Vaccinating at random in public places such as, notels etc., is without doubt a cause of additional work, because it is not possible to recognise who is vaccinated and Who, is not.

But if the authorities choose a method such as they do in other countries, one authorised man with one or two assistants to go from house to house in one section of the town and another in another and so on they will find it the best and easiest way to find out those who need vaccination because the names of all the immates of every house are properly entered in the lists of the above employees. This system more over helps to get in touch with a great many, who seldom or never go out of their houses and a greater part of such inmates are in near danger of getting the sickness for want of fresh air and sufficient exercise.

Out of the many disorders resulted by trying to vaccinate in public places, one or two instances are worth while mentioning.

Don Arturo Volio has resigned his portfolio as Minister of Fomento, in consequence of a Legal discussion between himself and Don Luis Anderson the Lawyer for the Simmons Construction Co. whose Contract he has rescinded, and due to some political insinuation of his as to Don Luis non patriotic attitude towards the Zelaya Government since 1906-07. The Amory case, and the Royal Bank oi Canada's case, Don Cleto intervenes and takes the responsibility from the shoulder of Don Luis, Don Arturo resigns and starts an exposé of documents proving his assertions, and on account of this the entire Cabinet walks out of office.
