

ACCION DEL CENTRO

Continuando sus análisis de la situación atlántica, el CENTRO PARA EL ESTUDIO DE PROBLEMAS NACIONALES quiere hoy referirse a un problema que es general y nacional, pero que reviste especial importancia para la región limonense. Es la introducción imprescindible de la máquina en la industria agrícola.

En todo el país tal paso es obligado si se quiere aumentar nuestra productividad y levantar el nivel de vida de nuestro trabajador campesino, que constituye la base de nuestra población. Mientras no se llegue a ello seguiremos sin poder cultivar infinidad de artículos para los cuales nuestras tierras y nuestro clima están perfectamente capacitados, pero los cuales serán siempre producidos por el extranjero en condiciones de desfavorable competencia para la industria nacional.

Todo lo anterior toma mejor relieve en la provincia de Limón. En ella la escasez de brazos es mayor; en ella existen condiciones climáticas que significan una gran ventaja para la feracidad de las tierras, pero que también acarrean serias dificultades para la recolección de los productos y su posterior confección. Además, quizás pocas otras zonas habrá en Costa Rica donde se facilite más el establecimiento de la maquinaria por las especiales condiciones del terreno.

Por consiguiente, creemos que cualquier plan que se promueva para levantar el perdido auge de la región atlántica, debe primordialmente basarse en un fomento y difusión de la introducción de la máquina a los diversos cultivos que sean susceptibles de realizarse en esa zona y todas aquellas fases de la producción que para ello se presten. A ese efecto los grandes finqueros y terratenientes pueden desenvolver tal plan con independencia y por sí solos. Pero debe tomarse en cuenta que hay un sinnúmero de pequeños cultivadores que necesitan más que ninguno otro esa mecanización, pues son los que más pueden sufrir de la competencia. Ellos nunca podrían financiar semejante plan por sí y aisladamente. En su ayuda debe venir alguna institución pública. Esa es la medida más fácil de idear para facilitarles los medios. Pero también cabe pensar que sean ellos mismos los que lo hagan, agrupándose en cooperativas que comprendan a todos los pequeños agricultores de las diferentes localidades de la Provincia y que les dé la suficiente fortaleza económica para que financien la adquisición de todos los implementos que sean necesarios. En esa forma tales cultivadores conservarían su entera independencia y no tendrían que temer nunca que en el procedimiento adoptado en su ayuda interviniieran la política o la penuria pública, cuado éstas aparecen periódicamente en el escenario nacional.

Cuando el general Porfirio Díaz era presidente de la República de México, al salir una tarde a recorrer la ciudad, se sorprendió de ver que la mayoría de los rótulos de los establecimientos comerciales estaban escritos en idioma extranjero. Una orden suya a su regreso a palacio puso fin en un término de cuarenta y ocho horas a esta costumbre servil de extranjerismo.

La municipalidad de Limón, hace unas cuantas semanas acordó, con acierto que todos aplaudimos, bautizar el viejo barrio de Jamaica Town con un nombre español que sirviera de homenaje y de recuerdo a este momento histórico. El acuerdo tomado quedó pendiente mientras se studia el nombre con que ha de bautizarse este barrio limonense.

Valdría la pena aprovechar esta iniciativa municipal para abrir un concurso a fin de escoger el nombre más apropiado para el barrio y que al mismo tiempo recuerde algún benefactor de la provincia o de la ciudad. Así, lograríamos dos cosas, limpiar de extranjerismos serviles nuestra vida nacional poniendo nombres españoles a nuestros barrios nacionales, glorificar a alguno de los pocos que se han preocupado de esta zona y despertar interés en conocer datos históricos sobre la ciudad de Limón. Si el concurso tuviera como base la indicación de un nombre y una relación de los hechos que han motivado su escogencia con biografía de su vida, haríamos una labor beneficiosa.

Como todavía la Municipalidad no se ha pronunciado en determinado sentido, cabría acoger nuestra iniciativa si ella tiene aceptación entre los señores municipales.

ALIMENTACION UNIVERSAL

En la conferencia Internacional de Alimentos de las Naciones Unidas, que se celebró en Hot Springs (Virginia), se adoptaron medidas para llevar a la realidad mediante la cooperación internacional el ideal del Presidente Roosevelt de extirpar la miseria en todo el mundo.

Los representantes de 45 naciones recomendaron sus respectivos gobiernos la creación de una entidad internacional permanente cuya organización quedó encamendada a una comisión provisional.

Entre las recomendaciones aprobadas por la Conferencia figura una que dice:

"La causa principal de hambre y de la mala nutrición es la pobreza. Es inútil producir más comestibles a menos que las naciones provean mercados para absorberlos. Por lo tanto, es necesario modificar la eco-

nomía mundial a fin de proveer el poder adquisitivo suficiente para proporcionar una alimentación adecuada para todos".

La conferencia manifestó que "pesa sobre cada nación la responsabilidad directa de velar porque su propio suelo obtenga la alimentación necesaria para mantener la salud y la vida".

La Lucha en la Selva

LA PICADA DEL ARBOL DEL HULE SILVESTRE

Técnico de la Rubber Development Corporation

Hay dos consideraciones fundamentales en la picada de los árboles de hule silvestre:

1.—Conseguir la mayor cantidad posible de leche de cada árbol cada vez que se pique.

2.—Picar los árboles de tal manera que se asegura su duración.

Es muy importante poner especial cuidado en la limpieza en cada una de las operaciones de pique y de recolección de la leche, para obtener hule limpio y bien preparado y así conseguir un precio más alto.

Cada hulero necesita un cuchillo especial para picar los árboles, una cincha para subirlos, un canalito y un recipiente para recolectar la leche que mana de cada árbol picado. Usando este equipo se consiguen los fines arriba mencionados.

LA COAGULACION

El árbol de hule silvestre debe picarse con un cuchillo especial. La hoja en forma de "U" permite abrir una herida o corte de poca profundidad en la corteza del árbol. El cuchillo tiene un regulador que evita que se penetre demasiado hondo a la corteza del árbol.

Al lado opuesto de la hoja en forma de "U", en la parte superior del instrumento, hay una hoja recta que se usa para profundizar el corte hecho con la hoja en forma de "U" y entrar en la capa de corteza interior del árbol. Este segundo corte se hace en el fondo de la herida abierta con el cuchillo en forma de "U". Es decir que el hulero primariamente hace una herida en el árbol empleando el cuchillo en forma de "U", y luego, en la misma herida, hace otra

más profunda para lo cual emplea la hoja recta.

En algunos lugares se usa el machete para picar el árbol, pero esto le perjudica y también permite el desprendimiento de leche que se escurre por los lados.

LA CINCHA

Para subir el árbol, el hule se vale de la cincha la parte más ancha de la cual se la pasa por la cintura, pasando la parte resistente del cañamo alrededor del árbol. Esto le permite tomar una posición cómoda frente al árbol, que le facilita la subida.

La cincha está provista de una cuerda que se emplea para atar la parte ancha de la misma a la cintura del hulero. La parte gruesa de la soguilla, que es parte integrante de la cincha, está provista de un gancho o undo para asegurar firmemente el cabo que se tira alrededor del árbol con la correa tejida.

Las cinchas se elaboran de cañamo o de mectate de manila de tres tamaños, es decir, sogas delgadas para las cuerdas de atar; sogas medianas para la parte tejida; y sogas gruesas para tirar alrededor del árbol.

Los huleros pueden hacer sus propias cinchas, ya que el mectate está de venta en casi todas partes. Un trabajador hábil puede hacer una cincha completa en una hora o menos.

El cinturón deserto ha demostrado, por su uso durante muchos años, ser muy seguro y de fácil manejo cuando el hulero está encaramado en el árbol.

En algunos lugares los huleros acostumbran enrollarse una soga alrededor de su cuerpo y del árbol sin amarrar sus extremos, en forma de cinturón que les rodea. Sin embargo, deben proveerse de algún medio para que esta soga o cinturón tenga atada sus extremos antes de que sea arrollada alrededor del árbol, como medio de seguridad.

También usan en algunos lugares espolones para subir a los árboles, como los que usan los reparadores de las líneas telegráficas, pero son muy perjudiciales al árbol de hule. Un hulero con una cincha adecuada tiene toda la seguridad necesaria sin usar los espolones.

BRITISH SOVEREIGN VISIT NORTH AFRICA

His Majesty King George VI of the British Commonwealth of Nations was, on Wednesday, reported to have arrived in North Africa last Saturday for the purpose of inspecting the Allied forces, particularly the aerial divisions prior to their entering on their offensive against the European Continent.

His Majesty is also stated to have taken the opportunity of personally decorating General Dwight Eisenhower with the Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath, accorded him some time previously.

ACTIVITIES IN MEDITERRANEAN REGION

Having firmly established their control in the North African territories, the Allied Command, as was anticipated, have directed attention toward the Italian peninsula. The important island base of Pantelleria was first attacked and occupied; this was the island of Lampedusa, after a twenty-four hours' attack by Allied naval and aerial units. The third to be taken was Linosa, and the fourth Lampione. More than twenty thousand Italians were taken prisoners.

The military and naval bases on the Island of Sicily have also been having their share of bombings with terrible results. The Island is now completely isolated by Allied naval units.

The inhabitants on the Islands of the Dodecanese group are said to be experiencing so serious an economic situation that those on Castellrosso are preparing to evacuate it. This island lies but a short distance off the Turkish coast.

Pro-peace manifestations are assuming such proportions in the south of Italy that it is feared a general uprising may result. The Germans have transferred the headquarters of their aerial forces from Sicily to the mainland of Italy.

Russian operations along the Central front, during the earlier days of the week in course, are said to have obtained advances in the Orel sector, while the enemy positions in the regions of Sverdlovsk, Bolgord and the west of Rosov were incessantly raided during a period of two days.

Violent fighting has been in progress in various sectors stretching from Kuban in the Cossack region to Lenigrad, with the Russians maintaining the offensive in all parts.

Foreign military experts have declared that the devastating attacks of the Soviet air force over the Nazi lines and rearguard have comple-

tely destroyed the summer plans of Hitler. During the seven weeks in which the aerial activities attained their maximum intensity, German aerodromes, railroads, munition deposits and roadways were ruined.

With the Allied victory in Africa and their control of the Mediterranean, it is believed the Germans will not be in a position to launch another intensive offensive against the Russians.

LIC. DON FRANCISCO FONSECA VISITS (D.Y)

Right pleasing it was for us to have had the visit of Lic. don Francisco Fonseca Ch., one of our Province's Representatives before the National Congress.

Don Francisco came from the Capital on last Tuesday's

passenger train, and was shortly after engaged on what seemed an official mission with our highly esteemed Governor, don Abel Robles, and our widely regarded supplementary Deputy, Attorney Daniel Zeledón.

GERMANY STILL BEING BOMBED

Allied air units continue to shower their bombs of destruction over Germany and Nazi occupied territories, with results said to be growing and more disastrous to the enemy.

During the week in course, the important German bases of Kiel and Bremen were hard hit. On the night of the 14th, the large industrial cen-

ter of Oberhausen, located ten kilómetros northwest of Essen, as well as other points in the region of the Ruhr also suffered. Between 400 and 500 bombing machines participated and discharged more than 1,000 tons of bombs over their objectives.

The vastly important city of Cologne was, for the 116th time, the object of an aerial attack on the night of Wednesday last. Other centers of the Rhine were also visited, as well as Nazi occupied positions in Belgium and Holland. The damages caused are said to have been enormous. One thousand Allied planes took part.

The Axis combine are stated to have lost 100 planes during the attack on Kiel and Bremen, 105 at Wilhelmshaven and the Japanese 75 in an aerial encounter with North American units over Guadalcanal. The Americans lost only six.

THE SIQUIRRES DRIVE AGAINST IMPIOUS HABITS

Through these columns we, a few weeks ago, became acquainted with the initiative of several residents of the township of Siquirres, whose regard for virtue rather than vice, prompted them to approach the authorities of Law and Order with a view of banishing or suppressing the impious habits rampant among a large number of their fellow residents. •

Many of the evils which have stirred Siquirres have been with us in this city for a long period, but the indegence is now so widely spread it has become a public scare. Wherever the profanity and vulgarity abound, persons of decency and respectability dare not approach.

The "Billingsgate" expressions are generally uttered in the English language, but even those who have no original claim thereto fully understand the indecent utterances. These profligates usually congregate in the Coffee Shops, Drinking Saloons, Restaurants, along the thoroughfares and other public places, and being aware that the policemen are unfamiliar with the language, indulge in their scandalous, boisterous conduct with impunity.

We wholeheartedly agree with the Siquirres "Crusade", and earnestly recommend that the suppressive measures be extended to our city. The need is urgent. We cannot make any real cultural advancement, as a community, while such conduct openly abounds; it is therefore necessary that repressive measures of a decidedly effective character be placed in force with the least possible delay.

THE REVENGE OF FRANCE STARTED IN AFRICA

The third anniversary associated with the fall of Paris passed recently; but it was, in all respects, different to the two previous occasions, for almost on the eve of the commemorative month, Free Frenchmen initiated their revenge in Tunisia. There, the tables were turned on the German mechanized units which had rolled over France three years previously.

General Giraud was able, we are told, to place from 50,000 to 75,000 men, at a time, on the front battle lines. It was a force of French men who are reported to have captured the strategic point of Pont du Fans on the road to Tunis. Frenchmen also flew with other Allied aviators in their attack. They fought, too, alongside the men of the North American Republic who took Bizerte, and marched with the fighting British into Tunis. French fighting units, under the command of General Le Clerc, journeyed from Equatorial Africa across the Libyan desert and joined in the battle of Tunisia. French casualties in this warfare totalled, it has been stated, 9,000, but they inflicted a much greater loss on their enemy and no less than 25,000 Nazi and Italian soldiers fell into their hands.

It is stated that the rapidity with which the French armies are being equipped with the most modern weapons for the approaching battles to regain the Mother

Maria Ivanova, a twenty two year old Russian aviatrix, has been awarded the Patriotic War Order (First Class) in reward for the one hundred and twenty-five dangerous flights she accomplished during a period of seventy days on one of the battle fronts. She suffered serious injuries on her last flight while bombing an enemy ammunition deposit.

DEATH OF MISS BERYL BERNARD

Picture the overwhelming burst of grief of a mother who hastened to the bedside of a beloved daughter who was reported ill only to find the tomb almost closing over her earthly remains.

Lamentably, the telegram bearing the news of Miss Bernard's death was sent to the Parish Priest a few hours after Mrs. Bernard had started on her sad journey.

On the news gaining circulation in the city, it threw a dense cloud of sadness everywhere, especially among those with tender recollec-

tions of the cultured, well intentioned, ambitious, intelligent and deeply esteemed young citizen.

Miss Beryl was the "apple" of the loves of her parents. She was born here, and grew to the age of sweet Sixteen in spotless innocence. Completing her elementary education in the Government Girls' School as well as in the English Day School of our Catholic Parish, under the tuition of another mother, she went, only five months ago, to the Normal School to pursue further studies, and there her brilliant and promising career has ended.

We are informed that the highest tribute, befitting Miss Beryl's character, was extended at the interment which took place during the morning of Wednesday the 16th. We tender our profoundest sympathy to her bereaved parents and other relatives. May her soul at ever rest.

ITS SECOND ANNIVERSARY

This letter, written on the 1st of June 1941, might never have been read, but for the death of the writer, Flight Sergeant James L. S. Dunlop, Royal Canadian Air Force, who crashed to death on the 11th. October 1941

Dear Mother and Father — I have no reason to believe or feel that this letter will ever be read¹ since it will only be opened if and when I am killed, or, at least, listed among those who "failed to return". I have no feeling of impending fate. I know that my duty, not only to my country and humanity but to myself, lies ahead. I know, too, that in carrying out my duty I must run great risks. It is because of the risks, rather than any certainty, that I write this letter.

First, I want you to realize and even try to be proud that you have given a man to the cause of human liberty. Please do not make the error of mourning me on account of my youth. — That youthfulness is only apparent to you, because you are considerably older than most parents with a sonny age. Young as I am, I have countries among free peoples, and have grown to manhood loving the liberty I have enjoyed. True, all has not been easy for me in life, nor was freedom so widespread as it might have been for others. Still, progress was being made along correct lines. That progress must never be stopped by anyone or anything. All men must learn to live at peace with their fellowmen and to grant all, regardless of station of birth, creed or colour, the same rights and privileges which they themselves desire to enjoy. Class distinctions must be wiped out. Surely, if there

we must inevitably suffer and die — die deaths of the soul and mind as well as the body. If there by any message which the coming generation should have from me, let it be a message from us who have fought and died to make future generations of human beings possible. Let the message be this — "We have cleared the site and laid the foundations, You build".

Well folk, I had better draw this to a close. This will not have been pleasant reading, yet I want no tears on my behalf. I have done my duty, completed my life's work. If there by any honours or reward due me, let them be these two — One, that you regard me worthy of being your son; two, that there come to pass at last. "A Good Earth". Goodbye and God bless you.



BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

THE R. A. F. SETTLES ACCOUNTS

Essen, the hardest hit town in all Germany, suffered its most devastating blow of the whole war from the R. A. F. on the night of Thursday, May 27. For 50 minutes, 10 consecutive waves of R. A. F. bombers swamped the Krupp city. "Concentration" is the key word in enabling the British Bomber Command to achieve an intensity of bombing far beyond the wildest imaginings of the Luftwaffe commanders. The late Essen raid once again demonstrated that the RAF can now drop on a German town a tonnage five times as great as the Luftwaffe's heaviest against any British city, and in a fraction of the time. The RAF's heaviest raid yet on Germany was more than 2,000 tons on Dortmund on May 23, 1943, in one hour. The Luftwaffe's strongest assault was less than 450 tons on London on April 16, 1941, in eight hours.

Compare also the more than 1,500 tons on Duisburg on May 12, 1943, in 45 minutes, with the 200 tons on Coventry on Nov. 14, 1940, in 11 hours; and the 1,000 tons on Essen on March 5, 1943, in 40 minutes, with the 400 on London on May 10, 1941, in five hours. In 90 nights of attacks on London, the Luftwaffe dropped 7,500 tons. In May, 1943, the R. A. F. surpassed that figure in five nights. Since the beginning of 1943, the monthly tonnage dropped on Germany has averaged 8,000 and the rate is rising persistently.

"Timing is everything. The recent big attack on Duisburg was timed to start at 2 a. m. and end at 2:45 a. m. The first aircraft was over the target at 2 a. m. precisely. Concentrating hundreds of planes — frequently 500 or more — over the target in less than an hour, calls for extra skill from the pilots. Reports suggest that the planes, hostile like race horses before a tape, 'I could have shaken hands with the bomb aimers in a Lancaster as it passed us,' said the gunner of another plane recently. Aircraft sometimes return damaged by collisions.

The effect on defenses of the initial onslaught is devastating. They cannot concentrate, and by the end of the attack are usually out of action. The effect on the fire service, A. R. P., etc., is equally paralysing. The fires cannot be controlled.

Germany has a bitter consolation in the fact that it was the Luftwaffe which first initiated the R. A. F. into the secrets of the fire-raising technique. On December 29, 1940, the Luftwaffe started 1,500 fires in the city of London by dropping thousands of incendiaries in a three-hour raid. The lesson was not wasted. The pupil demonstrated what it had learned when, on March 29, 1942, the R. A. F. fire-blitzed Lübeck, dropping 340 tons in three hours and wiping out 40 per cent of the city. The effect was all the greater since

AXIS MARITIME LOSSES

The Admiralty has stated that from the Battle of El Alamein to the recent capture of Cape Bon Peninsula, British naval forces sunk or damaged a known total of 313 enemy surface vessels in the Mediterranean. The number of U-boats sunk during the period is not included, nor is the number of ships sunk or damaged by mines. Fifty-six of the enemy ships destroyed were warships of various types, and the remaining 257 were supply ships. H. M. submarines carried out 228 of the successful attacks, surface ships 66, and aircraft of the Fleet Air Arm 29.

One hundred and fifty-two supply ships and 33 warships were seen to sink. The injury inflicted upon some ships listed as damaged was so severe that it is more than probable that a substantial proportion of them subsided at anchor. Of damaged ships which reached harbour, it is certain that many were made useless for many months.

The R. A. F. did not repeat the mistake made by the Luftwaffe when, after the London fire blitz, it failed to return with a load of heavy bombs with which it might have completely overwhelmed the civil defenses. To Lübeck and to subsequent targets, the R. A. F. took bombs of all calibers.

This was the beginning. The next step was to concentrate a sufficiently big force over a well-defended target to saturate the defenses and make sure that the planes carrying incendiaries found the target and lit the way. The latter job developed into a special pathfinder force guided by highly skilled navigators.

Cologne was the successful test of the saturation tactics. There 1,047 aircraft dropped more than 1,500 tons in 20 minutes. It is interesting to compare this with the first raid by night on a land target by the R. A. F. — Sylt seaplane base, on March 19, 1940 — when 50 Whitleys and Hampdens dropped just over 20 tons in six hours.

Since Cologne, saturation and pathfinding have reached a high pitch of efficiency. Major and concentrated operations — the word raid is hardly adequate now — occupy between 30 and 60 minutes — 45 minutes being the average for a 1,500 tonner, or 30 tons a minute.

The RAF's attacks are made possible by the development of the four-engined bomber, capable of big tonnages, high speed and long range, whereas the Luftwaffe's twin-engine, medium bombers, with a small carrying capacity could never have achieved concentration plus weight on the R. A. F. ventury. 300 planes to drop 400 tons to drop 200 tons on Coventry, 300 planes to drop 400 tons on London on May 10, 1941, and 450 planes to drop 450 tons on London on April 16, 1941.

GERMANY'S DEFICIENCIES

The Reich is today in a condition similar to that into which she came in the third year of the previous war, to go on to collapse from lack of military reserves, from lack of labor, from declining war production. The same inevitable deficiencies will spell her defeat in this war. One-half of Germany's skilled workers are in her armies. Nowhere in Europe can Germany find their equals. Normally in Germany there are 24,000,000 classed as workers, one-third women. Today there are 30,000,000, more than one-half women. Of the men, six millions represent dragoons; poor stuff. Compare those soft women with the thousands of sturdy Russian women digging coal, in telling guerrilla warfare, in fighting airplanes. In labor, on which all war is based, Russia has distinctly the better of it.

Nothing, of any sort, has hit Germany harder in this war than the bombings of the Moehne and Eder dams, of the Ruhr, of her war-consecrated plants wherever located. For the first time in more than a century and a quarter, with the exception of the slight invasion of East Prussia by Russia in 1941, the German people are being taught on their own soil what war can mean. Those bombing raids — many of them have had the value of the loss of a division or more.

DO YOU KNOW THAT

Employees of 8,000 commercial and industrial undertakings in the County of London are contributing to the Red Cross Penny-A-Week Fund at the rate of nearly £ 5,000 a week? Total Red Cross savings in Britain have so far realised more than £ 20,000,000?

Japan is short of telephones? Radio Tokyo announces "The Ministry of Communication has begun a movement for the contribution of telephones by the public. In one month 4,000 instruments were contributed.

Reports of sabotage in France for only one fortnight show: 9 trains wrecked; 11 bomb attacks made on German premises, including 2 on Paris hotels occupied by Nazis; 177 railway coaches, 7 locomotives, 28 lorries, 400 tons of straw and 1,600 litres of petrol all destroyed.

In two years, the British destroyer H. M. S. Winchester has scuttled 4,500 merchant ships, steamed more than 60,000 miles and spent 6,807 hours at sea?

F. used 400 machines on the occasions in March 1943, to take 1,000 tons to Essen — which also involved a flight three times as long as the Luftwaffe's to London. In its raids on London the Luftwaffe operated a shuttle service which greatly increased the time required for the operation. Though continuous bombardment of that type did embarrass the fire

THREE STARS OF BRITAIN

Three of Britain's best fighting men, renowned veterans of two world wars, are supporting General Eisenhower in North Africa. The names of the three British officers, whom General Eisenhower has described as "the three stars of Britain" are:

General Sir Harold Rupert Alexander, deputy commander in chief and commander of the British, American and French ground forces.

Admiral Sir Andrew Cunningham, Bart., commander of the Allied sea forces, including the waters of the Levant and the Red Sea.

Air Chief Marshal Sir Arthur Tedder, commander of the United Nations Air Forces. Cunningham and Tedder are Scots while Alexander is an Irishman, born at Castle Caledon, Tyrone County, Ulster. General Alexander's motto is: "Attack, attack and attack again, even when you are on the defensive."

Admiral Cunningham is noted for his willingness to do anything he asks of his men. On one occasion, when there was a shortage of stokers, he was found below decks, hard at work shoveling coal. He knows the Mediterranean like the palm of his hand, for a large part of his career has lain in its waters. England has not forgotten his laconic message to his men just before the battle off Cape Matapan: "We are going to have some fun. All guns will be in action".

Air Marshal Tedder is an authority on air support of ground operations. He was the first Allied commander to crack the dreaded Luftwaffe on any battle front. His pilots smashed the Nazis out of the sky at El Alamein. Tall and lithe, with the figure of a soldier, Tedder is a friendly and companionable person. He delights in gathering pilots and air crews about him for informal talks after they return from combat duty. He is also an accomplished artist, and sketched a fine likeness of Mr. Churchill when they travelled together in a transport plane during Churchill's recent visit to North Africa.

services to a serious extent. It never succeeded in knocking them out.

NAZI LOSSES IN RUSSIA

It lacks but three now, of two years since Germany rushed into an adventure which was to require only weeks. Germany is paying one of the greatest blunders in history. Dr. Ley's Labor Front, in Berlin, and insurance companies in Germany were in agreement, at the first of this year, that, up to that time, Germany's killed, permanently disabled and prisoners in the Russian business totaled 4,800,000. Since then there have been the huge losses at Stalingrad, in the Khar'kov and Donets fighting, and these carry the figure of man losses in Russia to more than 6,000,000. These figures do not, of course, include losses in Africa, nor do they include the great losses in Russia of Italian, Rumanian, Hungarian and other German satellites. "They were expendables." Germany's 1941 offensive included the whole Russian line from Leningrad south, 1,600 miles. More than 500,000 square miles were captured. The second offensive, in 1942, was on a vast a scale with far less result.

Since then the vast battle has seen victory and reverse. Both Germany is still hundreds of miles from the oil-rich Caucasus which she greatly wants despite her synthetics and Rumanian products, and far more important, as far as ever from the greatest of all her objectives, the vital thing the crushing of Russia's armies. There are now about 5,000,000 Germans and Russians in contact. Speculation as to what is to take place is of little value, at present. Russia is apparently trying to reach the Kerch strait to expel the Germans from that approach to the Caucasus, and to take Novorossisk on the Black Sea. It may signify only an offensive defense. Germany may repel her, have another shot at the Caucasus. She is also heavily massed at Orel, may make another try for Moscow. She may sit tight, try to hold what she has. It is anybody's guess.

THIS IS OUR HIGH CALLING
