We trust our readers vvill not vveary of our continual refference to this subject, but as vve are convinced that this is the only hope for the resuscitation of commercial activities on the Atlantic Zone, vve cannot but refer continually to the prjoect, with an idea that Don Cleto's Government vvill see vvith the same eyes through vvhich vve gleam at this Ca., as being the only salvation for the City of Limón and its surroundings.

The members of the Agricultural Board of Limón have done and are still doing all they can to bring the importance of this Canal prominently before the eyes of the President and his executive_officers as yvell as before the deputies of Congress to indicate the great importance which this Canal would be, not alone to the Atlantic Division of the Republic but to the entire country, yet vve cannot but say they cannot grasp the situation; because the very great majority of them do not knovy their country but on a Map. If the men vvho are the present guides of the destiny of the country knevv their Territory sufficiently, they vould knovy that to canalize these Lagoons vvould be to open up some of the most fertile lands of the Republic, vvhere unthought of timber forests abound, from which could be obtained millions and millions of feet of mahogany, cedar, laurel, pitchpine and other valuable lumber, eagerly sought at, vvhich great source vvould be a of Revenue to the vyateryvay and vvould soon help to defray the cost of its construction and maintenance.

They vyould know, that it vyould be a direct communication by vvay of Colorado straight into the heart of Nicaragua by vvay of the San Juan River up into the great Lake by vyhich the shipping capabilities of Moin and Limón yvould absorb all the

River Traffic from Bluefields thus enlarging the maritime trade of Limón a hundred fold.

They vvould knovv, that the cattle trade vvith Nicaragua could be quadrupled thus bringing eheaper meats into Costa Rican homes, and that there vvould be a continual exchange of commercial intercourse between the tvvo sister republics

They would know that by the fomentation of agriculture along the coast, vve vvould soon be encouraging compettion in our Banana Trade, vvhereby a European Fruit Co., vvould enter the market and take all the fruit offered along the coasts; yes vve re-peat if they knevv their -territory as they should, they vvould cease spending moneys on many unproductive vvorks of the interior and grasp the Bull by the born instead of the tail, and rush the construction of the Moin Tortu guero Canal as fast as it could be developed.

It was a pleasure to see our old friend don Federico Gólcher again on the job, pushing the point in every joint the Executive Council, and so far as vve have seen, it vvont be long before permission will be got to put these vvorks in hand; and hovv else could it be, don Federico as President of the Commithe vyhich has been instituted to investigate the possibility of the Canal, has placed before the Chief of State, his Ministers of Fomento and Agriculture and that of Gobernación, vvhat has been done by the Agricultural Society of Limón of vyhich our friend Mr. C. Harold Smith is a member, and has been instrumental in getting in touch vvith the shipping and Contracting Companies; these gentlemen of Limón have gone so far as to arrange vvith a dredging Company to construct the vvorks on their ovvn account, finding the necessary funds, machinery and materials to

vvhich payment vvill be guaranteed by the Export Tax on Bananas shipped from this Port, estimated at the present output in the sum of ffity thousand dollars per annum, therefore the construction of the Canal vvill not be a burden on the ratepayers of the Country, all vve vvant is the guarantee from the government to the Contractors and permission to stick the first spade in the soil. Would it not be criminal negligence

discountenance such efforts? God helps those vvho help themselves, and after the Limonenses have done all this, done more, vve happen to knovv that arrangements have been completed vvhereby, if sufficient free fruit can be got along the coasts to load a ship vvith 75,000 stems of fortnightly, the neces-ships vvill be provided for conveyng the fruit to European markets on a cooperative trading basis; vvould it not be criminal vve say again

to vvith-hold the help to velope one 's self after all these efforts have been made? vvould certainly be, and for this reason vve feel that on erations vvill soon be on foot. And vvhile here we would urge every planter in the Province, large and small, to join the Agricultural Society and swell its ranks and expand its influence before the authorities.

On Monday 2 nd inst. tvvo curtis Army planes Nos. 705 and 106 belonging to the military aerial service of the United States alighted in the Savannahs of San José from San Salvador on the vvay to their bases in Panama.

While the aviators left to present their papers to the Authorities and the American Legation, leaving in charge the field Policeman vvho in turn left his son in charge vvhile he vven for his pay; tvvo young aspirants to aviation Franklin Maduro and Fernando Zamora, came up and presented to the youngster vvhon the Police had left in charge, a certificate signed by the Director of Police Mr. Robles since 1929, acknowledging them as Airplane attendents and Mechanics; on presentation of this, they vvere allowed to go into the Hangar and no sooner in, they took charge of one of the planes

machinery in operation and started of vvith the idea of encircling above San Jose, but before they could have gone any distance, by some apparently vvrong adjustments the huge bird came back to mother earth from an altitude of about eight metres a perfect vvreck. The value of this aircraft is said to be \$ 40,000 being a 450 horse povver machine; needless to say that both young men vvere arrested and safely lodged in the jail, vvhile investi gations are proceeding. The President tendered his heartfelt sympathy in the incident and offered to stand the cost of the Repairs of the craft. The American Minister Mr. Eberhardt has assured the President that there can be no responsibility attachable to the government of Costa Rica, because his government looked upon the incident as merely an accident.

These things remind me of a Coyote Infested country. These Human inoculators have caused a degeneration amongst the younger generation; and day we are seeing more deformities, as a result of the ones' "Blood. The Chamber of Commerce of Hamburg announces that during the year 1930 Germany consumed 3.000.000 kilos more of Costa Rica coffee than the previous year, and that although the importations from Brazil, Guatemala and

Salvador vvere larger, neither they nor any other producing country shevved as large an increase. Of the total amount exported from Costa Rica, during 1930 Germay purchased 49% as against 45% in 1929 and 23% in 1925.
