ESTATUTOS DE LA "COOPERATIVA DEL CACAO, MIXTA, I. R. S.

Capítulo primero

Disposiciones Generales

ARTICULO 1º.— Bajo el nombre de COOPERATIVA DEL CACAO, MIXTA R. S. se constituye una sociedad comunitaria en la ciudad de Limón, Costa Rica, con los siguientes propósitos fundamentales:

a) Producir y transportar el cacao de conformidad con las mejores condiciones técnicas y materiales, para obtener así un artículo seleccionado, uniforme y capaz de competir ventajosamente en los mercados del exterior;

PROGRAMA DE REALIDADES DEL nuevo Arzobispo de WESTMINSTER

El acontecimiento católico de la semana en Londres ha sido el de la toma de posesiones de la Sede Primacial de Westminster por el nuevo Arzobispo, Mgr. Bernard Griffin. La gran solemnidad ha tenido lugar en la fiesta de la Catedral de San Pedro en Roma. El acto ha revestido un carácter casi doméstico, puramente diocesano, sin el fausto de las grandes recepciones o de las delegaciones oficiales del Gobierno y Jerarquía Católica Nacional. Todo ello va bien con el carácter del nuevo Pastor, hombre de acción, inteligencia clara, decisiva, que va a los problemas directamente y con un realismo sorprenden-

te. La víspera de su "entronización" visitó privadamente el Parlamento Británico, entreteniéndose con 15 diputados acerca del proyecto de ley sobre la Educación, que iba a ser presentado a la Cámara dos días más tarde. El día del debate, los Parlamentarios vieron sorprendidos que el joven Prelado tomaba asiento en la Galería de Visitantes distinguidos. Es que el proyecto de Ley está íntimamente ligado con los intereses católicos. El gesto del Arzobispo no ha tenido precedentes hasta ahora.

En su toma de posesión leyó desde su Trono unas cuartillas que resumían su programa de primer Jerarca católico de Inglaterra. Todos quedamos sorprendidos al escucharle en tonos que más bien parecían una declaración ministerial que un sermón común corriente.

Entra en la serie de los grandes Arzobispos de Westminster en una época grave, que ha de traer profundos cambios en la vida de las naciones. La guerra ha planteado problemas que es menester sean mirados cara a cara. Ante todo dijo, hay que reconstruir el hogar, la familia que tanto ha

sufrido con el obligado alejamiento de sus miembros del color de sus casas. Mejor acondicionamiento higiénico de las viviendas, salario suficiente y digno para respaldar la felicidad de los padres con sus hijos, garantía de respeto a los derechos del obrero, como persona humana, jefe de una familia y productor de bienes para la sociedad.

Dos días antes se despedía Mgr. Griffin de unos trabajadores en Birmingham, y al término de su charla, se le acercó un obrero a decirle: "Monseñor, V. se va a ocupar un alto puesto. Permítame le de un consejo: no olvide al obrero" "Prometo a V. solamente, respondió el Prelado, que ese será uno de mis principales programas de acción". Cuando el Arzobispo pronunció estas palabras en la Catedral de Westminster, pudimos observar la honda emoción que le embargaba. Luego aludió a los servicios de Seguridad Social existentes en Inglaterra, a los proyectos del gobierno, a sus sólidas esperanzas de que un por-

venir más humano se abría para la sociedad.

En pocas palabras señaló la posición de los católicos en el problema de la Educación y de las escuelas. El auditorio, de muchos miles, quedó profundamente impresionado por la claridad, por el realismo, por el tono de decisión, por el optimismo que saturaban las palabras del joven y nuevo pastor.

La prensa de todos los matices ha acogido con visible simpatía estas declaraciones. Le han rendido sincero homenaje a las preocupaciones de tipo social que revelan sus sentimientos cristianos. Y se preguntan: ¿Tendremos un nuevo Manning, el Cardenal de los Docks de Londres? ¿Otro Hinsley, que tenía puesta su mira en el acercamiento de todas las Iglesias Cristianas en el campo de las realizaciones sociales.

Mgr. Bernard Griffin manifiesta una fuerte personalidad, y su futuro será, a no dudarlo, fecondo, práctico, popular y extremadamente apostólico.

VIOLENT FIGHTING IN BOSNIA AND MONTENEGRO

Following on the signal for the pursuers of his forces in Russia, and in an apparently final and desperate effort to stave off further disaster from the rapidly advancing Russians, Hitler, assumed military control of Hungary in the absence of the Regent Admiral Horthy and his chief advisers, who had been called to Berlin on the pretext of conferring with the Dictator: I has been said that a Nazi controlled government has been placed in authority.

Bulgaria and Rumania are also being similarly occupied and controlled. Fighting of a somewhat serious character is reported to have occurred between the Hungarians and Rumanians.

Hitler is supposed to have of these countries that they had either to continue their opposition to the Allied Nations or be prepared to submit to the treatment he would accord them.

Pursuing their offensive against the retreating German troops, the Soviets, are said to have occupied an area of ninety kilometers in the vicinity of the old Rumanian frontier.

The Soviet are also stated to have resumed their advance in Poland following the route used by the Germans at the time of their invasion and to have covered about fifty kilometers.

planes based in England are reported to have discharged six thousand tons of bombs over Germany and the occupied zones with terrifying effects.

HALF A MILLION POLES MURDERED

It has been announced by the Polish Ministry of information that not less than five hundred thousand Poles were assassinated by the German in gas chambers in the concentration camp located at Oswiecim. The murderers are declared to have destroyed the bodies of the victims by incinerating them in three large ovens specially constructed for the purpose and with capacity for the consumption of 10,000 bodies each day.

A shortage of the poison gas is believed to have prevented a much larger number of assassinations.

Ireland has not, apparently, buried the hatchet of the Victorian Age. In many ways the Eamon de Valera Government is not behaving in manner satisfactory to the democratic nations. The righting of wrongs is generally a very slow process; but if after her experiences of the past four years, Ireland accepted the just measures of human freedom and liberty, she should be able to set aside the old Irish motto—"Sinn (Ourselves alone), and take her stand in common with the free peoples of the universe.

The principles of national self-determination are well known in Dublin. The vision of a completely independent Ireland long occupied the minds of Irishmen and for this they struggled and triumphed. It was the only solution which could have met the needs of Eamon de Valera; and hence his "Free State" should be ready to in every possible way assist the efforts underway for the liberation of the peoples of Europe, who suffer under the iron shod heels of Nazism. It seems incompatible for Ireland, with her demand for freedom, to ignore the herculean struggle being made by others for a similar purpose.

Eamon de Valera was asked by the United States of America and Great Britain to close the German Legation and the Japanese Consulates which operate in his country as they are known to be fomenting and aiding activities directly opposed to the efforts of the United Nations for the preservation of universal freedom. He refused, and the attitude he has adopted cannot be reasonably regarded in any other light than as decidedly unfriendly and inimical to the cause which he himself has so loudly and persistently espoused. However, when the cordon knot shall have completely encircled his Free State and his people be deprived of their economic and other necessities he may then choose whom he will serve.



DE VALERA

Marshal Tito has announced that Allied forces aided by air units recently destroyed the German Garrison on the Island of Sholta, while other patriotic troops recovered possession of the strongly fortified positions of Kruto and Orjaluka in Montenegro.

Violent fighting was also said to have taken place along the margin of the River Lina, in Montenegro, during a period of five days. The enemy suffered heavily.

On the Rosnian front of Bjeljina — Tuzlao—Broko, the Germans displayed stern resistance despite their serious losses in manpower.

With the capture of the important Island of Sholta off the Dalmatian coast, it is said that the German submarine base at Split has been isolated. Patriotic troops are also reported to have extended their successful operations to the vicinity of the frontier of Bulgaria.

AIR RAIDS CONTINUE OVER GERMANY

For the third time during the current week the Royal Air Force launched a squadron of more than one thousand units over Germany on Thursday, the majority directed their attack against the great industrial and chemical center, Frankfurt.

Berlin was also the object of another assault which, is said to have caused additional heavy damages.

More than three thousand tons of high explosives were rained over Frankfurt, which is now regarded as the worst bombarded city in all the war period. During the past two months it has been the recipient of eleven thousand tons of bombs.

CASSINO SCENE OF FIERCE FIGHTING

Fighting of the fiercest character is reported in progress in the ruined city of Cassinoy.

The largest canon of the Allied batteries, gigantic pieces of two hundred and forty millimeters, are battering the German positions on the outskirts of the city, while the New Zealand troops steadily fight their way across the ruins.

Several counter attacks of the enemy forces to secure new important heights

have been repelled with disastrous results to them.

A Rome radio broadcast reported the bombing of the city of Florence by Allied air units in view of the fact that it was being used as a point for the distribution of German troops.

In the Anzio region, the Germans are said to have directed a heavy artillery fire against Allied positions in the vicinity of Padiglione, seven miles off Cisterna.

WORLD'S SPEEDIEST AIRCRAFT

With the approval of the War Department the North American Aviation Company has released the information that the airplane P-51 Mustang, is the speediest in the world. It is claimed the machine can develop a speed much over 780 kilometers per hour.

It has also been stated that this new machine is capable of traversing more than 5000 miles and returning to its base without exhausting its supply of gas. It can also rise to a height of more than 12,192 meters and possess stupendous maneuvering qualities.

SIDELIGHTS OF THE WAR

Up to the 21st. instant, North American submarines are officially reported to have sent 642 Japanese ships to the bottom of the Pacific Ocean.

A newly invented rapid-firing rocket-cannon, whose projectiles, it is claimed, completely destroy everything within their range, is being actively used by the North American forces in the Far Eastern war zones.

A Rome broadcast announces that the Germans are arranging to remove all their military installations from the Eternal City and to also divert their traffic from its vicinity, with the view, it is stated, of preventing its destruction by Allied air raids.

It has been revealed by the war department at Washington that the North American bombing planes are now equipped with a new specie of explosive bombs, which weigh five hundred pounds and initiate fires which cannot be controlled.

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

ALLIED ACCORD STRESSED

Victory is now certain, but no one can estimate the time, the effort, or the sacrifice that will be needed to bring Germany and Japan to their knees, Field Marshal Sir John Greer Dill, chief of the British Joint Staff Mission to the United States declared.

Sir John revealed that the victory in the Battle of Britain, which meant so much to the cause of civilization, was won not only by the pilots of the Royal Air Force but by the scientists who invented the radio-location system.

"The great invention, which we now call radar, we owed to the university-trained men, and we owed it not only to their brains but to their hands," he declared. "For, before sufficient equipment was available from the production lines, we depended in part on apparatus which they had rushed together in their laboratories and installed with their own hands. We face powerful and desperate adversaries, made more desperate by the certainty of defeat. Germany and Japan are controlled by men who count no price in death and destruction too high if, by paying it, they can delay for a while the fate that awaits them. They are like men condemned on the scaffold, with nothing to lose and a brief extension of life to gain by trying every trick and ruse that may postpone execution."

Expressing the view that "the triumph over Germany in the coming months depends on a complete accord between the British and American forces General Marshall declared that Sir John had made "an outstanding, a unique personal contribution to the coordination of the Allied effort. Only those who have studied the coalitions in the past will be able to appreciate the importance and historic grandeur of the joint and cooperative war effort which has been welded by the British and American peoples."

"We honor him primarily and basically for his selfless devotion to the common cause in which we are fighting", Mr. Stimson said.

Post-war concord which would give peace and security for the future depended in large measure on the contribution of men like Sir John, men free of prejudice, single-minded in the sincerity of their efforts to promote the unity of our two great countries.

GERMANY'S DWINDLING

There can be no doubt that German losses, especially on the Eastern Front, have been stupendous. Nor is there reason to doubt that the question of finding manpower for the army and for factory and field has become one of the most pressing problems of the whole strained Nazi economy. When the war began in 1939 it was estimated on the basis of reliable information that one out of every ten German males of military age was in the armed forces. By 1943 the number of German men bearing arms had risen to one out of every three. To a certain extent the shortage of factory and farm workers was made up by drafting slave labor from the occupied countries.

But today, with the Anglo-American air offensive adding to the demands for labor behind the lines, the rising hope among the conquered people that the day of liberation is at hand has brought an increased resistance to the German labor drafts. Nazi Germany must be nearing the limit of her manpower resources just at the time when the United Nations, reaching the peak of their power, are preparing the heaviest blows that have fallen yet. In the summer of 1942 the German Army was believed to number about 8,000,000.

Nevertheless, it would be surprising if the German Army were as good today as it was when it marched into Poland or even as strong as when it swept into Russia in June, 1941. Young men between 18 and 25 make the best soldiers, and it is in that age group that losses have been heaviest, if the experience of the First World War is being duplicated.

DISINFECTANT BOMB

A new kind of bomb — which will not be destructive — is now being manufactured for the R. A. F. Its chief ingredient is pyrethrum which is a powerful insecticide, and the new bombs are used for disinfecting aircraft on tropical air routes where mosquitoes and vermin and the diseases they carry are transferred by a plane from one territory to another. Formerly the work was done by a spray, but now when the aircraft lands, a disinfectant bomb is thrown in the plane, and disinfection is far more thoroughly effected.

OUT OF THE SHADOWS

What makes any man great? It is not the infallible correctness of his opinions, for one may think him sometimes wrong and still consider him a great man. Somewhere there is a deep mystery of personality. Out of the masses of men these victors come when they are needed, out of log-cabins and also out of unmemorial mansions.

Winston Churchill is an old Tory. He is an old Liberal. He is a rank imperialist. He is a fervent democrat. But mainly he is one of those men who cannot walk into the House of Commons, or an yhouse or place, without creating something of an electric shock. He does not do this because he is Prime Minister. He is Prime Minister because he has made and projected an image of what the British people wish to be in this war; there he stands and there they stand, in courage so sure that it need never plume itself; in faith as strong as the British earth from which it springs; in cheerfulness that passes smiling into the dark Valley; in honesty of purpose; in loyalty.

This is the man who offered an honorable union to France when she was beaten to her knees. This is the man who raised his voice in savage defiance when Britain stood alone. . . . nothing but the invincible will to live and die free, between his island race and utter destruction.

HERITAGE TO BE MAINTAINED

"No Caesar or Charlemagne ever presided over a dominion so peculiar. Its flag floats on many waters; it has provinces in every zone; they are inhabited by persons of different races, different religions, different laws, manners and customs. Some of these are bound to us by the ties of liberty, fully conscious that without their connection with the metropolis they have no security for public freedom and self-government; others are bound to us by flesh and blood and by material as well as moral considerations. There are millions who are bound to us by our military sway, and they bow to that sway because they know that they are indebted to it for order and justice. All these communities agree in recognising the commanding spirit of these islands that has formed and fashioned in such a manner so great a

portion of the globe. My Lords British West African troops on February 26 captured the Kaladan valley town of Kyauktaw in western Burma, routing the Japanese or the Arakan front. The West Africans occupied Kyauktaw after crossing a stream in the face of opposition and were in a position to outflank the Japanese stronghold of Buthedaung, twenty-six miles to the west. West of the Mayu range, in the main Arakan battle area, remnants of a Japanese raiding party were driven from the chief crest of the Mayu ridge. British and Indian troops once again were firmly established in Ngakyedauk Pass. All casualties of the Seventh Indian Division, relieved after seventeen days of encirclement east of the Mountains, had been evacuated through the pass.

Since early in February Allied troops in Arakan had been engaged with an enemy force of several thousand that had moved in from the east against their lines of communication. The Japanese intention had been to disorganise the back areas, while making simultaneous attacks from the front against the Seventh Indian Division. The Japanese had hoped by this maneuver to check the Allied drive towards Buthedaung and to force the division to retreat, which would have been a difficult operation in thick jungle with opportunities for the Japanese to ambush isolated portions of the force. The reaction to this attack was not as intended by the Japanese. General Slim, commander of the Fourteenth Army, ordered the Seventh Indian Division to hold its ground, while active operations were undertaken against the enemy in the rear, in which the Fifth Indian Division participated. The Japanese were attacked and broken up into small parties and their casualties have been very heavy. Men of the Fifth Indian Division are veterans of the North African, Eritrean, and Abyssinian campaigns.

That Empire is no mean heritage; but it is not an heritage that can only be enjoyed; it must be maintained, and it can only be maintained by the same qualities that created it — by courage, by discipline, by patience, by determination and by a reverence for public law and respect for national rights."

—Lord Beaconsfield, in the House of Lords.

NO MIRACLE MAN

After two years of fighting in the Pacific, our boys are getting to know their Japanese counterpart as he really is. At first they thought him a joke, with his short bandy legs and his surprising agility and his surprising agility and what he is, skilled, brave, obedient and tough — how tall can be realised from the Under-Secretary for War's recent statement that only 337 Japanese prisoners have been taken — all by American forces — by no miracle man.

What has been often described as his fanaticism is more a condition of mind produced by rigid training under officers and NCO's who themselves imbued with the savage ideas of present-day Japan. The soldier is told he must fight to the end and kill himself rather than surrender, and he obeys because obedience comes naturally to him.

The unquestioning obedience of the Japanese private is a factor to be reckoned with, but it has its drawbacks in a want of initiative and dependence upon authority. Once his superiors are dead, the ordinary Jap is inclined to fold up.

NO TRUE PEACE UNTIL . . .

At this time our thoughts and efforts are centred on the great assault on Germany. It is well that it should be so, for with it comes the greatest test our arms have yet known, a test demanding the fullest exertions of every citizen of these islands.

Yet we should not forget our men serving on the distant battlefronts of the Far East. Theirs is the task of slowly building up the force, which, with our allies, will eventually defeat Japan. Theirs will be the honour of bringing about final victory in world-wide war.

For we fight the same enemy in east and west — the enemy of cruelty and oppression, of persecution and evil beliefs. It would profit us nothing to kill these things in the west and to leave them to pursue their deadly course in the east.

The world has become too small, its nations too interdependent for us to allow evil to fester in any part of it. That is why there can be no peace for us until Japan, as well as Germany, is brought to her knees.
