Ethiopians Trained As Telegraphists.

ADDIS ABABA (By Mail)—
In order to provide technical
experis to man the public servi
ees in Abyssinia, the emperor
has appointed 200 young Abyssinians to study telegraphy.

The boys, who know barely a word of English, are being instructed by British officers and will later form the nuclius of the new Ethiopian Telegraph Service and a signal company in the Abyssinian arm. Af-

ter only eight weeks' training some of them are advanced enough to be employed as asistant wireless operators in military operations against bands of Italian Blackshirts in the Gondar area.

Several school and a military academy have been established in the capital since the return of Haile Selassie.

The Empress and the Princess Tshai are making plans for a high school for givls and an hospital under Royal patronage. This work is being carried out by the Ethiopian Women's Association under the direct supervision of the Empress Menen.
