LA ISLA DE LOS JABALIES

Fué Bernardin de Saint-Pierre, el precursor del romanticismo, en Francia, el primero que, en su célebre novela "Pablo y Virginia" llamó la atención sobre Madagascar, la bella isla del océano Índico.

Dicha isla, que ocupa el cuarto lugar en cuanto a las dimensiones, fué descubierta en 1506 por el portugués Fernando Soares; hay quien atribuye dicho descubrimiento a Antao Gonçalves. Antes de aquella época, "Nossi Ndumbo", la isla de los jabalies como la llamaban los indígenas, había recibido ya la visita de los árabes que le dieron el nombre de "País de Manai".

Madagascar es una isla magnífica y los viajeros que han estado allí no se cansan de hablar de la belleza de aquel país. Todo se halla reunido allí: montañas cubiertas de nieve, altas mesetas con clima sano, pantanos de traídora belleza, ríos de impetuosa corriente y no navegables, selvas vírgenes, al mismo tiempo que la fauna, se distingue

El viajero que actualmente visita aquellas comarcas se inmuniza contra dicha enfermedad por medio de la quinina. Según los resultados obtenidos por la Comisión del Paludismo de la Sociedad de las Naciones, hasta tomar diariamente 400 miligramos de quinina durante toda la temporada de las fiebres para inmunizarse contra la enfermedad. Para el tratamiento bastan 1 gr. a 1,3 gr. de quinina diarios durante 5 a 7 días.

Ahora pues los turistas pueden disfrutar de la belleza de tan pintoresca región sin miedo de llevarse la malaria como de sagrable recuerdo.



CHAMBERLAIN'S ACTION SHOCKS CIVILIZATION

By Britain playing so deliberately into the hand of Germany Checoeslovakia has been outraged and sacrificed just as Abyssinia was, and the honour of the Empire destroyed by the bowing of her Premier before the bluff of the German Dictator. Who could have expected that, at so critical a time as this, the prestige of the great Empire would have been thrown in the dust by such cowardice? Can the smaller nations of the universe have henceforth any respect for the name of Britain or her pledged word?

When it was observed that the entire world favoured the attitude adopted by England, France and the Soviet Union and that it was supported by almost all the smaller States of Europe, we felt that Hitler, seeing his bluff was useless, and knowing the mass of his nation did not desire war, would have backed down; but Chamberlain capitulated and threw the respect and admiration for his Empire to the winds. The members of the Liberal and Labour Parties are shocked completely; Russia is altogether

disgusted, while every smaller nation of the world is disappointed — Hitler's bluff has gained him another and much more important victory.

Like the Abyssinians, the Chek have been sacrificed, and though their preparations for war were all complete, they had to admit they were forced to submit to the demands of the German Chancellor in view of the last moment capitulation of Britain and France.

As one sees it, Russia has been outflanked by the intrigues of Britain's Prime Minister; while Mussolini is dismayed, as there was no certainty whatever of Italy ranging her forces (aside the Germans) in the event of war. Even Japan has been pleasantly surprised as she had expressed a desire of keeping aloof unless France unprovokedly attacked Germany.

What has become of British reputation? The British Empire is doomed. The return of the German colonies in Africa will be the next act of humiliation, just as soon as Hitler has consolidated his forces in mid-

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A NEW POLITICAL PARTY FOR JAMAICA

A new Political Party has come into existence in Jamaica. It is called the "People's National Party" and has been formed by Mr. N. W. Manley, K. C. and his Associates.

On the 18th. September a meeting was held at the Ward Theatre in Kingston; there was an unprecedented attendance, the people filling the Theatre, the North Parade and the Victoria Gardens. Several prominent personages were on the platform. Mr. Manley presided and outlined the reasons for the launching of the Party and what would be its aims and purposes. Sir Stafford Cripps, a member of the British Parliament and a prominent Labourite, emphasized in very clear and forceful language the need of such a Party in the Island.

In his explanatory remarks Mr. Manley stated that the Party was a great necessity in view of the fact that the democratic institutions of the country had long ceased to lead public opinion or to inspire confidence, as also on account of the enormous growth of progressive ideas centering around the development of labour. He declared that during the past decade the people had been concentrating more and more on their individual affairs. They all had been think-

ing more of their Island home; had spoken more of it; had breathed more of its atmospheric influence with the result that all kinds of organizations had sprung up in all classes of the community, creating a marked growth of opinion among the young men and the dawn of the feeling that the Island is and should be their home and country.

Continuing his most interesting address, the popular Attorney-at-Law told his vast audience that in the past the majority of the inhabitants regarded Jamaica as merely a place in which to live, or to visit and meet friends or relatives. There was however, a great difference between living in or visiting a place and belonging to it with the feeling that one's life is only such a spirit, he affirmed thing he, at the present time, saw in the Island and it was that which had determined him to support the "People's National Party" with all his soul. It is only such a spirit, he affirmed, which encourages the development of a national consciousness and leads to self-government and to that which may resemble civilization. The Party would be run on true democratic lines, and he would so work as to en-

PUBLIC MANIFESTATION AGAINST BOUNDARY QUESTION

Much agitation is being experienced in San Jose and other interior localities in consequence of the large and frequent public manifestations in opposition to the proposals for settling the Panama Boundary question.

These manifestations are we understand, having the strong support of the members of the country's Legal Academy, as well as the Students of the Liceo and other educational centres, and a large number of prominent citizens and well known politicians. When the first of these demonstrations commenced the police authorities,

in keeping with superior instructions, endeavoured to stop it, but they eventually desisted as the thousands who were participating in it not only shewed their determination of continuing, but very carefully abstained from committing themselves in any way against Law or Order.

The subsequent marches through the principal thoroughfares of the Capital have not been interfered with, although clashes of an individual nature are reported between members of the police force and some of the students.

Rubber Plantations to be Extended

The Rubber producing trees which were planted in this zone some years ago, and were latterly taken over by the Goodyear Corporation and included in their experimental cultivations under their concession for the exploitation of the rubber industry, are reported to be giving such good quality material that the Company have decided to extend their opera-

tions to other sections of the Province. They will establish plantations wherever they can locate suitable and sufficient lands we are told.

We are certainly pleased to know of this, as the results of such extended activities on the part of the Corporation must, eventually, be of great benefit our economic conditions.

THE COSTA RICA - PANAMA LIMITS

There were much heated discussions during recent sittings of Congress as to whether the project regarding our Southern Frontier, as proposed by Panamá and accepted by our Executive, should go through our Legislative Assembly in the usual manner or be considered in secret sessions. After lengthy debates had been indulged in by many of the Deputies, it was decided, by 33 votes to 10; that the matter should be given consideration behind closed doors.

Much of the opposition to the proposals seem to have broken down after examination of the maps shewing the original boundary with Colombia, coupled with the explanations of ex-President don Ricardo Jimenez in support of the reasonableness of the demands of Panamá. It does seem as if the government of don Leon Cortes has taken the right course in adopting the proposals submitted by Panamá as to the proper boundary which separates both countries.

It has been shewn it is claimed, that the limits originally came up to the North River and not only to the Siuxaola, hence the visit of the nation's Representatives to the area in dispute has resulted in the verdict that, despite, the objections of the discontents, Panamá has her rights in the claims set forth, and it is only righteous that her pretensions should be attended to as they justly deserve.

WIRELESS NEWS

Chancellor Adolf Hitler entered Sudetenland early on the 4th. instant on a triumphal tour of the territory he had won without a fight from Checoeslovakia. Several thousand persons met him at the frontier. They cheered loudly, almost mad with joy. Konrad Henlein, the Sudeten Nazi leader, whom Hitler named Sudeten Reich's Commissioner for his work on behalf of annexation, accompanied the Chancellor. They crossed the former German border into Sudetenland at Wildenau, one half mile from Henlein's home town, Asch, at 11.16 a. m. Hitler entered Sudetenland several hours after his army, which formerly annexed the Asch Eger region, heart of the territory, at 8.05 a. m. Thousands lined along the cold, drizzling streets. Hitler's automobile was preceded from Selb, Germany, by two armoured cars and detachments of Brown

THE CONFERENCE

There seem to have been some misunderstanding in the carrying out of the intentions of the Conference announced by the President of the Limon Division of the U. N. I. Association.

The necessity for a Conference among the members of the Negro Race was mooted by Messrs. Farquharson, Scharsmidt and Wellington of Madre de Dios and supported by Mr. Eugene Roper of Liverpool. The idea was later on approved by Mr. Mitchell, and all seem to have been set for a huge meeting to devise the means of a closer understanding among the adherents of the Universal Negro Improvement Association; but at the appointed time there was a lack of the

anticipated brilliant gathering in consequence, we have no doubt, of a Handbill issued at the last moment by Mr. Mitchell in which it was stated that the Conference was not a U. N. I. A. question, but one of the Race. A Record Tobacco Crop

TORONTO. — Tobacco is not generally considered a Canadian agricultural crop, but tobacco growers in the Dominion will receive about \$ 18,000,000 for their crop this season. Sixty-one million pounds of tobacco were harvested this year, the largest amount ever grown on Canadian farms.

Tobacco-growing in Canada has become an important industry during the past ten years. Acreage has steadily increased and this year 80,000 acres were planted. South-western Ontario, along the shores of Lake Erie, has the largest acreage, with

It has been on the light, sandy lands of Norfolk County, Ontario, that the most phenomenal development has taken place. In 1924 only thirty acres were planted to tobacco in that country, while this year more than 35,000 acres were planted to the flue-cured varieties used for cigarette making and commanding the highest price. Nearly all the rest of the Ontario crop is of the cigarette variety, with a small amount to heavier kinds.

Most of the Canadian crop is sold for domestic consumption. Tobacco products sold in

ble the masses of the country to reach to better things, this being the desire of every true democrat. The Party would pledge a widespread educational campaign among the people. and eastern Europe and submits a formal demand for them. The world knows, except apparently Premier Chamberlain, that no Peace can be expected by the making of pretty speeches to Dictators; for as the London Fortnightly Review Magazine says — "The Patriotism of the German Race is not only Love of Country, but Love of more Country", for they are never satisfied. No German Leader has ever said or will ever say what Germany desires in order to be politically satisfied. None knows. — Polity as a civil order, is an alien conception to him. Voluntary discipline as the basis of domestic stability, and mutual concession, as the means of international Peace, have no meaning for him. International relations, the German never feels himself tied by any of the rules of the political game. For him international law is only a useful convenience which it may suit him to invoke in his favour according to circumstance. He will never admit that it lays down any rule of conduct which should be obeyed by him, or that it constitutes a code of ethics to which he should in honour conform. It is not merely that law must give place to Power, but that German Truth, German honour, German Faith, are for him conceptions apart. They are to him so sacred and holy that they cease to have any value if they are profaned by the rest of mankind participating in them.

In 1818 Prince Bismarck made the great remark that the necessity of solving problems must be by blood and iron.

Soon after this, he placed his theory in practice by waging a feudal war against germanic Austria and a war of rapine against France in 1870. But even then he left the problem unsolved for the answer to the question "What is the German's Fatherland" is contained in the poem of Ernst Arndt — "It is everywheres where there is a German". HENDAYE. — Insurgent artillery, aviation and infantry smashed at government lines anew during the night of the 5th, intensifying their offensive against government positions on the Ebro front on Eastern Spain.

Government reports acknowledged the attacks were becoming as severe as earlier drives before the Checoeslovakian crisis and bad weather combined to bring a temporary halt to large scale operations. At the same time insurgent aviators bombed the government ports of Barcelona and Valencia, wounding three persons and damaging three British ships.

LONDON. — Wind reaching 93 miles an hour in some sections, lashed the British Isles and caused 8 deaths during the night of the 4th instant. A large tree crushed a South London double decker bus and killed three.

TOKYO. — A Harbin dispatch to the Japanese News Agency said a Soviet Russian Border Patrol had taken 13 Manchukuoan boatmen prisoners on one of the river frontiers between Manchukuo and Siberia. The release of the men was promptly demanded by Manchukuo.

TOKYO. — The Japanese News Agency reports that Poland had assured Japan she

would not enforce sanctions against her in pursuance of the recent action of the League of Nations Council, which voted that article sixteen of the Covenant, the Sanctions Article, was applicable to Japan because of her war on China, but left each member free to decide whether to apply punitive measures.



SOUTH AMERICA'S HIGHWAY PROGRAMME

Peru's great highway from Tiago, eighty-four miles along Lima to Pucalpa is but one of many important road-building projects in South America. Peru's program is ambitious. In addition to the Andes-Amazon project, 35,000 men with \$ 2,000,000 worth of new road machinery are laying pavement from her northern border to Bolivia.

Venezuela has several remarkable highways. From La Guyra a spectacular concrete road leads over the mountains to Caracas, and on to Porta Cabello, some 176 miles. One can also go by bus from Caracas to Bogotá, Colombia, about 800 miles.

In Colombia, work is progressing on a highway which will connect Bogotá with the Caribbean.

Chile's only concrete road connects Valparaíso with San

"AGAINT WAR AND FASCISM"

Latin Americans are often quick to resent what they may regard as interference from "the Colossus of the North". But to one yanqui 50,000 Latin American listened recently with enthusiasm. The speaker was John L. Lewis, and his audience was gathered in the bull ring of Mexico City for an International Congress Against War and Fascism. Delegates, including representatives of the American League for Peace and Democracy, had been invited by the Mexican Confederation of Workers.

"With the workers of the workers of the Western Hemisphere", declared Chairman Lewis, "we join against our common foe. We shall continue to strengthen our organizations because we know that between ourselves and fascism there can be no peace". He charged that "reactionary corporations" in the United States "will turn to open-fascism when they find it convenient to do so", and that "reactionary groups of employers would welcome the growth of fascism in Latin America". Against such movements he warned, "workers' organizations must always be on the alert".

There were delegates from Europe, too. Leon Jouhaux leader of French labor, declared: "Germany and Italy, the Fascists and the Nazis, cannot impede the world workers".

An advice from Madrid discloses that on the 3rd instant thirty planes belonging to the air fleet of the Insurgent Party, flew over that city in mass formation and dropped 178,000 rolls of bread.

Each roll was wrapped in paper marked. "A present from the nationalists to the women, children and old people of Madrid".

The rolls aggregated a weight of about 60 tons.
