

# PROSPECTS OF AN ANGLO-ITALIAN WAR

From the advent of the Italo-Ethiopian conflict there has been, in some minds, a wish that there should be a clash between Great Britain and Italy as a means of distracting the attention of the latter from her unwarranted aggression on the African Empire. There are others who, while feeling that Britain, by her cautious attitude, is tollerating too many insults without retaliating by throwing the gauntlet at the mad Italian, yet from the standpoint of regard for life and the horror of shedding human blood, are proud that Albion has not yet slung a shot through an Italian battleship; but indeed the tension is so intensively taut that there is reason to expect something may happen at any moment.

There are again those who feel that the cause of delay is due to the unpreparedness of Britain, hence her discretionary deductions. While Britain may not be considered up to the proper standard of the strength required of her as mistress of the seas by reason of her attitude of persistent exhortations for a curtailment or armaments, yet, by a contrast of the magnitude of the armaments which we have observed from recent statistics, it will be found that England has, ready for war, two thousand military planes in addition to those used in commercial aviation which may easily be converted into bombing planes, while Italy has two thousand five hundred.

The British naval machinery counts on a tonnage of 1,357,140 while Italy boasts but 626,603 tons; they are divided thus. Dreadnoughts, Britain 15 Italy 4; Battle cruisers to 10,000 tons, Britain 15 Italy 7; Cruisers of from 6,000 to 9,000 tons, Britain 42 Italy 12; Submarine Destroyers, Britain 72 Italy 49; Submarines, Britain 62 Italy 54; Airplane carriers, Britain 9 Italy 1. It will thus be seen that the naval inferiority of Italy leaves little doubt as to what would be the ultimate result of a clash; but as already been said, the horror of bloshed would debar any highly cultured nation from a precipitate commitment of so serious a nature. However, with the many threats and insults of Mussolini as to what he shall do with Britain and Britishers in case the embargo of oil and its products is enforced, it is evident that if England does not allow herself to be held up to ridicule a clash of arms is inevitable.

The result of such a clash among nations would be as it is among individuals; a strong man is generally a docile animal until he is aroused, so it is only a most foolhardy fellow who will attempt to arouse him. Whatever might be said regarding the real cause of the provocation between these two powers, there is one object which stands out forcibly be-

## THE LAVAL HOARE PROJECT FAILS

As was expected the Laval Hoare Peace proposals have failed, and instead of bringing about a reconciliation among the warring factions have produced more serious complications than ever before existed.

As an outcome of the Parliamentary and public opposition with which he was confronted, Sir Samuel Hoare has resigned as Britain's Minister of Foreign Affairs and there is the probability of Laval also being forced to demit office. The Council of the League of Nations, which met on Wednesday last for the special purpose of discussing the matter, suspended its session without doing anything definite and the proposals are now regarded as having been shelved in that direction.

It is the general opinion that it is now left for the Committee on Sanctions to definitely decide the application of the embargo on petroleum and its products against Italy, but we understand that this will not yet be done as there is the suggestion that the application should be delayed pending the results of likely ministerial changes in France and England. Just what bearing these changes, if they do occur, can have on such action we are at a loss to understand, especially as Mussolini has again repeated his intention of pursuing the conflict despite the "egoism and hypocrisy of certain nations who have endeavoured to interfere with the rights of Italy".

The most intense pessimism is said to exist in all the important diplomatic circles of Europe, as to the possibility of staving off a general outbreak of hostilities, for England still persists that the sanctions, as agreed on, should be placed in force notwithstanding the threats of Mussolini.

## BRITAIN CALLS IN NAVAL RESERVE OFFICERS

Very significant it was to shipping men in New York when it became known that England had called in all her Naval Reserve Officers on the 2nd. instant to report immediately to Portsmouth.

This is the first call since the great World War, and officers serving in all departments of Merchant Marine the world over are hastening home as fast as they can. Those in the United States, serving in the line, will proceed at once; those serving in the Far East will report to their bases; those in other countries will take the first ship to reach Portsmouth in the short-

## THE ETHIOPIAN CONFLICT

The items of news which have reached us regarding the week's activities give the information that the Ethiopians continue inflicting defeats on the Italian invaders.

On the 16th. it was reported that an encounter took place to the southwest of Sassebene which resulted in the Abyssinians recovering several positions which had been lost during the earlier period of the conflict. In this fight it is said that the Italians placed, as is their wont, their native troops in the front of the Europeans so they were the ones who mostly suffered.

A dispatch from Addis Ababa, dated the 18th., officially announces that the Emperor's troops had obtained a brilliant victory in the Takazze battle. The loss is given

as more than 500 on each side with a majority on that of the Italians and of these the greater part being natives of Eritrea. The loss of this encounter is regarded as a great blow to the Italians, Takazze being of strategic importance to their advance movements. It is thought that it is the intention of Ras Kasas, who commands the troops near Gondar, to work his way toward the southwest and west of Aksum where he will join the forces under Ras Ayela for a united defence against the front lines of the Italians.

As has been the custom from the commencement of the conflict, Rome states that in both the above encounters the losers were the Ethiopians and whose casualties far exceeded theirs.

## THE PASSING OF VENEZUELA'S DICTATOR

On Tuesday night last General Juan Vicente Gomez, who for more than a quarter of a century had directed the destinies of the Republic of Venezuela died at his residence in the town of Maracay at the advanced age of 78 years.

His funeral, regarded as the most solemn and imposing ever witnessed in the Republic, took place on the 19th. and was attended by more than 700,000 persons.

A choir of 200 voices assisted at the religious ceremony in the Cathedral at Maracay and there were over 200 automobiles in the proce-

sion to the cemetery. Over 500 wreaths were sent from all parts of the Republic as tokens of the affectionate feelings of the populace; and while the body was on low was noticed been a week ago its way the cemetery 18 airplanes, circling overhead, showered flowers over the coffin meantime a salute of 21 guns was given from eight batteries.

The noted soldier and politician, who was a vastly rich man, has it is said left his entire estate as a gift to his native land.

## A MUCH NEEDED IMPROVEMENT

It is very gratifying to learn that a powerful Radio telegraphic and meteorological station has been equipped at George Town, Grand Cayman.

The meteorological station has been long needed for making correct observations regarding weather variations in the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean Sea where storms so frequently do immense damage.

Hitherto notices of approaching cyclones were only obtainable just a very short time before they were actually on us; with the erection of this station it will now be possible for notifications to be given in time for precautions to be taken to minimise the amount of damage usu-

ally experienced.

This monument to scientific research which was opened on the 21st. of last month, has been made possible by the co-operation of the Cuban government, through the untiring efforts of Dr. Jose Carlos Millas, Director of the Cuban National Observatory at Havana, and the Commissioner of the Cayman Islands.

The wireless as well as the Meteorological machinery are of the latest, most powerful and complete type; they were manufactured by Messrs. Negrelli and Zambra of London. The barometer is from Mr. Jules Richard of Paris and the wind Vane was made by Messrs. Green and Company of Brooklyn, New York.

## Cost of New York's Sanitation

The Sanitary Department of New York spends £ 16,000 a day in keeping the City clean. A permanent staff of 12,000 men are

employed, and the work is carried on throughout the day and night.

## FURTHER SUCCESS OF THE HERO JOE LOUIS

The Spanish Buffalo has at last been made to kiss the floor. On Friday night of last week at one minute past nine, in Madison Square Garden New York, the great contest, in the pugilistic art, was declared open between Paulino Uzcudum, the Spanish Idol, and Joe Louis, the Negro exponent. Great expectations were uppermost in the minds of the supporters of both contestants; Joe, of course, has suddenly become the idol of not only the Negro people but of the fistic ring; while Uzcudum is considered one of the most advanced representative of the art and a boxer who has never been known to be sent to the mat by any of the world's best. Joe however did the unexpected and in a manner which surprised his most enthusiastic admirers. He hit his man to that mat unconscious for the count of nine, and on rising he could not fully recover his wits. This Joe did in the fourth round although he had promised his closest associates to have done it in the seventh.

From start to finish Joe was the favourite, betting going at ten to one in his favour. Both men were well matched, Paulino turning the scale at two hundred and seven pounds and Joe at two hundred one and a half. Dempsey, Schmeling and Braddock were present at the opening. The fight was scheduled for fifteen rounds. In the first round neither seriously attacked as is their custom; but Louis got in a well timed upper-cut. In the second, Louis showed his superiority by his admirable exhibition, his desperate attacks and connections which made Paulino recede amid the shouts and whistles of the enthusiastic crowd; at the end of this round Paulino showed signs of surprise and fear. The third round brought much blood from Paulino; his face was beaten to a pulp, his defence was poor and it was seen he was at the mercy of his opponent. This was again Louis round. The fourth and final round found Joe walloping Paulino on every part of his body in rapid successive shorts and bombarding his face with five shots which put him to the floor.
