II

### EL PUEBLO AMERICANO

He aquí el segundo artículo de una serie de seis, basados en capítulos escogidos del libro *U. S. A.: Measure of a nation* por Thomas R. Carkashian y Rudolf Modley, publicado hace poco y que presenta en forma sencilla los resultados de un estudio de grande alcance realizados por el *Twentieth Century Fund*, que es una Fundación educativa independiente que se dedica a la investigación científica en el campo de la economía.

Los seres humanos son el hecho central del pasado, presente y futuro americanos. Con la aportación que se tiene en el empleo enorme de máquinas, herramientas y energía mecánica en Estados Unidos de América, todos los artículos y servicios rendidos y producidos son obra de gente y es gente la que de ellos sirve.

Es obvio que para conocer el futuro de los Estados Unidos de América se requiere de antemano estudiar a su pueblo: cuántos habitantes tiene el país? ¿Cuántos tendrá? ¿De qué edad serán? ¿En dónde se radicarán?

El gran crecimiento de los Estados Unidos ocurrió después de 1860. En el período de cincuenta años entre 1860 y 1910, la población se multiplicó casi al triple.

No todo el aumento ha procedido de la fecundidad nacional. Durante cada década del período los aumentos en proporción desde 20 por ciento hasta 50 por ciento se han debido a la inmigración. La onda migratoria alcanzó su punto sumo en los años anteriores inmediatos a la primera guerra, en que los inmigrantes llegaban aquí a razón de un millón por año.

Después de la primera guerra, la inmigración disminuyó abruptamente, y a partir de la época de la depresión o crisis económica, inclusiva durante el período de la Guerra Segunda, la inmigración a Estados Unidos cesó casi por completo.

Mientras tanto disminuyó la natalidad. Esta tendencia se neutralizó un tanto por haber disminuido igualmente la mortalidad. Durante los años de la crisis económica disminuyó aún más la natalidad; pero en los años de la guerra segunda aumentaron los matrimonios, y los nacimientos. En el período que media entre 1920 y 1930 la población aumentó [en] 17 millones; pero se redujo el aumento este a la mitad, entre 1930 y 1940. Sin embargo, se calcula que en el lapso de entre 1940 y 1950 la población habrá aumentado en más de 12 millones.

A base de estas tendencias Estados Unidos bien puede tener hacia 1960 una población de 155 millones. Las personas mejor autorizadas en esta materia son ahora del sentir que la población seguirá creciendo durante lo que le queda por correr al siglo 20.

Simultáneamente, la edad media del americano va en aumento. Según los cálculos, e 18 por ciento de la población será de sexagenarios, hacia 1960. En 1940 los sexagenarios re-

It is almost certain that sundry problems will come up for deliberation; many difficulties are sure to strewn the pathway of the Council, but despite these cliffs and steep rocks we believe the Municipal Fathers will surmount them due to the fact they are qualified, well seasoned and have already in other endeavours displayed their wares of public spirit and alert interest in public affairs.

It should be remembered that one rotten link on a chain is sure to give way and bring about diminution of the whole, and so will unhealthy conditions affect a people who are hemmed in by them; their disabilities will diffuse the whole citizenry as time goes by.

Conclusion —

The plan, in its present stage, would endow the Prime Minister of India with full powers to organize this mediation in whatever way he feels best to insure success. His instructions from the General Assembly would merely call for an effort to convince not only the governments of Washington and Moscow, but also the allies of both, that if the whole UN concept is to succeed, it must achieve constructive cooperation between East and West.

According to the confidential plan, the UN should accord to the Prime Minister the broadest personal authority. He should be authorized to choose among the estates-men of the World the assistants he would like to have. The UN would also place at his disposal a special secretariat to help him carry through his task.

In the view of those now exploring this plan, Mr. Nehru would begin by making a survey of all the outstanding differences between the East and West as well as areas of agreement. He would analyze the various proposals made by each side to achieve a modus vivendi. He would try to work out a minimum program of accord, which he would then discuss with the opposing governments.

It is felt that public opinion all over the world would strongly support any such initiative. It is also felt that no man today is better placed and more qualified than Mr. Nehru to under-

take such a gigantic job. First of all, Mr. Nehru's country, which has just won its independence, is in the forefront of those vitally interested in maintaining international peace. As one of the outstanding internationalists of our time, he is particularly equipped, both on the basis of his intellectual achieve-

## Stanley Dixon Self Styled President of the Port Limón Division No. 300 Accused Six Respectful Citizen Before Police Court

On Friday the 25th ultimo, six highly respectful and law abiding citizens were summoned to appear before the Police Court of this city on a charge effected by Stanley Dixon, self styled President of the Port Limón Division No. 300 of the Universal Negro Improvement Association.

Dixon presented a writ by which he accuses these persons of having attended the meeting of the Division and interrupted the business of the active members and accompanied by others they represented a menace to the members and to him, the president and that he asks for an order to prevent their future visit since they are not members. The persons charged denied categorically the accusation and stated in addition that the Constitution which is embodied in the Registration of the Association under the laws of Costa Rica entails a heritage to every person of the Negro Race, even to the unborn and furthermore they are registered members of the Port Limón Division No. 300 over periods of years; their arreage for contribution is no barrier to that racial heritage and that Dixon has bluntly refused to accept members on the financial or active roll.

It would be well for Dixon to study well the fundamental principles on which the Association has its existence.

On November 8, a letter signed by eighteen members representing hundred of others of the race who are opposed to Stanley Dixon as president of the Port Limón Division No. 300, was delivered to Mrs. Florence Pitters, Commissioner for Jamaica and Parent Body's Deputy to Costa Rica, requesting of her an interview on matters affecting their heritage to the Association. Mrs. Pitters granted the request and met the Committee in Liberty Hall on the afternoon of Tuesday, November 15.

The spokesman of the Committee delivered in the most convincing manner the clauses of Constitutional breaches, miscarriages and divers of irregularities committed by Dixon who is functioning as president.

## Copy of Letter Delivered to Mrs. Florence Pitters

Port Limón, Costa Rica  
November 8, 1949.

The Hon. Mrs. Florence Pitters  
Commissioner of the Universal  
Negro Improvement Association,  
Jamaica, British West Indies  
Present:

Dear Madam:

Stirred by consciousness of the great racial cause which you represent and your fame which preceded your arrival in conjunction with the Universal Negro Improvement Association, and in virtue of our inherent lineage and deeply planted devotion to its programme, not-withstanding the secrecy that surrounded your visit to this city, we embrace this opportunity to welcome you from the wealth of our very soul.

We observed, and not without resentment, the chill which marked your entry to the building of the Port Limón Division No. 300 as the consequence of a selfish few—individuals moving on the pivot of self-interest; selfishness that habit of seeking objects of desire and things for self, and for self alone! utterly regardless of the welfare and the happiness of others; leaving

outside the movements of racial impulse and with no consciousness of responsibility, revolving only on the axle of self aggrandizement.

Ever since the light of the Universal Negro Improvement Association dawned upon the world, we the undersigned, regardless of where we were have been closely associated with the grand racial uplift. Possessed as we are with full racial consciousness we are peev'd to see the ideal shattered;—shattered a thousand times by a selfish few. We feel your disappointment, though prudence will not permit you to mention; we should heal your wound if we had the honour.

Our most heightened desire is to have an ordinance with you and we respectfully solicit your goodness to effect the necessary arrangement for any day and hour which will be convenient to you; preferably in the afternoon. At four o'clock in the morning I awoke suddenly and found myself singing the Sankey No. 650 "Ring the Bells of Heaven there is Joy today", then with fear and trembling I rushed to little Irma's bed and there I found that she was gone. Little Irma was like a radio in the home; she was a friend of

all; - Although she has left four sisters and three brothers as the apples of our eyes, yet we missed her more than we can express in words. Her passing has left us to meditate on the words of Sankey 989 - "There is a Paradise of Rest-Meet me There".

all over the world, the Kremlin could not refuse to negotiate with him. The major difficulty foreseen at this stage is that Prime Minister Nehru might hesitate to undertake this task lest failure impair his global prestige. He would want to get some advance assurances that his mission would have a reasonable chance for success.

It would also be necessary for the UN to draft a resolution that would enable Mr. Nehru to act as a UN emissary rather

than as the Prime Minister of India. Another reason assigned for any display of hesitancy on Mr. Nehru's part is that his presence in India is urgently required especially in these critical times, when many economic, industrial, educational and political problems demand solution.

However, the Indian people and government might accede to his acceptance of this mission because of the pivotal importance it would give to India in world affairs, and the enormous prestige it would carry with it.

We have been given the word of many persons on the lines to act as agents; the first or second remittances are effected then the rest of the weeks the papers remained uncalled for at the point of delivery and it is only when we write for remittance we are being told that they have discontinued for the past several weeks without the common courtesy of advising us. These are the conditions under which we are trying to furnish the weekly news.
