LOS VIAJES DE MR. TAFT

La Unión Centroamericana

A propósito de una supuesta tentativa de volar el tren en que viajó Mr. Taft en su gira por los Estados Unidos, dice el "New York World":

"La dinamita puede no haber sido puesta en el puente con la intención de volar el tren de Mr. Taft. Es posible que se haya exagerado el incidente. Pero es lo cierto que siendo un Presidente ambulante, Mr. Taft se pone cada día asimismo en peligro. Es peligro de intentos criminales y en peligro de accidentes, que nadie tiene en ver con las personas".

"Desde que en 1900 fué nombrado vicepresidente de Filipinas, Mr. Taft ha recorrido 275 000 millas, ó sea más de la distancia que hay de la Tierra á la Luna. Ahora está cruzando de un lado a otro el continente regando discursos y distribuyendo apretones de manos hasta en las estaciones de bandera. Esto es indigno. Esto es innecesario. Esto es peligroso. Para qué tanto viaje?"

"Resultó un imbiso que el Primer Magistrado de una República en que io s los funcionarios son elegidos p el pueblo, se consideró que era necesario ser asesinado, pero debe recordarse que otros Presidentes de la República han sido asesinados precisamente porque habían sido elegidos por el pueblo.

"Estamos en la época de la dinamita y sin embargo no se ha convocado a ninguno dinamitero. La dinamita es el medio menos peligroso de asesinar y nadie tendrá de raro que se le inconveniente la tarea de la muerte".

Sigue don Federico Mora, consuegra de la Unión Centroamericana, pero en esta vez, se le ha olvidado el nombre de Estrada Cabrera, y ya, si su espíritu, es posible borrar, serenamente del asunto.

Tómica entre la Unión Centroamericana sería beneficiosa para estos países y con ella no habrá más que seguir la tendencia moderna á constituir grandes naciónalidades, único modo de hacerse respetar; pero, ni se forman grandes naciónalidades con elementos heterogéneos que necesitan largos años de fusión, ni aunque fueran los Centroamericanos homogéneos llegarían á formar una nación respetable por la fuerza.

La casta tica no es privilegiada, pero es otra cosa.

Hoy por hoy, no existe entre los pueblos Centroamericanos tanto algún positivo de Unión; tienen costumbres moneda, todo es diestro y astucioso, y como no se dan duros, para un hombre se necesita el trabajo de varia gen. Ademas,

SIR SYDNEY OLIVIER, JA-

"Fools rush in where angels
fear to tread," is a familiar quo-
tation and is understood by the
least intelligent; and my critic
"Expositor" has not failed to show
the pitiful, that he is a member
of the class that the quotation
suited. "Expositor" has tried by

himself. He has made a careful
analysis, and although he has
given the report of his researches

Arrival Of
the s.s. "Carillo."

HER FIRST TRIP TO TORT
MON.

The s.s. "Carillo" a fine s. c. m.
of English built arrived here
yesterday for the first time; the
ship has been added to the United
Fruit Company Line of steamers.

From early morning anxious
eyes were straining its nerves
looking for the arrival of the boat
but at the stroke of nine o'clock
the good ship with Captain Sim-
mons in charge as pilot came
alongside the pier.

The ship was tastefully decorated
with flags of different national-
ity, from bow to stern and all
looked gay on board, and on her
promenade deck was the cabin
passengers apparently eager
to put their foot on terra

firm. Captain H. Smith, com-
mander of the steamer "Lima" n.
came in charge of the vessel and
the purser Mr. R. Rigby, also of
the s.s. "Liman."

The length of the vessel is 395
feet and her tonnage is 3,108. Her
promenade decks are fine and
have attractive social rooms
pianos, writing tables, book case,
etc., etc., a spacious entrance hall,
private suites, each containing
two single beds, divan, dresser,
large wardrobe with mirror doors
and draws below, connecting bath
and ladies room and barber shop.

The cabin deck has 23 state-
rooms with cottage windows; of
these two rooms have private
baths and toilet connecting. The
smoking room with outside al-
cove seats situated aft and a
spacious comfortable entrance
hall forward.

The saloon deck has dining
room seating for 94; 13 first cabin
staterooms with large openings;
purser's, doctor's steward's and
stewardess' quarters.

Bath and toilet are situated con-
veniently on the cabin and saloon
decks.

State-rooms 9 and 11, 10 and 12,
14 and 15, 16 and 17, 18 and 20,
19 and 21, 26 and 27, 32 and 33,
34 and 35 are connecting rooms.

Staterooms 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14,
15, 17 and 19 have private bat-
and toilet connecting.

Each cabin stateroom has one
upper and lower berth, 2 feet 6
inches wide, and 6 feet 4 inches
long, and a couch. The upper
berth can be closed when not in
use. Steamer trucks not exceeding
12 inches in height can be
placed under berths in suites and
under berths in staterooms.

The Chinese
Revolution.

Shanghai Advices.

CONFIRMS REPORTS OF TRI-
UMPH OF THE REVOLU-
TIONISTS.

Shanghai, Oct. 20.—The follow-
ing message from Vice Admiral Winslow, senior British naval
officer at Hankow, sent by wireless
from a British vessel off Hankow,
was received here this morning.

"All telegraph lines to Shanghai
and to Pekin were destroyed by fire last night for a distance
of a mile beyond the settlement."

Another wireless message dis-
patched from Hankow at noon
to-day and re-transmitted over
land lines of Kiukiang reaching
here at 4 o'clock, says the govern-
ment troops retreated up Zev
Mile Creek while the Chinese
warships withdrew down the
river out of sight. The revolution-
ists claim a great victory.

Still another message says that
the revolutionists at Hankow
claim a great victory over the im-
perialists. They declare they cap-
tured the river side and the rail-
way station, after which all the
Chinese warships retreated, with
the exception of one cruiser,
which succeeded to the rebels.

The retreat of the imperialists
at Hankow is confirmed in other
dispatches from Kiukiang, which
state that the Chinese gunboats
are retreating to Kiukiang. The
conduct of the rebels at Hankow
is reported to be exemplary. Mar-
tial law is enforced.

Today's advice of rebel suc-
cesses at Hankow caused great
jubilation among the Chinese
here. Previously they had been
dismayed.

The run on the banks here has
stopped, but the native banks are
unable to pay their outstanding
checks and business is at a stand-
still. Otherwise the situation
here is quiet.

The venerable North China
Daily news, anticipating an un-
fortunate imperial victory, in an edi-
torial recalling the awful fate
which traditionally awaits rebels
in China, says the powers are not
intervening because of self-inter-
est, adding:

"The ringleaders undoubtedly
must die, but Yuan Shih Kai ar-
rived with well-filled money bags
and imperial pardons ready for
signature is offering mercy to
those who have been coerced into
participation in the revolt."

"The events of the past week
must lead to a genuine redress of
grievances. China should remem-
ber the starving multitudes beg-
garized by the Yang tse-kiang
floods. Those with whom the
rebels had been able to plead
fought and died."

War News.

BENGHAZI REDUCED.

Italian Fleet Bombs Place
And Lands Troops.

Benghazi, Tripoli, Oct.—In a
sharp fight between Turkish de-
fenders and the Italian fleet under
Rear Admiral Ambrey, the Italians
accomplished practical occupation
of this city yesterday forenoon.

The Italian fleet arrived in the
roadstead Wednesday morning.

The Turkish commander was
granted twenty-four hours in
which to capitulate. The entire day
passed. No reply was re-
ceived from the commander. Yes-

terday morning the guns of the
fleet began to hurl shells into
the town, and three hours later
a detachment of troops, under
protection of Italian guns, made a
landing. The troops were met
with a galling fire, but they ad-
vanced rapidly and took the
outlying barracks.

Benghazi has 15,000 population.
It is 42 miles east of Tripoli,
and is the starting points for
caravans for Wadi and Egypt.

TURKS TURN A TRICK.

Send Troops To Chios, Greek
Island, Alleging Attack.

Athen, Oct. 20.—It is announced
that Turkish troops have been
sent to the Island of Chios, in
view of the likelihood of Italian
attack.

As the population of the island
is almost entirely Greek, the
measure has produced a very bad
impression here particularly as
the pretext is a poor one, the
number of troops of troops being
quite insufficient to resist the
Italian fleet.

Special Train.

At one o'clock yesterday afternoon
a small crew of gentlemen


