Amongst the passengers on the "Wilhelmina," we note Mr. José A. Aramburu, one of the men who have made good in the mining business in Nicaragua. He was part owner for a long time of the famous La Luz y Los Angeles Mining Co., a concern which experts say, has ore in sight by the thousands of tons. The controlling shares in this concern is owned at present by some Pittsburg capitalist.

We also note Dr. Salvador Lejarza, who is passing through here on his way to the interior of Nicaragua, via Punta Arenas. We understand that the people are disgusted with the transportation on the Grey Down River, and that they (who can afford it) will in the future pass through Costa Rica instead.

Squires Notes.

THE WEATHER.
Inversely to the past week when it rained almost every day, this is a week of sunshine, with every one complaining for the heat. On Thursday night however, a regular *subarctic* covered the ground with many inches of water and from the blackness of the semi-circular hills there was apprehension of an inundation of that portentous dasher—the Siquirres River.

REPAIRS.
The Railway Station House is undergoing repairs from its foundation. In digging away the concrete pavement much dry rot was revealed in the main sills and for the maintenance of the equilibrium of the house new sills must quickly be put in. Some big cement pillars to the rear put up by Mr. T. B. Witter, the Company's trusty mason, tell the tale that the house will be pushed back a few feet so as to afford a wider platform, but this will offer an irregular front with the *zav bodega y Que Pasa!*

EARLY BIRD.
Now that Siquirres is made a town it is advisable to secure building lots before the price climb up to the *fancy figures*. This town is growing fast and new houses are in erection at its four cardinal. Some splendid places are now for sale and if I were you Mr. *Monted Business Man* I would come up, view the land and make my investment, before that big rich *Jaw* fills up his belly with them. See that you catch your *worm*.

Action of German Naval Officer.

Copenhagen.—Twenty-five German boats and cruisers arrived at the Skaw and were joined by a smaller division. When manoeuvring five torpedo boats entered and examined the waters near Knebisvin, where foreign warships are not allowed, that being the location of the Danish naval station. This matter has been reported to the Admiralty. The presence of the Germans re-awakened frequent complaints of Germany using Danish waters for her manoeuvres.

Local News.

The gasoline schooner "Alva" arrived from Bluefields and sailed for Boca del Toro with mails and passengers.

We are sometimes pleased to see our country friends in town especially those from the surroundings of Santa Rosa.

We are informed that in Guatemala a negro is allowed to carry a gun of any kind and that notices are placarded on all the farms to that effect. Work there does pay as well as elsewhere and that there is a very big depression of trade.

Mr. Ponce who was very much liked by the employees of the Northern Railway has returned after his commission in the States. He was sometimes ago deputed to proceed here for the purpose of selecting and buying cars for the company. He has again taken up his duties of foreman of the shops and hopes that he will work on the same lines as hitherto.

Many Jamaicans are always called up to pay 65 and sometimes 110. Under notice the Post Office is in a very filthy condition and has not been swept for days. The Sanitary Officers in many cases are not to be blamed as great negligence is shown by some in higher authority.

The following passengers arrived by the s.s. "Heredia" from New Orleans via Barrios: Mr. Frank House and wife, Clifford McMichael, Maximo Fernandez, and others.

Fernandez, John Moebuis, David Phillipp; from Barrios and Guatemala: Stewart Bellows, C. Vergara Clark, Miguel Fournier, Edward Percy Atmore; in transit: to Colon, Panama, 8 cooliaman. Sae also brought some deckers and a cargo of about 350 tons for this port.

An Amusing Incident.

A most amusing incident passed off in the Law Courts yesterday. A handy labourer known as "Maqui" in this town got in trouble night before last and was fined 65 75 for misconduct. This he refused to pay and rather took the time over at the island known as "Uviva". This man had the good fortune three months ago of winning of our monthly lottery the sum of 65,000, and yet without any ambition was willing to pass an easy stay where thieves and robbers do corrupt.

Change in Funeral Arrangements.

Kiev, Sept. 19.—A complete change has been made in the funeral arrangements. Before he died Stolypin expressed the wish to be buried at Kiev, and the Emperor ordered that his wishes be respected. Accordingly the body will be removed to Pechersk Monastery. The funeral will take place there at 10 o'clock Friday morning with a religious service in the monastery churchyard.

Constitution of the LIMON CITY DISPENSARY.

NAME. Limon City Dispensary.

OBJECTS. To provide medical attendance for the public of Port Limon at a cost of twenty-five cents per week.

To supply medicine free to members attended.

To be run on the same lines as that of the "New City Dispensary" of Kingston, Jamaica.

BENEFITS. For the sum of twenty-five cents paid weekly, you have a competent Doctor to attend you when sick, and save a Doctor's bill of perhaps hundreds of dollars.

You can always have a medical examination made, and so keep yourself in perfect health.

When you are sick and the Doctor in charge prescribes for you, the prescription is made up free of charge by a competent Dispenser, and from fresh drugs provided by the Dispensary.

A member not being able to present himself or herself at the dispensary for attention, and require the Doctor to attend, shall have to pay an extra charge plus. During the day twenty-five cents, from 6 p.m. until midnight, fifty cents, and ten cents in a.m. on a Colon.

That Obstetrical cases will only cost an extra nominal charge of Ten Colones for the occasion.

That infants of members will be attended free when sick up to one year old. That members' children can become members at a cost of Fifteen cents per week up to the age of three.

That when a consultation is necessary another Doctor will be procured at a nominal charge.

That Trained Nurses will be provided when necessary at a nominal cost.

HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER.

Each applicant must present himself or herself at the office of the Dispensary during the hours of 9 to 11 a.m. and 2 to 4 p.m. Week Days, 9 a.m. to 12 noon 3 days for examination.

Each person applying for membership must be examined by the Doctor, and will not be admitted unless in seemingly good health.

An entrance fee of One Colon will be charged each member which must be paid along with two weeks' subscription.

No one having become a member can apply for medical attention until two weeks after.

Porto Ricans Restless.

New York.—Joseph Wenar, a planter from Porto Rico, fighting a plumb of discontent from the insular possession as a part of his mission of making this country better acquainted with his island home.

"The Porto Ricans are tired of the caliber of the men in the insular government" he said at Hotel Astor. "They are planning to have a voice in the management of their own affairs and intend to get it. The majority of the officials sent down by Uncle Sam to govern the island are the greatest bunch of after-drinking speakers ever imposed on a bounded people."

The plan in the minds of the islanders, he explained, was to have the political parties in the island—the Unionists and the Republicans—nominated candidates for the government jobs and have the appointments made from these. At present all the important officers are appointed from Washington and the local patriots are allowed to choose only one or two of the minor places.

Mr. Wenar says he represents no organized body of men. From the political point of view this means that there is no revolution afoot in the island although many men believe, as does Mr. Wenar. The commercial side of his mission, he says, springs purely from a philanthropic desire to see home country flourish.

Sir:—We the undersigned on behalf of the entire British West Indians residing in this peaceful Republic of Costa Rica, sincerely beg to tender you our heartiest and deepest appreciation for your visit to these shores, and rejoice at your noble presence in our midst. We hope your visit may prove a blessed one, and your efforts crowned with abundant success in every effort that you put forward, to remove the ills which needs resistance, and to get for us those wants, in the getting of which it needs assistance.

As a fellowman and citizen of our dearly beloved island, you have taken a position that is arduous and perilous, first, in eradicating the form of Government administered by His Majesty's Representatives, with so much activity, namely, the importation of East Indian coolies to compete against native labour; secondly, the system that keeps our labourers poor and the injustices that are meted out to them. Showers of abuses, criticism, and hatred have been poured on you by those who are opposed to your views, and especially the officials who are solely responsible for the high-handedness, injustice, and mismanagement is carried on from time to time in our Island home under His Majesty's Flag and Banner, which has caused us to emigrate in such numbers, that if we were to be counted, our Government would be surprised to know that we have increased five times as much as when we left home.

Your well wishers beg to inform you that we share in all those criticisms and abuses that have been showered upon you for our betterment, and ask you not to fear nor think the battle long, for soon shall victory wake your song.

When we tell that a fairly large percentage of us is constantly contributing our share to our Government, as constant taxpayers, showing that our interests are still firmly centred patriotic feeling for the land of our birth, and our allegiance still to Our Sovereign Lord and King. Our sincere affection for the dear ones at home, just think how sorrowful it has been to us when many a day we look across the blue sea that divides us in the hope or returning to our families, but when we think again on the conditions that prevail, we console ourselves with the idea, it is best for us to remain, for we would be exchanging liberty for captivity.

We ask your kind sympathy, in extending a hearty congratulation to the people of this peaceful Republic among whom we reside, and whose treatment to us as foreigners cannot be excelled in no other Latin-American country, within this belt at present, and also a continuous prosperity to each and every foreigner, that emigrates to this Republic.

We now wish you a bon voyage,


