En el último número de "La Voz Atlántica" que Ud. tan cordialmente dirige he tenido



timos años, y los vecinos con razón tienen cierto temor de enviar a sus hijos a esos locales.

Los inspectores enviados por la Secretaría de Salubridad están haciendo un trabajo minucioso con el fin de evitar el contagio en el futuro. Ojalá que su labor deje en condiciones habitables un edificio que aunque en muy mal estado es el único con que cuenta la Junta de Educación para los miles de niños varones que se encuentran en edad escolar y que por falta de aulas andan vagando por las calles.

NOTAS EDITORIALES

A PROPOSITO DE LA ESCUELA

En otro lugar de este número publicamos una nota sobre la fumigación que se está practicando en la escuela de varones General Tomás Guardia. Parece que durante los últimos años se han presentado varios casos de tuberculosis entre maestros y alumnos.

Es posible que una desinfección completa destruya los bacilos de Koch, pero eso no quitará el miedo a los padres de familia que tienen que enviar sus hijos a esa escuela. Tampoco sería justo exponer a los alumnos y maestros a un posible contagio si la fumigación no es perfecta.

Por otra parte el edificio no presta condiciones de escuela. Las aulas están en pésimas condiciones y sería necesario hacer una reparación general cuyo costo alcanzaría a muchos miles de colones. Y reparado y todo, el edificio seguiría siendo inadecuado para alojar el número de alumnos que asisten diariamente.

Hay todavía otro problema que es necesario resolver de inmediato. La mitad de la población escolar de Limón no asiste a la escuela por falta de aulas, pupitres y maestros. La Junta de Educación apenas alcanza a suministrar los útiles indispensables para un mediano servicio. No puede, pues, ni reparar la escuela, ni ampliar la matrícula.

La Secretaría de Educación debe afrontar estos problemas resueltamente. No queda otro camino que construir un edificio. Pero hay que hacerlo con capacidad para alojar dos mil alumnos, que es más o menos el censo escolar de esta ciudad. En las condiciones actuales no puede pedir la Secretaría de Educación a sus maestros una labor eficiente si no les facilita las comodidades necesarias.

Este sería el momento de que la Junta de Educación, el señor Inspector Provincial y nuestros diputados por la provincia, hicieran la gestión necesaria ante el señor Presidente de la República. Estamos seguros de que serán escuchados. El licenciado Picado fué antes Secretario de Educación y conoce la necesidad que apuntamos.

JAPÓN DICE QUE HA DESTRUIDO 57 SUPERFORTALEZAS

SAN FRANCISCO, 27. U.P. — Otra radiodifusión japonesa insiste también en que los pilotos nijones han destruido o dañado 57 superfortalezas norteamericanas durante incursiones enemigas en bases de los gigantescos bombarderos en China. Estuvieron presentes los jefes de dependencias municipales señores Alvaado, Arzola, Barantes, Marín, Martínez, Montero, Mora Morúa, Vindas y Zeledón. Se excusó el señor Casco por enfermedad.

Artículo Primero: ACTA: Se leyó, aprobó y firmó acta de la sesión anterior.

Artículo Segundo: El Regidor Esquivel pidió revisión de lo resuelto según aparte b) del artículo segundo de la sesión anterior, la que fué admitida, **ACORDANDOSE DE FINITIVAMENTE:** Nombrar al señor Alfredo Barboza para el cargo de Auxiliar del Administrador del Mercado, por considerarse necesario ese empleado a fin de que el señor Administrador no tenga que trabajar más de ocho horas al día, y además para que haya quien lo supla en sus ausencias, así como también para que pueda disfrutar de un domingo de asueto, alternando el trabajo de ese día con su auxiliar. Además se dispuso, preguntar al señor Gobernador si ya le llegó aprobado,

el presupuesto extraordinario votado para aumentar el personal del mercado y en caso afirmativo, rogarle que proceda a completar ese personal y organizar sus horas de labor con el fin de cumplir con lo que el Código de Trabajo establece, en relación con las horas que cada empleado debe trabajar.

Artículo Tercero: —a) Se acordó archivar: Informe semanal del Fontanero Municipal y telegrama del señor Inspector General de Hacienda Municipal recordando que las comunicaciones de los Municipales al Congreso deben hacerse por medio del señor Gobernador.

b) El señor Inspector General de Hacienda Municipal trascibe la carta que recibió del señor Manuel Chaverri en la que este último ofrece sus servicios en la Tributación Directa para impedir la tramitación de las escrituras otorgadas por las personas que adeudan impuestos municipales. Se acordó: Contestar que ya la municipalidad nombró el seis de junio de mil novecientos cuarenta y cuatro un empleado de la propia Tributación Directa con tal fin, el que está cumpliendo satisfactoriamente con su cometido y como por un olvido no se votó el presupuesto extraordinario necesario para pagarle los cincuenta colones mensuales que se le fijaron como sueldo, se vota ahora, por trescientos cincuenta colones con cargo a la partida 7/1 "entradas extraordinarias" reforzando así la partida 9/3 "subvenciones".

c) El señor Sut Fong Ng, patentado de 26 Millas, apela de lo resuelto por la Corporación según aparte b) del artículo III de la sesión anterior. Se acordó: admitir la apelación.

CONTRIBUCION DE FRANCIA EN LA BATALLA

Lo que han hecho los patriotas

El General de Gaulle anó el 28 de octubre de 1944 que miles de alemanes han muerto en Bretaña por la acción de los patriotas franceses. Por su parte, los comunicados de guerra emitidos por el Supremo Comando Aliado ya habían recordado la importancia capital de esta lucha franco-alemana en la retaguardia de las líneas enemigas.

Observando el desarrollo de la batalla, llama particularmente la atención la "nación perfecta" que existe entre las Fuerzas Francesas del Interior y las tropas aliadas. Desde hace algún tiempo se sabía que la resistencia francesa estaba organizada, que poseía armas, que recibía instrucciones del Comité Francés de la Liberación Nacional del comando interiano; sin embargo, los resultados de esta cooperación han sido mucho más decisivos de lo que se poseía a prever hace unas semanas. La resistencia francesa ha devuelto una fuerza armada en la cual el ejército alemán debe y tiene que combatir.

Es así como Joseph Gaughan describe la entrada de las tropas americanas en Vannes, después de que las F. F. I. se habían rodeado de la localidad: "La guarnición alemana es ya fuera de combate". Los franceses habían reclutado el pueblo, matado o hecho prisioneros a todos los soldados alemanes, actuando literalmente como la vanguardia de las fuerzas aliadas. "Y el corresponsal americano agrega: "Las F. F. I. portaban jazzeles blancos con la cruz de Lorena y cascotes rotos en la última guerra, armados con fusiles, ametralladoras y granadas de mano que golpeaban de la fuerza, los patriotas bretones.

De otra parte, Walter Lucas expresa en el CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR:

TOR, uno de los diarios más serios de América: "Francia está en almas, en la retaguardia de las líneas alemanas. A raíz del desbarco aliado en territorio francés, el soldado alemán está obligado a vigilar todos sus flancos a la vez. Desde el 6 de junio del año en curso, la valentía y la fuerza de miles de soldados franceses ha estado constantemente en prueba. Han demostrado en reiteradas ocasiones que ellos eran la digna vanguardia del renacimiento francés. En un momento dado, seguramente que las F. F. I. contribuirá grandemente a precipitar la derrota del ejército alemán".

JAPANESE FLEET SUFFERS MOST CRUSHING DEFEAT

The great naval battle of the Philippines, in which the Japanese Command is reported to have risked the full force of their strength, in a double attack on Allied units, has resulted in their experiencing what General Mac Arthur has described the most crushing defeat of the entire war.

The fight started during the afternoon of Monday last and continued until the earlier part of Wednesday, when the remaining ships of the enemy fled at topmost speed from the scene of action.

This long awaited effort occasioned the Japs the loss of not less than 30 of their first line war units, which include ten battleships, three airplane carriers and more than 20 cruisers and destroyers. The loss on the side of the Americans were one aircraft carrier, the "Prince of Wales", and an unstated number of torpedo patrol boats. As the enemy ships are still being pursued by Allied air units, it is thought the final result of the fight will be a total catastrophe.

The Japs are also reported

to have lost 150 of their aerial units.

This blow has virtually destroyed all Japan's first line

ships and leaves her ports open to attacks by the Allied units. The invasion of the Philippines proceeds.

ON THE SEVERAL EUROPEAN BATTLE FRONTS

Motorized forces of the Russians have penetrated East Prussia to a depth of more than forty kilometers, according to the latest report reaching us. The Third army we are said to have been within eight kilometers of the railway center of Gumbinnen on the principal route to Koenigsberg, despite the desperate resistance being offered by the Germans.

Forces of the First Baltic army have occupied other important districts in their operations against Memel.

In Hungary, the Russians are in occupation of the south bank of the River Tiso and moving toward the north and northeast of Ayregynaza. In union with the Yugoslavians, they have also extended their positions in the area of the River Save to the west of Belgrade, and occupied other stra-

tegic points in Transilvania. Their advance in Czechoslovakian territory has liberated many districts along a front of forty kilometers. Further gains have also been obtained by the Soviets in the invasion of Norway.

General Montgomery is stated to have launched an intensive offensive in Holland with the object of expelling the Nazis from the southwest of that country. More than 50,000 enemy troops are reported fleeing in a disorderly manner over a front of 150 kilometers as a consequence of the movement. The areas of Breda and Tilburg are said to be menaced by Allied troops. The capture by the British of the important position of Shertogenbosch, which controls the way of escape for the German forces in west Holland, is regarded as imminent.

THE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Advice is more often than not regarded as offensive; not because it draws attention to faults which had escaped our attention, but because it shews we are known to others as well as to ourselves.

THE REASON

Following on the subject of the "Long standing Privilege cancelled", which appeared in our last Saturday's issue, we note the cancellation is said to be due to the sellers and others invading the trains on their arrivals and departures and thus impeding the detraining and entraining of passengers. We have no desire to enter on a controversy, but we feel further comment is necessary.

A highly and admirably regulated police vigilance has long existed in our city and has always been afforded full co-operation by the Northern Railway Company at its station and elsewhere. We are without the knowledge of complaints having been previously aired regarding the disorderly conduct occasioned by the invasion of the trains by unauthorised persons. In so far as we are aware, aided by the police, the disciplinary measures maintained by the Management of the Company's freight and passenger services at this terminal of the system, have kept passengers, particularly the outgoing ones free of the molestations now claimed. It is also understood that the watchmen of the Company have never experienced any difficulty in keeping possible disturbing elements from entering the coaches. They have also seen to it that sellers do not approach the ticket side of the station, along the full length of the train about to depart. Limon being the Atlantic terminal of the system, there is no need for the sale of edibles at our station on the arrival of trains. The location customarily occupied by the sellers could not have caused passengers any molestation as they rarely use that side to entrain, due to the greater height of the steps of the coaches.

We sincerely hope it is not yet too late for the matter to be given further consideration with the view of the restoration of the age-old privilege being authorized.

TO THE MEMORY OF PRESIDENT THEODORE ROOSEVELT

Yesterday, October the twenty-seventh, completed the period of eighty-six years since the human factor of the great North American Republic was benefitted by the birth of Theodore Roosevelt, who is said to have been of Dutch parental ancestry. His father was a merchant in the city of New York. To Harvard University belongs the honour for the very effective intellectual preparation of young "Teddy" as he was familiarly called.

Forty-four years ago, he was elected Vice-President of the United States of America under the regime of President McKinley, whose assassination

The writer of the article threatened that if no remedy were secured against these wrong doings, they, the complainants, would take the law in their own hands and do injury to the negroes.

Living in this my home of adoption as a peaceful citizen, and also as one who

has served the government, and even offered his life in military service on a certain occasion, I must call a halt to this lack of serious consideration for the people of my race, and to issue the call that they at once get together and ask for citizenship status, either as Britishers or Costarricans. For most of us, especially those in here are neither Britishers nor Costarricans, though the offspring of British West Indians. Being born in the country facilitates the means of securing "adoption" papers, or as it is called in Spanish, Opción. All who do this will, therefore, be able to claim protection and better attention. Get in line, therefore, and declare your nationality. Do not procrastinate any longer.

Indian Army Officer Tricked Rommel

On the day Rommel was promoted Field-Marshal, an officer of the Indian Army who had been captured with his men tricked him into allowing him to address his men. He did so—in the Urdu language—and told them where to go if they were able to escape from captivity. The Indians listened attentively, feigning despondency, and a fair number of them got away to rejoin the British armies.

This story, one of the most remarkable of the war, is related in "The Tiger Kills", published for the Government of India by HM Stationery Office, price 2/- The book describes the work of the Indian Divisions in the North African campaign and records the many feats of heroism performed by Indian troops in stubborn retreat and victorious advance.

The officer who hoodwinked Rommel was Lieut.-Colonel Morris of the 13th Frontier Force Rifles. Enemy tanks overran his company at Mersa Matruh and he and his fellow-prisoners were marched off to Rommel's headquarters.

Taking Snapshots

Rommel strolled through the group of prisoners with a camera, taking pictures of various Indian types, record the authors of the book. "Colonel Morris caught and obtained permission from the Marshall to say goodbye to his men and tell them how to behave in captivity. Standing in front of his men with the Germans listening respectfully behind he addressed his men in Urdu.

"First he told them that the Germans had given him permission to say goodbye and then proceeded to give them explicit instructions how to escape. The Indians threw themselves into the part, looking despondent and unhappy while listening to the careful orders.

"Wait till dark. Scatter and head to the east. Knock anybody on the head who gets in your way," said the Colonel.

"As the prisoners were being marched off, a British armoured car came out of nowhere with machine-guns blazing. The guards went to ground and the pri-

Foreign Workers in Germany resist

The Algiers radio recently claimed, quoting the Nazi paper, Das Reich, that "about 15,000,000 foreign workers at present in Germany show no interest in a victory by Germany, but actually pray for her defeat."

"The Berlin correspondent of the Swiss paper, Die Tat, said, in an article, the Algiers broadcast reported "that sabotage due to foreign workers has lowered the total production of Germany by at least eight per cent".

Credit for the total destruction of several factories in Germany was given by the Algiers radio to foreign workers, who set fire to the factories before the arrival of Allied planes and thus increased the effectiveness of the bombings.

According to reports emanating from Switzerland thousands of young Czechoslovakia workers employed in munition plants in Austria and Southern Germany deserted their jobs to join the Tito forces of Yugoslavia. Several steel plants in Austria had to close down owing to the disruption caused by these desertions. Allied bombings of Austrian cities facilitated the escape of Czech workmen.

On the list of executions compiled from various sources, mostly German newspapers, by the Inside Germany Reports appear the names of several Czech workers in Germany who had been sentenced to death listening to foreign broadcasts and organizing opposition to the Nazis.

Monster Turns up in Burma

Burma is said to have its "Loch Ness monster".

A number of Major-General Lentigne's men of the 3rd Indian Division claim to have seen it. The haunt of this alleged giant serpent-like creature is Indawgyi Lake, the 15-mile long stretch of water 20 miles to the west of Mogaung, and recently in the news as the base for the Sunderland flying boat operation which played such a successful part in this year's North Burma campaign.

Dropped Depth Charges

Describing how he first spotted the monster, Capt. John P. Lee-Warner, Recce Corps, whose home is at Seagrave, near Loughborough Leicestershire, said he was crossing the lake in a motor boat with three other men when he saw "two large bumps" sticking out of the water 50 yards away.

"Blimey, it's the Loch Ness monster!" said one of his companions as they turned the boat toward the bumps, which created a wash as they moved through the water at full speed. The little engine was not fast enough, however, and the "monster" disappeared. Re-uniting Europe's Families

A conservative estimate of the number of homeless or displaced persons in Europe, exclusive of the Soviet territories, is between ... 21,000,000 and 30,000,000. This figure is made up of forced labourers in Axis countries, civilian prisoners and persons in concentration camps, war refugees, hostages and thousands who have been routed from their racial and "living-space" doctrines.

All over Europe there are people whose only ambition is to find the relatives of whom they have not heard a word for three, four or even five years. How are all these millions to be reunited again?

Tackling the Problem

It is a difficult problem which will have to be dealt with partly by the military authorities and partly by the Allied Governments together with organisations which have already studied the matter—UNRRA and the Inter-governmental Committees on Refugees, the International Red Cross, and innumerable voluntary organisations who are anxious to provide help.

Maps are being prepared showing the routes along which organised repatriation is most likely to flow from areas where slave labour is at present concentrated. UNRRA officials have been working with Shaef officials and representatives of Governments in exile to plan advanced radio announcements as to standstill orders, registration forms and health certificates. A draft agreement has been prepared by the European nations pledging "mutual co-operation by the signatory nations to control organised mass movements of such displaced persons and to apply to them the principles of equality of treatment with their own nationals and to facilitate their speedy repatriation".

Tracing Relatives

UNRRA has estimated that it will take six or seven months to repatriate eight million Allied nationals from Germany to their own countries, moving an average of 35,000 a day.

Japs never found Union Jack

A few hours after the Japs landed on Abemama in the Gilberts, they sent the Senior Government Officer on the Island, a young Native Magistrate named Tobinabina. Before he answered their summons Tobinabina put on a thick leather belt with a huge brass buckle bearing a crown and the letters NM which constituted his sole insignia of office.

He said afterwards: "I didn't know what was going to happen to me, but I wanted to be in British uniform just in case I never got a chance to wear it again".

When they saw the belt the Japs burst into laughter and told Tobinabina that he would have no further use for ornaments of that kind. But Tobinabina had other ideas. He hid the belt in the bus so that it would not fall into the hands of souvenir-hunting Japanese soldiers. Then he waited patiently for the day when he would have the right to wear it again. The Japs dismissed him from office as being "inevitably pro-British".

Tears in His Eyes

On the day when the Americans landed to liberate Abemama, Major Holla a British officer who came a horse with them, had walked only a few yards along the road nearest the village when he met Tobinabina. His approach was smartly attention and Holland there were tears trickling down his cheeks. He wearing his belt and the brass buckle was gleaming as brightly as ever, for that morning he had given it the most thorough polishing of its life. Tobinabina had something else with him, too—a Union Jack which he had also kept hidden throughout the Japanese occupation.

That night the Commander of the American landing party slept at the House of the Senior Government Officer on Abemama. The house was Tobinabina's.
