## ESCRITORAS COSTARRICENSES

Es realmente escaso el delicado, noble y elegante, y "de ella podría decirse que, como escritora, es tan fina y exquisita que lo que escribe podría firmarlo un hada, y que, como mujer, a su paso los poetas deshojan flores porque no pueden deshojar estrellas", para repetir lo que acerca de ella dice un escritor.

Hilda Chen Apuy, hija de padre chino y madre costarricense, empezó a escribir con el pseudónimo de Rose Ling. Perteneció igual que Myriam Francis, al Ateneo de Costa Rica. Es sumamente joven, actualmente cursa la enseñanza secundaria, pero su literatura tiene una madurez plena, que nos admira, y esto nos hace pensar que, andando el tiempo, Miss Chen Apuy será una gloria de la patria. Poemas cortos — descripciones y estados de alma — y cuentos de poético ambiente chino, bellos en la forma y profundos en el fondo, son el bagaje de esta joven de exótica belleza oriental.

Leticia Rivera es una maestra rural que viene encantando a los lectores de "Ariel" la selecta revista antológica del gran poeta Froylán Turcios. En cada renglón que escribe Leticia Rivera se percibe un temblor de emoción, y hay una delicadeza de flor y un aroma de nardo en sus exquisitas frases líricas, cuyo estilo es muy semejante al de Myriam Francis. Además, Leticia Rivera ha escrito los primeros Kai-Kais que se escriben en Centro América, y que son una forma de poesía japonesa, en composiciones de tres versos únicamente; creemos que es, en toda la América Hispana, la primera mujer que los escribe, y lo hace tan bien como el mejor de los poetas orientales.

Culta, bellísima, elegante con una pluma de la que brotan las palabras como un torrente arrollador, lleno de fuerza y de belleza; tales es la señora Yolanda Oreamuno, tan admirada. Estuvo a punto de ganar en un concurso de la novela latinoamericana promovido por una editorial de New York, retirando su novela, que figuraba entre las mejores, antes de cerrarse el concurso, provocando un escándalo mayúsculo en los círculos intelectuales.

"Alma" es el nombre de la primera novela de la señora Rosalía de Segura otra escritora costarricense que promete para el futuro.

Blanca Milanés es el pseudónimo de la pintora Carlota Brénes de Rizo, que recogió sus poemas en prosa en un libro titulado "Música Sencilla", poemas llenos de esa sencillez que proclama la verdadera aristocracia del alma.

Carmen Lyra es un nombre conocidísimo en Costa Rica, cuyos cuentos para niños "Cuentos de mi Tía Panchita", son popularísimos.

También hay otras dos escritoras muy finas: la profesora Marina Blanco de Anderson y "Mayudel de Burgos" (señorita Lyra Bonilla).

Nos hemos referido hasta ahora solamente a las más conocidas escritoras en prosa. En verso escasean aún más, siendo quizás de las mejores Astridela de Jiménez, profesora, y Ninfa Santos, radicada en México ahora. Rosario Luna escribió hace algún tiempo, y valdría la pena que se reprodujera su obra poética.

Decíamos al principio que es pequeño el huerto literario de Costa Rica. Aparte de las ya nombradas, esas 4 rosas de prodigo que son, Myriam Francis, Yolanda Oreamuno, Hilda Chen Apuy y Leticia Rivera, las demás, en realidad, han dejado la literatura por la que sintieron pasajeros entusiasmos; no quedan más que algunas que de vez en cuando publican algún verso en algún periódico de provincia. Un huerto pequeño, repetimos, pero en el qué hay flores cuyo aroma, traducido en versos, poemas y cuentos, pone un aroma de feminina delicadeza en el pendón rojo, azul y blanco de la patria costarricense.

### NOTAS EDITORIALES

### — REAJUSTE DE SALARIOS —

El señor Secretario de Hacienda, en declaraciones que publicaron los diarios la semana pasada, ofreció un aumento de sueldo a los empleados del Poder Ejecutivo que devengan menos de trescientos colones mensuales. No indica el licenciado Tinoco a cuanto ascenderá ese aumento pero no podrá ser en ningún caso menor de un veinticinco por ciento. Solo así podrá resultar un balance, sino equivalente al alto precio de la vida, por lo menos una ayuda de inapreciable valor en esta crisis.

La Northern Railway Co. hizo también un reajuste de sueldos en sus empleados aumentando sus dotaciones en un veinticinco por ciento mas o menos. Falta todavía que las empresas particulares, los municipios y las demás instituciones nacionales hagan el aumento correspondiente a sus empleados. Este reajuste de salarios tendrá como consecuencia inmediata una elevación de los precios en todos los artículos. Así, que si el aumento no es general, la situación de los que se quedan como ahora está, será mucho más angustiosa.

Pero este reajuste de salarios es apenas una parte de lo que habría de hacerse. Es indispensable que como complemento a ella, se fijen los precios de los artículos de consumo indispensable. Solo este balance entre precios y sueldos puede nivelar la espantosa desproporción actual.

La creación de la Junta de Abastos como reguladora de los precios, ha resultado un organismo casi teórico. Como la Liga de las Naciones, sus acuerdos no pueden romper la malla de los intereses creados. Mientras no tenga una fuerza efectiva que pueda respaldar sus decisiones, toda su labor se estrellará inofensiva contra el agiotismo reinante.

No es cosa de leyes mas o menos elásticas que en este país las hay en abundancia, y que resultan casi inútiles. Es cosa de organización adecuada en lo que se refiere al control de existencias y de precios de venta. Es en estos aspectos donde hay que desarrollar una continua y eficiente vigilancia. Si la Junta de Abastos no puede crear un cuerpo de investigadores, no para el simple movimiento de San José, sino para todos los lugares del país y organizar ese cuerpo con el apoyo de las autoridades de policía, de los resguardos y de todos aquellos funcionarios que sea necesario, nada efectivo hará con las publicaciones de un boletín de precios que es una letra muerta en la especulación general.



## LABORES MUNICIPALES

Sesión Décima Sexta Ordinaria de la Municipalidad de Limón, iniciada a las diecinueve y media horas del veintidos de Junio de mil novecientos cuarenta y tres, con asistencia de los regidores señores Campos, Presidente; Solé y Espinach. ### ARTICULO PRIMERO:

Acta: Fueron leidas, aprobadas y firmadas actas de las sesiones Décima Cuarta y Décima Quinta Ordinarias.

### ARTICULO SEGUNDO:

Oficios del señor Gobernador: a) En nota número 0796 informa que para reemplazar al portero de la oficina de Sanidad y al ayudante del Fontanero, que renunciaron nombró a Jorge Solano y Mario Valerín, lo que ruega aprobar. SE ACORDÓ confirmar los nombramientos hechos por el señor Gobernador.

b) En oficio número 805 pone en conocimiento de la Corporación que el señor Inspector General de Hacienda Municipal le ha pedido enviar a la mayor brevedad al señor Contador, por ser necesaria su presencia en aquella dependencia, por lo que le ha dado orden de trasladarse a San José. SE ACORDÓ: Aprobar lo dispuesto por el señor Gobernador y autorizarlo para pagar al señor Contador los gastos que su viaje demanden.

### ARTICULO TERCERO:

Oficios de Jefes de Dependencias: a) Se acordó archivar: Informes semanales del funcionamiento de la Bomba de Río Banano, informe mensual del Jefe de Sanidad; informe mensual del Jefe de Sanidad; informes mensuales del Administrador del Matadero y nota del señor Tesorero manifestando que ha sido llamado por la Inspección General de Hacienda Municipal para ayudar a la liquidación del Presupuesto del año pasado, pero que como él no puede ir, irá el señor Contador en su lugar.

### ARTICULO CUARTO:

Escritos de particulares: a) El licenciado don Antonio Piñado informa que ya se dictó la resolución que fija la suma que en definitiva debe pagar la Corporación en la demanda de don Francisco Jiménez Ortiz contra esta Municipalidad, la que asciende a cinco mil ciento cincuenta y un colones, setenta y cinco céntimos (₡ 5.151.75) y cree conveniente cancelarla para evitar el pago de intereses, además acompaña constancia del tribunal de la que aparece después del fallo de primera instancia gastó diez colones cincuenta céntimos (₡ 10.50) en papel el que suplió y ruega se le cancele; expresa su sincero agradecimiento a la Corporación y a los señores Municipales, en particular por la

confianza en él depositada al honrarsele con el poder que le autorizó para la defensa de los intereses comunales; Se acordó: Cancelar al señor Piñado la cuenta de diez colones cincuenta céntimos que presenta y emitir un presupuesto extraordinario para cancelar lo que el Municipio debe pagar al señor Jiménez Ortiz, por cinco mil ciento cincuenta y un colones cincuenta céntimos, para reforzar la partida 9/5 "Gastos Judiciales" con cargo a la partida 6/2 "Pendiente de cobro año anterior".

b) Se acordó archivar nota del señor Director de la Revista Municipal relacionada con esa publicación.

c) El señor G. D., apoderado de la Compañía Bananera de Costa Rica nuevamente se refiere a la patente de Almacén Mayorista que paga dicha compañía. Manifiesta que en el primer trimestre de este año las ventas de ese almacén alcanzaron a ciento seis mil novecientos setenta colones (₡ 106.960.00) y las del segundo trimestre aun serán menores, por lo que debe imponérse una patente de segundo orden, o sean mil quinientos colones trimestrales.

Manifestó el regidor Presidente que la Compañía Bananera ha comprobado la reducción de sus ventas, lo que constata el señor Contador y que además no debe olvidarse que ese establecimiento no sólo vende a precios bajos, sino que ha tomado las medidas necesarias para evitar el acaparamiento de artículos y la especulación consiguiente con lo que toda la población se ha beneficiado. Como la comisión nombrada para proponer reformas a las tarifas, haciendo las más justas, no ha rendido su informe, rogó al señor Contador que expresara su opinión al respecto. El señor Contador expuso, q' de acuerdo con los números proporcionados por la Bananera, debe ésta pagar tributo de segunda categoría en el segundo trimestre de este año y puede cada trimestre, hacerse una verificación de las ventas para imponer la patente respectiva. Dijo que es cierto que la Compañía procura distribuir su mercadería entre el mayor número de consumidores y con ello evitar las especulaciones, permitiendo conseguir algunos artículos a precio razonable. ## ACCION DEL CENTRO

Es propósito del CENTRO PARA EL ESTUDIO DE PROBLEMAS NACIONALES referir esta columna de hoy a un englón de la agricultura atlántica cuyo incremento y desarrollo puede ser de incalculables beneficios para toda esta región oriental del país, como ha comenzado a serlo para la zona de Golfo Dulce. Tal es el cultivo organizado y sistemático del coco.

Ninguna planta es más fácil de sembrar y cuidar; su éxito no supone la exclusión de otras agriculturas, pues se exige la ocupación total de los terrenos dedicados a ese cultivo; con gran provecho puede ser combinado con otras plantas, pero sobre todo, puede serlo con los pastos. Ahora que la ganadería atlántica comienza a desarrollarse con grandes avances de éxito, el coco puede ser tomado como cultivo complementario que dé sombra a los potreros, sin restarles extensión. Es además su incremento una empresa que está al alcance de todos, del propietario más pequeño, miserero y enemigo entendido en ciencia agrícola, hasta el más grande y los latifundistas.

Una vez obtenido el producto, los cocales pueden ser parte de una gran riqueza por los muchos usos que pueden obtenerse de la fruta: en cientos pueden confundirse esas aplicaciones. Anotemos aquí tan sólo unos de los más importantes: la copra es hoy materia prima indispensable y valiosísima en cualquier fábrica de aceites vegetales, industria ya establecida en nuestro medio y que en gran parte tiene que seguir basada en la materia prima extranjera. El coco es fuente también de un inigualable sustituto del afrecho y demás productos alimenticios del ganado que hoy son importados; aquí se encontraría un ligamen más entre esas dos industrias que están llamadas a ser combinadas en su desarrollo: la ganadería y los cocales. Podríamos también mencionar su gran valor como producto de enorme demanda en el propio mercado frutero del interior del país; pero su importancia como elemento indispensable para mil usos industriales —tales como producto básico para fabricar un sustituto del oxígeno y otros más— hace que debamos considerar al coco, sobre todo, como un producto de exportación que habrá de tener en la post-guerra una importancia y un precio envidiables. Es por tal razón que no consideraremos baldío cualquier esfuerzo que se haga por fomentar su cultivo y por animar a los habitantes de la provincia de Limón a que emprendan su siembra en gran escala.



The principal reason for the suspension of service some time ago was because of the perils of Atlantic Ocean shipping lanes and the shortage in sea-going vessels. The resumption therefore, indicates, we feel, that these disadvantages have disappeared and the Company assured regular and sufficient supplies of the necessary fuel.

of Am. Negroes who had arrived there and were undergoing advanced training have either been, or might soon be, sent into action against the enemy. It is believed the "Darkies" will give sensational accounts of themselves against the Axis watercraft. Their squadron is named the "Warhawks".

A detachment of Soviet troops broke through the Nazi defences in the front of Smolensk on the 1st. instant and occupied important positions. The enemy retreated and left more than one hundred dead on the battlefield, many prisoners were also captured.

## ALLEGED INADEQUATE TRANSPORTATION BETWEEN ALMIRANTE AND CHASE

From Chase, in the Talamanca region, comes the report that travellers between Almirante and that locality are experiencing great difficulties on account of inadequate transportation facilities. The Company is said to operate a once-a-week freight and passenger train, which goes Almirante each Friday. Chase, the return trip being effected the same day, the time allowed, between arrival and departure of a train, being so brief, the

complainants declare they are not afforded sufficient time to transact their business, and in the event of missing the train an eight days stop-over at Chase is the consequence.

As we are assured that the movement between both places warrants a twice a week service, at least, we hope the people's solicitude will be given a sympathetic hearing and the necessary adjustment made.

From Yugoslavia comes the information that the patriotic guerrilla warriors have slaughtered the elite guard of the "Prinz Eugen" Nazi division, reducing their effectiveness by fifty per cent and frustrating the offensive under preparation by the enemy.

The Nazi Command is reported to have withdrawn a fifth part of their air craft from the Russian front as the result of the threatened invasion of the Continent. The Soviet military circles recognize this as a great relief for their troops. Numerous contingents are also said to have been moved from the Third Reich to aid the defence of the Low Countries and Balkan States.

A dispatch states that the Italian fleet had been removed to other bases less subjected to the terrible Allied Air bombings. This seems to indicate that Mussolini's Royal Italian Navy has backed out of the battle and the defence of the country.

Advices reaching London declare that the daily attacks by the Flying Forts and the nightly operations of the RAF units have virtually eliminated Wilhelmshaven as a naval base. The wharves, arsenal and other structures have all been destroyed.

Allied air units from North Africa bombed the island of Sicily for twenty-four consecutive hours a few days ago, and effected damages of an outstanding character. The important Italian base of Messina has also been rendered of almost no value to the enemy as the result of recent bombing. The vicinity immediately surrounding Naples also suffered terribly.

More than one thousand Italian officers and soldiers were killed in a recent encounter with Greek guerrilla warriors.

European centers declare the axis combine is displaying much nervousness because of the belief the Invasion of Europe will take effect to day July 3rd.

When the victory has been won, another opportunity will open up before the peoples of the Western Hemisphere. Then will our ideals of democracy, peace, tolerance and good neighbourliness be an example, an inspiration to the peoples over-seas. We have faith that some day these ideals will become the guiding stars of nations everywhere on this globe. Then, and only then, can we be sure that the sacrifices of today have not been made in vain. Today, we say with pride and humility that we are of the Western Hemisphere, knowing in our hearts that Americanism, in its deepest meaning, stands for the freedom, the welfare and the brotherhood of the plain peoples of the universe.



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# HOW THE ALLIED NATIONS TRAPPED THE NAZIS IN TUNISIA

(Condensed from the "American News Letter")

The battle has been fought and won, and the inside story of Tunisia is no longer a military secret, while the official dispatches from that war zone have become the text book of the Allied Commanders who plan the campaign against the European Continent. Field reports and summaries by officers responsible for the victory went into the study, which, naturally, disclosed many aspects of the battle, including weather conditions, troop dispositions, estimates of enemy strength and intentions. The following is culled from the information received by the United States War Department;

The battle was spread over five phases — Delusion, attack, feint, Surprise and Victory.

THE DELUSION referred to the bad weather which was of an unusually long duration. Weather-bound planes were unable to strike at German reinforcements by air or sea. The German High Command were apparently misled into thinking they could support and reinforce their troops and eventually evacuate them in safety. Enemy preparations at

Cape Bon indicated they had arranged for a progressive retreat and ultimate evacuation.

Weather conditions, changing suddenly for the better, there was a marked increase in the successes of the Allied air forces. By air and sea enemy transports were destroyed, and their retreat and evacuation programme completely upset.

THE ATTACK — The final phase of the land campaign was set in motion three weeks after the air assault began. After completing a holding action in the south, the Second United States Army Corps marched northward three hundred miles, in twelve days, to join the French Battalions in the assault against the hills which guarded the plain before Bizerta, and where the enemy held particularly strong positions which they had tried to make impregnable in several months of preparations. The French drove eastward along the Mediterranean shoreline, and just south of them were the regimental combat teams of the United States

9th. infantry divisions. Further south were two more United States divisions supported by the tanks of the first armored division. South of these United States forces and occupying the middle sector of the Allied line was the British First Army, including French units. General Montgomery's British Eighth Army was in the rough hill country at the southeastern extremity of the curving lines.

FEINT.—During the earlier days of the final attack, the Eighth Army exerted pressure in the south to contain a large number of Axis troops, while the major assaults were made by the forces to the north. Finally the United States 34th. division took Djebel Tahent, the new well known Hill 609, making a clean break through the Axis line of resistance, and sweeping forward to the plain. Quickly exploiting the penetration, units of the United States 1st. armored divi-

sion passed on to Mateur, which was hastily evacuated by the Germans. This movement outflanked the Axis positions in front of the British First Army and threatened them with envelopment.

SURPRISE—By a brilliant manoeuvre several British divisions were, in the meantime, secretly moved up from the Eighth Army front to reinforce the British First Army. This provided the tremendous power which carried the British through the hills and plains to Tunis. The last offensive was supported by what was probably the greatest concentration of air power over a battle area in the history of warfare. The Second United States army corps moved in co-operation with the British first army. A tank destroyer battalion attached to the United States 9th. division moved into Bizerta at the same time that the British Hussars entered Tu-

nis. It was expected the Axis troops would have made a fighting withdrawal to positions previously prepared, but they seemed to have been overwhelmed by the speed and power of the Allied advance.

VICTORY—German staff officers sought terms of surrender from Allied Commanders, but they met with the terse response — "Unconditional surrender".

In the Tunisia campaign, the Allies captured 287,000 Axis soldiers, nearly 3,000 planes, while the Allies lost

## WHAT BRITAIN IS LEASE-LENDING TO U. S. A.

### ATTACK ON REICH

### INVADERS WILL HAVE SURPRISES FOR FOE

### THE NAZIS CALL IT WAR

LeaseLend is a two-way traffic. For several months now Britain has supplied the United States with weapons of war of all kinds, but only with the recent exchange of Notes defining the principles of reciprocal aid have they been definitely specified.

How has "Lease-Lend in reverse" been working since America came into the war? Reciprocal aid between the U.S.A. and the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and the Fighting French has ranged from squadrons of Spitfires to new fanbelts for army lorries, from building aerodromes and naval bases to chocolate bars and bananas, and from convoy protection for American troopers to petrol for American planes. It is responsible for the appearance of British barrage balloons on the American west coast and anti-aircraft guns on the Atlantic coast and British corvettes on anti-submarine duty in American waters.

#### R. A. F. HELPS U. S. NAVY

An example of how LeaseLend works both ways simultaneously is supplied by the anti-submarine campaign off the North-American Atlantic coast. There a number of corvettes and smaller craft were turned over by the Admiralty to be manned and operated by American crews, while alongside them sail destroyers, corvettes and trawlers manned by British sailors but under United States command, and drawing food and other supplies from United States depots. Similarly R. A. F. Coastal Command planes and pilots fly over American waters in company with U. S. planes.

Within the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland the things that we are lease-lending to our ally include not only planes and guns and ammunition — the output of a number of British Ordnance factories is being earmarked for American forces — but materials and labour to build aerodromes, depots, cantonments; wherein a quarter of a million men are engaged. We are also repairing and supplying American ships that put into our ports and those of Cape Town, Port Sudan, Karachi, Bombay, Sydney and Auckland.

#### MILITARY SECRETS SHARED

Weapons of war, facilities and labour form the material side of the United Kingdom's aid to the United States. Less tangible, but of even greater importance, is the invaluable information which Britain has gained in battle and passed on to her ally. Military secrets which have been shared with the U. S. A. include:

Radiolocation, developed in Britain far earlier than in the United States.

The astrograph, by which the navigating officer of an air

Focke-Wulf 190s intercepted the four Spitfires searching for enemy shipping in the Channel.

A dog fight began. Sergt. Gerald Emes was separated from his companions.

Six German fighters chased him. One hit his engine, another wounded him in the leg.

Twenty-five miles off the French coast his engine seized up. As he floated down on his parachute he saw his abandoned Spitfire plunge into the sea.

Emes spent the next 192 hours — eight days and eight nights — adrift in his tiny rubber dinghy.

And even when rescue came, the Walrus, which picked him up, was unable to take off again because of a fractured cylinder.

#### TAXIED 50 MILES

It had to taxi 50 miles back to land.

Lying in hospital this, 22-year-old Canadian pilot said: "My greatest trial was lack of water."

"I used up my malted milk tablets in a few days and the emergency tablets went on the sixth day."

"Two of the nights were rather rough, and once I fell out of my dinghy. I never saw a ship the whole time."

The other Spitfires which went out with Emes came back safely after shooting down at least one F. W. 190.

This exchange of ideas, raw materials, weapons and even of man-power, this two-way LeaseLend, is one of the means by which the war effort of the United Nations can be speeded up and rendered infinitely more effective. Requirements can be satisfied from supplies on the spot; local, not imported labour is used; and above all, thousands of tons of shipping space are being saved.

Once again Germany is putting her faith in numbers as the main secret of success in the air. This time she is out for numerical predominance in fighters.

The only thing which can check the complete overwhelming of Germany in the air this year would be the production by the enemy of a greatly superior fighter. Of that there is no sign yet, but on the analogy of improvements in the Messerschmitt 109, a new and improved FW 190 may be expected soon.

American production of operational types of aircraft in March equalled the present first line strength of the Luftwaffe — some 4,000 aircraft. The total of American, British, and Russian production to-day is probably nearly three times that of Germany. Italy, and Japan with all the enslaved nations.

#### GROWING INFERIORITY

Naturally the enemy realizes his great and growing inferiority and is taking the only step open to him to try and offset the Allied advantage — to concentrate on the production of fighters for defensive operations. German output at present is probably about 2,800 aircraft each month. Of these about 1,800 are operational types. This output is about the limit of German capabilities and is likely to decrease as bombing is intensified. It represents perhaps 17,000 tons of aircraft per month.

By switching over to fighters and fighter-bombers about 3,400 aircraft of the smaller size could be produced each month for the same tonnage, thus increasing total German production from 2,800 to about 4,400 aircraft per month.

The fighter still plays the major part in winning the local air mastery so essential to military operations to-day and the threat of German numerical superiority in fighters can not be ignored.

At present the situation appears exceedingly favourable. The Luftwaffe is now overstretched and inferior on every front. The disposition of German fighter strength reveals this clearly. Fighter distribution is usually an excellent indication of where each side expects the major battles to occur.

#### FIGHTER DISTRIBUTION

Of its total of slightly more than 2,000 fighters, the Luftwaffe has the following approximate distribution:

AT AN ARMORED FIGHTING SCHOOL, in England, July. — (Reuter). — Anglo-American invasion armies have some sensational surprises for the Germans. When they blast their way forward from Continental bridgeheads they will throw into action an array of tanks and armored cars that bristle with secrets.

Facts point to this conclusion — that, when the Allied air forces have pulverized the first defences of Europe, Allied armies will surge forward with fire-power and mobility that will amaze the enemy. Tanks have new weapons, new defences and new speeds. A whole gallery of tanks whose very names are secret will be ranged beside them.

The "second front" will be fought with a new generation of armored car. Engines, guns and armor have been harnessed in a variety of combinations to meet every type of combat that Europe can provide.

New tactics have been perfected for armored battles on the Continent. Tank crews have wheeled and swerved under genuine fire from tanks and anti-tank guns. In cooperation with armored cars, anti-aircraft tanks and supporting planes have forged a polished instrument for combined operations against Germany.

Captured German tanks have played their part in the training. Every conceivable type of antitank obstacle has been reproduced and mastered. Alongside armored columns, artillery crews have trained with equally secret weapons.

In Britain today the coasts are alive with invasion craft, and innumerable fields and woods and shady lanes are shaking beneath armored forces as formidable as they are secret. (*New York Times*).

all the available evidence. The significant facts revealed are that 80 per cent, of the Luftwaffe's night fighters are in Germany and France in an attempt to repel Allied night raids, and that some 45 per cent of the Luftwaffe's day fighters are in the West to meet day raids.

Of Germany's bomber force nearly 1,200 aircraft (60 per cent) appear to be spread out along the Russian front and only about 150 (7½ per cent.) have been spared to face a possible invasion in the West. The substantial fighter force, can be roped in as fighter-bombers if required, and the Germans, as we have cause to know, are extremely good at moving air units from one area to another.

Germany still has fair reserves of aircraft, although probably not of crews. Undoubtedly the time for the major air attack on the Reich is fast approaching. And with it, the climax of the war.

This, then, was Berlin's infamous plan. It is worse than bombing churches and children, infinitely more horrible than putting hostages against a wall and running a bayonet through them.

#### DELUSION

But something misfired with the arrangements.

It was a scheme that would have misfired anyway. For the Nazis had under-estimated the British seaman. They did not know that a healthier minded body of men has never sailed the seas.

#### BEST KEPT SECRET OF THE WAR

One of the war's best kept secrets lies behind the success of Britain's Anti-Aircraft defences.

Part of the secret, the existence and exact nature of these weapons, has been shared by thousands of Home Guard who are the regular gunners to man them. Many batteries have been in action

How well the secret was kept can best be judged by the reactions of the German Air Force. German pilots, returning home after raids on Britain, reported with alarm and amazement on the power and concentration of the British "terror flak".

#### TRIPLE WEAPON

Better news still, and more evidence of the surprise sprung on the Luftwaffe, has the sharp increase in our nightly toll of raiders.

Improved tactics and closer co-operation with Fighter Command welded guns, searchlights and night fighters into a three-in-one weapon of increasing efficiency. Whichever made the kill's unimportant. All that mattered was that the kill was made.
