Will Costa Rica send a delegate to the 1931 Convention in August next?

This is the question that is engaging our attention very seriously, consequently I am bound to crave a little of your space in our valuable Journal to make a few remarks on this all absorbing topic to my fellowmen of the Negro race.

Just a little more than a year, we saw a somewhat flourishing Organization among the Negroes of Costa Rica. The standing of the Organization was such that its members (more than 1000 then) anticipated the sending of 3 delegates to the 1929 Convention of the Negro peoples of the World, and that could easily have been done if the same Unity had continued, but unfortunately for the Organization, it was at that same time that an awful split began, (which is much greater today.)

The split started when the Limón Division announced her withdrawal from the Conference of Presidents, and grew worse when Estrada and Madre de Dios followed suit, hence only two delegates could have gone to Convention; and except something tangible is done to reunite the scattered units; whose minds have been disgusted (rightfully) and as a result left the Organization, we will not be able to do much, and our labours of the past will be lost.

On the sick list

We are very sad to chronicle the very serious illness of our old friend Dr. Miguel Angel Velasquez. On Tuesday there was a strong rumour around town that he had passed away to the great majority but we were gratified to find on closer investigation that instead he had recovered, we hope this will be a good sign in favour of his recovery.

Dr. Velasquez has been a most sincere philanthropist of Limón and its inhabitants he is the most reasonable and charitable Medico around us, it is therefore hoped he will be spared to us for many and many a day yet.

Anyhow, the keen observer sees with the prospect of a reunion; a clean, progressive U. N. I. A. in the not very far distant in this country. One can decide thus after considering the prominence of the persons that are now interested in the future welfare of their countrymen.

One speaker at Pacuarito during the unveiling of her new Charter, said, there are two great men that are rendering yeoman service to our people in this country, namely Messrs A. L. Stewart and S. C. Nation I have seen these two, and a few more prominently among the others is Mr. W. A. Petgrave, a gentleman of some legal knowledge who is also playing a great part (in the press) to awaken the consciousness of our people.

It is however full time that some more of our educated men come out and offer themselves for leadership, because it really needs the best brains to lead our people in the paths that result in progressive ideas.

Lets have more Stewarts, Nations and Petgraves; there are plenty of them here. Preachers and teachers are specially invited to link up and help our people to think.

Calabar College to front again

By the Gleaner we find that Calabar has rushed to the front again this year, by winning the Jamaica Scholarship by its pupil Mr. Alfred Lind De Pass Carnegie at the age of 17 1/2 years. The son of the Revd. J. Carnegie, Moravian Minister at Maggoty. His brother also is a prize man, having got second class honours at London University in classics and is now engaged as one of the Teachers at

Calabar, and had the privilege of being one of young Alfred's tutors. This young gentleman has had the distinction of passing his Junior Cambridge exam at the age of 12 1/2 years and his Senior Cambridge at 14 1/2 year of age, and now the Jamaica Scholarship at the age of 17 1/2; by which he is will receive £250 per annum for three years to enable him to take up his profession in England.

Banana Consumption

According to the Food-stuffs section of the Department of Commerce of the U. S. A. there were imported into the United States for the year 1929 no less than 65,134,106 Stems of these bananas, Honduras and Jamaica were the greatest suppliers; and the imports into Great Britain has been 12,450,802; of this the greatest supplier has been Columbia being 31 per cent, with Jamaica next 21 per cent. Costa Rica next of 17 per cent. It gives the production of Jamaica for last year as 10,217,786 stems.

From Trinidad we find

that by the experiments being made by the Imperial College of Tropical Agriculture it is seen that the "Governor" bananas are immune from Panama disease, and can be made to travel as good as the "Gros Michel" variety and if this can be made to travel well, then Trinidad and Tobago will be a Competing factor in the Banana Supply of Britain.

The Commission on Council Enquiry

The investigation ordered by the acting Governor into the conduct of certain Councillors of the Kingston and St. Andrews Corporation Council, has been continuing its course, and startling revelations of alleged graft among certain members of the Community of Kingston and its municipal officers, as a means of obtaining whatever business propositions, or positions they may apply to the Municipality for.

Away from the former charges of alleged graft already investigated against Mr Fernandez, Mr. Duval the Revd Gordon Hay for accepting bribe from an employee of the Municipality to obtain for him promotion in the service etc. and influencing the Council in commercial propositions which findings have been reported.

Now comes further evidences from Mr. James Gore of "Cuyamel fame", saying that he too, had paid out £40 pounds to Messrs Fernandez, the Revds Gordon Hay, and Mr. McLaughlin as well as other gentlemen and for having also accommodated Councillor Clough with a Loan of £25 with similar intentions towards getting sanction for the erection of his tile factory and other proposals.

The Revds. Gordon Hay and McLaughlin have refuted entirely the statements of Mr. Gore Mr. Gordon Hay has since left the Island.

In the meantime the Commission has concluded its investigations and has

sent in its findings to the officer administering the government, as per. "The Gleaner" and it is understood that criminal proceedings will be instituted against certain individuals complicated in the charges; what is feared is that those persons found offering the bribes will also be implicated if criminal proceedings are set in motion because if there was no offer to bribe, there would be no graft.

Some people seem to have no faith in Mr. Gore's allegations, as they are hardly consistent; anyway his declarations have had the effect of lowering his prestige in the community, especially when considered in conjunction with his mixings here with the Cuyamel Fruit Co. and its Attorney Mr. Melano.

It is thought that these wholesale allegations of graft in the Corporation Council will bring about the dissolution of representative control in the manipulations of the city's affairs, and these placed in the hands of a Commission, as per a petition which has been forwarded to the government, which will be a blot on the integrity of representative government placed in our hands. This was the same idea, on account of which Mr. Marcus Garvey was framed up and criminally prosecuted for libel, in consequence of his memorable article in the "Blackboard" newspaper, "The Vagabonds again" and to see how happenings have justified his remarks.

Great dissatisfaction by Jamaica Banana Producers Association

The Jamaica Direct line ships of the Association have recently been calling at Baracoa, Cuba to take in half her cargo, before coming on to Jamaica to take on Producers Association fruit, which is causing great apprehension among the members of the Association, as they claim that there is not enough

space on the boats to convey their fruit to European markets, after these boats shall have called at Cuba to take on the fruit of the Di Giorgi Corporation.

On investigation it turns out that the Di Giorgi Corporation owns one half the value of these boats, and has the privilege of

loading one half the space on these boats with their own fruit wherever grown or bought, paying one half of the ships expenses, which arrangement was not known to many of the Jamaica Producers. Formerly the DiGiorgi Corp. used to buy their half of fruit from the Association at current prices based upon the market prices abroad; hence all went well so long as the producers were shipping all they grew, but now that the Di Giorgi Corporation claims that their fruit grown in Cuba or bought in that Island gives them better financial returns than the Jamaica bought fruit, they naturally divert these boats from the Jamaica direct service, to call on the outward service to take on their half of fruit at Cuba, hence the squeal. The members of the Jamaica Banana Producers Association are claiming that the extra expense for taking the boats out of the run, to go to Cuba should be borne entirely by DiGiorgi and not half by them, then again they are claiming that they are loosing a considerable amount of fruit, there not being sufficient space on the boats, to take their fruit, after DiGiorgi has taken on 50000 stems of Cuban fruit.

The new boat being got ready will considerably relieve the situation as DiGiorgi will not have 1/2 claim in her.

Overnight discovery

In the 7th issue of "The Excelsior of Cartago" we find note, in defence of the Telephone system of Cartago in respect to the article in our last issue with respect to public utility, but while seeking to defend the gentleman in charge of the office, he alleges that the service is not only bad but dishonest, by carrying more clients than its lines of Communication are capable of attending to.

Our intention is never to blame any individual employee, but rather to point out defects when they appear and invite a remedy, hence we are glad that our colleague corroborates with us that the service is fairly with a hope of betterment.

This is however remarkable that we cannot allow to go unnoticed. This misnomer in Journalism term "The Searchlight" a Jamaican Newspaper, this shows its lack of Education, in not being able to differentiate between a Jamaican and a Costa Rican Newspaper, edited and printed in Cartago Costa Rica.

If the appellation is intended to carry a "stigma" we can only refer this overnight discovery to "The Daily Gleaner", a Jamaican Journal of world wide reputation, on the correspondence staff of which the writer "A. J. M." is a boastful Jamaican, has always been sought after and I am afraid that comparisons do to culture, blood, education, integrity and Social Standing in our spheres might be odious.

I would therefore advise this writer, that it is not the spot under the Sun in which one is born that Counts, but it is the culture and refinement, imbibed around that spot coupled with personality and rectitude of ones character which counts.

Apenas hay una queja, por bien fundada que sea, por más que nos conste que la deficiencia existe, y que podría subsanarse, preferimos dejarnos sorprender por cualquier intrigante, que va de casa en casa y de tienda en tienda con un memorial redactado ad hoc, a implorarnos una firma, a mendigar una protección inmerecida, antes que preocuparse por el mejoramiento del servicio, que interesa a la comunidad. Por eso las cosas están como están.

Va el apreciable señor Panagua y los no menos apreciables empleados de la central de Cartago, poseen una credencial que los limpia de

todas sus culpas y el servicio continuará igual, o peor que antes, porque ya la red telefónica de Costa Rica está convencida de que el servicio es eficientísimo, de que ellos contestan en el acto a las llamadas, de que no cortan las conferencias, de que no contestan con brusquedad y des cortesia a los reclamos que se les hacen por el mal servicio, etc. etc.

Dos de las personas que firman el memorial nos dicen: «Tiene Ud. razón; el servicio es malo, pero si Ud. se queja, echarán al pobre Panagua. No diga Ud. nadal!» Ese es el proceso de este país: el proceso de nuestra debilidad y de nuestra falta de carácter.

A todos nos consta, por ejemplo, que el servicio de la luz eléctrica en Cartago es infame, que ni la Municipalidad ni los abonados están recibiendo ni la tercera parte de los vatios que les corresponden. Pues bien, que se queje alguien, y ya verán los lectores al dia siguiente un memorial con dos o tres veces más firmas que las que respaldan el oficio, en que afirman que «la queja es *inversimil*».....

The Embargo Explained

Dear Mr. Editor.

Please allow me space in your valuable column to explain my reason for taking legal actions against the Limón Division of the U. N. I. A.

My mother died a financial member of the Port Limón Division in the year 1925. Leaving me as legatee to her death—grant, along with an executor whose duty it was to see to it that I was paid the sum of ₡ 300.00, according to the laws of the Organization. Some months expired, and I went to ask about this money and was told that my executor drew the amount of ₡ 150.00 without my knowledge. I immediately wrote the officers of the Executive board, advising them not to pay the balance of this money without my consent or they would be held responsible for same. It was to be left until I was of age to receive it. I wrote the Executive Board on the 31st of December 1927 during Mr. Nation's regime, asking that a part of this money be paid to me; and on the 8th, of January 1928 I received ₡ 50.00 without any trouble whatever. I did not ask anything about the balance until sometime in 1929, when I heard that the executor had gone to the officers of the Division, claiming the balance of this money. Upon hearing this, I sought advise from a student of the law; and he told me to go and tell the President of the Division who was Mr. T. A. Smith at the time not to pay this money to any one beside myself or else he would be held responsible for it. This I did immediately; and was assured by him that he would not do such a thing for it would be illegal. A few months ago after the President Mr. T. A. Smith found that I was one who was against his mal administration of the division and with an intention to spite me in some way or other advised my executor to demand the money although knowing that I had denounced this man already, knowing that I was of age, to demand the money, and seeing the plan that was laid out to deprive me of it; I wrote to the officers of the Executive Board of the division on the 15th, of May requesting that the amount be paid to me within thirty days. This letter was taken to the members by the President. He told them that I was not of age to receive this money and he could not pay it to me because someone else was claiming it. The members advised him to call the two parties together and see who the money was belonging to: This was done in a membership meeting on the 24th of June. According to his action, in the matter, it appeared as if a part of this money was promised to him. After a lengthy discussion, the members decided that the money should be paid to me being the legal legatee. The President not being pleased of this decision,

the next day advised my executor to embargo me for the ₡ 50.00 which I had drawn during Mr. Nation's regime so that I could loose my work. He also assured this man that he will see to it that I dont get this money as long as he is President of the division. Up to the last of July, not a word was said to me concerning the money. On the 7th of August I wrote the following letter.

To the President and Officers of the Executive Board.
Esteemed Sirs:

I am instructed by my attorney to write you for the last time, requesting that a settlement be made in full of the amount due me within fifteen days from today. Failing to grant this request, legal steps will be taken to obtain same. I have given you thirty days already and nothing was said to me from the time the members decided this matter. Therefore I dont expect to wait longer than fifteen days more. Be it further known that no part payment will be accepted.

This letter I was told was laughed at by the President. On the 12th, of August the letter was brought before the membership; and after half an hour planning of ways and means to pay the money, the members ask me to wait until thirty days more when they would make a voluntary subscription and pay me. The President being absent at this meeting upon hearing of the members action, protested strongly that such a thing cannot be done.

He would not stand as a President of this division, and allow the members to do as they like. He Will see to it that I wait until when the division is able to pay me. The thirty days expired and I went for my money, and was told that there was no money to pay me. Not having any intention to harm the association; but since Mr. Smith is trying to use his "Poder Generalísimo" to deprive me of what is mine, I had to resort to an Embargo. Which will now cost the Division over ₡ 200.00 instead of ₡ 100.00. If the members wont get rid of such a man, in a short while he Will cause them to loose their Liberty Hall along with the property. Thanking you for space Mr. Editor.

Los triunfos soviéticos

Más todo ésto no es sino una fregua en la gran lucha de vida o muerte que se enfrenta pronto entre los Estados Unidos y Rusia, debido a la invasión de los productos soviéticos en el territorio americano a precios que,—a pesar de las altas tarifas—, no le será dado a Norte América poder entrar en competencia, surgiendo de allí la catástrofe, pues aunque no llegaran a territorio estadounidense los productos rusos, éstos se desplazarían por el resto del mundo, dando muerte al comercio de los Estados Unidos.

En el colosal ensayo que está llevando a cabo Stalin en Rusia, según leemos en la misma prensa americana, existen 1377 especialistas de alta pericia técnica, ocupados en la tarea de la reconstrucción de las industrias rusas. De éstos, 687 hasta mayo, eran alemanes; 452 norteamericanos, y el resto franceses, ingleses, suizos y de países, yendo en crecimiento el pedido de expertos ingenieros americanos que a estas horas deben ya pasar de mil, y que tratarán de hacer por Rusia lo que quizá no han hecho por su propio país, calculándose que los salarios de sólo éstos subirán a cinco millones de dólares al año.

Sí los jefes comunistas, encabezados por Stalin, tienen éxito en su plan de industrialización por cinco años, cuyo triunfo dejá entrever el National City Bank en su boletín del mes de Julio, que tuvimos a la vista, Rusia gastará aproximadamente treinta y cuatro mil millones de dólares, o sea casi el total de lo gastado por Estados Unidos en la guerra mundial. Muchas autoridades económicas y financieras creen que los bolcheviques harán un reto al mundo en materia de producir artículos baratos para la exportación, constituyendo ésto, como dijimos anteriormente, una amenaza tremenda para las industrias norteamericanas y aún europeas.

Llama la atención de la Prensa Asociada, que mientras el Gobierno de Estados Unidos rehusa reconocer a los soviets y dicta órdenes como la del embargo en New York de los productos rusos, ingenieros norteamericanos están ayudando a construir una moderna y mecanizada Rusia, que intenta entrar en competencia abierta con los Estados Unidos.

Una cosa que es digna de estudio, según la prensa americana, es cómo hace Rusia para disponer de tan grandes sumas de dinero sin hacer ningún empréstito en el extranjero, ni haber un sólo dólar estadounidense en ninguna empresa soviética.

Para que se vea la extraordinaria potencialidad económica de Rusia, a quien se hace pasar como país pobre, baste saber que el Coronel Hugh

L. Cooper, de New York; gana quinientos mil dólares al año por supervisar la construcción de una gran planta de fuerza eléctrica en el río Dnieper, con valor de ciento veinte millones de dólares, basándose el salario de Cooper en la proporción del costo de la empresa.

Está en autos el gobierno americano de que la cuarta parte del programa industrial ruso se ha realizado ya, y de que con el producto de las abundantes cosechas obtendrán los soviets empréstitos interiores para dar cima al enorme ensayo que quieren

realizar, con verdadero pasmo del mundo, que jamás habíamos visto cosa semejante en forma estatal.

Cómodo salvarán los Estados Unidos su potencialidad industrial y agrícola; es cosa que no sabemos, pero que de seguro debe estar siendo objeto del más detenido estudio por parte de los grandes estadistas de que dispone esa gran nación, que da a la sorpresa a la humanidad con sus rápidas concepciones y la eficacia de los medios que emplea para salir avante de las mayores dificultades.

What the King of Britain thinks of the Stupidity of some Court Rules

A London dispatch in the *China Press* says in part:

The king's illness, it is stated on all sides, has completely changed his outlook on life. The long months of isolation in the sickroom, first in London and afterwards at Bognor, have made King George "hungry for human companionship and anxious to meet as many people as he can in the future."

"When I am better," King George remarked to

a circle of friends who visited him in his convalescence, "I am going to abolish many of the artificialities that have hitherto separated me from other human beings. I have come to realize during my illness more than ever before, that a king is a very ordinary human being, but that the things that distinguish him from others and keep him out of contact with the world of reality, are nothing but a set of extraordinary and antiquated rules and

regulations which in many instances have very little sense to them. And I mean certainly to bring a change in the situation, once I am fully myself again."

The queen is fully converted to the king's new point of view. And King George, in turn, is now able to sympathize with and understand the dislike of the Prince of Wales for ceremony and the endless drudgery of court life with its thousand and one formalities. The entire royal family, in fact, is unanimous in the opinion that 75 percent of it, is all silly and senseless and belongs to another age.

The first practical effect of this revolutionary change in royal psychology has been a personal order from King George that gives the servant staffs at Buckingham Castle, Windsor Castle and Sandringham the full benefit of an absent court, which used to mean a period of "disciplined idleness". Disciplinary regulations at all royal castles are henceforth relaxed.
