## A Hard Case.

Much dissatisfaction now exist among the travelling public in Limon owing to the manner the tickets are being sold at the railway station. It is said that since the resignation of the former ticket agent matters has been going on rather recklessly.

The complaints that have reached us and which we have noticed on one or two occasions is this: that although many persons presents themselves at the ticket office for tickets to travel on the train before the hour announced for its departure are in very many instances unable to do so, owing to the very slow manner the agent does his work.

According to the railway timetable the passenger train is timed to leave the terminal at 10:00 a.m. every day. A few minutes before this hour a gong is sounded as a warning to the passengers, and at the stroke of ten o'clock the train conductor gives the order to the driver to proceed; but much to the disgust and excitement of the unfortunate few that remain before the ticket window have to rush for the door and with nimble leap for the train. But this is not all, once seated in the coach brooding over the narrow escape of losing the train and reclining in its seat after the hard chase to be even with the conductor he is called upon to *sacar* his ticket. If the ticket is not shown and the country's currency is tendered a fine of 50 cents is imposed on such an one.

The conductor is not to be blamed for this, he is only carrying out the orders of the company and rightly so too, for every servant should obey the orders of their master and no concern is properly managed without strict discipline. But here comes the injustice: these parties after availing themselves of the opportunity of presenting themselves at the window of the ticket seller before the time appointed for the departure of the train, and owing to the slow manner persons are attended to they are unable to secure a ticket to catch the train and not to be left behind take the chance of getting on board without their ticket, with the hope of giving the equivalent in cash and which are called upon to pay a fine.

A little consideration should be given the ticket agent because he is a bit new and is not quite at adept at the business, for to fill such a position successfully it requires a few months practice, or the ticket seller should make it a daily practice of reading over the tariff so that he may be conversant with the fares of the different sections by doing this he would find it an easy task to despatch his customers in time to catch the train. The time taken in looking up the tariff and making change would enable all to be served and comfortably seated in the coach, thus avoiding the hurry scurry that is seen now-a-days.
