Muy señor nuestro:  
En sesión número 20 de dia 24 de agosto del año en curso, del Comité Ejecutivo de la Federación de Trabajadores de Limón; se conoció el informe campesino rendido por el compañero Lucio Ibarra, quien desempeña en este organismo el mencionado secretariado; me permite muy respetuosamente trascribir a usted, como se acordó, uno de los puntos de dicho informe por creerlos de gran importancia para un gran sector de pequeños agricultores, por ser de su incumbencia y seguros de que en usted encontrarán estos agricultores el apoyo que necesitan.

Informa Lucio Ibarra q: "Guácimo es una tierra apropiada para la produc-



# Labores Municipales

Sesión décima séptima ordinaria de la municipalidad de Limón, iniciada a las 19 horas del 21 de agosto de 1945 con asistencia de los regidores señores Echeverría, quien presidió, Hernández y Pica, do. Estuvieron presentes los jefes de dependencias municipales señores Alvarado, Arrazola, Barrantes, Martínez, Montero, Mora Aguirre, Mora Morúa, Vindas y Zeledón.

Art. I.—Acta: Se leyó, aprobó y firmó el acta de la sesión anterior.

Art. II.—El regidor Echeverría hizo moción que fue aprobado por unanimidad y definitivamente, para alterar el orden del día y manifestar la condolencia de esta Corporación Municipal y de los señores regidores en particular, a los señores don Fulgencio Campos por la muerte de su señora madre y a don Rafael Eduardo por el fallecimiento de su hermano político.

Art. III.—Notas del señor Gobernador: a) En nota N° 1158 solicita la emisión de un presupuesto extraordinario por trescientos treinta y seis colones, a fin de reforzar en esa suma la partida 1.4 “desinfectantes y otros” y cubrir así la cuenta que pasa la Compañía Bananera de Costa Rica por servicios de ambulancia ya prestados, tomando los fondos de la partida 6.2 “pendiente de cobro del año anterior”. ## ANOTHER IMPORTANT DISCOVERY BY BRITISH SCIENTISTS

# BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

## FIRST FRUITS OF VICTORY

The pooling of resources by Lend Lease and reverse Lend Lease has speeded victory, but it has had grave effects upon the British economy.

When the war began, Britain planned on producing for herself almost everything to equip her armed forces. Apart from food and raw materials which had to be drawn from overseas and some manufactured products from the United States, Britain planned on fighting a self sufficient war. With the fall of France, the situation changed completely, and Britain had to plan for a sudden increase in the size of her armed forces.

From that moment production was insufficient to sustain the military effort, but the gap was met temporarily by taking over the French contracts in the United States and increasing her own. To pay for the munitions, Britain speeded up the sale of foreign assets, drastically limited imports, and increased exports to the utmost. But, despite these measures, her dollar resources were almost exhausted a few months later.

At that point, Lend Lease came in to redress the balance between Britain's production and her military effort. It enabled a larger army to be kept than could be equipped with out outside aid. More than that, it enabled her to cut her exports drastically and to increase her war production and the size of her armed forces by shutting down or converting the export industries. Lend Lease therefore enabled Britain to maintain armed forces almost 25 per cent larger than would otherwise have been possible.

The price for this increased effort, which is being paid now, is heavy for the British economy is completely dependent upon large imports of food and raw materials. Before the war Britain imported two thirds of the food supply and most of the raw materials for factories. She must export to pay for these supplies, but the loss of export markets during the war means that it will be some time before the volume of overseas trade necessary to pay for the needed will be achieved.

## BRITISH CIVIL AVIATION.

Some impressive facts about the wartime achievements of the British automotive industry were given recently by Sir William Rootes, head of the well known motor firm of Rootes, Ltd., in a speech at Maidstone, Kent.

As early as 1936 a number of British firms had joined the Shadow Factory Scheme. When war came, they were in full production and had delivered, among other products, a large number of aeroplanes.

Then came plunkirk, and the loss of the greater part of the army's mechanized transport, and much of its equipment.

This emergency called forth the industry's tremendous resources. They have produced since then over one million transport vehicles for the service, 75% of all the truck and armoured fighting vehicles made in Britain — and 80% of all the auto engines.

They have also made, in quantities never before seen in Britain, tanks, aircraft, aero engines, guns and ammunition, and assorted equipment ranging from mines and torpedoes to trailer pumps for the N. F. S.

Sir William revealed for the first time that approximately 80% of all the units in the British and Imperial armies were at the end of the European war fully mechanized, whereas with Germany the comparative figure is 15%. This gives the measure of the achievement of the British motor industry.

It while the export industries are restarted. This week British civilians were told that sugar supplies for manufacturers were to be cut — meaning less beer, less jam, ice cream, chocolate and confectionery. They were also told that the clothes ration will be cut; that there will be fewer stockings for women, a severe shortage of woolen goods, no relaxation of style restrictions and an overall reduction of civilian clothing supplies to about 36 per cent of the pre-war supply. This is lower than at any point in the war.

For British civilians the first fruit of victory has been still greater austerity.

## UNIO BRIEFS

The Polish Air Force, between July 1940, and VE Day accounted for 1,113 enemy planes and 33 U Boats. The force lost 2,025 airmen, 57 of whom were British.

The former Italian luxury liner "Saturnia" (now to be named "Francisco Y. Gonzales") has been converted into the world's largest hospital ship and is now being used to take home U. S. casualties.

More than 150 U. S. university professors, and instructors have arrived to staff U. S. Army university centres at Shrivenham, England and at Biarritz, France.

The U. S. A. A. F.'s Air Transport Command is now running daily flights into London, Prestwick, Paris, Marseilles, Berlin, Bremen, Frankfurt, Munich, Stockholm, Athens, Geneva, Rome, Naples, Copenhagen and Oslo.

The third in a series of conferences held over a period of two years to consider the unification of engineering standards will open in Ottawa on September 24 next, under the auspices of the Combined Production and Resources Board. It will be attended by Canadian, British and U. S. delegations.

## LEND-LEASE FACT AND FICTION

The following extracts are from the President of the United States' Nineteenth Report to Congress on Lend-Lease operations, dated May 1945:

"Since the beginning of the Lend-Lease programme in March, 1941, rumours and reports which are either incorrect or exaggerated, have circulated throughout the United States and frequently among our armed forces abroad. These rumours and reports have been based largely, on misinformation or on misunderstanding of the basic purpose of lend-lease, which is the effective utilization of the manpower and resources of all the United Nations."

The following are some of the fictions about lend-lease and the true facts regarding each.

### FICTION

There is an impression on the part of some people in this country that the furnishing of foodstuffs under lend-lease is the principal reason for short food supplies here.

### FACT

Of our total food supplies in the year 1944 the United States armed forces got 15 per cent, the United States civilians 80 per cent, lend-lease exports accounted for 6 per cent, and commercial exports for the remaining 1 per cent. American farmers have succeeded in increasing food production substantially during the war; our total food production in 1944 was about 35 per cent larger than the 1935-39 average.

A large proportion of this increase has been required by the Army and Navy, as men in the armed forces consume more food than they

did as civilians. There must be available for each soldier for example, three times as much meat as he ate as a civilian.

The sharp rise in consumer incomes during the war has made it possible for most people to buy more food than formerly. People in the higher income groups have not been able to obtain the same quantities of foodstuffs which they purchased before the war, while the many more people in the lower income groups have been able to increase their consumption. The net result has been that the average U. S. civilian has consumed more food each year during the war than he did in the pre-war period.

### FICTION

The shortage in the United States of domestic beef and veal supplies has resulted in the misconception that large quantities are being lend-leased.

### FACT

Only 1.1 per cent of our domestic beef and 1.3 per cent of our veal supply was diverted to our allies as lend-lease in the first three months of 1945. American forces stationed in the South Pacific have received from Australia and New Zealand, under reverse lend-lease, two-thirds as much beef and veal as we have exported under lend-lease to all countries.

### FICTION

Americans who have stood in long lines in recent months to purchase cigarettes have sometime heard that one reason for the shortage was the large number furnished to other countries under lend-lease.

### FACT

Our lend-lease exports of cigarettes in 1944 required only about 1 1/4 per cent. of our production. For every cigarette which we lend-leased in 1944 we sent 20 to our armed forces abroad and the people in this country smoked 60. No cigarettes have been supplied under lend-lease for civilian use. Some have gone to the French forces in Africa; the remainder have been furnished to British armed forces on various war fronts. Our total wartime exports of cigarettes, both commercial and lend-lease have taken a smaller proportion of total production than in the pre-war period.
