EL GENERAL CLARK INICIA SU ASALTO CONTRA NAPOLES

ARGEL, 24. UP. — Mark Clark inició hoy su ofensiva en gran escala contra Nápoles. Tanto el 5 como el octavo ejército avanzan constantemente y han logrado ocupar dos ciudades. Las tropas del teniente general Clark ocuparon la ciudad montañosa de Oliveto Citra, a 38 kilómetros al este de Salerno y 16 al sudeste de Acerno. Matera, a 57 kilómetros al noroeste de Tarento cayó en poder de las tropas británicas, lo que representa un avance de algo más de 17 kilómetros desde Ginosa — ya ocupada. Las tropas aliadas realizaron una incursión contra el pueblo de Valona en la costa de Albania. Se hundieron a dos barcos enemigos. Los bombarderos aliados operaron anoche contra el norte de Italia, donde atacaron las instalaciones ferroviarias y aeródromos de Pisa.

LA NUEVA LINEA ALEMANA ES EL DNEIPEP

MOSCU, 24. UP. — Al llegar las fuerzas rusas a la región de Ucrania el comunicado ruso incluyó por primera vez la ciudad de Kremenchug indicando que el ataque se dirige hacia ella. Se trata de un acudid bastante grande, sobre la orilla oriental del Dnieper 90 kilómetros al sudeste de Poltava y 100 kilómetros aguas arriba de Dnieperpetrovsk. Rechazados hasta el Dnieper por ese sector del sur de Ucrania, queda ahora por ver si los alemanes tratarán de resistir en dicho río con Kiev como centro de la nueva línea.

MOSCU, 24. UP. — Según las últimas informaciones del frente, las fuerzas rusas están a 16 kilómetros al este de Kiev y las avanzadas soviéticas han llegado al Dnieper en varios puntos. Las fuerzas rusas se han colocado a 16 kilómetros al este de Dnieperpetrovsk y a 13 al sudeste de Kremenchug, según lo hacen saber informaciones recibidas en ésta.

TRES LOCALIDADES MAS OCUPARON LOS ALIADOS

CUARTEL GENERAL ALIADO EN ARGELIA, 24. UP. — Se informa que fueron ocupadas las localidades de Matera, a 18 kilómetros al Norte de Ginosa, así como Oliveto y Citra a 10 kilómetros al NE. de Campagna.

EVACUACION DE SMOLENSK Y VITEBSK

ESTOCOLMO, 24. UP. — Las fuerzas alemanas están evacuando a Smolensk y Vitebsk, según el corresponsal de la agencia Telegráfica Sueca en Berlín.

BONIFACIO Y PORTO VECCHIO CAPTURADAS POR LOS FRANCESES

ARGEL, 24. UP. — Se informa oficialmente que las tropas francesas ocuparon Bonifacio y Porto Vecchio en la isla de Córcega.

EVACUADO EL CAUCASO

LONDRES, 24. UP. — Los alemanes admiten que se están retirando del Cáucaso, según la BBC y han anunciado que ya evacuaron sus equipos pesados, instalaciones militares y a los civiles.

NOTAS EDITORIALES

**SOLO ESO NOS FALTABA**

La Northern Railway Co. avisa en los periódicos de esta semana, que a partir del seis de octubre entrante, la tarifa de pasajes en los trenes de esa empresa será de 0.107 por milla en primera clase y 0.0757 en segunda.

Hechos los cálculos, a base de un trayecto de 102 millas que es la distancia más o menos entre Limón y San José, resulta el pasaje en lo que con tanto optimismo denomina la Empresa PRIMERA CLASE diez colones noventa y un centavo y cuatro centésimos. Es decir, diez colones noventa centavos si la empresa se resuelve a perder la diferencia por falta de moneda fraccionaria. El pasaje de segunda alcanzará a siete colones ochenta y dos centavos.

Este aumento de treinta por ciento en los pasajes de ferrocarril en los momentos angustiosos porque atraviesa la ciudad y toda la provincia empeorará nuestra situación que es ya bastante mala. El mayor precio de los pasajes restará visitantes a Limón y limitará el movimiento comercial que es una de las pocas fuentes de vida que tenemos.

Hace ya tiempo sabíamos nosotros que la nueva Administración de esa empresa estaba aplicando lastarifas de fletes con el mayor rigor posible, aprovechando cuanta circunstancia se presentara en su propio beneficio. A esas horas ha resultado necesario un conocimiento profundo de tarifas, circulares y bonificaciones, hechos por la empresa en el curso de muchos años, para conseguir fletes equitativos. Pero todos estos pequeños detalles estaban justificados por la situación anormal que vive el mundo.

La elevación de los pasajes no admite defensa posible. Hay que pagar lo que nos cobran. La Empresa seguramente ha revisado los contratos que rigen su actuación y está plenamente amparada a sus derechos. Pero se nos ocurre que así como la crisis económica - resultado inevitable de la guerra- obligó al Gobierno a fijar precios para los artículos de primera necesidad y a limitar ganancias al comercio, podría también defender al público contra el aumento de los pasajes.

No hay que olvidarse que en la meseta central, hasta Turrialba, el público puede prescindir del ferrocarril usando automóviles, camiones, bicicletas, caballos o simplemente la vieja carreta de nuestros abuelos. En esa región del país hay caminos veredas o simplemente trillos que facilitan el tránsito para las gentes pobres.

Aquí no hay otro camino que la trocha de Limón a Portete. Guápiles, Siquirres, La Estrella, y todos los lugares que son centros de población y de cultivo no tienen otra vía de comunicación que el ferrocarril de la Northern.

Si se han regulado los precios de la carne, de la leche, del maíz, de los frijoles, del zinc para construcciones y del cemento, tratando de evitar el alza en el costo de la vida, parece natural también que se regule el precio de los transportes como parte esencial de la vida, sobre todo en esta provincia donde dependemos exclusivamente de la Northern.

Por poca visión que se tenga de este problema no es posible olvidar que el aumento de un treinta por ciento en los pasajes hará subir

## NAPLES DESTROYED BY GERMANS

Making ready to flee the important city of Naples before the effective advance of the victorious Allied troops, the Germans are reported to destroyed everything which could have been of value to the Allies. They are however supposed to be constructing defence systems in the vicinity to the south and east of the city.

Refugees reaching the Allied lines declare that thousands of the civilian population were killed and the electrical and water services destroyed. They also state that the atrocities committed by the Germans have been much worse than those of Varsovia. About thirty ships, laying at anchor in the harbour have been sunk to impede the Allied activities.

## AN EXAMPLE NOT TO BE IGNORED

Our attention has been called to the fact that on becoming suspicious of the health conditions of the Chinese retail trader, who operated in their midst, the residents of Andoval, a village along the Cent Branch railway line, and the matter brought to the notice of the Health authorities. The investigation which followed, disclosed that the man, who had been handling the people's food stuffs, was infected with some of the most dangerous and germ spreading physical disorders.

This should serve as an urge for a general campaign throughout this province and

elsewhere, regardless of who the traders may be. In fact, the Public Health regulations in force, obligate, we think, each caterer of our food stuffs to be possessed of a duly authenticated health certificate. This requirement should be sigidly to the main. As a further to the maintenance of our community's good health might it not be possible for our Municipal Fathera to inaugurate a regulation requiring the presentation of a clean Bill of Health by each person who applies for a trade license or the renewal of an existing one.

### RUSSIANS PUSHING TOWARD KIEV

Conditions grow worse each day for the Nazi forces in Russia. After having liberated more than nine hundred localities during the past couple of days, the Soviet armies are reported on the point of obtaining some of their most prized objectives since starting their sensational summer campaign.

The important and strategic positions of Kiev, Dnepropetrovsk, Gomel and Smolensk are now directly threatened and their fall are expected shortly. Kiev is being subjected to a pressure of steel from the north, the east and the south.

In the extreme south of the fighting line the port of Anapa, one of the last occupied by the enemy in the Caucasian region, has been captured by the Soviets who are now

advancing toward the strait of Kerch.

Poltava, in the heart of Ukraine, and the stronghold which protected the northern area of the River Dnieper, has been abandoned by the Nazis.

Demidov, one of the most powerful centers in the German defence has also fallen in the hands of the Russians. This victory increases, it is said, the danger which hangs around Smolensk. The territory of White Russia is also reported penetrated in the direction of Gomel.

The Germans are reported abandoning Smolensk and Vitebsk as also the Caucasian area. The Soviets are said to have reached the River Dnieper despite the stern enemy resistance, they were forced to beat a retreat.

II—In consequence, on the request of the Rubber Development Corporation, the Ministry of Agriculture desires the traders who purchase Rubber.

#### TO KNOW THAT

- 1.—The official price for Rubber in "borruca", the shrinkage of which is estimated at not more than 25 per cent, is ₡ 150.00 per quintal, in the producing Zones in the interior of the country.
- 2.—The official price for Rubber in "borruca," the shrinkage of which is estimated at more than 25 per cent, is ₡ 130.00 per quintal, in the producing Zones in the interior of the country.
- 3.—In NO CASE will Rubber be accepted which has a shrinkage greater than 40 per cent.
- 4.—The adulteration of Rubber with mud, wood, stones, etc., will be punished in conformity with the law.
- 5.—These dispositions become effective on the 30th. day of September 1943 throughout the Republic.

# BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

## CONFUSION REIGNS IN RHINELAND

In western Germany, the dislocation, confusion, dismay and discouragement among the people were revealed by a review of the massive Allied attacks based on air pictures of the battered towns and reports from neutral and enemy sources.

"All sources of information report that there been a catastrophic fall in morale and conditions since the spring of this year. The greatest problem of all is the question of the bombed-out populations of the big cities. 'It is becoming increasingly impossible for the authorities to deal with this, and Germany will be faced to face with a really grave crisis on this score alone'. Corroboration has now been received of the "general effectiveness of small-scale Mosquito attacks on the German capital. 'The utter fatigue prevalent among the Berlin population is apparent'.

"Fresh details were given of the attacks on Essen. 'The attitude of the workers added to the difficulties from the actual damage made it difficult to restart stricken Krupps. Referring to the attack on Wuppertal on May 29, fires were still raging at noon the following day and 'the efficiency of the civil services was considerably impaired by the fact that high officials were already absent in the countryside'.

"Among the effects of Allied night and day blows against the Nazi transport system were: Complete stoppage of barge traffic on the Rhine from the Ruhr to Basle, Rhine barge traffic in the direction of Holland delayed for a week, coal traffic cut a third. Fifteen thousand tons of bombs were dropped by the R. A. F. in June.

## NEGRO SKY FIGHTERS

Alfred Rosenberg, the mad philosopher of the Nazi racial creed, has a new worry which he explained to the conference of Axis satellite and stouge journalists which was lately held in Vienna. It puzzled them he whimpered that "These Yankees even fly their bombers with Negroes sitting in them." And, presumably to keep his 'philosophy' straight, he added "this shows to what a low level American culture has fallen."

We fully understand that the subject of bombers must be distinctly preying to Herr Rosenberg and after several years of burning books by negro authors, banning songs by negro singers and sterilising any of France's brave negro troops that his little Gestapo boys could catch, we can further appreciate his feelings when he learned that negro pilots might be flying over his bomb-shelter in coming nights. Just how short of the mark Herr Rosenberg is, probably not even he fully realised.

## THE SAGA OF OLD MAN MACLEOD

Old Man MacLeod, like all his ancestors on rugged Scotland, was a fisherman all his life — until war began. Then he lifted his nets for the last time, called his son and his daughter together and told them he was taking a different job. Old Man MacLeod was "going to sea". And he went Able Seaman aboard one of Britain's tramps. But he did not go alone. Young MacLeod, pointing out that the sea was in his veins too, decided to go along with his father. They sailed together.

When the torpedo hit the ship, Old Man MacLeod was below. He was trapped and both his legs were broken. The ship was sinking and Old Man MacLeod struggled to climb through a hole to the deck. He failed and fell back on his fractured legs. Someone threw him a rope and he was pulled aboard. Lifeboats were launched, but Old Man MacLeod refused help. He crawled along the sloping deck and reached the mate's lifeboat. His son was in that boat and land was far off.

So the old fisherman, wise in sail and sea and weather, sailed the ship to land. And all the time he knew he was dying. Party the story of Old Man MacLeod was told when it was announced that he had been awarded posthumously Lloyd's War Medal for Bravery at Sea. The other part was in a letter to the ship's owners, a letter passed on to Isabel MacLeod, who waited for news of her father and brother in Stormyway. "While lying in the boat he handled the foresheet and halyards and advised the officer in charge about sailing," says Lloyd's citation. "When rescued he smoked a pipe and joked with the doctor. He showed great courage and a fine spirit throughout, although he knew he had not long to live."

And of Old Man MacLeod, as he was known by owners and shipmates alike, the letter said:

"He was a very brave gentleman. Despite his fractured legs, he slid down the boat falls into the lifeboat. ## "ATTACK, ATTACK AGAIN"

In olden times a general named Alexander had himself proclaimed a god in self-recognition of his military ability. Today, there is a successful commander of the same name who hides his light under a bushel and prefers to have his subordinates take all the credit. He is General Sir Harold R. L. G. Alexander.

It was Alexander who supervised that tough disciplinarian and hard-hitting army commander, Sir Bernard Montgomery. It was Alexander who physically welded the Americans, British and French, with their air forces, into one coordinated entity capable of victory. Alexander waited a long time to put into execution his formula: "Attack, attack and attack again". Since a year ago, however, when Prime Minister Churchill placed him in charge of Britain's forces in the Middle East, he has had his face set constantly toward Berlin. In his favorite field uniform of breeches, high boots, jacket with red facings and cap with red band, this Irishman reminds one of a deadly, poised rapier. His outstanding feature, cold blue eyes, capable of freezing under stress, point to the steel in his character. He has a fine smile, but when those hard eyes turn really cold his subordinates feel the inherent authority he possesses. His voice is soft and melodious until he wants to emphasize a point. Then it becomes clipped and brittle. A champion athlete who always has kept in tip-top shape, he moves with a light rhythm and balance that point to another facet of his character. Alexander never allows himself to be upset.

Even though they may never see him, men at the front sense, to the point of knowing, whether a commander is handling them well or badly. When Alexander commands, a feeling of confidence gradually seeps through his forces. Through his ability, rather than his personality, he makes his force felt. At places like Matruh and Mareth he planned the break-through against the Africa Corps, then went into the background and let his lieutenants carry out his instructions. Alexander's genius is in the massing of all arms. He believes that artillery, tanks, infantry and planes all have their particular job to do in battle and he sees that their functions are coordinated properly. He not only hits with concentrated strength; he exploits with utmost rapidity any advantages gained by a body blow. It is in the following that many otherwise fine generals fail, as the military record shows. Put in another way, Alexander has become an expert in blitzkrieg, a man who thus far had beaten the German generals at their own game. French, Italian, German, Russian and Urdu he speaks fluently. A man of wide interests, during the peace period, as a hobby, he painted water colors, studied science.

## THEY FEAR THE LIGHT

Nothing in the Nazi regime is more horrible than its war on the mind and the spirit. Both in Germany and in the occupied countries the attempt has been consistently made to control and pervert the Church, the school and the Press. Professors and teachers are dismissed, universities are closed, books are destroyed, the newspapers are muzzled. Persecution and death strike, among the first at ministers of religion, teachers and writers.

In Germany it is the mass production of Nazis that is the aim. In the occupied lands by destroying higher education and starving the minds and souls of the young, the Nazis hope to breed a race of obsequious slaves. These are strong words but unhappily they are not too strong. The evidence is irrefutable and damning. The Nazis fear the light because their deeds are evil.

## MAIMED — HE CARRIED ON!

When the Canadian Corvette "Weyburn" was sunk during an engagement in the Mediterranean her personnel was saved by a British destroyer. There were many wounded including a Canadian officer whose foot had been crushed. Lt. P. R. C. Evans, R. N. V. R., the Surgeon aboard the destroyer had the Canadian officer on the operating table when the sinking Corvette's depth-charges detonated and threw the ship out of the water like a cork. The impact was so terrific that it snapped the legs of many of the men standing on the steel deck. Both the surgeon's ankles were broken. Despite his injuries, Lt. Evans, now a hospital case himself, performed a completely successful amputation of the Canadian officer's foot. Later, he attended more than fifty other casualties, regardless of his own agony. This silent war hero is now recovering in a Gibraltar hospital among most of the crew members whom he treated. The Canadian officer is also recovering in a British hospital.

## AS GOOD AS A PANZER

Complacency is Victory's foe and Dr. Goebbels' friend. There is nothing that twisted little man would like to hear more than rumour of "the war's as good as over" type spreading round. It would be as good as a new panzer division in the German war effort. Here are some simple rules, the observance of which kills rumour dead. (1) Never repeat a rumour. (2) Do not repeat a rumour verbally even to deny it. (3) If you know the facts which can deflate a rumour, cite the facts promptly. (4) If you do not know the facts which can stop rumour, ask the rumourer where he got his facts. (5) Don't give a rumour the benefit of any doubt.

Our watchword should be: Let the facts speak for themselves. Our feet are marching along the

## THE GREAT LEAD

The springs of greatness finally, as they do in Winston Churchill, in the conviction that he must serve the country that he must do what is right, whether or not he is successful. That was how he spent the darkest hours of 1940 and 1941. When none could calculate the future of Britain, he settled the issue on the grounds of honor and of duty. It was the way of greatness. In supreme moments, he speaks terms like duty, truth, and become the measure of decision. Mr. Churchill is not only the Prime Minister of Great Britain. He is also one certainly authentic example of greatness in a man who moves among Churchill's special gift, which enhances all the others, is moral quality; he draws out of their meanness. And even his wrath against the enemy which is awe-inspiring, that is not the malice of the man but the chivalry of a good warrior.

In these energies of the spirit, he radiates upon the world in which we are engaged an habitual vision of greatness. The war as he reveals it is not only strategy and tactics and production, not mere series of bombings, landings, ship movements, factory schedules, rationing, taxes, but the historic drama of our century. Nations do not wage a war of this magnitude unless they carry them in their minds, hearts such a measure of depth and its scope.
