LA NORTHERN RAILWAY EXPLICA QUE ES IMPOSIBLE DAR MEJOR SERVICIO DE FLETES A LOS PRODUCTORES DE MAIZ DEL ATLANTICO

LOS PEQUEÑOS FINQUEROS DE CAHUITA ESTAN PERDIENDO TODA SU PRODUCCION POR FALTA DE SERVICIOS DE CABOTAJE REGULAR

Siete mil aguacates, cuatro mil mangos, dos mil quinientas naranjas y doscientas papayas se perdieron en la última semana

Nuestro corresponsal en Cahuita nos escribe para trasmitirnos una queja de los finqueros pequeños de Cahuita, en relación con el servicio de lanchas entre los diferentes puntos de la costa.

Nos dice que la única lancha que hace un servicio regular entre Limón y varios puntos de la costa Atlántica es la lancha Moderno de propiedad del señor Ernest. Pero esta lancha no tiene capacidad suficiente para trasladar toda la mercadería especialmente productos agrícolas que se producen en la Costa y estos se pierden siempre con grave perjuicio de los finqueros de esas regiones.

En días pasados, nos indica nuestra corresponsal que la semana pasada cuando pasó la lancha para dejar carga en Puerto Viejo, avisó a los finqueros que preparan en Cahuita mercaderías para traer a Limón. A su regreso la capacidad de la lancha estaba completa y no fué posible recibirles carga. Así se ayudará a muchísimos

finqueros pequeño, quienes podrían encontrar mercado en esta ciudad o en el interior para sus productos, sobre todo en estos momentos que hace falta comida para el pueblo. Antes se daba una subvención a la casa de Gmo. Niehaus para que hiciera ese servicio. Luego fué suprimida y nadie más se ocupó de este asunto.

Nosotros hacemos la sugerencia al gobierno en la esperanza de que tome alguna medida en beneficio de esta provincia.

En nota que su Gerente envió al señor Secretario de Agricultura, contestándole una comunicación, le expresa que el problema de los productores está en las dificultades de los mismos para llevar su producto a las estaciones más accesibles

El señor Secretario de Agricultura, atendiendo a observaciones que le hiciera un estimable finquero de la zona de Guápiles, se dirigió a la gerencia de la Compañía del Ferrocarril del Norte, para pedirle solucionar el problema del transporte del maíz, especialmente.

La respuesta del señor Green acaba de llegar al señor Secretario de Agricultura y explica ampliamente las razones que existen para esta que se califica como dificultad y falta de atención de parte del despacho de agricultura.

Al respecto, se considera en dicha nota que es sumamente difícil para el ferrocarril realizar un transporte de este artículo en las condiciones en que se usa, por cuanto los productores realmente hacen ingentes esfuerzos luchando duramente con los maíos caminos, para salir de sus fincas hasta la orilla de la vía férrea. Pero eso les hace doblemente difícil converger en su mayor número hacia una o dos o tres estaciones en las cuales haya comodidad de recibido, de atención de flete y hasta protección del artículo en el momento de un aguacero. Detalla que los precios en los fletes no pueden ser más favorables y de acuerdo con las condiciones que puede ofrecer la empresa en un acto de cooperación con esos agricultores.

Es por lo expuesto que, en diferentes casos, se hace imposible recoger los sacos de maíz, —dos o tres a veces— que los campesinos logran acercar hasta la vía férrea, a la salida de las fincas, y sin que sea posible saber si realmente esperarán allí al tren para recoger esa carga.

Anota, pues, el señor Secretario de Agricultura, que hay motivos bastantes para demostrar que ese despacho se ha preocupado por atender las quejas, pero q' el caso responde a la versión que ahora se da.

NOTAS EDITORIALES**NO HA CONTESTADO EL SEÑOR VOLIO**

El ingeniero don Claudio A. Volio, Asesor técnico de la Secretaría de Agricultura ha contestado todavía las críticas que se ha hecho a su informe sobre la ganadería en zona atlántica. Los señores José Rossi, Fernando Castro y Ricardo Gutiérrez, experimentados agricultores de la provincia de Limón quienes han invertido mucho dinero en la cría de ganado, difieren en absoluto de lo que pide el señor Volio.

Para la provincia de Limón ese informe reviste una importancia extraordinaria, porque la opinión bastante teórica del señor Volio, sea cosa definitiva y absoluta, sino porque su carácter oficial va a causar muchísimos perjuicios. Los bancos que nunca han tenido muy abiertas sus cajas para prestar dinero a los agricultores de esta zona, las cerrarán ahora definitivamente cuando se trate de fomentar la ganadería de esta provincia. El Gobierno que había ofrecido en innumerables ocasiones como base para nuestro resurgimiento, una ayuda completa a la ganadería, aceptara las conclusiones de su asesor técnico y dejara el mismo abandono de siempre toda la ayuda que nos había ofrecido.

Y mientras tanto el ingeniero señor Volio guarda silencio no obstante la gravedad que ese silencio tiene. Su mismo prestigio profesional y la seriedad del cargo que desempeña obligan a ratificar sus conclusiones, si es que ellas son exactas, o aceptar la ligereza de sus opiniones hidalgamente.

Y si el señor Volio continúa callando, la Secretaría de Agricultura quien está obligada a recurrir a otros técnicos, para que un estudio más amplio puede justificar una u otra tesis. El Banco Nacional de Costa Rica, a través de su Departamento Agrícola hizo hace algunos años, un estudio sobre las posibilidades de ayuda a la industria ganadera en esta zona. Sus conclusiones fueron del todo favorables. El señor Iglesias, autor de ese trabajo, tiene tanta autoridad científica como el señor Volio. Si en la balanza de la razón ponemos las opiniones de los señores Iglesias, Gutiérrez, Castro Cervantes y Rossi, contra la que sostiene el señor Volio, la elección no es dudosa.

Pero aquí no se trata de opiniones más menores autorizadas por la experiencia y el conocimiento, sino del carácter oficial de un informe que, lo repetimos, puede tener incalculables consecuencias para nuestra provincia.

Mientras todas estas cosas se aclaran, es oportuno que el señor Cónsul de Costa Rica en Panamá a quien seguramente ya mandó el informe, lo tome a juicio de inventario, y espere las publicaciones que nosotros iniciaremos de otras muchas opiniones de tanto valor como la que tiene en sus manos y que son favorables al desarrollo de la ganadería en nuestra zona.

UNA HISTORIA DE DOS ISLAS, MENORCA Y PANTELERIA O LAS CAÑAS SE TORNAN LANZAS



Julio de 1936. Unos genialitos despedidos se han sublevado en España contra el gobierno legítimo. "Es un conflicto local — dicen algunos sénecas— y lo mejor es no intervenir en líos de familia". Pero algunos amigos de los de la familia, no piensan lo mismo, y... en Argelia, a pocos kilómetros del Marruecos Español, han hecho un aterrizaje forzoso varios Junkers, cortos de gasolina, en su viaje de Alemania a Melilla, el primer feudo de los generalitos. Pero otros muchos llegaron a su destino... Menorca es una isla leal. A pesar de su guarnición y de la semilla lanzada por los "turistas alemanes" y los "comerciantes italianos" que desde hace tiempo pululan por el archipiélago, Mahón está con la República Democrática Española. Pero en Mallorca no sucede lo mismo; el generalito Goded ha dado bien el golpe y ha salido para Barcelona, a "conquistar" Cataluña... El fascista italiano, delegado de Mussolini, Conde Rossi ha tomado el mando de la isla, y los primeros "Sa-voias — Marchetti" ya han

llegado en vuelo directo de Cerdeña al aeródromo de Palma. El Conde Rossi ha dicho: "Hay que machacar a Menorca con aviación, hasta que se rinda".

Julio de 1936. Sobre el cielo de Menorca aparecieron unos raudos, gigantescos, extraños trimotores. Y Mahón fué la primera ciudad europea que supo de las bombas totalitarias; y un aviador español, el Capitán Freire, la primera víctima en Europa de la metralla de la aviación fascista. El asedio de Menorca por mar y aire duró muchos meses. Desde julio de 1936 hasta el 18 de febrero de 1939. Como en Malta, muchos aviones italianos y alemanes pagaron cara la osadía de bombardearla. Algunas veces, en medio de las tinieblas de la noche, se acercaron el "Bolzano" y el "Deutzchland", de "control del Mediterráneo", para atacarla, pero las baterías de La Mola les infundían demasiado respeto. Después de treinta y tres meses agotados todos los recursos, sin caídas en el aeródromo para su defensa y sin víveres para la población,

y entre los Licores Nacionales sobresale la "Ginebra extra-fina", con Gin Ale y limón, entona y sienta bien.

ción, capituló la plaza. Una de las condiciones aceptadas por el bando vencedor, y en la que hizo hincapié el Gobernador de la Isla, el heroico marinero D. Luis Ubieta, fué la evacuación a bordo de un crucero inglés surto a la sazón en el puerto, de todos los responsables civiles y militares que

se habían distinguido en la defensa de la isla. Los representantes de Franco aceptaron la condición y a bordo del barco británico embarcaron unos cuatrocientos refugiados con sus familiares. La guerra se había acabado en Menorca; de una forma muy triste, pero... se había acabado. Dos horas más tarde, cuando los exiliados se hacían a la mar, en el ciclo de Menorca aparecieron por vez primera los "Savoias 81" y bombardearon el barco y a la ciudad... Fué su última hazaña. Los cañones antiaéreos de La Mola, de acuerdo con las capitulaciones, hacia 2 horas que habían sido desmontados.

El 26 de marzo capituló Madrid, y el 29 empieza campaña anti-polaca en la prensa del Reich. Italia, siempre cauta, aprovecha la ocasión de haber quedado las manos libres en España, y da el paso siguiente. El 7 de abril ataca a Albania... etc., etc. Ya lo saben ustedes: después de terminado el episodio de España los acontecimientos se precipitan. Cinco meses más tarde Grecia es atacada. Ahora ven la guerra hasta los niveles de la "no intervención"... Y solamente en semanas se derrumban Polonia, Noruega, Holanda, Bélgica... Todavía los Aliados tienen más que cañas para defenderse, y Mussolini aprovecha la "feliz circunstancia", para dar el empalcito fácil a Francia, o se tambaleaba sobre la linea Maginot... Túnez, zá y Córcega, en la mano. El apetito se excita comiendo, y... íbamos por Malta. Pero ¡Malta!; las cañas aliadas las empieza a convencer en lanzas la Gran Bretaña.

Después de Menorca y del colapso de La República Española hubo unos días de paz. Muy poquitos; solamente los necesarios para que el monstruo recobrara aliento. La primera víctima de España, había sido la más difícil. Las que sucederían iban a ser más fáciles, vendida la retaguardia estratégica de las democracias. Virtualmente, la guerra de España terminó el 5 de marzo de 1939. Lo que allí que dío hasta el 28 de marzo



CONDITIONS ON THE FIGHTING FRONTS

Each day passes, the
a of the enemy forces
e different war zones
me more and more pre-
arous.

The larger and more impor-
ant part of the Island of Si-
cily has fallen under the
control of the Allied Com-
mand. The capture of the
island's capital, Palermo,
is said to be imminent.

The capture of the impor-
tant position of Enna so
disorganized the enemy's
system of defence in the
center of the Island that
their forces were compelled
to flee toward Messina.

The Germans are said to
have concentrated their ac-
tivities in the Catania sec-
tor, where they still offer
tubborn resistance to the
forces of General Montgome-
ry. In other sectors the Ita-
lians are reported surren-
dering en masse, while ma-
king a general retirement.

The Russians have an-
nounced their big offensive on
our fronts, and the fighting
is said to have assumed
an intensity unparalleled
throughout the period of
war.

In the central zone, they
have broken through the
principal Nazi defences in
the exterior of Orel, after
cutting all the railway lines
leading from the locality.
The Soviets have also made
advances in the Bel gorod
sector, where the Nazis were
forced to abandon their
chief lines of defence. The
offensive in the South has
also been extended and it is
thought the Russians plan
to reach the sea of Azov and
completely surround the German forces lo-
cated in the Donets and
Caucasian regions.

Due to the effectiveness
of the Allied aero-naval
blockade, it is expected
that only a very small part
of the enemy troops will
be able to evacuate Sicily,
while advices from Rome
declare that the Italian
ports having been so badly
damaged by the aerial at-
tacks there is hardly any
possibility of re-inforce-
ments being sent to main-
tain the defence in Sicily. A
later advice reports the cap-
ture of Palermo by the Al-
lied troops.

Melbourne reports that Allied air units effected the most devastating attack of the war in the southwest Pacific on Wednesday last, when they discharged 133 tons of explosives over Japanese positions in New Georgia.

ROME HAS BEEN BOMBED

Neither the governing authorities nor the public of Italy seem to have seriously regarded the joint ultimatum addressed to them by President Roosevelt and Premier Churchill, in which they were advised that they held their destiny in their own hands, as the only way of saving their country and themselves from the mighty striking forces of the United Nations was by getting rid of Mussolini and his chief henchmen. As a consequence of this attitude,

the long delayed aerial attack on Rome, the Eternal City, was effected in plain daylight last Monday the 19th. instant, during a space of two and a half hours. The attack was conducted by squadrons of bombers of the Mediterranean Command. Numerous objectives of great military importance including factories, railway stations, concentration camps and other edifices were heavily damaged. It has been officially stated that the pilots in charge of the attack had been specially instructed to abstain from effecting any damage to the Papal State or religious or cultural monuments; unfortunately a bomb exploded some three hundred yards off the famed Basilica of San Juan de Letran and produced serious damage to the edifice, which appertains to the Vatican.

An official report from Rome places the victims at 717 persons killed and 1,660 injured.

With a view of saving Rome from further bombings, the information has been released that His Holiness the Pope has solicited the removal of all installations of military value so the capital can be declared an "open city".

Meantime, the Governor of the City has arranged to give effective assistance to all who wish to leave.

IN THE PACIFIC WAR ZONE

North American troops repelled an enemy counter attack in the vicinity of Munda and inflicting serious losses.

Three hundred Japs were killed in an attack they initiated south west of Salamaua, New Guinea.

When a friend is carried to his grave, we at once find excuses for every weakness and palliations for every fault; we recollect a thousand endearments which hitherto glided off our minds without impression as also a thousand favours unrepaid, numerous duties unperformed, and wish, vainly wish, for his return; not so much that we may receive as that we may bestow happiness and reward that kindness which we once never understood.

THE APPEAL ON BEHALF OF MEN OF ROYAL NAVY AND MERCHANT MARINE

The development of the present age has provided the means whereby world-wide happenings are vividly brought before our eyes, rendering us, at times, impulsive, as we gaze on the pictorial views. Among the grasping scenes, we note the life of the mariner who faces the storms, the tempestuous billows and the monsters of the deep—perils which are today greatly increased by the activities of the enemy under-water craft.

The men of the Royal Navy and Merchant Marine are combatting these dangers in order to carry out the duties demanded of them and to maintain free communications with the various territories of the United Nations for the supplying of the essentials of the war and the feeding of their peoples.

The plea for an overwhelming financial support to King George's Fund for the sailors of the Navy and Merchant Marine of the British Commonwealth of Nations is most deserving. In fact, those who truly appreciate freedom, justice and civilization cannot fail to realize the indomitable courage of the men for whom the Fund has been promulgated. The Fund merits the fullest support, not only of Britshers, but of every anti-totalitarian who is cognizant of the fact that all those terrors which Nazidom has employed against other free peoples are also designed for us. We have every reason to believe it is not the distance which separates our Continent from Europe that has freed us from greater perils than the torpedoing of a single ship, but the daring Sea-Power of the Britons and their Allies. It should not be forgotten that the real aim of the Axis Combine is world domination, to obtain which the control of the seas is needed—and this they have not been able to wrench from our Navy and Merchant Marine.

We urge a wholehearted support to King George's Fund for the sailors of the Royal Navy and Merchant Marine. As mentioned in the memorandum of the H. M. Charge d'Affaires published in our last Saturday's issue donations can be sent direct to the British Legation in San José. We believe the Consulate in this city will, for convenience, be willing to accept contributions for remittance to the Capital.

ITALY HAS NO AIR RAID SHELTERS

Not only Rome, but Sicily also—contrary to what the totalitarian radio says—has the best constructed and equipped air-raid shelters in the whole world', affirms an expert on the present-day Italy of Mussolini.

Throughout Christendom, it is a well-known fact that during the first centuries of the Christian Era, thousands of persecuted men, women and children took refuge in the underground catacombs, which year after year yielded Italy millions of pounds and dollars from those tourists who were the outstanding source of profit for the land of that execrable jackal Benito.

Why howl now that the first bombs, which the Duce in his pride asked permission from his crony Hitler to rain on London, are beginning to fall on his own ground. "Twas a bad day for the "brave" Italian airmen who knew only how to drop mustard-gas bombs on Abyssinia, when in their "memorable" attack on London they lost thirteen machines, that is half the number that managed to cross the English Channel and this fatal number is perhaps the most certain augury of the approaching fall of the fascist government in the Italy of Garibaldi.

Why the howling over there, when those catacombs, so glorious in Christian History, have already saved the life of one of those depraved fascists of modern times, who dishonor ancient history and not deserve to exist today.

80 BRITISH GIRLS KEPT IN CELLAR

Letters from British girls interned atлаг Liebenau, a former nunnery in Bavaria, reveal something of the life lines.

One letter from Miss Joan Thomson, an actress said:

"We are under punishment—Eighty women are sleeping together. We have just completed nine days of being kept in from two till four".

Boredom is the chief enemy of these girls, who are allowed out only in a schoolgirl "crocodile." The only man they have seen for two years is the sentry at the entrance to their prison.

The Germans, apparently, tell the girls that it is Britain's fault that they are not returned home.

"Are you doing anything about our exchange," Joy writes. "I hear the men at G--- have been asked to sign their names if they want to go to England, so perhaps the transport is working after all."

On a previous occasion she said the Germans had offered to send them to Palestine, but every one of the 250 girls refused to go.

THE INITIATIVE IS OURS

The one momentous fact emerging from the fighting of this year, and of decisive importance for the outcome of the whole war, is that the Axis Powers have completely lost the initiative and that the United Nations are now on the offensive on all fronts. For years before the war the initiative was Hitler's, and nations trembled with apprehension as to where he would strike next. One Government after another thought it wise either to appease him or to throw in its lot with him, including the Japanese, who plot their wars according to the degree of division among the Western Powers. But how changed the picture looks today.

In Europe, Germany is definitely on the defensive and Italy is on the verge of catastrophe. The bold invasion of Sicily, breached one gate of Hitler's European fortress, and assaults on other gates may be expected soon. In Russia, where Hitler made one last effort to maintain the initiative, his third offensive was stalled by immediate Russian counter-attacks which Stalin is now expanding into an offensive, jumping all fortress walls, has been carrying the war home to the enemy for some time.

Hitler can no longer choose the time and place for his attack, but must worry about the time and place of Allied attacks. He must scatter his resources to guard all the vulnerable points of his extended battle lines instead of concentrating them for assault. What is more, he is now confronted with three factors which spell defeat to every German. The first is the failure of the Blitzkrieg, which puts into effect the German military maxim that Germany must win a short war or lose a long one. The second is the certainty that Germany must now wage war on two fronts. And the third is the knowledge that Allied resources are growing steadily while Germany's have passed the peak.

All reports from the German front, together with the growing number of deserters and the efforts of satellite Governments to get out from under, indicate that history is beginning to repeat itself. After the failure of the Russian offensive, the German generals must have arrived at the conclusion, that the war can no longer be won by military means. The length of time it will take before they and the German people are able to draw the consequences from this realization will depend on

ROMFORD MAN'S MAGNIFICENT OFFENSIVE SPIRIT

Said to have carried out certain operations with a dash and enthusiasm which were a great inspiration to the whole of his column, Sergt. Edwin Kerwynne Chapman, of the Essex Regiment, whose home is at Romford, has been awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal as a result of exploits in the Middle East desert, which enabled him to destroy two German planes and to take a German officer prisoner.

Sergt. Chapman was n.c.o. in charge of a section of carriers forming part of a mobile column which left Mersah Matruh on the afternoon of June 26th. During hours of darkness many columns were encountered, and only means of identifying them as friend or enemy was by sending the section of carriers forward to investigate.

TOOK A PRISONER

On every occasion Sergt. Chapman carried out this role with great dash and enthusiasm, although often encountering considerable enemy opposition. On one particular occasion he identified a column as hostile, but continued his investigation so close to the enemy that he was able to procure an officer prisoner, in spite of heavy fire.

On a later occasion he identified two German aircraft on the ground, and wrecked them both by small arms fire and grenades, again under enemy fire.

"Throughout the entire operation of the column he displayed a magnificent offensive spirit, which, coupled with a complete disregard for his own personal safety, was a great inspiration to the whole column," says official report. "Furthermore, his quick and accurate identification of enemy columns enabled considerable damage to be inflicted on them, and at a later stage was of great assistance in enabling the column to get back when completely surrounded."

the effectiveness of Hitler's control organization.

The Italian people are apparently ready to draw these consequences soon, and the collapse of Italy would prove the signal for many Germans to follow them.

In the Pacific the Americans and the Australians and the Chinese are likewise on the offensive. Unlike Axis Europe, however, Japan is still strong and her final defeat is impossible till the end of the war in Europe releases the bulk of Allied power engaged there. But the Allied offensives have already demonstrated that Japan, too, has lost the initiative.

In this war the end may still be long and costly, but both the military and the moral factors are now on our side and it is up to us to make the most of them."

PIGEONS SAVE LIFE IN RAF

LONDON. — Pigeons have often been the means of saving the lives of Royal Air Force crews, who, after a raid on Germany, have been forced down in the North Sea. It is when German "flak" has put the radio out of action that the pigeon comes into its own.

Before the plane is "ditched" the crew member in charge of the pigeons—two to each plane—closes the airtight breathing caps of the two containers, just in case they have to swim for it. A sealed container gives the bird an hour's air and protection from sea water, besides providing extra buoyancy for the crew.

After the dinghy has been launched and the crew are safely on board, an SOS by carrier pigeon is soon on its way home, unless it is a night crash, when the birds are held until daybreak, as they refuse to fly in the dark.

Pigeons are an absolute necessity to Coastal Command planes on convoy duty, for often radio cannot be used, as the signals would tip off U-boats lying in wait for the convoy. So the radio operator takes a bird from its container, and with trained and gentle fingers, attaches a tiny bakelite cylinder to its leg with a ring clip. The container holds a 1½ by 2 inch piece of "limsy" on which the message is written.

Now comes the hardest part of the operation. The bird must be properly launched. For just to throw it out in any old way is asking for the immediate destruction of the pigeon.

Only birds of the best racing strain are used by the RAF, with the result that 80 per cent of the messages sent while planes are on operational flights reach their destinations.

THE GREAT BENITO

In 1928 Benito Mussolini's own story of himself, "My Autobiography", was published. How strange the book's boastful words read today, in the light of World War II. The Duce, in 1928, the strutting great; today, the humpy dumpty jackal of Adolf Hitler.

In the book, the Italian dictator failed to attribute only one virtue to himself. That was modesty. After about 300 pages of describing himself as the bravest, brainiest, most triumphant and fairest man of all time, he winds up in a blaze of glory, holding a royal flush against Napoleon, Caesar, Plato, Alexander, Cicero and all the other boys who just have to throw in their hands.

The Duce wrote of himself: "But when it has become necessary, I have shown myself to be inexorable."

"I always feel a power over events and over men."

"In politics I have never gained a penny. I detest those who live like parasites, sucking away at the edges of social struggle. I hate men who grow rich in politics."

"I push on toward better forces of life and progress. I weigh them. I launch them. I guide them. I desire our nation to conquer again."

"I think that Italy is advanced beyond all European nations."

"I have controlled my impatience. I have avoided leaps into darkness. I do not sleep my way into conclusions."

"The Duce now has the RAF—sent opportunity, instead of merely 'telling the world,' of SHOWING these remarkable qualities which, tis hoped, in contrast to his Fascist legions famous Marathon from Egypt's frontier to Tunis, will prevent his running hell for leather to clasp the clay feet of his shining disciple, Hitler, imploring shelter in a padded cell in Berchtesgaden."
