Entre la Secretaría de Agricultura y don Fernando Alvarado Chacón, como apoderado de la Atlantic Balsa Company Limited, se ha hecho una transacción de venta de parte de las fincas Guacimo y El Hogar, ubicadas en el cantón de Pocococi. Parte de esas fincas las ha adquirido el gobierno por la suma de 350 mil colones, suma que paga en bonos de la defensa a la par, con los cuales la vendedora ha dado por cancelada la totalidad del precio de venta de la sección objeto de transacción. La venta se hace libre de gravámenes y la Compañía deberá cancelar, por lo tanto, la mera hipoteca que pesa sobre las fincas que traspasa y que monta a la suma de 200 mil colones. Este contrato deberá obtener, para su validez, la aprobación del poder ejecutivo.



Estuvieron presentes los jefes de dependencias municipales señores Arrázola, Barrientes, Casco, Martínez, Mora Aguilar, Mora Morúa, Vinadas y Zeledón.

Art. I—Acta: Se leyó, aprobó y firmó el acta de la sesión anterior.

Art. II—Informes de jefes de dependencias: Se acordó archivar informe semanal del fontanero y copia de nota en la que comunica se conectó

una nueva paja de agua en la manzana 000, lote tres, en propiedad de Joseph Brotherton.

Art. III—Notas de dependencias oficiales: a) Se acordó acusar recibo del telegrama enviado por el señor jefe del departamento de Lucha Antivenérea, en que solicita la colaboración del municipio para obtener una resolución favorable, en el Congreso de Municipalidades, a la iniciativa que se presentará para dar más amplio apoyo a la Compañía Nacional Antivenérea.

b) El señor inspector general de Hacienda Municipal invitó a la corporación para asistir a la sesión solemne que verificará a las 16 horas del 15 de setiembre, en el Teatro Nacional, para conmemorar la independencia y celebrar el acto de la firma del protocolo del tratado de limi-

tes con la República de Panamá, sesión en la que el señor Presidente de la República, leerá el acta de la independencia y el acta del tratado limítrofe con nuestra hermana del sur. Agrega que la inspección a su cargo aprobará gustosa cualquier presupuesto extraordinario que se acuerde para sufragar los gastos de traslado y permanencia de los señores regidores que con el objeto indicado se trasladan a la capital. Se acordó que todos los municipios que puedan hacerlo, concurran a ese acto. Se les ruega, a los que se propongan asistir, dar aviso a la secretaría.

BRITISH PARACHUTE TROOPS SUFFER HEAVILY IN HOLLAND

Third Army launch powerful attack against fortifications of Metz

A communique from the Allied Command in France discloses that after eight days of the most heroic fighting against much superior enemy forces, numerous tanks and various other weapons of war, the British parachute troops who landed in the region of Arnhem, on the northern side of the Rhine in Holland were compelled to give way. The report states that 2,000 of the men succeeded in retiring across the river, while more than 6,000 were taken prisoners and 1,200 killed.

Notwithstanding this retirement, military circles regard the effort as having been an outstanding aid to the establishment, on a firm basis, of the Allied corridor in Holland, and which has since been enlarged by forces of

the Second Army. Consequent on the heroic resistance of the Britishers, the Nazis are said to have lost the hope of success and retired across the river Maas, with the view of establishing better defence systems against the inevitable invasion of Germany by way of Holland.

Aided by numerous air units, the forces under the command of General Patton launched, last Wednesday, a most powerful attack against numerous fortifications of Metz. The infantry troops are said to have reached the ditch of the Drinant Fort, but were forced to beat a retreat as the result of the intense gun fire by the defending Germans.

Fighting of an unusually intense character is also in progress in the region west of the Moselle. But a small

part of the Duchy of Luxembourg is now controlled by the Germans. In the sector north of Nijmegen, the British troops are reported advancing despite fierce opposition.

A double fanking attack has been launched against the Sigfried Line which was reported to be favourably progressing.

Another batch of parachutists have landed in Holland in an effort to oppose the escape of the Germans from the western sector.

The Japanese get a Lesson

West African troops fighting in the Kaladan Valley have recently given the Japanese their best lesson in "mobility". To the enemy it was a most painful course of instruction.

The West African troops, marching from the Kaladan Valley for new operations in the Kalapanzin foothills, caught a Japanese headquarters in an ambush. The enemy had not believed that several thousand men could have moved from one part of a front to another without being seen. They forgot about the tough jungle warriors of West Africa.

The Japanese were actually moving to wipe out the Africans in a place they had already left, and the enemy were trapped in a narrow ravine and slaughtered. At a later date the enemy made the same fatal error of Judgment, only this time they thought that the West African's guns could not have reached a certain point on the opposite side of the Kaladan River. Once again they forgot about the speed with which African soldiers move through the jungle.

A platoon of Gold Coast troops, who had found the Japanese positions, gave a signal and the gunners wiped out the enemy; while Gambian and Sierra Leone troops, who had crossed the Kaladan to meet the Gold Coast Troops, toppled the Japanese officers off their horses and inflicted heavy casualties on the column.

Such was the speed with which West Africans moved from one spot to another that many thousands could in a few hours disappear from one battlefield or camp and begin operations miles away, unknown to the enemy.

Speed of movement is the key-note of modern warfare, and it entails a great deal of planning, whether by land, sea, or air; but in places like Burma the difficulties are increased by the absence of lorries. The West Africans have overcome this difficulty by transporting arms, ammunition and equipment on their heads. Shovels and radio sets form part of their loads.

In a single line miles long, each man loaded with his own equipment and carrying an

American Negro Combat Corps

As the Allied forces surge north from Florence recently, the High Command announced the arrival and active participation in the fighting of the first Negro combat unit assigned to this theatre of operations.

These soldiers, representing elements of the famed 92nd Division will become the first coloured ground forces to engage the enemy in actual combat in Italy.

When the story of this present war is fully written, it will record many exploits of heroism on the part of Negro soldiers. In the fighting on the islands of the Pacific, on ships at sea and in combat planes over enemy territory; in the campaigns in North Africa, Sicily, Italy and in the invasion of France, Negro soldiers, aviators and seamen have written and are still writing brilliant chapters of gallantry and service.

Supplying the Pacific War

It is amply clear to anyone who tours the Pacific war fronts that huge supply commitments in Europe are not creating any new supply problems in the Pacific area. On the contrary, there are in many instances improvements which point more than ever to the fact that the European war will not hamper present plans to push decisive offensives aimed eventually at Tokyo.

In the matter of heavy shipping, European commitments will undoubtedly continue for some time to deprive the Pacific theatre of needed supplies. But the military advances and consolidation of bases which have been stepped up in the past few months have considerably eased the shipping problem. Ships from the U. S. A. which formerly were forced to put in and tranship cargoes at bases far in rear of the front, are now able to use primary unloading ports as far advanced as Hollandia.

Not only has this speeded up the disbursement of cargoes and the turnaround of ships, but it has eased the strain on small craft which average of forty pounds, they march over hills and through rivers. One meets these West Africans on the march, cheerful, streaming with sweat and humming some little song.

Promise of the Sixth Year

We enter on our sixth year of fighting with the end of the European war within measurable distance, and with the steel ring of Allied might drawing ever closer round Japan.

To-day the armies of Germany and its miserable rump of discredited and disheartened satellites are reeling back on every European front before the advance of the Armies of Liberation. Never in history has any nation achieved more than the Russians in the progress they have made since those days (not so very far away) when the Germans were knocking at the gates of Moscow and thousands of square miles of Russia were under the Nazi tyranny.

Hitler has failed in Russia. He has failed in France. He has failed in Britain. He has failed in Germany itself. Something must be very rotten in the state of Germany for high-ranking officers, men who have been drilled for a lifetime into an attitude of unquestioning obedience, to dare to question the infallibility of Adolf Hitler, Chancellor of the German Reich, Commander-in-Chief of the German Army. Quarrels between thieves and murderers offer little attraction at the best of times, and the excesses of the Borgias pale into insignificance beside the latest blood bath into which Hitler has plunged his unhappy land.

Hope and Honour

But if the position of Germany is one of squalor and shame, hope and honour are to be found in the occupied Continent the total mobilisations are rising as one man against their oppressor, to harass his troops, to batter down his barracks, to blow up his communications.

formerly moved much of the cargo from rear bases to areas nearer the front.

At the same time the unexpectedly low expenditure of small invasion craft in the European invasion should have a favorable effect on the arrivals in the Pacific area of amphibious craft, which at present constitute one of the biggest needs.

Thus despite the terrific needs of the European war the Pacific war theatres are still able to build for and major operations.

Where Slavery Still lives

One of the most terrible features of Nazi policy has been the gradual deportation of more and more workers from the occupied countries to Germany to increase the manpower available for the German war machine.

In spite of the immense effort which the Nazis have made to overcome this labour deficiency, they are still, after nearly five years of war, in such a position that the Nazis can make statements such as: "Owing to the terrible threat to our Continent the total mobilisation of European manpower has become a fateful necessity which no European nation is permitted to shirk and remain unpunished".

This is the final resort of a nation which has tried everything else. A familiar pattern has been followed in all the occupied territories, not only by Germany but also by Japan. At first, propaganda was used to cajole the people to enrol for labour service. The propaganda was frequently based, however, on sheer fraud.

Spur Of Hunger

When it proved ineffective, pressure was applied. Compulsory registration was introduced, and unemployed persons failing to volunteer for work in Germany were deprived of ration cards. To sharpen the spur of hunger and want unemployment was deliberately created. When even these measures failed to get the required response, the enemy resorted to compulsory decrees and round-ups of civilians for mass deportation, with extreme penalties for resistance.

Coal cures Potato disease in Britain

A new British synthetic material made from coal eliminates disease in potatoes. This has been developed by a British coal processing company—Low Temperature Carbonization Limited—in co-operation with the British Department of Scientific and Industrial Research. Under the direction of the British Ministry of Agriculture, supplies of this material have been despatched to

Mending a Wire Under Fire

Lance Bombardier John Mc Guire was in charge of the maintenance of a section of line from an advanced observation post to a Field Artillery Battery for four days and nights. His section of the line was cut seventy-one times during this period by shellfire and other causes. During two hours he mended it fifteen times though under fire—the very fire which was directed towards cutting his line and which was heavy calibre shells. The cable route led from the gun position through a village which was being constantly shelled across a bridge to another village. Mc Guire was wounded on the third day but refused to leave his post and continued to mend his line. Eventually he agreed to retire but refused to allow the line truck to be used and walked to an advanced dressing station with the assistance of a comrade.
