

## WHO IS RESPONSIBLE?

No one will dare deny the fact that it was a miracle that lives were not lost in Mondays explosion at the camp where the St. Kit's men reside. Who is responsible for the explosion ought to feel happy to-day that the situation is not more grave and only ended as it is: the destruction of part of a building and slight injuries to three men. Indeed the result would have been greater but for Providence it is as it is.

But what has not happened today could occur to-morrow and experiences of the past serves to make one more cautious in the future, or alive to one's sense of duty. The question that is now asked by intelligent persons is, how came those cylinders, containing ammonia in the yard, and for what purpose were they kept there, and were the men apprised of what the cylinders contained? The enquiring public world like to know, and perhaps they will know, because we believe a searching inquiry will be made into the matter to find out who is responsible for the careless manner these destructive cylinders that contained ammonia were kept.

We are inclined to say that undoubtedly the matter now rests with the United Fruit Company to give account of the whole affair; the destructive articles were on their premises, how they got there no one is better able to explain. But this is a solemn fact that lives been destroyed had they would be held responsible for it, and perhaps be called upon, after a careful and painstaking inquiry to hand up a decent sum by way of compensation. But after all what good will compensation do to a dead man after suffering untold agony before his demise. Echo answers none away.

As if it is these parties have been injured in the catastrophe, but not serious, cannot this be called unnecessary pain? A woman that lived on the building that the cylinder passed through is now lying in the hospital prostrated through the shock, and which might have caused her death. Surely if reasonable protection was taken the mishap would be unknown. There is the property of Mr. Beckly, possibly we will hear a law suit with the company if the proprietor of the damaged building is not properly compensated, and who will blame him?

It is said that the men (natives) that used the cylinders for making fire are to be blamed. We are not at one in this argument, and can see the force of this argument, how could the men know what was in the cylinder if they were not told, and if they were properly put away they would not be in the reach of these men, who at the best is very deficient in reasoning. They ought to be excused for having kindled fire on the cylinders.

However this explosion ought to be a warning to all so that in the future more care will be exercised in the keeping and storing of explosives.

O' rhymin, chismist and buffoon! Has the Governor proved himself a reformer and restored has he proved himself listful to the means and groans of more than 700,000 people and gracious in redressing their wrongs and supplying their needs, why we must consider well what he is worth?"

## Local News.

The s.s. "Frutera" is expected to arrive here today from New Orleans. She comes in ballast.

The s.s. "Toruguero," after taking a cargo consisting of 56,000 bunches of bananas will sail for Bristol early this morning.

The s.s. "Cartago" will be despatched this afternoon at 5 o'clock for Colon taking mails and passengers.

"La Informacion" is responsible for the following: "We learn that the Atlantic Fruit Company has purchased here all the farms owned by Lindo Brothers."

The s.s. "Sibria" sailed on Monday last for New York via Kingston, Jamaica, taking the following passengers. For New York: Juan Fernandez and child, Miss Emma Rojas. For Kingston: Mrs. Lucy Green, Mrs. Alice Hart, Mrs. Benjamin Smith, and Miss Irene McAlexander 21 deckers. She took the following cargo: 21,000 bunches bananas, 710 sacks coffee, 232 sacks corn, 100 bundles hides, 13 packages rubber and 23 live turtles.

The United Fruit Company's steamer "Cartago" arrived here yesterday morning from New Orleans via Puerto Barrios with the following passengers: H. M. Louis Eustis, Mrs. L. Eustis, Mrs. L. Ralli, Miss M. Ronette, John Sutcliffe, Mrs. Margaret Sutcliffe, Frederico Soltrado, Arturo Pait, Luis Arias, Frank E. Morton, Mrs. Luisa Loada, Messrs. Antonio Frederico and Aristides Luana, and 3 in transit, also four deck passengers. She brought 67 sacks mails.

A special train left here yesterday morning immediately after the arrival of the "Cartago" from New Orleans. The special came to Limon on Monday evening and was in waiting till yesterday morning when the Hon. Luis Eustis, wife and daughter on fishing boat, all a

minutes after the train was on its way to San Jose.

It is understood around the Zent Division of the United Fruit Company that no labourer is allowed to earn more than \$30 per month, whether it be for draining, underbrushing, cleaning or fallowing. Should anyone make more than that amount in any one month his surplus must be shown in the following month's pay roll, exclusive of his commissary account. Field labourers are not supposed to earn more than one dollar gold per day whether for task or contract.

It is learnt on good authority that through the able ability of Mr. E. J. Hitchcock that there is some dissatisfaction arising out of the result of measurements of various farms—including the experimental farms, Avonmouth farm and others in the vicinity. With the aid of a chart placed before him he sees that many creeks have been certified for, and the Company has paid for, which the map shows lesser creeks. For the past month the engineers that have worked are trying to find out if any mistakes has been made. Some one will have to answer.

We are reliably informed that the United Fruit Company has instructed one of their chief employees of the fruit office division to go around the regions of Banana River and offer small settlers great bargains for their possessions, (cultivated land) and to those who have refused selling that gentleman tried to make contracts with them. Many of the residents have found it wise to refuse all inducements.

## Reduction of Armaments.

London.—According to the "Chronicle" Vienna correspondent, negotiations which were initiated by Germany have been proceeding for months between Great Britain and Germany for a reduction in naval armaments.

## New Dread-noughts.

Vienna.—Italy is reported to be hastening the completion of three Dreadnoughts, and has ordered 4,000 tons of armour plate from an American firm because the Italian works are unable to finish it speedily enough. It is expected that the ships will be ready for service by the end of 1912.

## Steel Trust.

New York.—It was reported in excellent authority here that the United States Steel Corporation intended to cancel its contracts with the Great Northern Ore Co. The contracts on a royalty basis and its terms provide for cancellation upon two years' notice. It is said that this notice will be given before the end of the year. The term assigned is that the contract has proved unprofitable to the Steel Corporation.

None of the officers of Steel Corporation or of the Great Northern interests would discuss the rumour.

## Gain for Socialists.

Stockholm.—The elections for the Second Chamber yesterday, the first held since universal suffrage and proportionate representation were introduced, showed additional to the strength of the Socialists. Returns from 204 of 300 give the following results: 186, 100, Liberal 87, Socialists 56. The People's Union, which excludes the Socialists, got 26. Pranting, were all returned for Socialists. The newspapers predict a new Ministerial Staff. The Socialists declare that they will not enter the new Cabinet.

## Train Wreck.

Rio Janiero.—Six persons are known to have been killed and twenty others injured, some of whom, it is believed will die, when a freight train running past the signals crashed into a passenger train which had left the rails.

The longer train, a fast express from San Pablo, was running at a high rate of speed near the town of Purify when the engine left the rails. Several of the cars hung along the roadbed for some distance, but were not overturned, and there were no fatalities and only minor injuries among the passengers.

In just a few minutes and before the passengers in a panic because of the accident, could gather their wits and escape from the derailed cars, a fast freight crashed into the rear end of the stalled train. It was said that the engine driver ignored the signals set that should have warned him of the trouble ahead.

## Central China Will Remain a Unit.

Kansas City.—The foreign powers are waiting to seize the outside provinces of China, but the central part of the country will remain a complete union under the organization that is coming, asserted the Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, Bishop of the Episcopal Church here. Bishop Partridge spent seventeen years as a clergyman in China, returning to the United States only a few months ago.

"The revolutionary movement," he continued, "is a welcome one, as almost any change in China will be a benefit to the people, who are held back by ancient customs and corrupt officials."


