting of the great Destroyer was, doubtless, wholly distant from the thought of Mr. Wilfred Leopold DeLeon, when, on the morning of Monday last, he left his residence to partake of his breakfast prior to assuming the day's responsible duties at the local Customs Department. His summons had, however, already been prepared, and it reached him while seated at the table awaiting his meal. He succumbed instantaneously. So well and widely regarded was he that the news of his sudden passing into eternity was rapidly winged throughout the city, and in a few minutes teeming dozens of friends and sympathizers were on the scene.

The late Mr. DeLeon was of British nationality, and born in the parish of St. Catherine in the Island of Jamaica. He lived in this city for more than a score and a half of years, during which period he gained the highest respect and recognition. He possessed a comprehensive summary of useful knowledge reading was his greatest habit. In addition to his immediate associates our democratic institutions have lost a true friend and defender.

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SOLDIERS OF PRODUCTION

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

NATIONAL SOCIALISM

On January 30th, 1933, Hitler came into power. Since that time the German people have been under his complete domination. What have they gained by it? What has Hitler brought them?

HE BROUGHT WAR. Hitler promised peace over and over again. On October 10th, 1933, he said: "As a National Socialist on the ground of our principles, I refuse to conquer and annex with blood the lives of those who are dear to us, the people of other nations." By unprovoked aggression and annexation of Austria, Czech-Slovakia and Poland, Hitler brought the whole world to war. As to his own people nearly 5,000,000 Germans have lost their lives in foreign battlefields.

HE BROUGHT MALNUTRITION. The average German consumer received 15% less caloric value in 1937 than in 1927. In 1937 20% less fresh milk, 7.2% less total fats, 17% less meat, 36% less fruit and vegetables, were consumed by working class families than in 1927.

HE BROUGHT DISEASE. The number of cases of scarlet fever, infantile paralysis and dysentery have risen 200% in these ten years. The mortality of children between the ages of one and five has increased by 12%, and that of children between five and ten by 25%. Examination of the Hitler Jugend in 1938, showed 70% foot deformities. Under the Weimar Republic there was one doctor for every 1,300 people. In 1941 there was one per 15,000.

HE BROUGHT SLAVERY. The Nazis abolished Trade Unions August 1933, seizing their funds and arresting their leaders. In 1934 the Labour Front was created with virtually compulsory membership. This resulted in the abolition of Works Committees and the abolition of workers' rights to strike.

During six pre-war years the status of the workers showed a steady deterioration. Overtime became the rule. Industrial accidents mounted from 327,609 in 1932 to 1,766,000 in 1938. Even in peacetime, workers were subjected to the most severe restrictions. The Decree of 1938 stated that: "All Germans can be obliged by the President of the Labour Board to work at any place assigned them for any period".

HE BROUGHT DISTRESS. By the law of land inheritance of October 1933, half a million peasants' sons no longer had any claim on their fathers' farm holdings. The peasants' incomes have declined. In 1939 almost a million less men were employed on the land than in 1932. Since 1939 the number has steadily gone down.

CAPTAIN SAVES LINER

By pretending his torpedoed ship, the liner *Laguna*, was sinking, Capt. Grant Hoodwinked a U-Boat commander and sailed the vessel 1,600 miles to port.

When the torpedo struck, the cargo helped to keep the ship afloat—but the German commander of the U-boat was not so fortunate.

The Navy caught and rammed his tin-fish—and when Captain Grant, who lives at Kinross road, Waterloo, Liverpool, brought his "torpedoed" ship to port, he saw a naval vessel bring in the U-boat commander who had "sunk" the liner.

The bluff that tricked the Nazis was simple. Captain Grant ordered "Stand by to abandon ship".

The U-boat commander submerged, apparently satisfied that another British liner had gone to the bottom.

That was his big blunder. The "sunk" liner was very much afloat.

"CREW WERE GRAND"

"There was not a whisper of complaint from a single member of my crew", said Captain Grant. "They were grand the way they went about the job of saving the ship".

In spite of the gaping hole which the torpedo made, the *Laguna* lost only 250 tons of her 8,000 tons of cargo.

When the *Laguna* met her torpedo she was No. 24 in a convoy.

After her repairs she joined another convoy for the homeward-bound trip and was again No. 64.

Her cargo was described as "something that will give the Axis a headache".

U. K. HEALTH EXCELLENT

London, Feb. — The high standard of health maintained in the United Kingdom has greatly impressed the American medical authority Dr. Sydenstricker, who has just spent a year studying wartime nutritional and rationing policies in England, states the leading Georgia newspaper "Atlanta Constitution". "What is perhaps the most remarkable aspect — Dr. Sydenstricker states — is the skill with which child health is being maintained. It was feared at the beginning of the war that tuberculosis, the surest index of a nation's health standards, might rise sharply as it has done in Germany and in German-occupied countries. The health figures published in 1942 have more than dispelled this fear. They show that among British children there is an incredibly slight percentage of tuberculosis cases. Throughout 1941 only 1,1516 deaths occurred from all forms of tuberculosis between children up to fifteen years of age. As there are 10,250,000 children in Britain under fifteen, this represents a negligible percentage of only 0.00015. Even the total number of cases of tuberculosis notified in the vital age group from

IN QUEST OF WORLD PEACE

GREAT IDEALS OF WILSON AND ROOSEVELT

Two Presidents of the U. S. A. in this century, Thomas Woodrow Wilson and Franklin Delano Roosevelt, will always be held in honour by those who care for freedom and peace.

Woodrow Wilson was President during the first Great War. A professor before entering politics, he was a highminded, intelligent, benevolent man, who hated war, and strove to keep America neutral. But the intolerable tyranny of the Germans at length made neutrality impossible for a free nation, and the U.S.A. entered the war on our side in 1917, to "make the world safe for democracy".

A Step Forward

The idea of the League of Nations was Wilson's creation, and it was he who insisted on its insertion in the Treaty of Versailles. Although through the folly, laziness and wickedness of the nations the League has not been wholly successful—hitherto, to have tried to put into practice at all was a tremendous step towards world peace.

Franklin Delano Roosevelt was Assistant Secretary of the U.S. Navy during the last war. After the war he was struck down by a form of paralysis, but by a supreme moral and physical effort he dominated his disability and continued his political career.

He was elected President in 1932, during a great economic depression, and at once began his New Deal, spending huge sums on farm relief and construction programmes to provide employment.

The Four Freedoms

Mr. Roosevelt's ideal world, as he told Congress in 1941 is "founded upon four essential freedoms: freedom of speech and freedom from fear". While worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear". While America was still neutral in the war, his openly declared policy was to give all possible material aid to the nations resisting aggression. On August 14, 1941, Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Churchill met at sea in the Atlantic, and drew up, as they said, certain common principles on which they base their hopes of a better future for the world — the declaration known as the Atlantic Charter.

On December 7, 1941, Japan attacked the American fleet in Pearl Harbour, and America became our ally against the Axis powers.

ANGLO-AMERICAN ACCORD

London, Feb.—The justious rumour that the British authorities are muddying the waters of French North African politics in order to replace General Eisenhower with a British general, has been denied, on behalf of the British Government, by Mr. Clement Attlee, and this denial cannot be repeated too often. The vicious treasonable rumour that prompts it has a strong, authentic stench of Nazi propaganda, aiming at the disruption of the excellent relations between Britain and the United States.

It has also been suggested that criticism in the British press of the political situation in French North Africa has been inspired by the British Government for the same purpose. This is of course equally false. The British Government has no more control over the British press than the United States administration has over the American press.

The British Government is in full agreement with the Government of the United States that whatever arrangements are made now, even if ideally satisfactory to the United Nations and to the people of French North Africa, they do not create a commitment by the United Nations in the future. The post-war government of French territory can be decided only after they have been liberated by the French people—and only after they have been liberated by the victory of the United Nations over the Axis powers.

"FRITZ" JOINED CHARGE

This is a story of a German non-commissioned officer who, fed up with the Nazis, wished to become British.

He was captured during some of the heaviest fighting in Tunisia by men of a famous British regiment, and though later offered his freedom preferred to risk his life with his captors. Fritz, as the men of the regiment christened him, said he was very happy to be a prisoner.

TOLD TO HIDE.

He remained in the front line during heavy fighting doing odd jobs and helping with the cooking until he could be sent to a prisoners' camp.

The regiment, however, found itself surrounded on three sides by the enemy, and had to charge out.

Before the charge Fritz was told he had better hide in the hills until after the attack and then rejoin his own regiment, as he British were unable to take him further.

Fritz agreed, and the charge took place, the British breaking through the enemy.

When the troops re-formed and the roll was called, out stepped Fritz.

He had taken part in the charge.

BRITISH WORLD LEADERSHIP

London, Feb.—"The political and dynamic quality of British leadership is of paramount importance for the shaping of post-war world" states the Zealand newspaper "Wellington Evening Post." "Prime Minister Churchill's flights, in which is politically a pioneer, world events", the paper goes on to say. "Everything coned with his recent flight Casablanca to Turkey and 'Turkey to Tripoli shows history is writing a new and is approaching blank page on which will be written that may decide the trend of the twentieth century. NAZIS ATTACK CATHOLICS

London, Feb.—The Nazi in Holland has started a series of attacks on the Catholic bishops in that country, religious newspaper "The Tablet" reports, on account of opposition shown by the Catholic hierarchy to the compulsory labour service. "Evidence from private sources—The Tablet goes on—shows that the Catholic bishops have a good reason for opposing this forced labour. The sending of workers to Germany is a real forced deportation, as there is not even any differentiation between the workers who have jobs and those who are unemployed. When the dual or black-coated workers are deported in this way, in Holland, they are told just before leaving that they will not pay unless they sign a "voluntary contract".
