SEIS MIL SESENTA Y NUEVE COLONES SE HAN RECAUDADO EN LA CIUDAD DE LIMON POR CONCEPTO DEL IMPUESTO PARA CASAS DE HABITACION

Según el informe que en días pasados remitió la Junta de la Habitación a la Corporación Municipal de Limón, hasta el momento se han los balances de prueba, se han recaudado seis mil sesenta y nueve colones y algunos céntimos como impuestos para las casas baratas. Pero no obstante haber llegado ese arroz el sábado a medio día y haber puesto telegramas pidiendo la autorización correspondiente al señor Director de la Oficina de Control de Precios, hasta el lunes en la tarde no se había recibido contestación ninguna.

Esta deficiencia que anotamos indica que es necesaria una mejor organización en cuanto se refiere a las provincias. No parece que los señores inspectores de precios, que son los representantes de la oficina general de bien tener mayor libertad de acción en casos de emergencia. No es posible dejarlo así.

LETTER WRITTEN BY A POLISH SOLDIER TO HIS PARENTS

From strongest issue of the Post, last Friday. This is not a full-length letter written by a Polish soldier to his parents before being wounded in Germany on March 30th. He died on the 5th of April. He was a paratrooper and had just landed on the eastern bank of the Rhine to secure six bridges. He fled the German invasion of his native land, reached California where he took a university course and then entered the armed service of the United States of America.

THE LETTER

"My beloved parents:

I have watched over us and I hope we will all live well. I believe that whatever He does is for the best; even if at the moment we do not see it. We had many proofs along our road that what seemed bad for us at the moment, always came out for good.

Whatever might happen, believe in

God—He is not afraid of anything and I do not worry about myself. I am fighting and working for my ideals and believe that God will help me. My ideal is that all people are individualists and should be treated as such, regardless of their sins, understanding of God and appearance. That is my faith, ideal and religion, and the goal of my life is to do whatever I can to spread that faith among people, so that finally everybody may recognize that truth and virtue as citizens of the world and live together in friendship, goodwill toward everyone,

THE GENERAL ELECTIONS IN BRITAIN

As this paper goes to press, it is apparent that the Labour Party scored a decisive victory over the Conservative Party. At 10 o'clock in the morning of Thursday, July 26, The Labour Combine had obtained 390 seats in the new House of Commons, while the Conservative Combine held 190. The Liberal Party, whose political policies were similar to those of the Conservatives, lost a number of seats. Sir Archibald Sinclair, the leader of the party and former Minister for Air, was defeated, as also Sir William Beveridge, the author of the

famous insurance scheme.

At the above given time the voting by numbers was as follows: Labour: 10,843,228; Conservatives: 8,004,615; Libe-

rals: 2,069,000; Independents: 398,450; Nationals 140,221; Commonwealth: 107,547; Communists 74,540; Independent Liberals: 46,679. Although there can be no doubt that the next British Government will be formed by the Labour Party, headed by Clement Attlee and Ernest Bevin, the general trend of the vote indicates that there will be a strong opposition in the House of Commons, and that for this reason the debates will be salutary for the British Nation as a whole as it faces the vast problems of the post-war period.

ALLIED AERONAVAL OFFENSIVE CONTINUE TO EFFECTIVELY DESTROY JAPAN

The combined North American enemy ships and 596 of their aircraft and British fleets continue their raids. They have also laid in ruins a large number of military and industrial Japanese interests, in which they are being constantly aided by power

ful aerial squadrons. During fifteen days of their intensified activities, against the big naval base of Yokohama they are said to have destroyed 791 vessels in the Bay of Tokyo, produc-

ing, we are told, the heaviest losses yet inflicted in a single attack.

More than two thousand North American planes also raided the important naval base of Kure in the island of Honshu, 650 kilometers south of Tokyo, and left it in ruins. — (PASA a la página OCHO)

THE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Kindness is preserved by a constant reciprocation of benefits or interchange of pleasure; but such benefits can only be bestowed as others are capable of receiving, and such pleasures imparted as others are qualified to enjoy.

INTENSIFIED PRODUCTION ONLY CURE FOR SPECULATION

Speculation is rife. From all parts we hear the cry of the large majority of the working classes against the traders whose unscrupulous actions compel them to procure most of their items of every day necessity at well nigh profiteering prices or, at least, much beyond those fixed by the Competent Authority.

There was the case, somewhat recently, of Dulce, when the price of a "head" soared to more than two colones. Rice and Sugar are the items most affected at the present time. Necessity has no regard for well established principles or customs; so when the stomach is empty, and there is a marked scarcity of the needed article of food, it will be purchased, whatever the inflated price may be. The unscrupulous trader, consequently, seizes the opportunity to add to their gains, regardless of the heavier burden he places on his less fortunate fello' creatures.

The Competent Authorities endeavour to control the situation, but they will never completely succeed. In our opinion the only measure which will effectively destroy the malevolent germ is an intensification of our agricultural activities — a greater production of the things we need for our daily consumption. The more abundant an article the lower the price will fall.

An experiment was made, we have been reliably informed, with the cultivation of Rice in this Zone. Cultivation was conducted on a quarter of an acre of land at Sandoval in the district of Zent, and notwithstanding the predatory actions of birds, a harvest of twelve quintals was reaped. This certainly proves that if the cultivation of Rice be scientifically undertaken, and a threshing plant established within easy reach of the growers, instead of our experiencing such frequent shortages, there would be regular and sufficient supply for all. This also holds good for other items of food.

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

IMPASSÉ IN INDIA

The latest British offer to India has met with such astonishing coolness — so far as the principle is concerned—from the major Indian political groups, that it would be a pity indeed were it to break down because of the old Indian religious problem. And yet something very like that appears likely to occur, in spite of the real efforts of Field Marshal Wavell, the Viceroy, to avert it.

The crux of the matter lies in the fact that the Moslem League, representing those Moslems who fear political domination by the numerically stronger Hindus, are seeking the largest possible representation in the proposed all-party Executive Council. They are not too well pleased with the plan to allot one-third of the seats to them and their co-religionists, one-third to the predominantly Hindu Congress party and one-third to the smaller groups. But they are strenuously resisting the Congress party's claim to have one or two of the Moslem seats allotted to Moslems within its own membership. The goal of the Moslem League is partition of India and it has fought any attempt at a truly national government until that goal can be achieved.

Needless to say, this old quarrel jeopardizes India's hopes for speedy self-government, whether as a dominion or as an independent state. The British can argue, with much justification, that unless Moslems and Hindus agree it will be necessary either to coerce the former or maintain the status quo — which means, in effect, coercion of the latter. The dilemma is not a pretty one, but it is very real. Lord Wavell's efforts to resolve it, which have impressed American observers, are another indication of Great Britain's sincerity in seeking to assist the progress of Indian autonomy. The chief contribution toward that end, however, must come from the Indians themselves. A great civil war, on political-religious lines, would not only be a tragic way in which to launch a nation but would have grave repercussions in many other parts of the world.

BOMBS ON PARLIAMENT

The Speaker, at a farewell party at the House of Commons to all who took part in the defense of the Palace of Westminster against air attacks, said that the Houses of Parliament were hit 12 times by bombs. The building was also hit by two anti-aircraft shells, one

REVENUE FROM OPIUM

From Saigon on June 19th the Japanese news agency reported that revenue from opium monopoly sales constitutes the biggest item of revenue in this year's budget. As compared with last year, estimated revenue from this source is risen from 33 to 65 million piastres.

To absolve the Japanese authorities from responsibility in the matter the report noted that the subject was drawn up by the former Government. General of French Indo-China, which ceased to function when the Japanese military took over complete control of Indo-China last March. There was no suggestion, however, that revenue collections from opium sales would be discontinued.

Last December it was reported from Saigon that imports of opium had been reduced and the sale price increased enormously. The authorities also expressed regret from responsibility in their determination to suppress opium smoking although it would mean a reduction in revenue. It was claimed that opium had been cloned in Tonkin and Annam and that others would be cloned in Cochin China and Cambodia. Incurable addicts were to be rationed to a minimum and efforts made to cure others.

It was plain, however, that the Government-General was making a virtue of necessity, as before the war only about four tons of opium were produced in Indo-China and the rest was imported.

Despite denials to the contrary the Japanese have exploited the opium smoking habit as a major source of revenue in occupied territories. Last January, for example, the Japanese controlled Peking radio announced receipt of a donation of \$1,970,000,000 to the Army and Navy Aircraft Fund from the Tientsin Special Municipalities Donations Committee. Subsequently a Tientsin broadsheet noted that contributions from opium addicts collected by opium dens have not been sent to the Japanese authorities because they came too late. It is understood that this contribution has been received by the Donations Committee through the Opium Den Guild.

damaging Big Ben and the other exploding in the Royal Court. A naval shell which fell in the library of the House of Commons did not explode. During the war with Germany there were 1,224 alerts at the Houses of Parliament covering 2,188 hours. Casualties were three killed and 15 injured.

TWO NATIONS, ONE PROVIDENCE AND CAUSE

It would indeed be difficult to suppress a thrill in the reading of the news that the United States and British fleets together for the first time against Japan's home and, forming the greatest carrier striking force ever assembled, in the history of the world, have compiled to hurl 1,500 planes at the Tokyo area. The memory and depth of the thrill goes not so much from the power and might assembled, as from the knowledge that the two great democracies, the United States and Britain, possess such complete coordination, efficiency and battle understanding, that Japan cannot repeat the impact of their blows.

The admiral in charge is an American, Admiral William F. Halsey, Jr., and under him are the distinguished British vice-admirals Sir Bernard Rawlings and Sir Phillip Vian, the skipper of the famous destroyer "Cossack". Great British dreadnought, built since the war began, under Halsey's command, include the King George V, and there are cruisers and destroyers whose typically English names evoke hours of historical memory.

The British soldier was proud to fight under an American, General Eisenhower, in Europe, and the British sailor is proud to fight under an American, Admiral Halsey, and the people of the British Commonwealth of Nations with the people of the United States must rejoice that in the hard, bitter days of battle, their fighting men give an example to the world of co-operation and comradeship such as has never been seen in history before.

It augurs well for the future, and comfort must come to humanity in the knowledge that what these two great nations have been able to achieve so well and so completely in the days of war they can also accomplish in theateful years of peace that lie ahead.

COAL GAS WITHOUT MINING

Coke and gas produced at the bottom of the mine before any coal is dug is a development foreseen by mine-owners and minersworkers.

A survey of Britain's coal recommends that gasification should be introduced. It consists of setting fire to the coal seam to produce coke—The resultant gases, mixed with those produced by incomplete combustion, are drawn to the surface.

PROVIDENCE AND PENICILLIN

Penicillin might have been thrown away and never discovered in time to work its marvellous cures among the fighting men of this war. Professor Alexander Fleming, discoverer of the drug, told of this when he preached at the Hospital Sunday sermon at the Savoy Chapel Royal, in London.

"I have often thought that it was a curious thing that this discovery ever happened," he said. "Every bacteriologist has had moulds drop on to plates by mistake; and when this happens every bacteriologist throws them away with suitable language. But in this case it happened that I did not throw the plate away at once—and so we got penicillin."

"It is a most wonderful thing that a minute square, no one knows from where, dropping on a place where it was not wanted, should have given us this marvellous result. It seems as though Providence had been kind in presenting us with this substance just at a time when it is most wanted."

"It has already done a good deal to help the wounded soldiers, and it is going to do more as the supply increases. In the last war there were many wounded soldiers whose wounds remained open for six months or more. Now we hope that if sufficient penicillin is available, wounds will not become infected at all, or, even if they do, that many of them will be well inside one month."

"It will not be very long now before this stuff is available to all of us civilians as well as soldiers, but civilians must wait just a little longer".

be used in boilers and motor engines, while the richer qualities can be chemically treated to produce synthetic substances.

The idea was evolved in Britain by William Ramsay, a famous chemist, and developed in Russia as a result of Lenin's enthusiasm.

Quoting Mr. Harold Rose, B.Sc., a British scientist, the report on "Britain's Coal" declares that while conventional mining methods yield 30 per cent of the total coal in the seam, underground gasification utilises from 80 to 90 per cent of the coal.
