Realizaciones y Objetivos Americanos

He aquí el primer artículo de una serie de seis, basados en capítulos escogidos del libro "U. S. A.: Measure of a Nation", por Thomas R. Carskadon y Rudolf Modley, publicado hace poco y que presenta en forma sencilla los resultados de un estudio comprensivo, *America's Needs and Resources*, por J. Frederic Dewhurst y socios. Ambos trabajos son resultados de un estudio de grande alcance realizado por el *Twentieth Century Fund*, que es una fundación educativa independiente que se dedica a la investigación científica en el campo de la economía.

Casi en dondequieras se tiene a los Estados Unidos de América por la nación más rica y más productiva en la historia de la humanidad, pero no se comprenden bien los factores que han hecho posible semejante realización económica.

El objeto de esta serie de artículos es exponer los hechos concretos del expediente americano, y de analizar los factores de tal expediente, y de calcular las perspectivas del futuro americano.

nares de kilómetros de México,
un campesino de más de sesen-
ta años me dijo un día: «Está
muy bien, señor, mi familia y
yo hemos aprendido a leer ya
a escribir. Se lo agradecemos.
Pero ¿no podría usted mandar-
nos un profesor que nos ense-
ñara algo más práctico? A mí,
por ejemplo, me gustaría ser
arquitecto».

Esta anécdota es significativa.

Acaso aquel hombre no poseía
una noción muy cabal de la
arquitectura; pero, por intuición
había encontrado la palabra
justa, aquella cuyas dos raíces
griegas hacen surgir ante nues-
tro espíritu toda una vocación
de maestros de obras, todo el
dominio del constructor. Para
desarrollar a un país—mi buen
compatriota lo sabía—la educa-
ción fundamental no es más

que una etapa; la enseñanza
primaria es otra. Precisa pues
atacar a fondo—y al mismo
tiempo—la ignorancia de los
analfabetos y la insuficiencia de
la enseñanza científica superior.
Hay que formar obreros espe-
cializados, contratistas y moni-
tores, ingenieros y expertos.

Lo que planeamos no es una
empresa, sino un desarrollo
económico. Para favorecerlo,
estamos en la obligación de con-
cebir al lado de medidas de
rendimiento más o menos rápi-
do, pero a veces efímero, medidas
en profundidad, cuyos efectos
perdurables. Tales medidas no
exigirán necesariamente mayor
tiempo que las otras. Cuando
menos su lentitud eventual no
parece preocupar especialmente
a países que esperan mucho de
la ejecución de nuestros pro-
yectos. Así, las peticiones reci-
bidas hasta la fecha por la
Unesco no conciernen a la edu-
cación fundamental, como hubiera podido pensarse, sino a la
educación técnica.

Text of the Memorandum on "The World Calendar" presented by the Delegation of Panama to the United Nations General Assembly Fourth Session

His Excellency Mario de Diego, the distinguished permanent delegate of Panama to the United Nations, earned the honour in behalf of his country for having presented the World Calendar resolutions before the Fourth Regular Session of the General Assembly.

NEED OF A PERPETUAL CALENDAR

The ideal of the whole world is to have a logical and perpetual calendar to replace the present Gregorian calendar, because it is widely recognized that the calendar we now use is unsatisfactory for economic, social, educational, scientific and other activities of man. Modern progress demands the change.

Such a revision has been the subject of study and research on the part of experts, institutions and international organizations for many years. The general consensus was that a new time system was necessary, adhering to the customary twelve months; but that it should be fixed, uniform, an invariable ca-

lendar, perpetually the same, regulated astronomically according to the movement of the earth around the sun, and consequently more regular, more scientific and more advantageous from every point of view than the present Gregorian calendar.

DEFECTS OF THE GREGORIAN CALENDAR

Our present calendar is virtually the one introduced by Julius Caesar in 45 B.C., which due to its irregularity and the time difference caused by erroneous astronomical calculations was corrected and readjusted in 1582 by Pope Gregory XII. This is the reason why the present calendar is known as the Gregorian calendar. Since the time, mankind has laboured under its shiftiness, irregularity and instability. Successive years are never and can never be identical. There are fourteen variations of calendar years; 28 different kinds of months; quarters and months begin and end on any day of the week, days at dates never agree from year to year; quarters are unequal, and, though containing 52 weeks the year must borrow from another week to complete itself. This causes unending discord and confusion to all levels of society throughout the world even more so than the chaotic condition which existed before the adoption of Standard Time Zones.

Work of Railroad yard Enclosures

It has already been reported that the deputies of the National Assembly who were deliberating on the project of the new Constitution and other important matters prior to the establishment of the present constitutional government, had recommended to the Government the abolishment of that old law which restricted or prevented the workmen of colour to earn his bread in the Pacific Zone.

We gather that in one of the latter sessions of the outgoing administration this request of the legislators was approved and it was resolved to eliminate this restriction and to promote a decree correspondingly, on the part of the Minister of Labour to annul that law and to effect a registry of the citizens of colour residing in the national territories with a view to determine Costarricans of colour from foreigners.
