Agricultura
y ganadería

Para quien quiera que comience un poco á Costa Rica es indudable que su porvenir debe basarse en dos grandes fuentes de riqueza; la agricultura y la ganadería.

En tiempos de la *gominola* colonia, había en Costa Rica diez veces más ganado que hoy; fincas que a principios de siglo mantenían veinte mil cabezas, tienen hoy escasamente dos mil y gastamos en carne próximamente un millón anual de colones, mientras nuestros terrenos están improduc-

tora. Dentro de algunos años, no mucha casi toda la zona dedicada hoy al cultivo del banano tendrá que convertirse en potreros, porque no tenemos brazos para labrar en otras culturas.

Pero, la ganadería ofrece un porvenir brillante y justo es que se le dedique mayor atención que hasta ahora, si las generaciones venideras quieren vivir y vivir bien, en el suelo le la patria.

Según decíamos días pasados en un súltimo, el consumo europeo de carne aumenta considerablemente; países como los Estados Unidos han dejado de ser exportadores para atender al consumo local y no tardarán en convertirse en importadores.

La urgencia de provisión de carne es tal en Europa, que en el mes pasado el gobierno Francés, para tranquilizar el clamor público, ha dictado medidas proteccionistas a fin de facilitar la importación de carne de la Isla de Martinica, que sin embargo, tiene muy poca importancia como productora de ganado.

Méjico estableció desde hace tres años la industria de congelación de carnes y Venezuela la acaba de establecer en Puerto Caballo para aprovechar la inmensa ventaja que les da su proximidad a los mercados americanos y europeos, sobre la Argentina y Australia proveedores hoy del mercado mundial.

La labor á base en Costa Rica es ardua y lenta, pero es una labor de previsión para el porvenir y es una tarea necesaria, porque nuestros artículos de exportación menguan diariamente y hay que reponerlos en otros, si no queremos ir á la bancarrota y al aniquilamiento del país.

Precisa ante todo trabajar para evitar la exportación de dinero en cambio de carne, estudiar las causas del descenso de las antiguas fincas ganaderas y el modo de recuperarlas, vor como se aprovechan los terrenos poco mejores que desiertos de la patria.

En algunos países, y con fines puramente militares, el Estado sostiene estaciones de caballería, selemente que los pobres entierran á sus muertos, ni es posible ir con facilidad á rendirles un piadoso homenaje.

Si de todos modos, la Municipalidad tiene que liquidar su presupuesto con déficit, drése si quiera una obra de la que pueda decirse «Esto lo hizo la Municipalidad de 1911».

HARM DONE BY VISIT

We call the following from the "Telegraph and Guardian" of the 13th inst. as we believe it will be interesting to many here, especially Jamaicans. We will not comment on the article, we leave our readers to do that. But this we say: there is always a right and wrong way of doing a thing, and in very many cases when some persons attempt to do that which is good they fall short through over zealousness—

Christobal, Oct. 4.—The news of the proposed visit of His Excellency Sir Sydney Olivier to Central America some time during this month is gradually spreading throughout the Isthmus of Panama. Some have read it in the local papers as well as in the Jamaica "Daily Telegraph"; others have heard it. The great question is what really is the intention of the visit—why really is the Governor of Jamaica about to tour on the Isthmus of Panama and Costa Rica! Many are sceptical about the reason as given in extenso in a publication of the "Daily Telegraph" and the "wise" ones are sure that the intention lying behind the visit of Jamaica's Governor is to see the prosperity of Jamaicans in order to know or estimate how much more taxes should be levied; how much higher fines in the law courts should be; how much more to make the lodgment in the Treasury be for each emigrant—in a word, how much more the "poor people" should be oppressed. There is no doubt about it that among the illiterate Jamaicans on the Isthmus Sir Sydney Olivier bears a very bad name. All the misfortunes and woes of Jamaica and Jamaicans are attributed to him and to him alone; and thus his belief exists in the minds even of some whose intellect and reasoning ability is below the average.

With this belief the majority of these people left Jamaica and to some extent the scepticism as to the good intention of the Governor for visiting Central America is due to it, yet it is undisputable that the public addresses delivered by a certain gentleman on the occasion of his two visits to the Isthmus of Panama have had the effect of fostering this belief and strengthening the doubt as to the Governor's good intention. This gentleman toured the Isthmus ostensibly in the interest of a certain newspaper of Jamaica, now defunct. In his addresses he spoke strongly of the mismanagement of affairs by the Government of Jamaica, and unfortunately, he left the deep impression on the minds of the people that this management of the Government is due to or must be laid wholly at the door of the Governor. Probably such an impression was unintentional, yet it, unfortunately, exists as a result of the addresses. Now, all thinking people know that Sir Sydney Olivier is at the head of the Government of Jamaica and can do and undo many things, yet he cannot do or undo everything and often he is deceived by his subordinates on whose recommendations and advice he acts.

In passing I must mention another series of remarks by the gentleman referred to that has already had a particularly bad effect, and his injudiciousness in making these remarks has astoun-

ished even his staunchest admirers and adherents. Among other things he spoke of the very small wages Jamaican labourers, artisans and teachers receive at home, and compared them with what they receive at the hands of the Isthmian Commission: the first class of men receiving here per hour practically what he receives per day in Jamaica. This of course, is not quite true, but suppose it was, what good effect could he have expected a parading and exposure of the fact to have? Indeed, as I have said, it has had a bad effect already, for Jamaicans cannot now complain of their pay, being small far less to ask for a raise of pay, for they have been told that they are far better paid by the Canal Commission than they would be at home for the same work, and in some cases wages have been cut down. Now it has been said that "we should never wash our dirty linen in public," so that even if all this gentleman said were true, it was bad policy for him to have said it under the circumstances in which they were said.

I am certain, however, that His Excellency's visit will have a good effect; many are looking forward to with anxiety, and preparation is being made to give Sir Sydney Olivier a good reception and memorials. In this respect the Colon Literary Association is among the most active. Undoubtedly, Sir Sydney Olivier will be able to remove false impressions, if he will have of addressing the people.

THE APPROACHING TRIP.

The "Daily Telegraph" learns that long before he left Jamaica on his last visit to England His Excellency the Governor contemplated going on a visit to the Isthmus of Panama and Costa Rica. We have reason to believe that while in England he mentioned this idea of his to the Secretary of State for the Colonies (for, of course, no Governor can leave the seat of his Government without permission from the Colonial Office), and as a result of that conversation the idea of the visit developed further.

The Colonial Office has been endeavouring to find out what influence the opening of the Panama Canal will have, not only upon Jamaica, but on all the West Indies; it desires this knowledge for the purpose of being able to decide on plans and arrangements affecting the future development of the West Indies.

Sir Sydney Olivier is staying recently in London as the representative of all the British West Indian Colonies, and having acquired a high reputation as a collector and collator of important information, he was requested by the Secretary of State to study conditions in Panama, and to endeavour to discover what would be the effect of the Canal upon the West Indian future.

This information will be placed before the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and it will be all probability form the basis on which the Colonial Office will act when considering proposals for expenditure in connection with West Indian coaling stations, floating docks, repairing plants,

An Unjustifiable Attack.

In our issue of Saturday 21st instant there appeared a paragraph under the headline "Clever Capture." In the paragraph referred to Mr. Hilary Beckles' name appeared as having been named as having been in possession of 28 zinc sheets, carried by a cartman to a building that Beckles is erecting.

To say the least of this matter is to say that it was gross impertinence on the part of this man for so accosting an honest man for doing his duty. Was not this matter public property? While the articles that were stolen was being conveyed to the place they were found was a secret the discovery of them made it the reverse, and especially since the matter was in the hands of the Government. We fail to see how we have caused Mr. Beckles and his secret men any pain through the publication of the article we simply reproduced what we supply reproduced what the zinc the party that premises It is quite too true "darkness hatched light."

On the 23rd inst. Beckles was before the police Judge, along with the cartman and stated that the zinc was sent by Nurse in the cart driven by the man to the building over which he was building and had charge or worse to this effect. He did not try to deny the articles, he made no attempt to hide or shield anyone. In our opinion he spoke the truth. But the truth in this matter does not disprove the fact that Mr. Beckles and the cartman were receivers. We did not nor are we charging him with having connived with Nurse in taking what was not their own. We simply gave facts as they were.

The Southern capitals of Kiangsu the Yunnan of the Voisroy and Tarter have been destroyed. Twenty miles of the Peking and Hankow railway has been torn up and the bridges burned. The situation is most serious. The revolutionists have occupied Hankow unopposed.

Fighting In French Guinea.

Konakry, French Guinea—Palauois warriors have attacked a detachment of French troops on the Cameroons frontier. The French lost five and thirty wounded.


