## EL COMERCIO DEL CACAO PRESENTA BUENAS PERSPECTIVAS DE CONTINUAR EN AUMENTO DURANTE LA POST - GUERRA

Cerca del 47 por ciento de las importaciones de cacao estadounidense se originaron de la América Latina desde 1935—1939

El comercio del cacao en las Américas, aunque depende de muchos factores, se espera que seguirá una fuerte tendencia de aumento durante los años de la postguerra. Eso informa el New York Journal of Commerce al hacer un estudio de dichas perspectivas.

Según dicha información Estados Unidos continuará siendo el principal mercado del cacao producido en los otros países americanos. Sin embargo y de conformidad con el criterio del New York Journal of Commerce, los países productores, a fin de marcar el paso con las demandas crecientes tendrán que arrostrar los siguientes factores que afectan la producción: (1), mejoramiento de las prácticas de producción; (2) el control y extinción de las plagas que atacan los árboles de cacao; (3), presección mejor del grano para el mercado.

Las demandas de cacao en los Estados Unidos no han alcanzado el punto de saturación, según dichos informes; y dado el período de gran actividad industrial en los años de la postguerra se cree que la tendencia de aumento continuará caracterizando la demanda.

Durante el período entre 1935

1939, cerca del 47 por ciento de las importaciones norteamericanas de cacao llegaron de las otras repúblicas americanas.

## DISCURSO DEL CONSUL DE PANAMA

Señores:

La democracia y la libertad celebran hoy su fecha más gloriosa.

La segunda guerra mundial constituyó para la humanidad el sacrificio más grande que registra la historia. Muchos pueblos libres de la tierra tuvieron la amargura de sufrir el atropello de las que fueron pruebas nacionales del funesto Eje, y supieron de la desgracia de ver sus derechos conculcados, sus ciudades y campos arrasados, sus ciudadanos masacrados y sus libertades suprimidas siendo sustituidas por la más repugnante esclavitud.

Francia, la hidalga patria de tantos varones ilustres, fue sojuzgada por la fuerza nazi, Inglaterra, la avalancha nazi, y la avalancha contempló con amargura el terrible sacrificio de Flandes y Dunkerque. La China, que estocó sombra durante varios años, oíla sola, el encapuzamiento de la máquina de guerra del Japón. Grecia, la cuna de la civilización antigua, ese pensamiento frágil del pensamiento humano, fue también arrasada por el poder aplastante de la Fuer-

za, y así, uno a uno, los pueblos libres de Europa y Asia cayeron al primer empuje de aquella plena potencia que se llamó un día el poder destructor del Eje.

Sin embargo, la Justicia y la Libertad tenían que romper el velo tenebroso de aquella noche de desgracias para que irrumpiera el sol luminoso de la Victoria al'alba. Era preciso que los hombres que se sacrificaron con denudio en aras de la libertad, en holocausto a la justicia y en nombre de la civilización, pudieran oír las fanfarrias del más hermoso triunfo humano que la historia registra. Porque ésto no es señores el simple triunfo de las armas, si no el triunfo del pensamiento, la libertad del sol de los hombres libres que supieron ofrecer sus vidas por la Humanidad.

Hoy celebramos aquí la caída del último bastión de ese terrible triunvirato que se llamó el Eje. Contemplamos las humillaciones del organismo Imperial del Sol Naciente, a roto pedazos, sumiéndolo en la oscuridad, y sus restos por qué ese Sol naciente a asomar en el oriente del mundo.

## EDITORIAL

### LA LISTAS DE PRECIOS

Cuando don Isaac Zúñiga Montúfar fué nombrado Administrador de Precios, renació en el país la confianza de que se terminaría con la especulación. Era el señor Zúñiga Montúfar la persona indicada para el cargo. De honorabilidad indiscutible y alejado de todo compromiso político o comercial, su actuación tenía que ser todo lo eficaz que el país era en esos momentos de crisis.

Pero todas sus buenas cualidades y todas sus buenas intenciones están fracasando ante una especulación que parece estar firmemente organizada. Y decimos esto porque no obstante las listas oficiales de precios, las denuncias y la labor de los inspectores los artículos de primera necesidad no han bajado de precios y parece que reina completa anarquía en la distribución de los artículos de consumo en las distintas regiones del país.

En lo que se refiere a esta provincia algo hay que hacer en beneficio de los consumidores. Hace veintidos días no se consigue arroz pero no obstante las grandes compañías tienen en cantidad suficiente para el consumo de sus empleados. Esto indica que puede conseguirse en el país en cantidad suficiente para una justa distribución entre pobres y ricos.

No hay en estas observaciones empeño ninguno de crítica. Hay la necesidad de que las cosas se organicen en beneficio de toda la población. Mientras permanecemos en estado de guerra podíamos resignarnos con esta situación de anarquía. Siempre esperábamos que ella era transitoria. Ahora que se ha firmado la paz en necesario que la organización de la oficina de precios responda a la importancia que ella tiene. Una acción rápida y efectiva podría normalizar un poco la situación de crisis que atravesamos en muchos lugares del país, y es el señor Zúñiga Montúfar quien tiene en sus manos el remedio.

## CASOS Y COSAS

Por H. P. SMITH

El presidente Truman declaró a los periodistas que los rusos están tan ansiosos de entenderse con los Estados Unidos como los norteamericanos de entenderse con la URSS.

En la batalla que se libra en los Estados Unidos acerca del servicio militar obligatorio en tiempo de paz, se exponen los siguientes argumentos:

### EN CONTRA:

— Que el servicio militar obligatorio en tiempo de paz es antidemocrático.

— Que es innecesario en vista de la nueva organización de la paz.

— Que los Estados Unidos, Inglaterra y la Unión Soviética deben reducir considerablemente sus ejércitos y sus preparativos bélicos ya que no existen diferencias entre ellos que hagan temer la guerra.

### A FAVOR:

— Que el servicio obligatorio universal es más democrático que el voluntario.

— Que es necesario prestar militarmente a todos los ciudadanos para que tengan mayores posibilidades de so-

breviar en caso de guerra.

— Que es necesario que las naciones enemigas de la guerra tengan un instrumento apto para hacerla.

— Que no hay derecho a poner en peligro a los Estados Unidos con la esperanza de que será posible evitar una nueva guerra.

Entre las condecoraciones otorgadas al general Eisenhower antes de su regreso a Washington se cuentan:

### — La Orden del Mérito

— La Orden de la Victoria más alta condecoración militar soviética.

— La Cruz de la Liberación, de Francia.

En los Estados Unidos recibió de manos del presidente Truman una segunda Cruz del Servicio Distintivo.

El mariscal Von Kluge pidió una entrevista secreta con los norteamericanos, en agosto de 1944, para rendirse. En vista de que los oficiales norteamericanos no llegaron al lugar de la cita, Von Kluge regresó a su cuartel general, donde encontró

# Labores Municipales

Sesión segundo extraordinaria de la Municipalidad de Limón, iniciada a las diecisiete horas del nueve de julio de mil novecientos cuarenta y cinco, con asistencia del señor Gobernador y de los Regidores señores Echeverría, quien presidió, Hernández, Heilbron, Picado, Solas y Esquivel. Estuvieron presentes los Jefes de Dependencias Municipales señores Arrázola, Zeledón y Vindas; además los Ingenieros señores Pardo y Arisicreto, en representación, respectivamente, de la Compañía Eléctrica de Limón y de la Distribuidora S. A., representante en Costa Rica de la Allis Chalmers Cº de los Estados Unidos de Norteamérica.

**Art. 1 Convocatoria** — Se leyó y aprobó la convocatoria que a la letra dice: "Limón, nueve de julio de 1945. Señor Secretario Municipal Presente. Para los efectos siguientes le trascrivo la convocatoria a sesión extraordinaria que dice: "Señores Regidores Propietarios y Suplentes de la Municipalidad, Ptes. Me permite convocarlos para que asistan a una sesión municipal extraordinaria que se efectuará en el Salón de Sesiones, a las 17 horas (cinco de la tarde) del próximo lunes nueve de los corrientes, con el objeto de oír lo propuesto de venta de una planta de bombeo para servicio de la ciudad de esta ciudad que se servirá hacer a la Corporación el Ingeniero don Guillermo Arisicreto, representante comercial de la casa "Allis Chalmers Cº" de los Estados Unidos de Norteamérica. Limón, 6 de julio de 1945. Muy atento, y s. s. de Uds. If I Abel Robles, Gobernador. NOTIFICADOS: V. Echeverría, Hernán Esquivel, William Heilbron, F. Picado Sáenz, H. Solas, P. J. Hernández P. Nota: No notifico al señor Rafael Eduarce por encontrarse en San José. Eloy Fernández, Ciudad. Muy atentamente, Abel Robles, Gobernador.

**ARTICULO II**

El señor Presidente concie-

dió la palabra al Ing. señor Arisicreto, quien en resumen manifestó: Con base en el informe presentado por el Ing. Mr. Pfister, de la casa Allis Chalmers, quien visitó el lugar donde está instalada la estación de bombeo, se iniciaron los estudios técnicos del caso y como resultado ofrecimos a la Municipalidad un equipo que tiene las necesidades de la población y reúne otros requisitos, como reducido costo inicial, poco costo de operación y conservación; la propia casa Allis Chalmers está supliendo a la Compañía Eléctrica de Limón una unidad generadora de igual potencia y la actualmente tiene instalada, sean 530 caballos de fuerza, con lo que dicha empresa estará en aptitud de proporcionar la energía eléctrica necesaria para la planta de bombeo que la casa ofrece a la Municipalidad y además para llenar las necesidades de la población y de las industrias que en el futuro se establezcan. La instalación de la nueva bomba municipal debe hacerse ya sea adquiriendo un motor diesel o uno eléctrico y si se permite recomendar el equipo eléctrico que vende la casa que representa, el que reúne ciertas ventajas, las que totalitariamente puntuó, entre ellos el corto plazo de entrega, que no pasará de cuatro meses contados a partir de la fecha, y tal vez antes, si se consigue una prioridad alta, como A A 1, ya que la fábrica tiene estos modelos en bodega y puede remitirlo pronto como se lo concede la autorización del caso.

Interrogado el ingeniero señor Pardo por el Regidor Hernández en cuanto a las seguridades que la empresa puede dar de suprir la energía eléctrica necesaria para el motor y si lo que se necesita para mover esa bomba no será quitado de otros servicios que la empresa presta, con perjuicio para el pueblo de Limón, a lo que el Ingeniero señor Pardo respondió que la empresa ha invertido una gran cantidad de dinero y esfuerzo en mejorar los servicios y

pueda atender las demandas del público, pero que desde hace cuatro años está necesitando una nueva unidad generadora, la que por razones conocidas no ha podido conseguir sino hasta ahora, que la ha pedido a la casa Allis Chalmers, como puede corroborar lo el Ing. señor Arisicreto. Sin embargo, la empresa puede, antes de que la llegue la nueva unidad generadora, suministrar corriente a la municipalidad para la bomba que trata de adquirir, en casos de emergencia y en horas de la noche, con solo hacer los arreglos necesarios para suprimir, durante esas horas, el servicio de alumbrado de calles y algo otro, pero que en todo caso hace formal promesa, debidamente autorizado por el señor John Saxe, de suprir a la Municipalidad, tan pronto como tenga instalada la unidad generadora que ha pedido, los cien caballos de fuerza necesarios para la bomba, lo que confirma por escrito según no se que presenta.

Los señores Regidores hicieron varias preguntas a los ingenieros, los que dieron los informes del caso y el Regidor Echeverría hizo moción, que fue aprobada por UNANIMIDAD y DEFINITIVAMENTE para autorizar al señor Gobernador para contratar la compra del equipo ofrecido por la casa Allis Chalmers, votar un presupuesto extraordinario por cincuenta mil colones, reforzando la partida 41 (materiales y jornales de oficina) con cargo al empréstito contratado con el Banco Nacional de Costa Rica Comisionado asimismo al señor Gobernador para que ruego al señor Presidente de la República interponer sus buenas oficios a fin de que la Embajada de los Estados Unidos recomiende la prioridad más alta posible para que se permita a la casa Allis Chalmers despachar el equipo que la Municipalidad ha dispuesto comprar, así como el que encargó a la misma casa la Compañía Eléctrica de Limón, puesto que el funcionamiento regular del equipo adquirido por la Municipalidad, este sujeto a la ampliación que la Compañía Eléctrica haga de su planta generadora. Comisionar además al señor Gobernador para que gestione ante el Servicio Cooperativo Interamericano de Salud Pública una recomendación que también ayude a conseguir las prioridades necesarias para q' ejecución de las obras preli-

## THE TASK WHICH LIES AHEAD

The warring nations have sheathed their  
swords; their cannon have ceased to roar; the  
longed hoped for victory has been achieved.  
The enemies of our civilization have been beaten  
on the battle fields, and in the fulness of  
our souls there is unrestricted gladness. We  
are nevertheless cognizant of the vast and com-  
plex circumstances which lie ahead of the Po-  
wers that be; of the great task which confronts  
them—the task of the re-adjustment of a world  
upset by the horrors of a ruthless war.

It will be no easy task to re-organize the  
great masses who have experienced untold suf-  
ferings from a tyrannical aggression, and have  
them see and accept the new order of things.

The most important phase of the work to  
be successfully undertaken will be the es-  
tablishment of a genuine, lasting peace, based on  
a perfect understanding among all peoples.  
Discontentment must be eliminated. So long  
as dissatisfaction exists, so long will it be im-  
possible to obtain the true rewards of the  
final victory.

The structure of our civilization had almost  
been crushed. The damages inflicted on the  
human race are incalculable, and the true  
effects of the evils wrought by Nazi and Shinto  
militarism will long remain unknown. It therefore  
requires the united efforts of all the peace-  
loving peoples of the universe to participate  
in the task of reconstruction.

We are greatly concerned, too, of our own  
re-adjustment programme. — While the war  
waged, we were the recipients of effective  
sympathies from many avenues. It is obvious  
these benevolent activities will now be directed  
elsewhere. The onerous task therefore lies with  
ourselves. Our earliest efforts should be directed  
toward treating with the two controlling  
factors — Capital and Labour. To procure the  
greatest common good, these must work in per-  
fect harmony. This is of paramount import if  
we are to pull ourselves out the economic rut  
and guide our beloved Republic along the road  
of progress.

An unrestricted confidence is necessary  
between employer and employed. Relationships  
between both factors should be based  
on intelligence free of all cant. To denounce  
either the interests of the capitalist or worker  
without proper cause would be unjust. A phi-  
anthropically disposed public opinion is need-  
ed to help bridge the gap between these two  
camps, and the sooner this is accomplished  
the better will be the stability of our economic  
peace.

## SERMON PREACHED BY REV. W. J. EVANS AT THANKSGIVING SERVICE AT ST. MARK'S

Today is a day of great joy to all the peoples of the United Nations, and we are gathered here to give thanks to Almighty God for complete deliverance from the terrors of war all over the world, although we know it is possible that there may be fighting in isolated districts for a little while. In the final surrender of Japan we are sharing in the joy of all our Allies, who have suffered together with ourselves from this aggressor; but particularly with the people of China, who have borne the horrors of war and all its attributes for ten weary years.

Now that the acute crisis of danger is past, we have time to ponder and realize how great were our perils from the aggressive and cruel foes, and how wonderful the deliverance and guidance we have received. Each of the United Nations has in its own way put forth superhuman efforts, but all our hu-

man works would not have waited had not the power of the Almighty been leading, guiding and supporting us.—

The aggressor nations were preparing thoroughly to gain absolute power, not only over the territories of the world and the bodies of all peoples, but what would have been worse, over their thoughts, ideals and souls. We shudder to think what life in this world would have been if that had been allowed to happen. Fortunately for us we were fighting on the side of God and the right, and in the very darkest days of the enemy's triumphs we knew the final victory would not be with them, if we only stayed on the right course.

Now, as I have said, we rejoice and praise God for His mercy, and we are right to do so, but we must remember those who are not here in the flesh to rejoice with us, although their sacrifice has made possible our rejoicing.—

Their loved ones, left behind in their proud sorrow, have our deepest sympathy.

Now, as our King said to us in his remarkable speech to his people, we must turn to the future hopefully and without fear; placing before God our several problems and trials, in putting all the countries which have been at war back on to a peace-time basis. We must learn to take into account God's will for all men in times of peace as well as going to Him in our darkest days of war.

The marvellous inventions of science revealed and unrevealed of this war are beyond anything the man in the street thought possible a few years ago. Now our energies must turn to construction instead of destruction, and we must not be afraid of the dreadful knowledge which so dramatically shortened the end of the war in the Pacific. There would be no point in God allowing the United Nations to perfect their knowledge of the "Atomic Bomb" by such a narrow margin over the work of the German scientists in Norway, only for the world to be destroyed a few years later; we must go on working with this wonderful thing until we find how it is intended for it to benefit humanity in general.

Before the war the most critical problem in every country was the problem of relations between owning groups and working groups. The bitter conflicts of labour and capital led to vast social unrest, and each group endeavored to use the Government to enhance its own power at the expense of the other in Great Britain and the United States of America. The Government assumed an even larger role in economic affairs, and political parties tended more and more to represent radical cleavages in public opinion, although the process did not go far in these two countries as in some others. During the war social struggle has continued though it has been muted in favour of cooperation to meet the common peril. Competition between economic groups cannot of course be completely eliminated, complete victory for one group would be complete defeat of freedom.

The Church in earlier days had a concept, which has never been wholly lost, of the sense of a sacramental relationship between man and

From a Speech by  
General Eisenhower

GENERAL EISENHOWER.

No man in history has been supported, encouraged and given things more liberally than I have by the British Government and the British Empire. One incident only. We got into Africa, and we were trying to do a lot of good work, and things got a bit grim, and one day I received a telegram from the Prime Minister, who said, "I have a Churchill Brigade". He said, "The shipping people told me I can't ship it, and they said it is not ready, but if you want it, it will be on the road immediately". And it came. I didn't know how he had sent it, but it came and it took an important part in the battle.

I have never forgotten that thing because of the complete generosity with which it was offered. His associates in government, and you will forgive me if I don't know what their policies were, but his associates in the Chiefs of Staff have given me exactly the same cooperation all the way through this war.

Would it not then have seemed little on my part if I had not translated some of it within my own command? To the great officers that have served with me there is no tribute that I can pay you, and I almost hesitate a moment for the simple reason that I may forget one. But as long as histories are written in the English language, Sir Andrew Cunningham, Tedder, Montgomery, Alexander, Crerar, Sir John Cunningham, those men will be remembered and respected and loved, and I say loved because those men not only performed a magnificent duty, they did it with a selflessness that only real men, big men, possess.

## ODD GIFTS

Original gifts helped to raise \$ 200,000,000 for Britain's Red Cross Fund.

Gifts of livestock, though always welcome, were sometimes a source of embarrassment when delivered, as they often were, to one of the London depots. Like the live cockerel which intended for Mrs. Churchill's Aid to Russia Fund, was deposited on the secretary's desk after an unsuccessful attempt to effect personal delivery at Downing Street.

A diamond necklace was contributed and sold for \$ 44,000. One new laid egg—the only single item salvaged unbroken from a house demolished by a bomb—was sent by the woman who had lost her home. Some of the cash gifts had their peculiarities, too—like the \$ 400 given by an old couple who wanted an announcement of the gift to be broadcast as a way of breaking the news to their relatives "not to expect anything in the future!"

One enthusiastic youngster wrote a letter to tell of his scheme for charging a penny a peep on a baby hedgehog he had found. He enclosed a postal order for \$ 1.50, but was sorry there would be no more to come as the exhibit had made its getaway while he was out buying the postal order! Another small boy who devoted all his spare time to the catching of tadpoles, which, said to his friends at the rate of 14 a penny, raised \$ 3.60.

## SECRET FACTORY

When flying bombs were falling on or passing over, the heart of London last year, a miniature but complete war factory was at work under the Central Hall of the Houses of Parliament manufacturing special new instruments for combating the raids.

The opening of the factory, in which 74,000 man-hours were used in 1944 alone, was one of the best guarded secrets of the war. It began shortly after the fall of Singapore in 1942, when the Prime Minister, Mr. Churchill, called for even greater efforts from the nation.

Members of Parliament and the staff offered to give their assistance in nearby factories, but their duties were already so heavy that it was decided to open an underground factory in the heart of Parliament.

A strange assortment of part-time workers was assembled—men over seventy, girls under twenty, husbands and wives, mothers and daughters, Parliamentary counsel, policemen, Cabinet Ministers' wives retired by my officers, former civil servants, and even members of the Parliamentary kitchen staff.

They were soon turning out precision instruments, machined in my details to half a thousandth of an inch. Shifts were changed every three or four hours, and the work went on ceaselessly and smoothly. When enemy planes and flying bombs were overhead the workers never once went to shelter, although they were in one of the most vulnerable parts of the building.

A works canteen served 150 meals a day at 20 cent a meal. 1,000,000 articles were assembled, inspected and despatched by this small but enthusiastic body of workers.

## FEARLESS

The first eye-witness account of the epic sea battle in which the British Armed Merchant Cruiser Rawalpindi steamed into action alone against the German heavy ships Scharnhorst and Gneisenau was given recently by CPO K. G. Humphries, a survivor of the fight who has just been repatriated from a German prison camp after five-and-a-half years' imprisonment. "Although twice warned by the German battlecruiser Scharnhorst to 'heave to' and three times ordered to 'abandon ship', said triumphantly, 'the Commanding Officer of the Rawalpindi refused these instructions and steamed full speed into action'.

Shortly afterwards a cruiser appeared on the starboard side. The Rawalpindi took it to be one of the British Northern Patrol Ships and made towards her. It turned out to be the Gneisenau. The Scharnhorst signalled to Rawalpindi "Abandon your ship", repeating the message three times. Captain Kennedy's answer was to open fire immediately, scoring a hit amidships on the Gneisenau.

The Scharnhorst and Gneisenau then began firing simultaneously at the Rawalpindi. In spite of the incredible odds—the Rawalpindi was armed with 6" guns and as a converted liner had no armored protection, while the German ships had 11" guns, armored protection and a far greater range and speed and a secondary armament of twelve 5" guns apiece—the Rawalpindi continued to fire with every available gun until she was at last hit in the magazine and blown in two.

## ONE IN FIVE

The Merchant Navy has lost one in five of its men in the war.

The strength of the Merchant Navy has been maintained at about 150,000 men throughout the war years, and Mr. Churchill stated in a written Parliamentary reply yesterday that 30,589 have been killed.

That is a little more than one-fifth of the number constantly maintained in the service.

In addition 4,690 were reported missing, 4,215 wounded and 4,088 interned, making the total casualties 43,582. Of those reported missing or interned 5,591 are still unaccounted for.

## SCARLET PIMPERNEL

From the little village of Temford in Bedfordshire the R.A.F. created two secret special maritime squadrons.

The squadrons delivered arms, ammunition, radio sets, food and other supplies to the underground fighters of all the occupied countries. They carried skis and sleighs to the Norwegians and bicycles and bicycles (made in England but stamped with the names of French makers) to the underground in Western Europe.

There was also a passenger service. Czech, Polish and Dutch agents were dropped in their own countries, while others were brought back to England for training in saboteurs.

The old unarmed Lysanders and Hodsons in which the "pick-up" flights were carried out had no secret devices to help them operate. Guided only by the dim lights shown by the patriots below, the planes landed in small secret fields to pick up their passengers.

There were many hairbreadth escapes. A pilot was just about to land when he saw a German with a revolver standing behind each flash light holder. Realizing what was happening he revved his engine and flew off. He was wounded in the back but returned safely. When a Hodson was bogged down on landing the pilot rounded up 200 soldiers, 12 oxen and six horses, and worked for two and one half hours before the airplane could leave.

## AIR CASUALTIES

Air Chief Marshal Sir Arthur T. Harris has revealed that 47,000 men of the total of 100,000 who passed through the Royal Air Force Bomber Command were killed during the war, but that this loss held down the army's casualties. Speaking

at his alma mater, All Hallows School, he said: "In modern warfare, rather than put the whole youth of the nation into the fray, you send out selected champions to take the edge off the enemy first. That was the task of the boys in my crews".

## SHRINKING WORLD

The India bases of the Royal Air Force Transport Group operating internal services for India and Burma has carried in the past 15 months 100,000 passengers, 15,308,834 pounds of freight, and 4,820,013 pounds of mail. In 78,500 hours of flying, over 11,000,000 miles, only four deaths occurred. If a passenger flew 200 hours a year, he need only worry about a fatal accident after 100 years.
