TELEGRAMA

Limón, 6 de octubre de 1942.
Sr. Presidente de la República
Dr. R. A. Calderón Guardia.
San José.

Muy respetuosamente pedimos al Sr. Presidente apertura almacén depósito comestibles en esta ciudad, similar al que existe en Fábrica Nacional de Licores, lo que aliviará situación creada por alza desmedida precios artículos primera necesidad, beneficiándonos además rebaja 25 por ciento de que goza el Gobierno sobre fletes ferrocarril.

Limoneses esperamos confiados su ayuda esta provincia tan azotada por la actual situación y en donde realmente se sienten los efectos del hambre debido alza constante costo vida, agravada por paro obligado actividades portuarias y agrícolas.

Dos CHINOS Comerciantes han sido víctimas de una CURIOSA ESTAFA

SE DESPEGAN BILLETES DE DIEZ COLONES Y SE COMBINAN PARA DUPLICAR SU VALOR

En días pasados dos chinos comerciantes de esta ciudad han sido víctimas de una estafa con los billetes de diez colones. El sistema usado es el siguiente: Se despegan los billetes de diez colones y de dos y luego se pegan cuidadosamente el frente de uno con el reverso del otro. En esa forma el billete presenta una cara de diez colones y la otra de dos. Aprovechándose de la oscuridad, se presentaron simultáneamente a diferentes cantinas a comprar cigarrillos y entregaron los billetes con el frente de diez colones, que el chino cambió sin ocurrírsele verlos por ambos lados.

En esa forma, de dos billetes que suma doce colones, uno de diez y otro de dos, se hacen dos billetes de diez. La utilidad es de ocho colones en la operación.

En el Banco Nacional de Cos-

ta Rica tuvimos oportunidad de examinar los billetes y el trabajo es bueno. Damos la noticia para que el comercio esté alerta y se pare la estafa.

SE ESTA HACIENDO UNA CUIDADOSA REVISION DE LAS PATENTES DE COMERCIO

MONSTRUOSO CRIMEN DE INFANTICIDIO COMETIDO EN EL PUEBLO DE GUACIMO

Una madre esconde al hijo acabado de nacer, después de extrangularlo para ocultar su crimen

Hace por ahí de un par de meses, nos dice nuestra informante, que la propietaria de la casa donde vivía sola una señorita,—ex maestra hoy, de Guacimo—de esta provincia, dió cuenta a la autoridad de policía de aquella localidad del macabro de una criatura en el exbro hallazgo que hizo del cadáver de dicha casa, en estado de semi descomposición y la circunstancia de haber dejado la casa el día anterior, su inquilina, una señorita Alfaro, maestra del lugar so pretexto de haber quedado cesante y sentirse atacada de paludismo.—El señor Agente de Policía lo comunicó al señor Alcalde de Siquirres, quien dispuso con toda actividad, que fuera extraído el cadáver para su reconocimiento y dió comienzo a las diligencias sumariales del caso.

RECONOCIMIENTO DEL CAVER DE UN NISO

Constituida la obstétrica de Guápiles en el lugar del macabro hallazgo, se constató que se rataba del cadáver de un varoncito bien formado, pero rubio, nacido en tiempo, que nació vivo y que a juzgar por las contusiones que presentaba a los lados del cuello, fué extranguado al nacer y echado el cuerpecito al inodoro con las placentas, y ser de pura raza blanca, y que en aquella época todas las mujeres que se encuentran en estado de gravidez en esa localidad, ninguna había dado a luz, continuando con estos datos las autoridades con la diligencia que en ellas es característica, una minuciosa investigación, colaborando en esa labor los vecinos para dar con la autora de tan repugnante hecho.

Gravemente enfermo es trasladado al Hospital de Limón, el señor Agente Principal de Policía de Estrada

En la mañana del lunes fué traído al Hospital de la Compañía Bananera el Sr. Agente Principal de Policía de Estrada don Tobías Chavarría. Un fuerte ataque de fiebre de aguas negras ha puesto en peligro su vida. En un tren expreso fué traído precipitadamente y aunque su estado es gravísimo las atenciones que ha recibido en el Hospital le han salvado la vida.

ESTAMOS EN GUERRA!

Todo no ha de ser quejas y lamentaciones sobre la furiosa crisis económica que azota a este sufrido Puerto de la Buena Esperanza. No había de faltar la nota tragi-cómica que nos pusiera como quien dice, de moda. Pasó lo del SAN PABLO, y las lágrimas que nublaron nuestros ojos al contemplar la devastación de hogares costarricenses no nos dejaron saborear el agrado de la notoriedad, insensibilidad a la cual contribuyó en gran manera la nerviosidad que por algunos días nos dominó al suponer seriamente amenazada nuestra integridad física, que es ya lo único que a los ticos nos preocupa. Vino luego el oscurecimiento de la población, y al sentirnos cobijados por un manto de sombra densa fué renaciendo la tranquilidad y continuó nuestra vida, como siempre monótona y un poco aburrida. Se olvidaron de nosotros y hasta la luna, que días después llegó a bordar en plata el terciopelo de nuestro abrigo, una noche de tantas, cuando más redonda estaba, se puso a mostear por la oscura boca que le abrió el eclipse.

Bueno pues, lírmosos aparte, ahora resulta, como ya dijimos, que estamos de moda y todo por causa de los periódicos capitalinos que nos suponen —¿tan lejos estaremos?— librando una descomunal y fiera batalla anfibia (y valga la novedad del término ahora que sólo se habla de batallas aéreas, terrestres y navales). Nuestras baterías costeras, dicen ellos, sostienen fuego nutrido contra los submarinos del Eje que obstinadamente se empeñan en tomar por asalto nuestra costa seguramente para establecer en ella una cabeza de puente astronómico que serviría de punto de partida a los totalitarios para posesionarse de este democrático continente americano. 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NOTAS EDITORIALES

LAS TIERRAS DE NADIE

En otro lugar de este número insertamos un proyecto sobre la colonización de una faja de tierra que es actualmente propiedad de la Compañía Bananera, pero que está casi totalmente abandonada.

El proyecto —que es de don Rafael de la Peña— contempla una de las mayores necesidades de esta zona y resuelve muchos de sus problemas esenciales. Fue laborado cuando el señor de la Peña era regidor municipal en la administración pasada. Y cuando la Agrupación Progresista Atlántica pensaba que todo su esfuerzo no iba a morir en el vacío de indiferencia y en la tela enmarañada de las conveniencias particulares.

Seguramente ahora con la visita del señor Secretario de Agricultura y del señor Gerente del Banco Nacional, este proyecto puede otra vez cobrar vida y despertar interés en estos altos funcionarios.

Este proyecto, si acaso tiene defectos, es por lo menos la base para una colonización de algunas de las tantas tierras inútiles que duermen al margen de la vía férrea esperando la mano del hombre que las trabaje y las cultive.

Desde hace muchos años, todos sabemos y nos lo repetimos los unos a los otros, que mientras no se repartan en pequeñas parcelas muchos de los terrenos que tiene abandonados la Compañía, no se podrá colonizar, en el amplio sentido que tiene este vocablo, la zona atlántica.

Más que el cultivo del abacá; más que el desarrollo de la ganadería; más que la ayuda a los productores de cacao, es necesario afincar de manera estable familias y trabajadores que ahora ambulaban de campamento en campamento, como gitanos que buscan un pedazo de tierra donde acampar con la carreta. Cuando esas gentes tengan su propia tierra, cuando hayan construido su rancho y hayan criado su vaca y sus gallinas; cuando rieguen la semilla y recojan el fruto para su propio bienestar; cuando trabajen para ellos con esperanza y con fe de que su trabajo ha de hacerlos independientes, allí se arraigarán y allí formarán su familia.

Este fenómeno no es simplemente un espejismo ni una idealidad virgiliana. Es un hecho real en todo el resto de la república. Cuando se recorren las otras provincias y se visitan los hogares campesinos, se advierte el amor que esas gentes le tienen al pedazo de tierra que fué de sus abuelos y que será para sus hijos. Allí, en esas pocas parcelas de siembra están encerrados todos sus afectos. Los que murieron descansan allí bajo la paz de una cruz y los que viven dejan allí el sudor del trabajo y la esperanza de la cosecha futura.

Aquí nada de eso tenemos. Exploradores y explotadores de un momento sin más interés que sacar en racimos de bananos el dinero invertido, es lo que forma el campesino de esta zona. Agotada la finca a los dos o tres años, sacuden el polvo del calzado y trasladan a otros lugares su ambición o su fracaso. Por eso la provincia de Limón es la tierra de nadie. Se viene y se va con inestabilidad de turistas y no hay cariños ni hay arraigos.

La labor del Gobierno en estos momentos no es solamente solucionar el problema económico del momento, desarrollando fuentes de riqueza. Es también nacionalizar de una manera estable la población flotante que siempre hemos tenido.

Un pedazo de tierra que sea propia; un rancho, una vaca, un perro, unas gallinas, es todo lo que se necesita para hacer un labriego. Y es tan fácil hacerlo con sólo un poco de visión para el mañana y un poco de buena voluntad para hoy...

HON. GEORGE LYALL WILL NOT LEAVE JUST NOW

In our previous issue we mentioned, with much regret, that the Hon. George Lyall, His Britannic Majesty's Charge d'Affaires resident in San Jose, was slated for retirement and would be leaving Costa Rica at an early date. We have since had the information that his government has forwarded instruction for his Government has for the distinguished diplomat to remain in this Republic to remain in this Republic to the end of the present year. We are genuinely pleased.

REGARDING THE WAR

The Russians still hold Stalin grade and the Nazis are reported to be diverting their attention to Astrakhan on the Caspian Sea, 230 miles southeast of Stalingrad.

In the fight which continues within Stalingrad the invaders' efforts of breakthrough the defences and separate the defending forces have again failed with heavy losses. Their offensive in the Caucasian front is still detained.

The offensive of the North American Air units against the Japanese in various sectors of the Pacific has greatly intensified and is obtaining much success.

The Air raids over Germany and occupied territories progress daily. The industrial center of Lille, France, suffered heavily yesterday.

Anti-Nazi movements are daily increasing among the subjugated peoples of Europe. A reign of terror is said to have been experienced in Norway during the past several days. More than 100 patriots have been arrested and all the male inhabitants, between the ages of 20 and 25 years, of a particular district were shot by the German authorities.

5,000 TONS OF BOMBS OVER EUROPE IN 10 DAYS

In ten night attacks, effected by units of the Royal Air Force during the first two weeks of the recent passed month of September, nearly 5,000 tons of bombs are stated, officially, to have been discharged over European territory.

Included in this extraordinary total, were a quantity of four ton explosives discharged over Dusseldorf which was regarded as the most destructive raid effected on a moonless night. Extensive damage was caused several important steel and iron foundries and munition factories.

MANY DETAINED FOR FAILURE TO PRESENT RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATES

It cannot be reasonably denied that the Government afforded a very large number of the foreigners residing in the Republic extensive opportunities to comply with the requirements of the law dealing with the important matter of 'Residential Certificates'. The Diplomatic Representatives of the nationals affected by the decree also rendered as much assistance as they possibly could. We too have called attention to the importance of the law and the serious inconveniences which would occur to those who did not comply therewith. Thousands, we understand, have, however, failed and many of our citizens have in consequence been detained by the police authorities. If this campaign against all defaulters continues, it is obvious the detentions will largely increase and a delicate situation created.

None can, of course, claim ignorance as an excuse for their non-compliance, but knowing, as we do, the cha-

acteristic law-abiding tendencies of our people we are inclined to the opinion that economic and other embarrassing circumstances are mainly responsible in a large majority of the cases. We, therefore, hope that in pursuance of his well known democratic and humanitarian disposition, our Chief Executive and his Administrative Personnel will find it possible to approve an early solution of the difficult situation.

ETHIOPIA JOINS ALLIED NATIONS

According to a declaration made a few days ago by President Roosevelt, the Emperor of Ethiopia, Haile Selassie, has placed his entire military forces as well as the economic resources of his Empire at the disposal of the Allied Nations.

The Emperor is also stated to have asked that Ethiopia be numbered among the nations at war with the Axis combine.





BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

BRITISH PARA TROOPS

There are several battalions of paratroops in the British Army now. They consist of volunteers from a variety of regiments and from all parts of the Kingdom. The physical requirements are of course severe, particularly for eyesight and hearing. Recruits begin with ground training. They learn on models how to drop through the circular hole in the floor of the plane (a practise peculiar to British paratroops—those of other armies make their exit through the door of the plane); how to land and pick up the weapons dropped separately in containers; the care and manipulation of parachutes. They have special physical training to develop those muscles which will take up.

THE SHOCK OF LANDING

Toughest lesson of all is the self-control necessary to sit still, without fidgeting and checking over gear, during those tense moments just before making a real jump. The impulse to do this does not diminish, however many jumps a man has made. It has been found that about one practise jump a month is the right number to keep a man in condition. More than that is too much of a strain on the nervous system—fewer jumps result in a let-down of the nervous system. Parachutists say that once a jump is made, there is a pleasurable sense of thrill and achievement, and

NO FEELING OF DANGER

Besides this specialised training, parachutists also go through Commando-like courses in unarmed combat, fieldcraft, weapon training, including the use of foreign weapons and high explosives. They must, of course, be first-class map readers and be able to find their way by the sun and the stars.

CHURCHILL VERSUS HITLER

RUSSIA - BRITISH STRAWMEN

On September 24th., the "Giornale d'Italia" published an article by a member of the Italian forces who had recently returned from the Russian front. Here is an extract: "Another Soviet trick consisted in the use of camouflage straw suits which, in the dark, made Soviet soldiers appear like sheaves of wheat. The Soviet soldiers were thus able to cross, at night, fields which they could not storm in daylight. The Italian soldiers in this sector were rather young and were not yet acquainted with Soviet tricks. Even so, some Italian outposts recognized that an entire field of wheat sheaves had begun suddenly to move toward the Italian lines. An Italian soldier reporting this incident said it looked as if the whole field had begun to spin round. When the Italian troops realised that this was the Soviet's latest trick, they opened fire. In looking over the dead, it was discovered that these straw suits had been manufactured by the British firm Ellony & Co of Manchester, and these make believe sheaves had obviously been shipped to the Soviets as Britain's assistance in the Russian war".

THE UNEASY BALKANS

Persistent reports are coming out of neutral countries, particularly Turkey, that the various satellite rulers in the Balkans are becoming more and more disillusioned about the prospects of an Axis victory and, terrified by the rising popular discontent are looking round for a means of escape from their dilemma. Such reports should be treated with great reserve, for it is worth noting that they are being indistinctly publicised from Axis sources. Though there is no evidence available in London, there may be substance in other reports to the effect that Hungary (who has, up to now, got off lightly) is to be ordered to make a more substantial contribution to the Russian campaign, and that those parts of Transylvania ceded to her two years ago are to handed back to Roumania. In a recent issue of the "Neues Wiener Tagblatt", a flattering reference to Hungary's future in economic collaboration with Germany ended on this warning note: "Of course, there can be no doubt that this work will also demand its sacrifices—sacrifices actually in Hungary's economic war effort which, as far as it concerns agrarian exports, might come very near to the limit of what Hungary can contribute having regard to her own supply position".

SECOND FRONT ISSUE

There danger that the clamor for a new front will reach a point where it becomes "second front for second front's sake". of a kind that can only be launched by the opening of another front. But a front opened for such a purpose must be a success. The price is going to be too high in lives and equipment not to get something permanent and strategically decisive out of it. (The Prime Minister revealed recently that losses at Dieppe were half the total force). We must think in terms of decisive action and not merely in terms of a more half diversion, or our losses may.

PROLONG THE WAR FOR YEARS

And if we do not think in these terms, then obviously the opening of a new front must not go off half-cocked. We cannot afford merely a super-colossal hit-and-run commando raid. We must be prepared to spend the time and thought that is required for the elaborate and detailed planning, the gathering of information, the marshalling of equipment and men, that will assure success. Day and night in the British Isles strenuous preparations are under way. Nobody in England asks "Should there be a second front"? or even "Will there be a second front"? They ask, only, "When?"

FLAGS OF THE ALLIES

RUSSIA

The red flag, which had hitherto been a symbol of revolutionary activity, was adopted in October, 1917, as its State flag by the Soviet Union.

It bears, in the top left-hand corner, a five-pointed star surmounting a hammer and sickle. The hammer and sickle symbolises the union between the workers of town and country.

CHALK FOR SUGAR

The German occupation authorities have advised housewives to use powdered chalk instead of sugar, which has become virtually unobtainable. They claimed that chalk neutralizes the acidity of vegetables, (like rhubarb), just as well as sugar does. A little sugar may be added for sweetening purposes.

BRITISH ARMY CRAFTSMEN

A new regiment of the British Army officially came into being on October 1st.—the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. The bulk of its personnel is made up of mechanical engineers from the Royal Army Ordnance Corps. Others to be transferred are the maintenance men of the Royal Army Service Corps (except those serving on transports) and some of the mechanical maintenance men of the Royal Engineers. The new Corps' job will be the repair and maintenance of all kinds of mechanical equipment, from stop-watches to range-finders, to tanks. R.E.M.E. men will often

and repair vehicles under fire, even forging unavailable spare parts on the spot. Theirs will be the job of extracting tanks from traps. To most of the men of the R.E.M.E. none of this will be new, since they have been doing these things with their past units. The formation of the new Corps was planned to bring about closer coordination between maintenance and those Army units the corps will service, and also to establish a more direct link with the arms industries. All the officers of the R.E.M.E. will be fully qualified engineers, while the tradesmen in the ranks will have a new Army title—they will be called "Craftsmen".

ITALY AND VICHY - CURRYING THE MASTER'S FAVOURS

Whenever Vichy-German collaboration advances a step, Rome becomes disquieted lest these services rendered to Germany should be held by Hitler to have liquidated the Italian territorial claims on France. The official Italian review "Relazioni Internazionali" describes Vichy's cooperation with Germany as "only a manoeuvre to gain a free hand against Italy", "Franco-Italian cooperation is a dead letter, but French public opinion remains.

OUTSPOKENLY HOSTILE

to Italy. No attempt is made in Government circles to counteract this hatred of Italy, as it is fully shared by a responsible member of the government. One of Vichy's main aims is the frustration of Italian aspirations". Similarly, the Rome correspondent of the "Tribune de Geneve" writes that France is more than ever trying to play off against Rome her collaboration with Berlin. "France's tenacious hope", he continues, "to reduce Italy's claims by concessions to Berlin, rushes her to make greater contributions to the Axis victory".

THE A.T.S. ARE FOUR YEARS OLD

Four years ago, on September 27th, seven women, pledged to secrecy discussed with high Army officers the formation of a woman's army. A few months later, by Royal decree, the Auxiliary Territorial Service came a part of the armed forces of the Crown. Since then, every woman who has put on the battledress of the A.T.S. has done so with the knowledge that she was subject to the same discipline as a soldier. Today the A.T.S. are a vast army, growing daily, and undertaking more and more.

MORE SKILLED WORK

Every tank arriving overseas has been prepared for its journey by four (4) A.T.S. The guns that arrive have been assembled and packed by A.T.S. A soldier of lone patrol who is saved by a portable radio owes his life to the A.T.S. who have put it together, tested and packed. When great motor transport convoys arrive, it is A.T.S. motor mechanics who, through

have driven the lorries from the factory to the port. In England, drivers, cooks, clerks, orderlies and storewomen carry on their vital duties, and on their side have grown up a huge new body of technicians and specialists who work at more than 60 different trades. They are the women soldiers who have become trained electricians, acetylene welders, radio mechanics, fitters, metal machinist working side by side with men in the Army's workshops.
